

Charging the Battery

At the time of purchase, the battery pack will not be sufficiently charged. Before using the phone, ensure the battery pack has been fully charged. Instructions for charging the battery pack are shown below.

OCharging Using the Desktop Stand

Connect the AC Adapter connector to the desktop stand then plug in the power main. Place the A5514SA on to the stand. When the phone is charging, the Charge Indicator Light will be flashing red. When charging has finished, the light will go out.

OCharging Using the AC Adapter

Connect the AC Adapter connector to the A5514SA phone external jack and plug it into the power socket. When the phone is charging, the Charge Indicator Light will be flashing red. When charging has finished, the light will go out.

E-mail is a service that allows the sending and receiving of messages between compatible cell phones and personal computers, using the Internet. Messages containing up to 5000 double-width characters may be sent and received. Digital photographs and movies can also be sent and received.

- * E-mail messages can be sent to a maximum of 5 recipients at a time.
- * A maximum of 1000 E-mails can be sent per day (one recipient = 1 E-mail).

C-mail is a message service for use between au C-mail compatible cell phones. A maximum of 50 double-width or 100 single-width character messages may be sent and received.

Infrared Data Communication

About Infrared Data Communication

Infrared Data Communication is a feature by which au cell phones use infrared light to facilitate data communication with other au cell phones. This data includes Address Books, profile data, contents of data folders, photos, movies, etc.

Using Infrared Data Communication

Align the infrared ports of two cell phones so they will not move and are no more than 20cm apart.

Data able to be sent via infrared

- Address book
- Diary
- Profile
- Favorite Site
- ScheduleTask list
- Contents of data folder (photo, movie etc.)

- •Due to copyright protection, not all data may be transferred
- Dependent upon the type of infrared port being used, not all cell phones may communicate with each other.
- Other circumstances may prevent infrared data communication from working these include direct sunlight, being directly under a fluorescent light or other infrared beams.

Using Infrared Data Communication

Receiving Data

<Example> Receive profile data.

From the Standby screen press • and using • choose [Tools], then press • [Select].

The phone will begin to receive data.

Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) for Wireless Phones
