1.9.7 Peak Output Power and Peak Power Density (Radiation)

The radiated power output and the field strength of the transmitter radiation were measured at the distance at 3 meters away from the transmitter under test which was placed on a turntable 0.8 meter in height. The recet ving antenna was oriented for vertical polarization and raised or lowered through 1 to 4 meters until the maximum signal level was detected on the measuring instrument. The transmitter under test was rotated through 360° until the maximum signal was received. The measurement was repeated with the receiving antenna in the horizontal polarization

The transmitter was removed and replaced with the antenna. The center of the antenna was placed approximately at the same location as the center of the transmitter. The antenna was fed with a signal generator, and the output level of the signal generator was adjusted to obtain the previously recorded maximum reading at the particular frequency and recorded. This procedure was repeated with the receiving antenna and the antenna in the orthogonal polarization/

The input power into the anterna was measured using the power meter. The level of the emissions in dBm(EIRP) were calculated from the following formula:

Transmitter Power[dBm](EIRP) = (Meter Reading of Power Meter) + (Antenna Gain[dBi])

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
