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FCC & Industry Canada Regulatory Compliance

The NeoPoint phone is approved for use with CDMA and AMPS networks. This device complies with Part 15 of the FCC Rules. Operation is subject to the following two conditions: (1) this device may not cause harmful interference, and (2) this device must accept any interference received, including interference that may cause undesired operation.

Your wireless hand-held portable telephone is a low power radio transmitter and receiver. When it is ON, it receives and also sends out radio frequency (RF) signals. In August 1996, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopted RF exposure guidelines with safety levels for hand-held wireless phones. Those guidelines are consistent with safety standards previously set by both U.S. and international standards bodies: American National Standard Institute (ANSI), National Council of Radiation Protection and Measurements (NCRP), and International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection (ICNRP). Those standards were based on comprehensive and periodic evaluations of the relevant scientific literature. The design of your phone complies with the FCC guidelines and applicable standards.



WARNING: You should only use the manufacturer specified hands-free headset with the NP1660 phone away from your body (not in your pocket); or use it with the handset in the manufacturer specified leather case. For body worn operations, third party hands-free accessories that have not been SAR tested may not comply with FCC RF exposure limits and should not be used.

WARNING! Read this information before using your phone

In August 1996 the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the United States with its action in Report and Order FCC 96-326 adopted an updated safety standard for human exposure to radio frequency (RF) electromagnetic energy emitted by FCC regulated transmitters. Those guidelines are consistent with the safety standard previously set by both U.S. and international standards bodies. The design of this phone complies with the FCC guidelines and these international standards.

Use only the supplied or an approved antenna. Unauthorized antennas, modifications, or attachments could impair call quality, damage the phone, or result in violation of FCC regulations.

Do not use the phone with a damaged antenna. If a damaged antenna comes into contact with the skin, a minor burn may result. Please contact your local dealer for replacement antenna.

Body-worn Operation

This device was tested for typical body-worn operations with the back of the phone kept 0.8 inches (2 cm) from the body. To comply with FCC RF exposure requirements, a minimum separation distance of 0.8 inches (2 cm) must be maintained between the user's body and the back of the phone, including the antenna, whether extended or retracted. Third-party belt-clips, holsters and similar accessories containing metallic components should not be used. Body-worn accessories that cannot maintain 0.8 inch (2 cm) separation distance between the user's body and the back of the phone, and have not been tested for typical body-worn operations may not comply with FCC RF exposure limits and should be avoided.

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


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Preface

Your NeoPoint Phone

Congratulations! Your new NeoPoint phone is going to change the way you communicate.

The NeoPoint 1660 is a compact, lightweight personal communications system with added features for the person on the go. More than just a mobile phone, the NeoPoint phone allows you to:

- Access your e-mail, voicemail, and text messages
- Track your outgoing and incoming calls for future reference or call back
- Organize names and numbers (referred to as *contacts*)
- Go on-line through the MiniBrowser (depending on your carrier service - surf the web, get e-mails, stock quotes, etc.)
- Use your NP1660 as a wireless modem to send or receive faxes with your laptop computer.

NeoPoint: a smart, simple, and affordable solution for your active life style.

NeoPoint - your *new* point of communication.

Manual Conventions

All the phone displays shown in this manual show the icon views. The procedures are written from this base, but produce the same results regardless of whether the NP1660 is in icon or list mode for you particular display choice.

Each procedure also provides a "Shortcut Combo" that will also work in any display set up. These combinations typically look like this:

Shortcut Combo: [Soft Key] + [Keypad #] +[keypad #]

Each button is pressed in sequence, one following another. There are no combinations that require you to press and hold a button while pressing another.

All key names are enclosed in square brackets [Key Name].

[SoftKey 1,2, or 3]: These buttons always have the function they activate directly above them on the LED display.

About CDMA...

The NP1660 is a digital CDMA wireless phone, compatible with both digital (CDMA) networks operating at 800MHz.

Code division multiple access (CDMA) is the type of digital wireless transmission that the NeoPoint phone employs. The following sections provide information on CDMA performance and advantages. These sections are designed to help you understand how to better use your NeoPoint phone.

Signal Strength and Phone Performance

Like other portable wireless phones, signal strength is affected by the surrounding environment of the user. Buildings, parking garages, elevators, and basements are some examples of structures that reduce signal strength. Problems initializing a call, muting of the audio during a call, or a call drop are signs of low signal strength. Moving toward a window (if indoors) or



Blasting and Refueling Safety Information

Do not use your phone near a blasting site. Power down your phone when in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere. Radio transmissions in such areas could cause an explosion or fire, resulting in bodily injury or even death. Obey all posted signs and instructions regarding the use of wireless phone usage.

