

TALK, RADIO HANDS FREE INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE

Always make adjustments to your unit during non-operation of your vehicle.

INITIAL SET UP INSTRUCTIONS

1. Insert plug-end unit into the cigarette lighter.
2. Attach the phone jack to the base of your phone.
3. Power "ON" your cellular phone.
4. Tune your car radio station to 88.1 on the FM band of your car radio.
5. You may want to designate this FM position on your car radio by storing it into memory as one of your pre-set stations. This will be your Talk Radio Hands Free station on your car radio!

To receive a call:

1. The audible ring signaling an incoming call can be heard as normal. Access your hands free feature by pressing the pre-set station on the radio (if you have pre-set the station into your radio memory) and then pressing the appropriate button on your cellular phone to receive calls.
2. When the call is completed, terminate

your call as you would normally do.

3. If you desire you may now press the radio station of your choice to return to the normal operation of your radio or you may choose to leave as set to activate incoming and outgoing calls.
4. Use your car radio volume dial for desired sound volume.

HELPFUL HINT:
Adjust your cellular phone handset volume to mid-range for optimal send and receive sound levels.

To initiate a call:

1. Access your hands free station on the car radio by pressing the pre-set station to 88.1 FM (if you have pre-set the station into your radio memory)
2. Dial the number or use the memory/dialer of your cellular phone and initiate the call as you would in the normal manner.
3. When the call is completed, terminate your call as normal.
4. Press the radio station of your choice (if you desire) to return to the normal operation of your radio.
5. Use your car radio volume dial for adjusting volume level.

HELPFUL HINT:
Adjust your cellular phone handset volume to mid-range for optimal send and receive levels.
