



Letter of Attestation for Product Naming and Product ID

To whom it may concern:

Spot/Globalstar has created a satellite transmitter product for the purposes of providing a user's GPS coordinates via the Globalstar satellite network. This product will be known to the consumer market as Spot Gen3. However, during development, the product was known under a couple of other names as work progressed.

- Initially, the project was under the heading of PT3 which is in line with the first and second generation naming conventions for regulatory IDs. As a result, this was chosen as the ID name for all markings in users manuals and on the plastic enclosure.
- As marketing became more involved, there were multiple versions of the product proposed and schematics were created for each version. They were known as Spot3A, Spot3B, and Spot3C. Spot3A and Spot3C were tabled for the foreseeable future and Spot3B because the basis for the product.
- Occasionally, the product was referred to as Spot3 instead of Spot3B just as an abbreviation.
- Finally, in the tail end of development, marketing settled on an actual product name for the customer level. This is where Spot Gen3 comes from.

All efforts have been made to maintain consistency going forward, but there are some documents (theory of ops, schematics, BOMs, etc) which may refer to the various iterations of the product name. Ultimately Spot3, Spot3B, and Spot Gen3 are all just product names associated with the PT3 product ID.