Chapter 1: Getting Started

Unpacking the Phone

Your NP1660 package includes:

- The NP1660 Phone
- A battery pack
- A travel charger
- A Quick Reference card
- and this User's Guide.

If you are missing any of these items, please return this package to your point of purchase and pick up a complete kit.

There are also some very useful accessories available to help you get the most from your new phone:

- An Ear-Microphone Kit
- An attractive Leather Case
- A Data Cable
- An Extended Battery

These accessories are available through the store where you bought your phone, or through the NeoPoint Website at www.neopoint.com.

Phone Description

The NP1660 Phone is a single mode, CDMA digital phone with several very powerful and useful features not typically available in a phone as compact and affordable as the 1660. These features include:

- An Internet Minibrowser

4. When the alignment is correct, gently press on the battery pack below the release button until you hear a click.

Basic Operations

Power on/off

To power on, press the END/PWR key. The phone will activate and briefly display NeoPoint banner.

To power off, press and hold the END/PWR key until the the message "Powering Off - Good-Bye" is displayed.

Last number redial

The last 10 numbers you dialed are stored in the call history list. You can use this list to redial these numbers as desired.

1. Simply scroll to the desired number, and press [SEND].

OR






If the phone is in standby mode, press the [SEND] key to access the call history list.

2. Scroll to the desired number.
3. Press the [SEND] key again.

Navigating through the menus

There are two methods you can use to move through the menu functions on your NP1660 phone. The first (default) method uses the soft keys to select and scroll through the menus to access the desired setting or function. The second (shortcut) method makes use of the soft keys in combination with the keypad.

When using the default method, select one of the three major icons shown at the bottom of the display. The functions for the soft keys available for each sub-menu will then appear at the bottom of the display above the corresponding key. Typically softkeys 1 and 3 will be used for scrolling

Installing the Battery

Charging the Battery

Inserting/Removing the Battery

To install the battery pack:

1. Align the two hooks at the bottom of the battery with the alignment holes on the bottom back of the phone.
2. Swing the battery pack in toward the phone. Allow the top of the battery pack to rest loosely against the back of the phone.
3. Check the alignment of the battery pack release button with the button notch on the phone.

- To answer the call, press any key except the [PWR] key.
- To mute the ring, press soft key 2.

Ending a call

Press [END] key.

Last number redail

Adjusting the volume

The Volume Buttons on the left side of the phone can be used to adjust the earpiece volume while in a call. These buttons also adjust the ringer volume when you are not in a call.

Locking/Unlocking the keypad

On the left side of the phone is a small, gray button with a lock icon on it.

- Press the Lock button once to lock the keypad.
- Press the button a second time to unlock the keypad for use.

Displaying the phone number

Shortcut Combo: [Phone Book] + [6]

1. Press [PhoneBook] (soft key 2).
2. Scroll to "My Number" and press [OK] (soft key 3).

The number assigned to the phone will be displayed.

Auto retry

Shortcut Combo: [Preferences] + [7] + [1]

1. Press [menu] key (soft key 1) on display screen.
2. Scroll to 'Features' and press [OK] (soft key 3).
3. Scroll to 'Auto Retry' and press [OK] (soft key 3).

through the choices; soft key 2 will be labeled OK for accepting a selection or change. The keypad can also be used to enter the number of the desired menu item.

When using the shortcut method, select one of the three major icons shown at the bottom of the display, and enter a series of numbers (up to three, but usually one or two) using the keypad that take you directly into the desired function or setting. The number combinations can be found on the Quick Reference card or [X-REF to Menu Map].

Regardless of whether your phone is configured to display menus using icons or text lists, the shortcut combinations will take you directly to the desired function.

Setting the time

There is no need to set the time on your NP1660 phone. The clock sets itself using a time signal received from your service carrier.

Please note that your clock will go blank when you leave your service area, but will reset itself when you re-enter your service area.

Making a call

1. Enter a phone number (including area code when appropriate) using the keypad.





If you make a mistake while dialing, press [CLR] key to delete the last character, or press and hold [CLR] key to clear the entire entry.

2. Press [SEND].

If the number is stored in your phone book, the contact name associated with the phone number is displayed along with the message "Connecting."

Answering a call

When you receive a call, the phone alerts you either by ringing, vibrating, or both. The call indicator also flashes and the backlight will turn on.



4. Scroll to select either on or off.

* When the system is busy or the receiving party is on another line, 'auto retry' does not work.

Auto answer

[menu] + [7] + [2]

Press [menu] key (soft key 1) on display screen.

Scroll to 'Features' and press [OK] (soft key 3).

Scroll to 'Auto Answer' and press [OK] (soft key 3).

- off / after 5 seconds / after 10 seconds / after 15 seconds

Mute

Press [menu] (soft key 1) in use.

