RE: Amendment to Confidentiality Request for FCC ID: L7KWTRC-01 dated June 25, 2004

Dear Sir/Madam,

Nokia Networks has previously requested (reference Confidentiality Request for FCC ID: L7KWTRC-01 dated June 25, 2004) that internal photographs showing the inside of any unit that is part of the UltraSite WCDMA Base Transceiver Station (BTS) be held as confidential per Section 0.459 of the Commission Rules. This amendment to the original letter dated June 25, 2004 is being provided to give additional support for the confidentiality request for internal photographs.

When a Base Transceiver Station (BTS) is installed into a network it is usually placed in an enclosed area, with access only available to authorized personnel. If the BTS is not in a restricted area (possibly because it is on the top of a building) access into the BTS is still not possible due to the fact that the cabinet is securely locked. This means that the only way a competitor could get hold of technical information on the BTS is from FCC records. We are concerned that if a competitor is able to get hold of sensitive information on the Nokia BTS, such as internal photographs that show details of our unit design, our position as a market leader could be seriously compromised.

In addition, UltraSite WCDMA BTS units are not available for sale to the general public. Sensitive information, such as internal photographs that show details of our unit design, is not available for public download from any Nokia site and is not available to the general public in any form. The UltraSite WCDMA BTS is only made available to legitimate customers (mobile operators who own FCC licenses for the appropriate frequency airspace). If Nokia were to determine that it was necessary to provide sensitive information to a legitimate 3rd party, Nokia would require that a Non-Disclosure Agreement (NDA) be in place before providing the information.

It is for these reasons that we request internal photographs showing the inside of any unit that is part of the UltraSite WCDMA BTS be held as confidential.
