Remark:

1. All the test data for each data rate were verified, but only the worst case was reported.
 2. The data rate was set in 1Mbps for all the test items due to the highest RF output power.
- a. The EUT has been associated with peripherals pursuant to ANSI C63.4-2003 and ANSI C63.10-2009 and configuration operated in a manner tended to maximize its emission characteristics in a typical application. Frequency range investigated: conduction (150 KHz to 30 MHz), radiation (9 KHz to the 10th harmonic of the highest fundamental frequency or to 40 GHz, whichever is lower). Pre-scanned tests, X, Y, Z in three orthogonal panels, and different data rates were conducted to determine the final configuration (Y plane as worst plane) from all possible combinations, and the worst mode of radiated spurious emissions is Bluetooth 1Mbps mode, and recorded in this report.
 - b. AC power line Conducted Emission was tested under maximum output power.

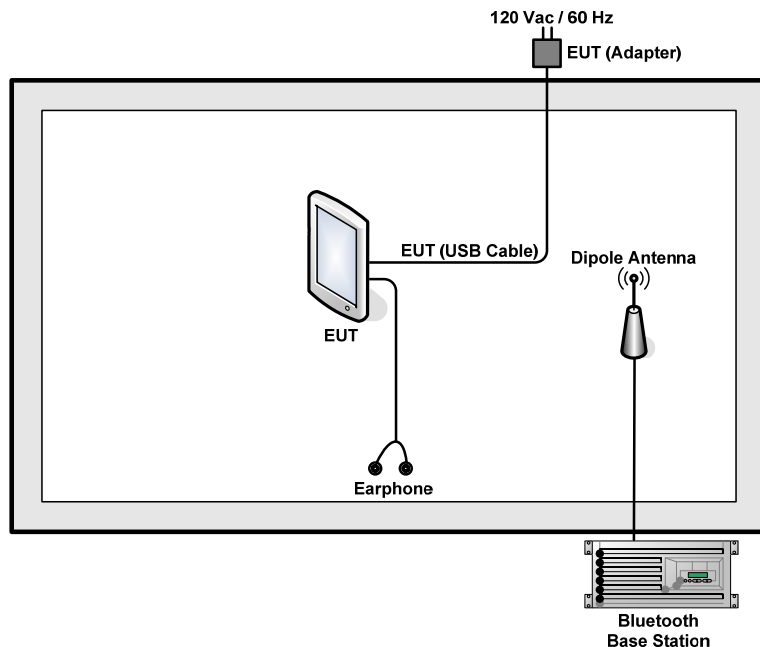

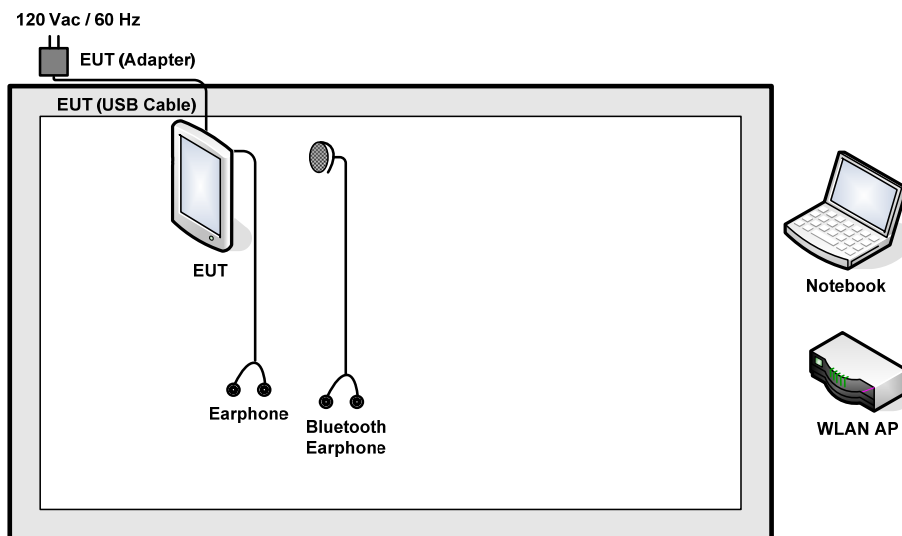

Remark:			
1. For radiated test cases, the worst mode data rate 1Mbps was reported only, because this data rate has the highest RF output power at preliminary tests, and the conducted spurious emissions and conducted band edge measurement for each data rate are no worse than 1Mbps, and no other significantly frequencies found in conducted spurious emission; and the tests were performance with Battery 1 for Sample 1.			
2. For conducted emission, the worst case is mode 1; only the test data of this mode was reported.

2.5 Description of RF Function Operation Test Setup

For Bluetooth function, key in “* # * # 3646633 # * # *” on the EUT directly. Then, the EUT will get into the engineering modes to contact with Bluetooth base station for continuous transmitting and receiving signals.

2.6 Measurement Results Explanation Example

For conducted test items:

The offset level is set in the spectrum analyzer to compensate the RF cable loss and 10dB attenuator between EUT conducted output port and spectrum analyzer. With the offset compensation, the spectrum analyzer reading level is exactly the EUT RF output level.

The spectrum analyzer offset is derived from RF cable loss and 10dB attenuator factor.

Offset = RF cable loss + attenuator factor.

Following table shows an offset computation example with cable loss 7.5 dB.

Example :

$$\begin{aligned}
 \text{Offset(dB)} &= \text{RF cable loss(dB)} + \text{attenuator factor(dB)} \\
 &= 7.5 + 10 = 17.5 \text{ (dB)}
 \end{aligned}$$

For radiated band edges and spurious emission test :

Per part 15.35(c), the EUT Bluetooth average emission level could be determined by the peak emission level applying duty cycle correction factor, to represent averaging over the whole pulse train.