Scroll to "Mute" and press [O.K] (soft key 3).

To release mute, press [Unmute] (soft key 3).

Reading text messages

When you receive a text message, a series of short tones sound and the LED lamp blinks. The display will look like this: [graphic]

The Message type, received time and caller ID will be shown on the display.

If caller ID is supported, you can make a call back by pressing [send] key.

The phone can store up to 22 messages. When the message memory space is full, the oldest message in memory will be replaced by the most recently received message.



Scroll to 'Anniversary' and press [O.K] (soft key 3).

Scroll to 'View' and press [O.K] (soft key 3)

Add (To add data on the list)

[menu] + [4] + [5] + [2]

Press [menu] key (soft key 1) on display screen.

Scroll to 'Time' and press [O.K](soft key 3).

Scroll to 'Anniversary' and press [O.K] (soft key 3).

Scroll to 'Add' and press [O.K](soft key 3)

Enter month and date with number keys and press [save] key (soft key 3).

Enter name and press [save] key (soft key 3).

Automatic store in empty location

Cannot be stored exceed 10

On reserved day, the stored anniversary displays instead of banner.

If not clearing the anniversary, it will display for 24 hours.

Erase

[menu] + [4] + [5] + [3]

Press [menu] key (soft key 1) on display screen.

Scroll to 'Time' and press [O.K] (soft key 3).

Scroll to 'Erase' and press [O.K] (soft key 3).

Scroll to one of you want and press [x] key (soft key 3).

World time

[menu] + [4] + [7]

Press [menu] key (soft key 1) on display screen.

Chapter 2: Features & Capabilities

Main menu

The Main Menu provides access to a variety of options that allow you to personalize your phone.

Use the [menu] key to take the menu items and press []/[] key or matched number key to access to the option.

Press [O.K] to confirm the selected option.

Changing the Display

You can change the Sub-menu screens to display available menu items in either icon form or a numbered text list.

To change the menu screen to icon graphic or list, press [Preferences (Soft Key 1)] + [5] + [7] on the keypad.

[menu] + [7] + [3]

Press [menu] key (soft key 1) on display screen.

Scroll to 'Features' and press [O.K](soft key 3).

Scroll to 'Distinct. Ring' and press [O.K](soft key 3).

Enter phone number and press [save](soft key 3).

Scroll to ring sound you want to adapt for stored phone number and press [save](soft key 3).

You can set the distinctive ring 2 and distinctive ring 3 as repeat 4) to 5)

Input location address. If press [save] without location address, the number will be stored at empty location automatically.

Add another number for the same name and press [save] (soft key 3).

(Another 1 phone number can be added for the same name if the first number is less than 16 digits)

Select "yes" or "no" for secret and press [O.K].(If you select "yes", you shall enter lock code to confirm hidden phone number.)

[book] + [1]

Press [PhoneBook] (soft key 2)

Scroll to "Call history" and press [O.K] (soft key 3).

If there are call history, scroll to you want and press [O.K](soft key 3).

Press [time](soft key 2) and you can view detail information.






Message volume

[menu] + [2] + [4]

Press [menu] key (soft key 1) on display screen.

Scroll to 'Volume' and press [O.K](soft key 3).

Scroll to 'Message volume' and press [O.K] (soft key 3).

- 4 steps (silent / low / medium / high)

Scroll to 'Reserved call' and press [O.K] (soft key 3).

To set up the 'Reserved call' choose on from the option and press [O.K] key (soft key 3)

The current time and Set Time will be displayed. Set the 'Set Time' with number keys and soft key 2

If you store the data by pressing soft key 3, "Enter Number" message will be displayed.

Input the phone number and store the number by pressing soft key 3.

When it is the reserved time, the phone is sounding alert for 1 minute and display blinking text "reserved call.

Press [SEND] to activate the reserved call. If you don't want to activate the reserved call, press [End] key.

Chapter 4: Care & Troubleshooting

Caring for your Phone

- Keep your phone clean.
- Keep your phone dry - humidity and liquids may cause your phone to fail and will corrode the internal circuits.
- Protect your phone from temperature extremes - high temperatures may damage the batteries, shorten the life of electronic components, and warp or melt certain plastics.
- Do not attempt to open or access the internal components of your phone. If your phone is not functioning properly, take it to a qualified NeoPoint service center.
- Do not drop, shake, or handle your phone in a rough manner - it may damage internal components or the LCD screen.

Cleaning Instructions

1. Turn the power off on your phone prior to cleaning.



NOTE: Do not apply cleaning liquids directly to your phone. Avoid using harsh chemicals, strong detergents, and petroleum-based solvents to clean your phone. Some household cleaners may contain chemicals that may damage your phone.

2. Apply the cleaning liquid to a soft cloth or towelette.
