
# **Get started**

## Keys and parts



- 1 Earpiece
- 2 Touch screen
- 3 End key
- 4 Keypad

- 5 Microphone
- 6 Call key
- 7 Messaging key



- 8 Headset connector
- 9 Micro-USB connector
- 10 Volume keys
- 11 Key lock button

- 12 Antenna area
- 13 Loudspeaker
- 14 Camera lens
- 15 Charger connector

If there is protective tape on the screen or camera lens, remove the tape.

### Insert the SIM card and battery



Switch the phone off, then remove the back cover.



Lower the holder, then slide it locked.



If the battery is in the phone, lift it out.



Line up the battery contacts, then push the battery in.



Slide and lift the holder. Put the SIM in with the contact area face down.



Replace the back cover. See → 5 in "Feature specific instructions".

### Insert a memory card



Remove the back cover.



**Tip:** To remove the card, push it in until it's free, then pull it out.



Push the card in with the contact area face down until it locks into place.



Replace the back cover. See 🛏 4.

### Charge the battery



Plug the charger into a wall outlet.



Connect the charger to the phone. See  $\Longrightarrow$  7.



Battery full? Unplug from the phone, then from the wall outlet.



### Charge the battery over USB

Battery low, but you don't have a charger with you? You can use a compatible USB cable to connect to a compatible device, such as a computer.

To avoid breaking the charger connector, do not turn or twist the cable when connecting or unplugging the charger cable.

#### Switch on



Press and hold the power key until the phone vibrates.



Select the time zone, then select if daylight saving time is used.



Select the date, then type in the day, Select Save. month, and year.





Select the time, then type in the hours and minutes



Tip: To switch the phone off, press and hold the power key.

### **Explore your phone**



To see the features and apps in your phone, press **Menu**.



Tap an app or other item to open it.




To go back to the previous view, press **Back**.



Tap and hold an item to see more options.



To go back to the home screen, press .



To swipe, steadily slide your finger to the desired direction

### Lock the keys and screen



To scroll, slide your finger quickly up or down, then lift your finger. See 

1.



Lock the keys and screen when not using your phone.



To lock, press the key lock button.



To unlock, press the key lock button, then swipe right along the arrow.

### Change the volume

### Attach a strap



Is the volume too loud during a call or when listening to the radio?



Remove the back cover.



Use the volume keys.



Push the loop through the hole, then put it over the hook.



Better.



Replace the back cover.



### Copy content from your old phone

Easily get your contacts, calendar, and other stuff to your new phone.

- 1. Switch Bluetooth on in both phones.
- On your new phone, select Menu > Settings and Sync & backup > Phone switch.
- 3. Select  ${\bf Copy}\ {\bf to}\ {\bf this}\ {\bf and}\ {\bf what}\ {\bf you}\ {\bf want}\ {\bf to}\ {\bf copy},\ {\bf then}\ {\bf select}\ {\bf Done}.$
- 4. Select your old phone from the list of found devices.
- 5. If asked, create a passcode for this connection (such as 123), then select  $\mathbf{OK}$ .
- **6.** Follow the instructions shown on both phones.



## Use your phone offline

In places where you're not allowed to make or receive calls, you can still use your phone to play games or listen to music, if you switch the flight profile - on.

- 1. Select Menu > Settings > Profiles.
- 2. Select Flight > Activate.

### A Warning:

When the flight profile is activated, you cannot make or receive any calls, including emergency calls, or use other features that require network coverage. To make a call, activate another profile.

#### **Indicators**

- ♣— You have unsent, cancelled, or failed messages.
- An alarm is set.
- **G** / **E** The phone is connected to a GPRS or EGPRS network.
- ⑥ / E A GPRS or EGPRS connection is open.
- 8 The phone is connected to a 3G (UMTS) network.

- \* Bluetooth is on.
- The profile in use is timed. After a set amount of time, the phone changes back to the previously used profile.

- The phone is connected to a device, such as a PC, with a USB cable.

# Phone basics



### Change the time and date

Select Menu > Settings and Date & time settings.

### Change the time zone when travelling

- 1. Select Time zone:.
- 2. Select the time zone of your location.
- 3. Select Save.

The time and date are set according to the time zone. This makes sure your phone shows the correct sending time of received messages.

For example, GMT -3 is the time zone for Buenos Aires (Argentina), 3 hours west of Greenwich, London (UK).