The average level is derived from the peak level corrected with "Duty cycle correction factor".

$$\text{Average Emission Level(dBuV/m)} = \text{Peak Emission Level(dBuV/m)} + \text{Duty cycle correction factor(dB)}$$

$$\text{Duty cycle correction factor(dB)} = 20 * \log(\text{Duty cycle}).$$

$$\text{Duty cycle} = \text{On time} / 100 \text{ milliseconds}$$

$$\text{On time} = \text{dwell time} * \text{hopping number in } 100 \text{ ms}$$

For example : bluetooth with dwell time 2.9ms and 2 hops in 100 ms, then

$$\text{Duty cycle correction factor(dB)} = 20 * \log((2.9 * 2) / 100) = -24.73 \text{ dB}$$

Following shows an average computation example with duty cycle correction factor = -24.73dB, and the peak emission level is 45.61 dBuV/m.

Example :

$$\begin{aligned} \text{Average Emission Level(dBuV/m)} &= \text{Peak Emission Level(dBuV/m)} + \text{duty cycle correction factor(dB)} \\ &= 45.61 + (-24.73) = 20.88 \text{ (dBuV/m)} \end{aligned}$$

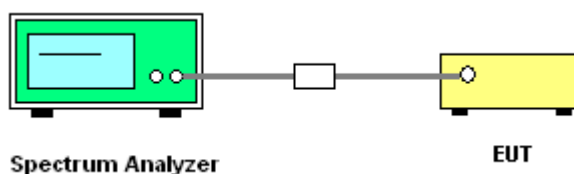

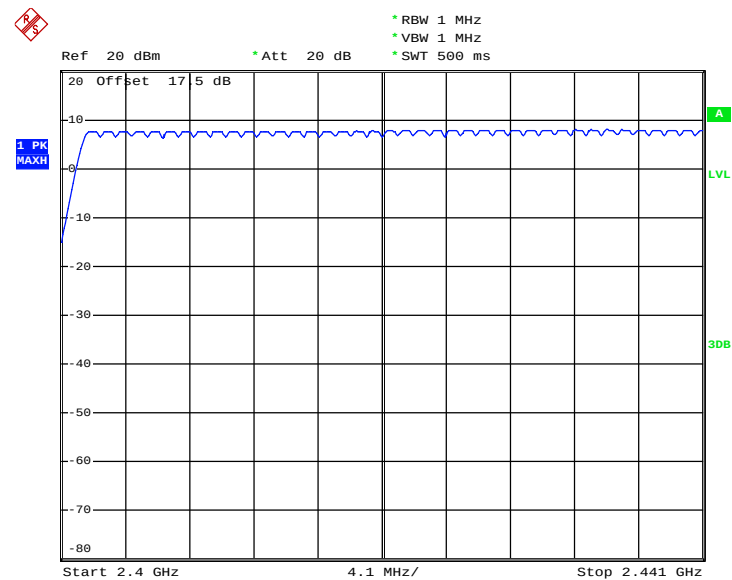
1. The testing follows FCC Public Notice DA 00-705 Measurement Guidelines.
2. The RF output of EUT was connected to the spectrum analyzer by RF cable and attenuator. The path loss was compensated to the results for each measurement.
3. Set to the maximum power setting and enable the EUT transmit continuously.
4. Enable the EUT hopping function.
5. Use the following spectrum analyzer settings: Span = the frequency band of operation; RBW $\geq$ 1% of the span; VBW $\geq$ RBW; Sweep = auto; Detector function = peak; Trace = max hold.
6. The number of hopping frequency used is defined as the number of total channel.
7. Record the measurement data derived from spectrum analyzer.

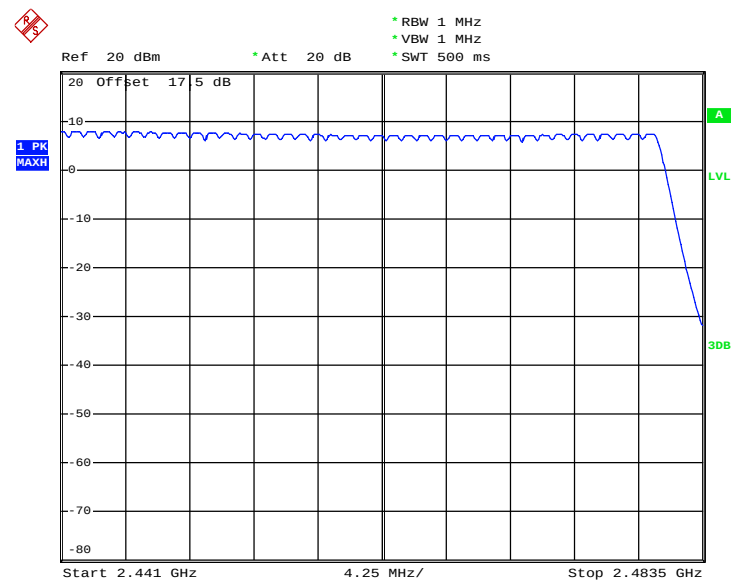

3.2 Hopping Channel Separation Measurement

3.2.1 Limit of Hopping Channel Separation

Frequency hopping systems operating in the 2400-2483.5 MHz band may have hopping channel carrier frequencies that are separated by 25 KHz or two-thirds of the 20 dB bandwidth of the hopping channel, whichever is greater.

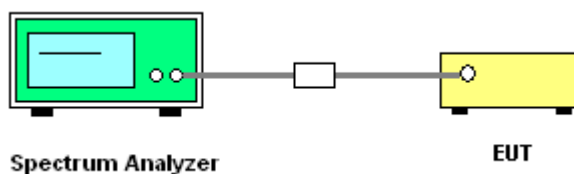

2. The RF output of EUT was connected to the spectrum analyzer by RF cable and attenuator. The path loss was compensated to the results for each measurement.

4. Enable the EUT hopping function.
5. Use the following spectrum analyzer settings:
Span = wide enough to capture the peaks of two adjacent channels; $RBW \geq 1\%$ of the span;
 $VBW \geq RBW$; Sweep = auto; Detector function = peak; Trace = max hold.

