Other Information

Some cordless telephone operate at frequencies that may cause interference to nearby TVs and VCRs. To minimize or prevent such interference, the base of the cordless telephone should not be placed near or on top of a TV or VCR. If interference is experienced, move the cordless telephone further away from the TV or VCR. This will often reduce or eliminate interference.

Privacy of communications may not be ensured when using this phone.

- Environment do not place the unit in room where the temperature is less than 5 degree C (41 degree F) or greater than 40 degree C (104 degree F). Allow 10-cm (4") clearance around the unit for proper ventilation. Avoid excessive smoke, dust, mechanical vibration, shock, or direct sunlight.
- Routine care: wipe the unit with a soft cloth. Do not use benzene, thinner, or any abrasive power. When you leave the unit unused for a long period of time, unplug the AC adapter from the outlet.
- If there is any trouble disconnect the unit from the telephone line and connect a known working phone. If the known working phone operates properly, have your unit repaired by one of the authorized C2000S Service Centers. If the known working phone does not operate properly, consult with your telephone company.

When you ship the product

- Carefully pack your unit, preferably in the original carton.
- Attach a letter, detailing the symptom, to the outside of the carton.

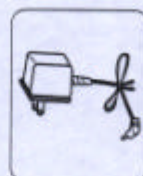

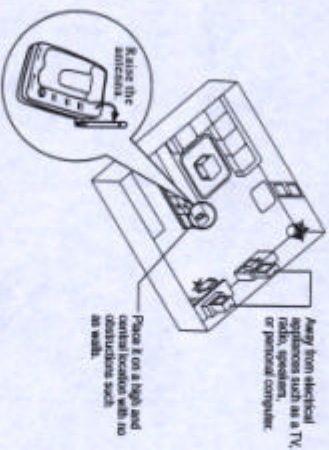

Operating Distance / Noise

- Calls are transmitted between the base unit and the handset using wireless radio waves.
- For maximum distance and noise free operation, the recommended base unit location is:



- When the transmission between the base unit and the handset becomes weak during conversation, the handset beeps to warn you that you are about to go out of the transmission range. Move closer to the base unit to avoid disconnection.
- If noise interferes with the conversation, move closer to the base unit.

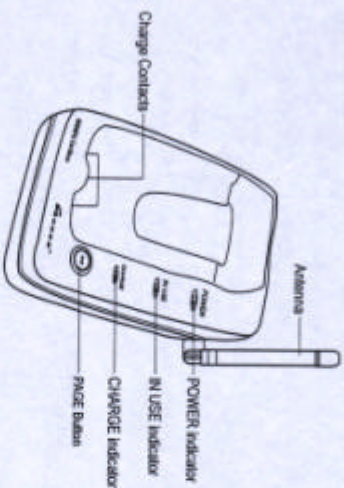

Battery Charge

Place the handset in the base unit either in face-down or face-up position. The battery must be charged for about 12 hours before initial use. The handset beeps and the CHARGE indicator lights up while the battery is being charged.



A rechargeable Ni-MH battery powers the handset.



Recharge

In the Off-Hook mode, if the battery voltage is low, the handset LCD will display "BATTERY LOW" and speaker of handset shall beep to inform the user to charge.

Always, handset is in the recharge cradle of base, the charge LED is ON.

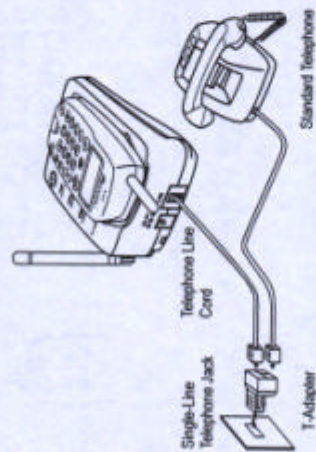

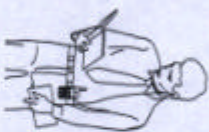
- Battery life may vary depending on usage conditions and ambient temperature.
- Clean the handset and the base unit charge contacts with a soft dry cloth once a month. Clean more often if the unit is subject to grease, dust or high humidity. If not, the battery may not charge properly.
- If the battery is fully charged, you do not have to place the handset on the base unit until LCD displays BATTERY LOW. This will maximize the battery life.
- The battery cannot be overcharged.

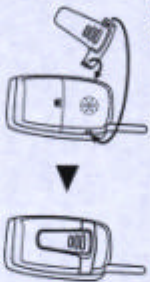

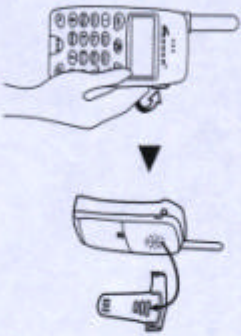

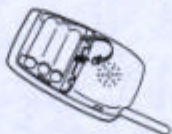
B attery Replacement

If the LCD shows **BATTERY LOW** and handset beeps at intervals after being fully charged, replace the battery with a new battery.

- Remove the cover by sliding it while pressing the arrow.



- Replace the battery, then close the cover.
- Be sure to charge the new battery for about 12 Hours.

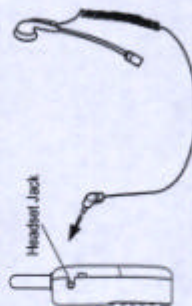

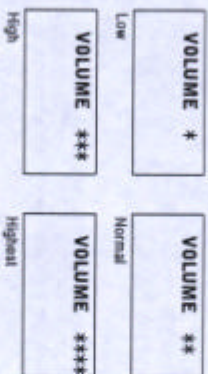

Making A Call

After initial set up, put handset in the recharge cradle of base for 12 hours to charge the battery

Making A Call

Auto Phone On Function

- When you put the handset to recharge cradle and coming ringing, pick the handset up directly, the handset will enter auto phone on mode.

Phone Off Function

- After talk, press **(OFF)** button to hang up or replace the handset to the recharge cradle to auto phone off.
- The unit will automatically release the telephone line and enter standby mode.
- The call timer will be stopped and displayed on handset LCD screen for 10 seconds.

Battery Low Indication

- In the Off-Hook mode, if the battery voltage is low, the handset LCD will display "BATTERY LOW" and speaker of handset shall beep to inform the user to charge.