#### Set an alarm

You can set an alarm to sound at a desired time.

On the home screen, select the clock.

- 1. Set the alarm time.
- 2. Select ( ) to set the alarm.
- 3. To set the alarm to sound at the same time every day, select Settings > Alarm repeat > On and the days.



## Add an appointment

On the home screen, select the calendar.

- 1. Go to the date of the appointment, then select **Options** > **Make a note** > **Meeting**.
- 2. Fill in the fields, then select Save.



### Remember a birthday

Want to keep track of birthdays? Add them to your calendar.

- 1. Select Menu > Calendar.
- 2. Go to the date of the birthday, then select **Options** > **Make a note** > **Birthday**.
- 3. Fill in the fields, then select Save.



### Use the calculator

Stay within your budget wherever you are – your phone has a calculator.

- 1. Select Menu > Applications > Calculator.
- 2. Select Options > Standard calculator or Scientific calculator.
- 3. Type in your calculation, then select =.

**Tip:** You can also calculate interest rates and loan periods or instalments. Select **Options** > **Loan calculator**.



### **Convert currencies**

Quickly convert currencies, to keep track of local prices while travelling.

Select Menu > Applications > Extras > Collection > Converter.

#### Set the exchange rate

- 1. Select Options > Set exchange rates.
- 2. Select a currency pair.
- 3. Type in the exchange rate for one of the currencies.

#### Convert currency

- 1. Select Select > Currency and a currency pair.
- 2. Type in the amount for one currency. The converted value is shown automatically.

#### Add additional currency pairs

- 1. Select Options > New currency conv..
- Write the names of the two currencies, then select OK.
- 3. Type in the exchange rate for one of the currencies.



#### **Convert measures**

You can convert measures on the go, such as kilometres to miles.

- 1. Select Menu > Applications > Extras > Collection > Converter.
- 2. Select Select and a conversion category.
- 3. Select conversion units.
- **4.** Type in a value in one of the unit fields. The converted value is shown in the other unit field.



### Download a game or app

Download new games and apps directly to your phone.

Select Menu > Applications and Extras > Options > Downloads.

Your phone supports Java $^{\text{TM}}$  ME apps that have the .jad or .jar file extension. Make sure the app is compatible with your phone before downloading.

- 2. Select **Game downloads** or **App. downloads**. A list of available services is shown.
- 3. Select a service, then follow the instructions shown on the phone.

# **℃** Calls



### Make a call

1. On the home screen, type in the phone number. To delete a number, select **Clear**.

The + character may not work in all regions. In this case, type in the international access code directly.

- **2.** Press **∩**.
- 3. To end the call, press ෙ.

Answer a call

Decline a call
Press ⊚.



### View your missed calls

Did you miss a call, but want to see who called?

On the home screen, select **View**. The phone shows you the caller's name, if stored in the contacts list. To call back, press  $\frown$ .

Missed and received calls are saved only if the network supports it, and your phone is switched on and within the network service area.

View your missed calls later Select Menu > Contacts > Log and Missed calls.



#### Call the last dialled number

Did you try to call someone, but nobody picked up? It's easy to call again.

- 1. On the home screen, press  $\frown$ .
- 2. Select the number, then press  $\frown$ .



### Call several people at the same time

Want to tell your great news to all your friends? With a conference call, you can easily call several people at the same time, saving you the trouble of calling each one separately. Conference call is a network service.

Check the network service availability from your network service provider.

- 1. Make the first call.
- 2. While in a call, select **Options** > **More** > **New call**.
- 3. Type in a phone number, or search for a contact.
- 4. Press ☐. The first call is put on hold until you connect the conference call.
- When you're able to talk to the second caller, select Options > Conference. You can add more calls to the conference.
- 6. To end the conference call, select Options > End call.



### Forward calls to your voicemail or another phone number

Your phone is ringing, but you can't answer? Let the call go to your voicemail, or forward it to another number. Call forwarding is a network service.

- 1. Select Menu > Settings > Call > Call divert.
- 2. Select when to forward the incoming voice calls:

All voice calls — Forward all calls.

If busy — Forward when busy.

If not answered — Forward when not answered.

**If out of reach** — Forward when the phone is switched off or out of network coverage for a certain length of time.

If not available — Forward when busy, when not answered, when the phone is switched off, or when out of network coverage.

- 3. Select Activate > To voice mailbox or To other number.
- 4. If **If not answered** or **If not available** is selected, set the length of time after which a call is forwarded.