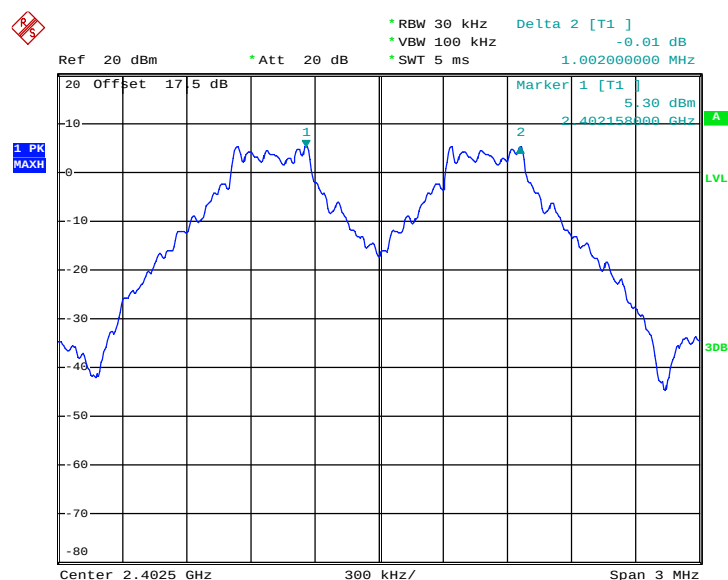

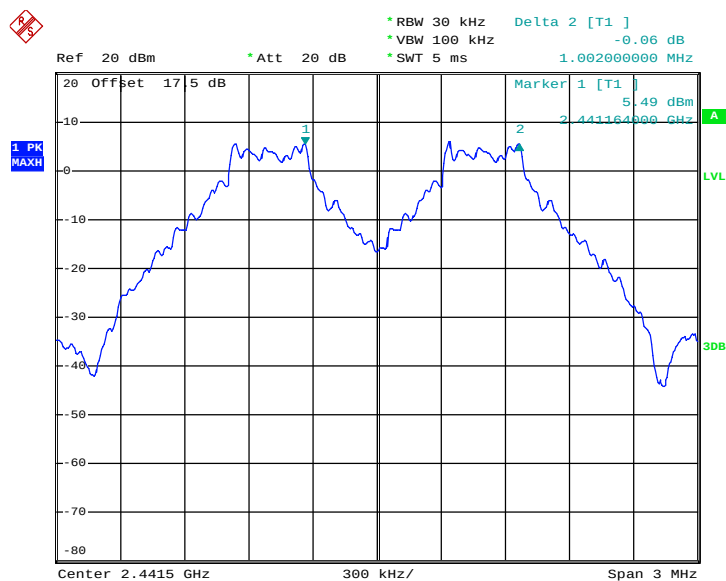
Channel Separation Plot on Channel 00 - 01

