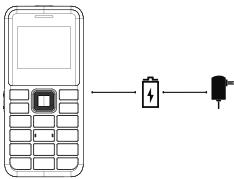


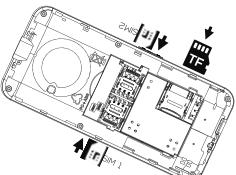

These values are within the limits of the FCC's SAR exposure limit and FCC requirements. The FCC's SAR limit for mobile phones is 1.6 watts/kg (W/kg). While there may be differences in the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all must meet the government requirement for safe exposure. Body/Handset Operation

This device is tested for typical hand-held operations. Third-party beltclips, holders, and similar accessories used by this device should not contain any metallic components. Non-wireless accessories that do not meet these requirements may not comply with RF exposure requirements and should be avoided. Use only the supplied or an approved antenna.

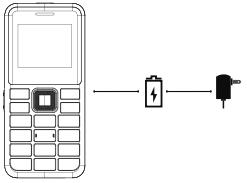

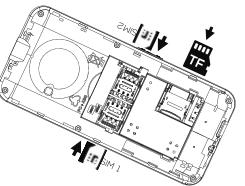

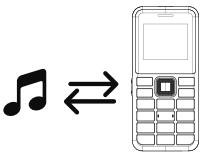