### Prevent making or receiving calls

Keep your phone bill under control by preventing certain types of calls. You can prevent, for example, incoming calls while you're abroad. Call barring is a network service.

- 1. Select Menu > Settings and Security.
- 2. Select Call barr. service and an option.
- **3.** Select **Activate**, then type in the barring password you have received from your service provider.

### Contacts



### Save a name and phone number

Add new contacts to your phone.

Select Menu > Contacts and Add new.

#### Add or edit contact details

 Select Menu > Contacts and Names, then select a contact. To search for a contact, select Search, then start writing the contact's name.

#### 2. Select Options > Add detail.

Tip: To add a ringtone or photo for a contact, select the contact and Options > Add detail > Multimedia.

Tip: Want to call or message a contact straight from your home screen? Select the Favourite contacts bar, then select ℍand a contact that is saved on your phone. The contact is now shown on the home screen.



### Make calls quickly

Call someone often? Set their number as a speed dial.

Select Menu > Contacts > Speed dials.

#### Assign a phone number to a number key

- 1. Select a number key. 1 is reserved for the voice mailbox.
- 2. Type in a number or search for a contact.

Remove or change a phone number assigned to a number key Select and hold the number key, then select **Delete** or **Change**.

### Make a call

On the home screen, press and hold a number key.

### Switch speed dialling off

Select Menu > Settings and Call > Speed dialling > Off.



### Create a contact group

If you add your family members or friends to a contact group, you can easily send a message to all of them at the same time.

- 1. Select Menu > Contacts.
- 2. Select Groups > Add.
- **3.** Write a name for the group, optionally select a photo or ringtone, then select **Save**.
- 4. To add contacts to the group, select the group and  ${\bf Add}.$



### Move or copy contacts to your SIM card

Want to use your SIM card in another phone, but still have access to your contacts? By default, contacts are stored in the phone memory, but you can copy your contacts to a SIM card.

#### Select Menu > Contacts.

More contacts can be stored in the phone memory, and contacts saved on the SIM card can only have one phone number. 

means a contact is stored on the SIM card.

#### Copy all contacts

Select Copy contacts > From phone to SIM.

#### Move all contacts

Select Move contacts > From phone to SIM.

Tip: If contacts are stored in both the phone memory and on the SIM card, there may be duplicate contacts in the contacts list. To show only contacts stored in the phone, select **Settings > Memory in use > Phone**.

# Personalisation



# Change your ringtone

You can personalise the ringtones and key and warning tones for each profile.

- To select the profile for which you want to change the ringtone, select Menu > Settings > Profiles and the profile, then select Activate.
- 2. Select Menu > Settings and Tones.
- 3. Select Ringing tone: and the ringtone.

**Tip:** Download more ringtones from Nokia Store. To learn more about Nokia Store, go to **www.nokia.com/support**.

# Change the volume of the keypad tones

- 1. Select Menu > Settings and Tones.
- 2. Select **Keypad tones**:, then use your finger to drag the volume bar



# Add a shortcut to your home screen

Want to open your favourite apps straight from your home screen? Add shortcuts to your most used features.

- 1. Tap and hold the home screen, then select Personalise view.
- Select a bar you want to personalise and an item, such as a widget, then select **Done**.

#### Change a shortcut on the shortcut bar

 Tap and hold the shortcut you want to change, then select Change shortcut.

To change all the shortcuts at the same time, select **Select shortcuts**.

2. Select an item, such as a widget.

**Tip:** You can also add shortcuts to the Go to menu. On the home screen, select **Go to > Personalise view**.

**Tip:** Try tapping different areas on your home screen. You can, for example, change the date and time, set alarms, or add to your calendar also from your home screen.



# Personalise your home screen

Want to see a favourite landscape or family photos on your home screen? Personalise the home screen to your liking.

### Change the wallpaper

- 1. Select Menu > Settings and Display > Wallpaper.
- 2. Select a folder and a photo.

Tip: You can also take a photo on your phone, and use that.

**Tip:** Download more wallpapers from Nokia Store. For more info, go to **www.nokia.com/support**.

# Rearrange home screen items

Replace shortcuts with new ones.



# Create your own profile

When in a meeting or at a public event, you may want to use a different ringtone volume. You can create new profiles for different situations.