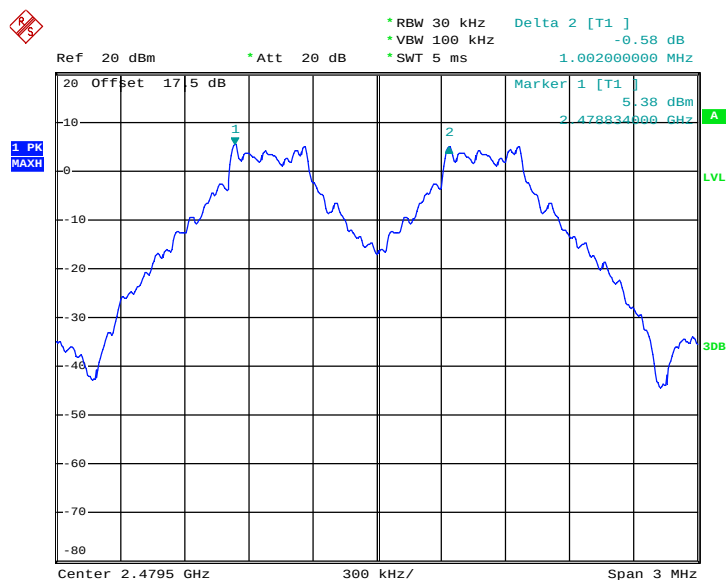


Channel Separation Plot on Channel 39 - 40

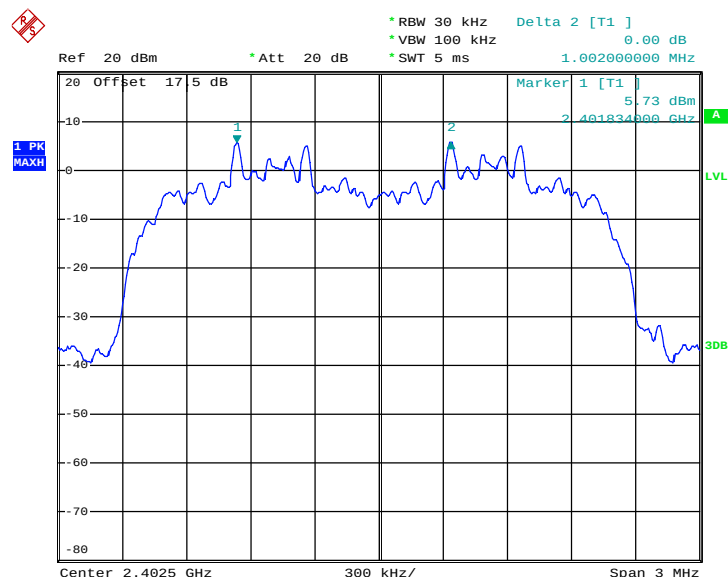

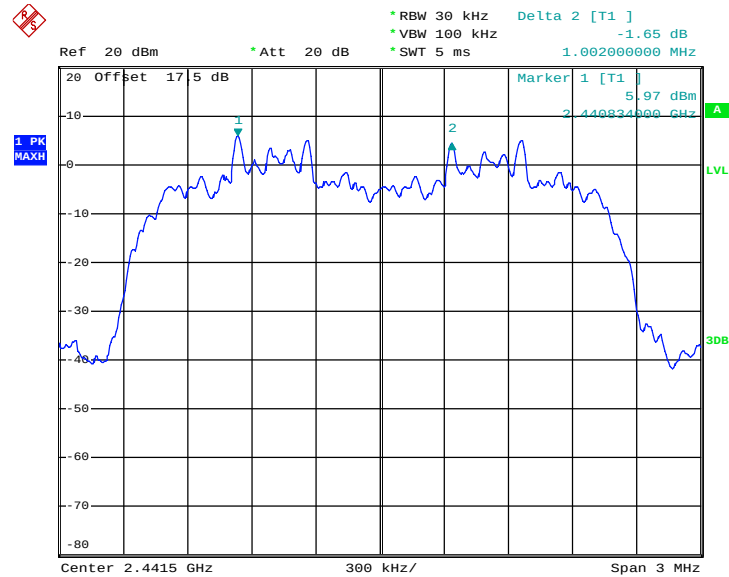

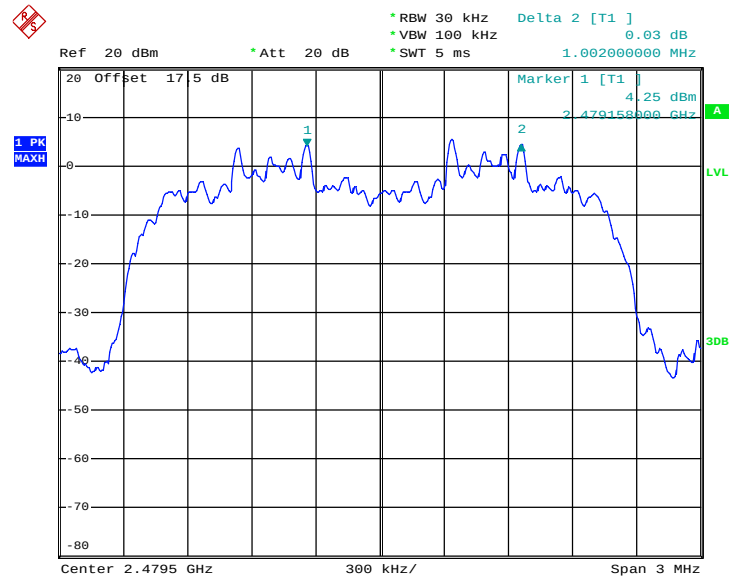
Channel Separation Plot on Channel 00 - 01

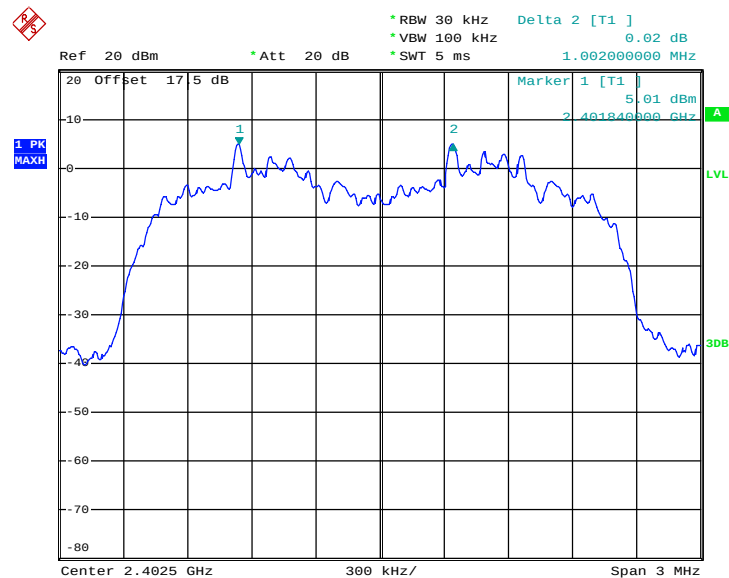

