

Save Battery Life
Make sure that the vehicle & transmitter are turned off when not in use.

TROUBLE SHOOTING

PROBLEM	CAUSE	CORRECTION
VEHICLE DRIVES SLOWLY	-WEAK BATTERIES IN VEHICLE BATTERIES ARE OLD, MISMATCHED OR NOT ALKALINE.	-REPLACE VEHICLE BATTERIES WITH FRESH ALKALINE OR RECHARGE THE BATTERY PACK
POOR STEERING CONTROL	-LOW BATTERY IN TRANSMITTER -FLOOR TOO SLICK OR TOO DUSTY	-REPLACE NEW BATTERY -TRY ASPHALT OR CONCRETE

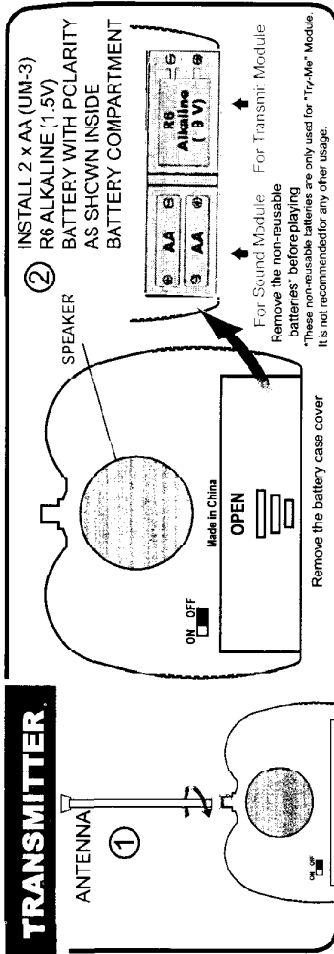

OPERATOR'S MANUAL FULL FUNCTION RADIO CONTROL

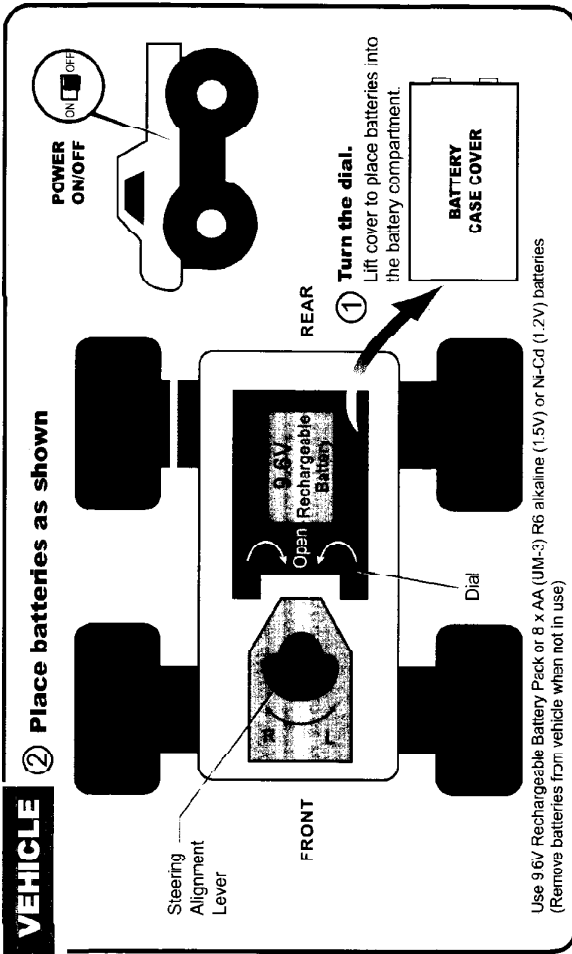
BATTERY INSTALLATION

HINTS WHEN USING BATTERIES

1. Do not use old and new batteries or batteries of different types at the same time. When charging batteries, always replace with a new set of batteries.
2. Do not use non-rechargeable batteries with rechargeable batteries or rechargeable batteries of different capacities.
3. Observe the polarity marks on the batteries and match them according to the battery compartment markings.
4. Remove all batteries from the transmitter and the vehicle when not in use for an extend period of time.
5. Misuse of the built-in rechargeable battery may lead to heat, break, fire or leak of electrolyte. Please pay enough attention to be following cautions.
6. Please charge the battery only when it's fully stopped. Never charge a vehicle that has been fully charged to avoid danger caused by excessive charging.
7. Stop using whenever it's wet to avoid short-circuit.
8. Never throw the battery into water or fire or disassemble or weld it.
9. Do not use, charge or store the toy near a fire source or in hot and humid place.
10. Use only special charger for charging purpose.
