## Ladies and Gentlemen:

We understand Internal Photos are not typically held confidential, but may be eligible for confidentiality in certain circumstances. Confidentiality for this information may be granted in the following circumstances:

- Internal photos of a non-consumer device may be held confidential if the device is not accessible to the general public.

Medtronic, Inc. ("Medtronic") requests that the internal photos pertaining to the above referenced application be withheld from the public disclosure in accordance with Section 0.457 and 0.459 of the Commission's 47 C.F.R. Rules, following grant of the application.

Medtronic's programmer which is the subject of this filing is not available for general public to order. It is a device used in the hospitals by fully trained medical staff and only works with patient's specific implantable device. The CareLink Encore 29901 Programmer is a portable, line-powered (AC) or battery-powered microprocessor-based system with software to interrogate and program Medtronic and Vitatron implantable devices.

Information regarding internal photos is not released to the public, the device cannot be obtained by the public, and any parties with access to this information are required to sign a non-disclosure agreement.

It is with this understanding that we respectfully request the agency to honor our request to maintain internal photos confidential.