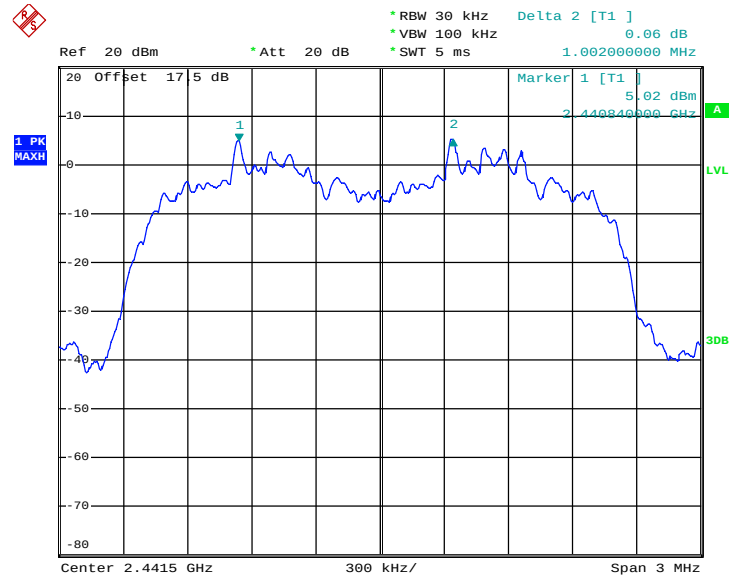

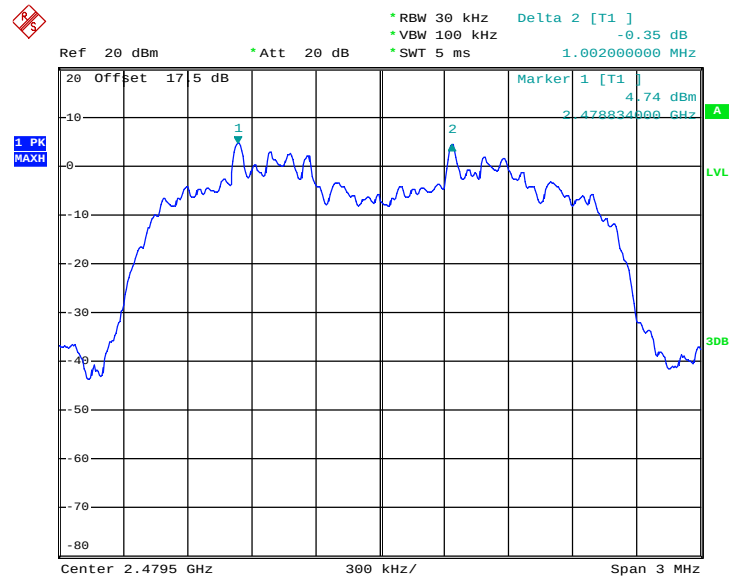
Channel Separation Plot on Channel 00 - 01

3.3.1 Limit of Dwell Time

The average time of occupancy on any channel shall not be greater than 0.4 seconds within a period of 0.4 seconds multiplied by the number of hopping channels employed.

