Gentlemen:

Your letter dated April 27, 1998, requests that the following information submitted with the application for Equipment Authorization be withheld from public disclosure:

1. Block diagram,
2. Schematic diagrams, and
3. Theory of operation.

This request is made under the provisions of Section 0.457(d) of the Commission's Rules, and Section 552(b)(4) of the Freedom of Information Act. These sections authorize withholding from public inspection materials which would be privileged as a matter of law if retained by the person submitting them, and materials which would not customarily be released to the public by that person.

We accept your statement that the material for which confidentiality is requested falls within the scope of Section 552(b)(4) as trade secrets. Under the provisions of Section 0.457(d), the specified material will not be routinely available for public inspection.