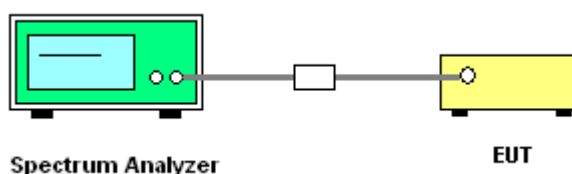

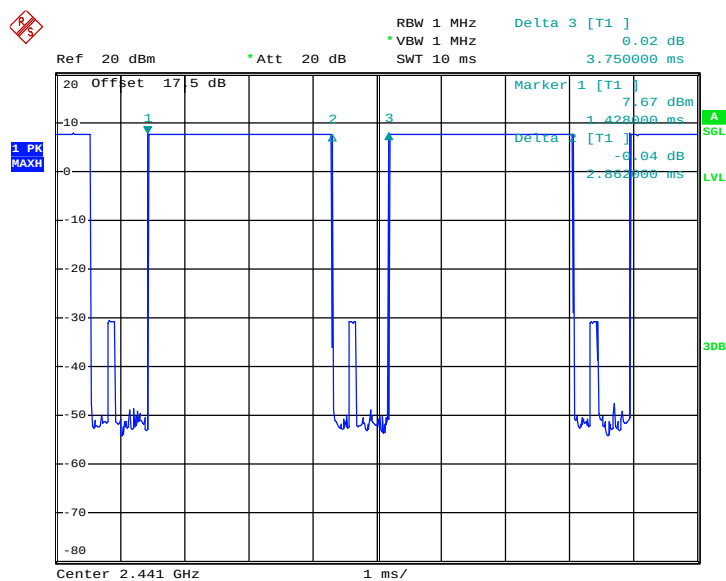

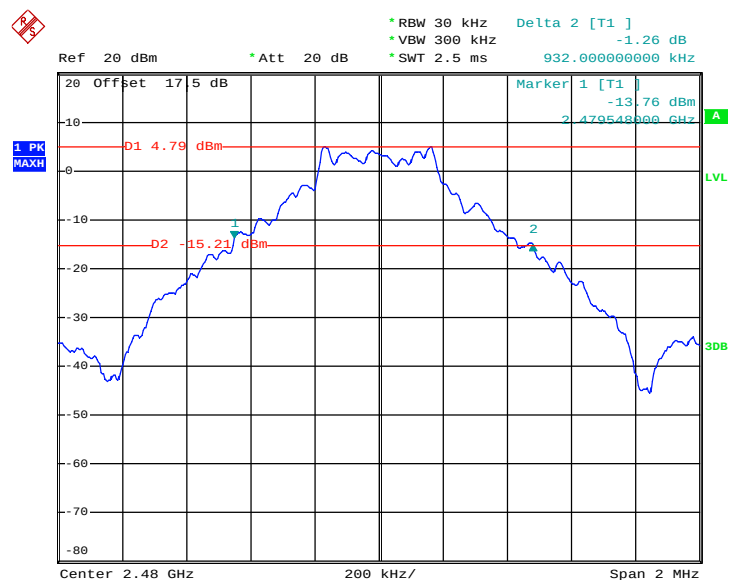
20 dB Bandwidth Plot on Channel 00

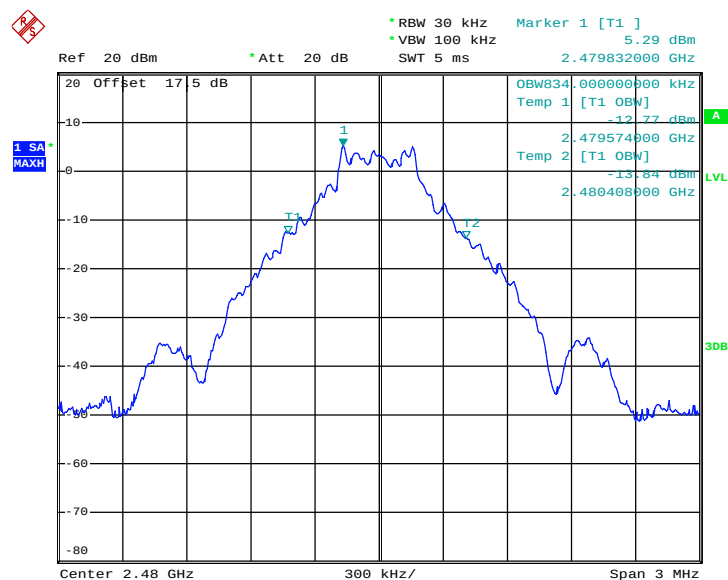
99% Bandwidth Plot on Channel 00

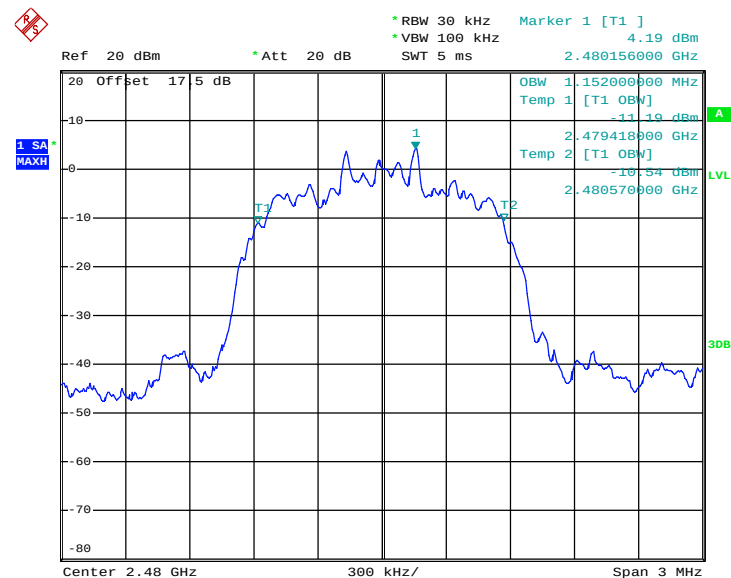

3.5 Peak Output Power Measurement

3.5.1 Limit of Peak Output Power

Section 15.247 (b) The maximum peak conducted output power of the intentional radiator shall not exceed the following: (1) For frequency hopping systems operating in the 2400-2483.5 MHz band employing at least 75 non-overlapping hopping channels, and all frequency hopping systems in the 5725-5850 MHz band: 1 watt. For all other frequency hopping systems in the 2400-2483.5 MHz band 0.125 watts. The power limit for 1Mbps is 1watt, and for 2Mbps, and 3Mbps are 0.125 watts.

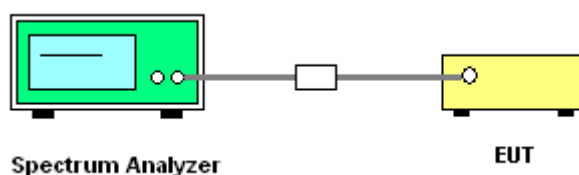

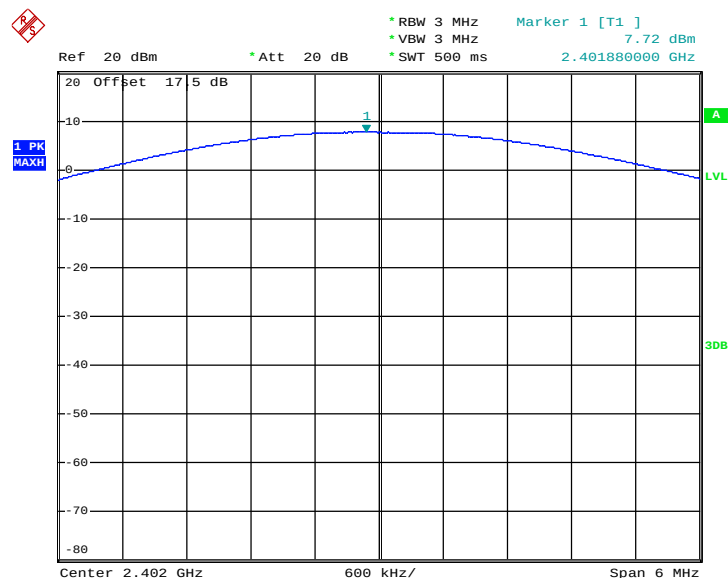

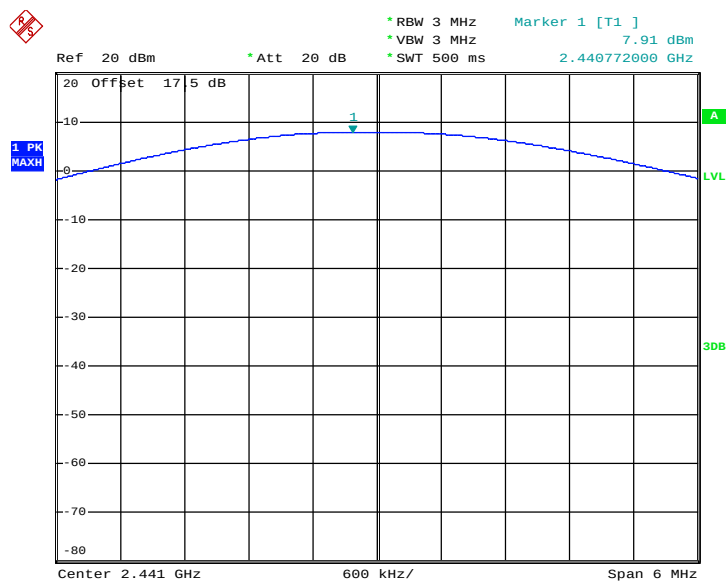

Peak Output Power Plot on Channel 00



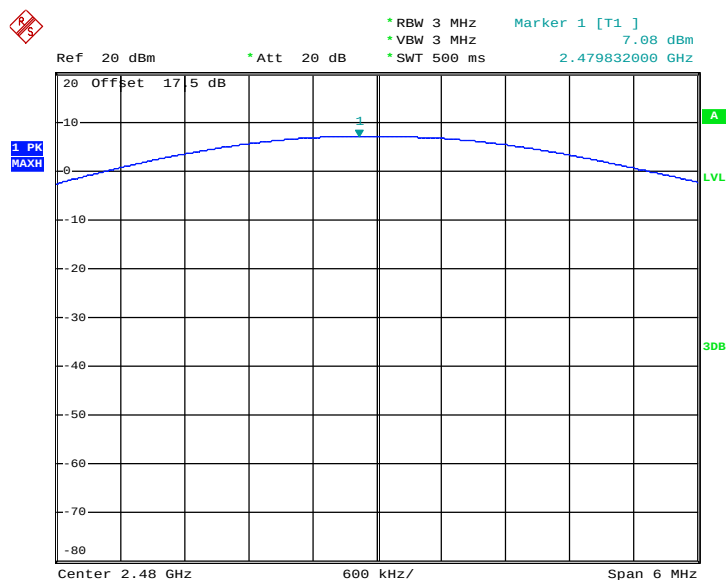

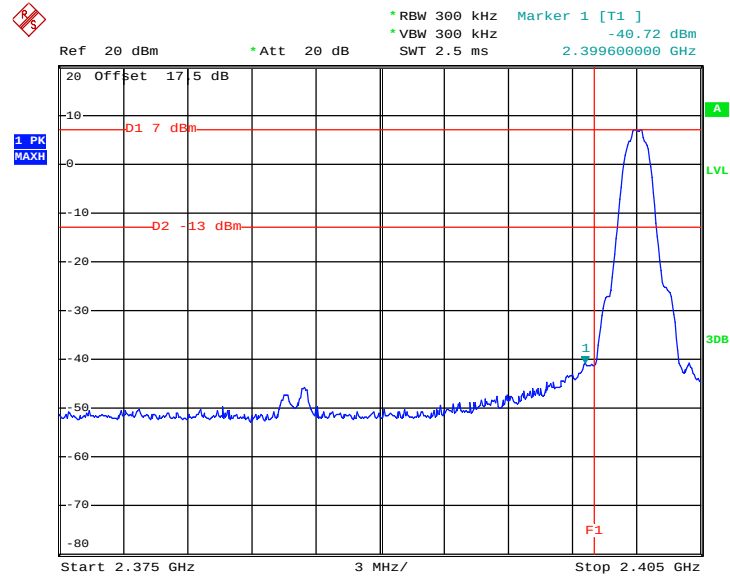
Low Band Edge Plot on Channel 00

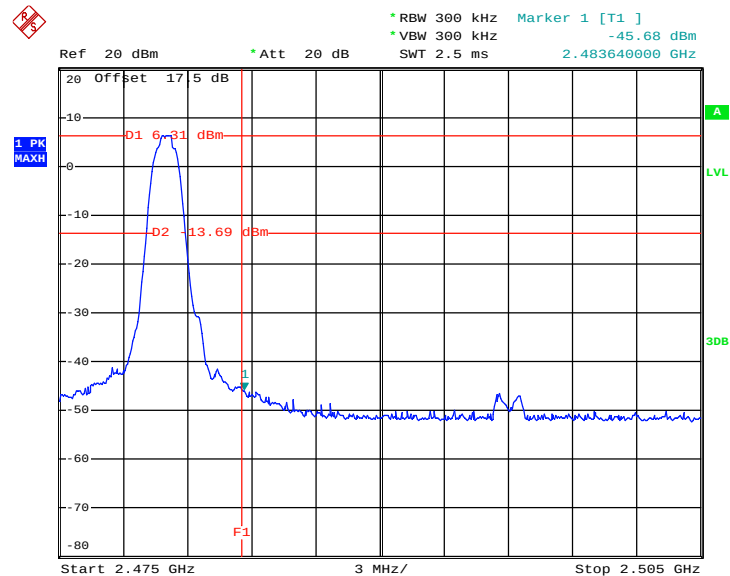

Low Band Edge Plot on Channel 00


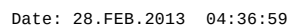

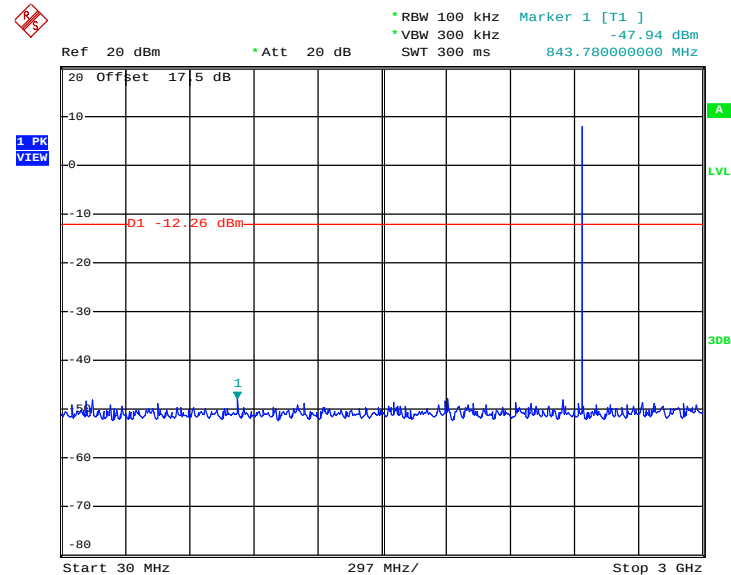
Conducted Spurious Emission Plot between 2 GHz ~ 25 GHz



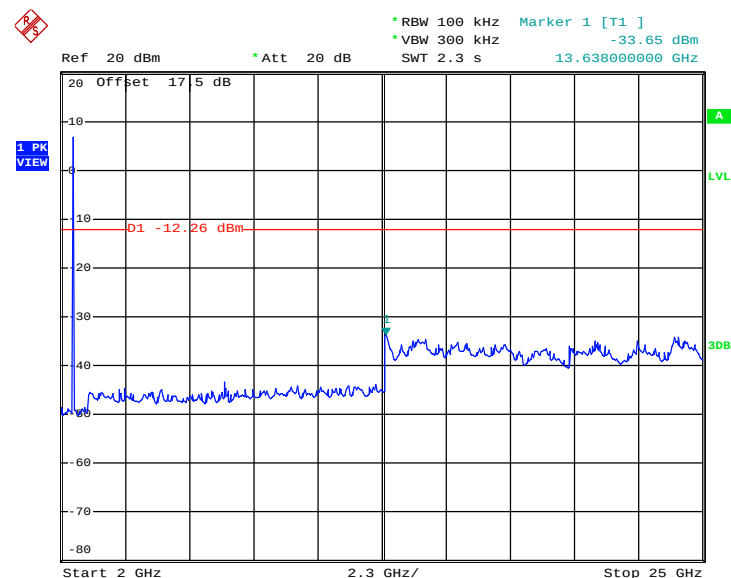

Conducted Spurious Emission Plot between 30MHz ~ 3 GHz

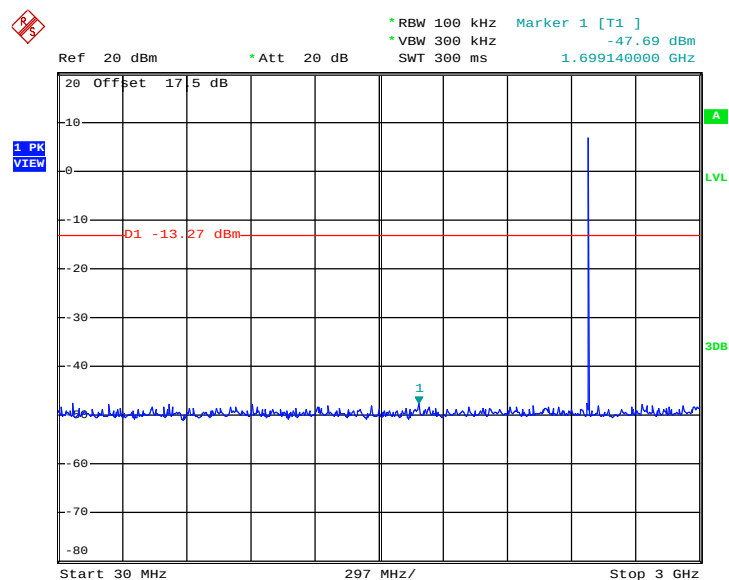

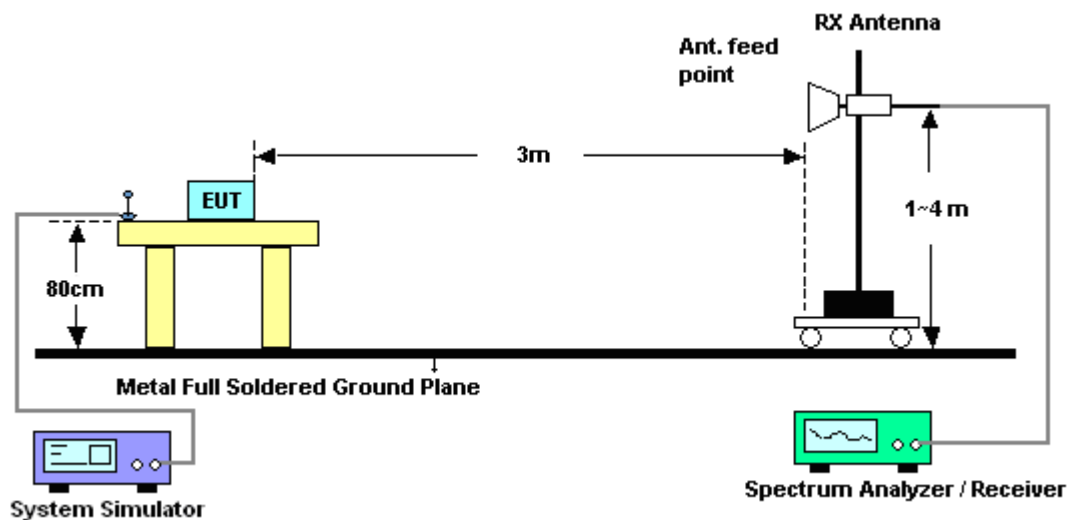
For radiated emissions below 30MHz

For radiated emissions above 1GHz

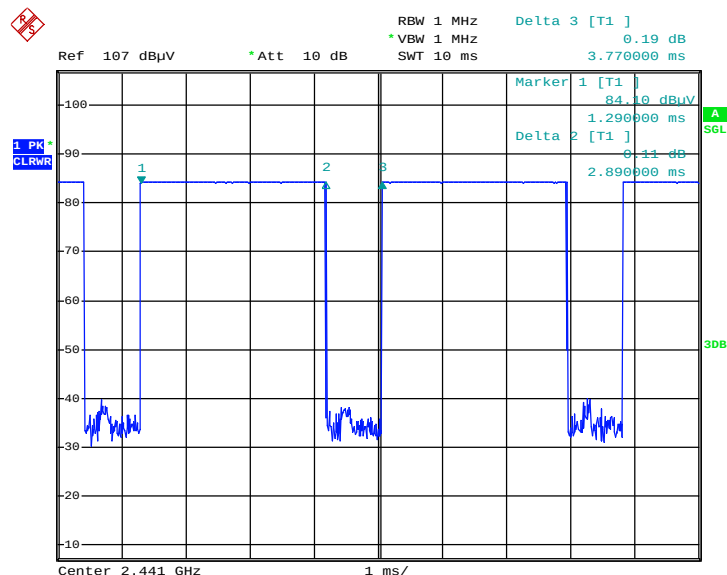

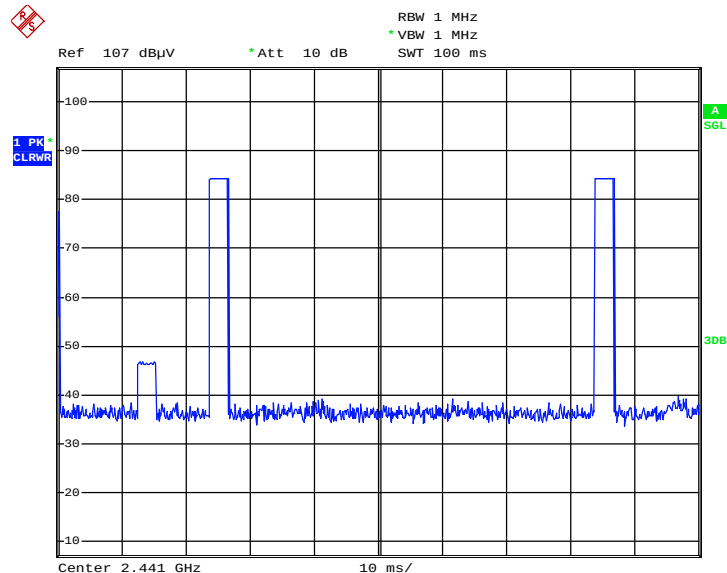

3.10 Antenna Requirements

3.10.1 Standard Applicable

If directional gain of transmitting antennas is greater than 6dBi, the power shall be reduced by the same level in dB comparing to gain minus 6dBi. The use of a permanently attached antenna or of an antenna that uses a unique coupling to the intentional radiator shall be considered sufficient to comply with the FCC rule.

3.10.2 Antenna Connected Construction

Non-standard connector used.

3.10.3 Antenna Gain

The antenna peak gain of EUT is less than 6 dBi. Therefore, it is not necessary to reduce maximum peak output power limit.