- 1. Select Menu > Settings > Profiles.
- 2. Select My style 1 or My style 2.
- **3.** Select **Personalise**, then select a suitable ringtone and volume level.
- 4. Write a name for the profile, then select OK > Save.

# **■** Messaging



### Send a message

Keep in touch with your family and friends through messages. You can send your photos and videos in your messages.

- 1. Select Menu > Messaging and Create message.
- 2. To include a photo or video, select Options > Insert object.
- 3. Write your message, then select Continue.
- 4. To add a recipient, select **Contacts**. To type in a phone number or mail address, select **Number or mail**.
- 5. Select Send.

**Tip:** You can also press the messaging key to start writing a message.

Tip: To type in a special character or a smiley, select **Options > Insert symbol**.

Sending a message with an attachment may be more expensive than sending a normal text message. For more info, contact your network service provider.

### Send a message to a group of people

Would you like to send the same message to all your family members? Create a contact group of them in your phone, and you can send the message to all of them at the same time.

- 1. Select Menu > Messaging.
- 2. Select Create message.
- 3. Write your message, then select Continue.
- 4. To select a group, select Contact groups.
- 5. Select Send.

#### Write text

- 1. To type in the first letter or character, press a number key (2-9) repeatedly until it's shown.
- 2. Type in the next letter or character. If it's on the same key, wait until the cursor is shown, or select  $\triangleright$ .

The available characters depend on the selected writing language.

### Move the cursor

Select ◀ or ▶, or tap where you want to put the cursor.

#### Type in a space Press 0.

**Type in a punctuation mark** Press **1** repeatedly.

Type in a special character Select ?!£ and the character.



# Save an attachment

 $\operatorname{\mathsf{Did}}$  someone send you a great photo? Save it to your phone. You can also save other types of attachments.

Select Menu > Messaging.

### Save a message attachment

- 1. Open the message.
- 2. Select Options > Save contents.
- 3. Select Options > Save.
- Select a folder to save in, such as Images, then write a name for the file.

#### Save a mail attachment

- 1. Open the mail.
- Select the attachment. Your phone may ask you to download the file.
- 3. Select Save.

Pictures and videos are saved in Gallery.



# Check your voicemail

Did you let your calls go to voicemail when you couldn't answer? Listen to the messages people have left you at a convenient time.

# Set up your voicemail

To use voicemail, you may need to subscribe to the service. For more info on this network service, contact your network service provider.

Before using your voice mailbox, get your voice mailbox number from your network service provider. Check your order confirmation or your network service provider's support website.

- Select Menu > Messaging > Voice messages and Voice mailbox no..
- 2. Type in your voice mailbox number, then select OK.

#### Listen to your voicemail when you just missed a call

- 1. Select the notification of a new message on the home screen.
- 2. Select Options > Call sender.

# Listen to your voicemail later

Press and hold 1 on the home screen.



# Send an audio message

Don't have time to write a text message? Record and send an audio message instead.

- 1. Select Menu > Messaging.
- 2. Select Other messages > Audio message.
- 3. To record your message, select lacktriangle.
- 4. To stop recording, select ■.
- 5. Select Continue and a contact.
- 6. Select Send.

# Mail and chat



# Set up your mail account

Do you use more than one mail address? You can have several mailboxes in your phone.

Select Menu > Messaging > Set up mail.

- 1. Select your mail service provider.
- 2. Type in your username and password.

**Tip:** If you don't want to type in your password every time you use your mail account, select **Save password**:.

3. Select Sign in.

#### Add a mailbox later

- 1. Select Menu > Messaging > Mail.
- Select Add account, then follow the instructions shown on the phone.



### Send a mail

Would you like to send a mail while on the go? With your phone, you can read and send mail, even when not sitting at your desk.

- 1. Select Menu > Messaging > Mail and a mail account.
- 2. Select Options > Compose new.
- 3. To add the recipient's mail address, select Add, or manually write the address.
- 4. Write the subject and your message.
- To attach a file, such as a photo, select Options > Attach > From Gallery.
- 6. Select Send.



# Chat with your friends

Do you like chatting online with your friends? If you are out, you can send instant messages with your phone no matter where you are.

- 1. Select Menu > Messaging > Chat.
- 2. If several chat services are available, select the service you want.
- 3. Sign in to the service.

**Tip:** You can sign in to and chat in several services at the same time. You must separately sign in to each service.

- 4. In your contacts list, select the contact you want to chat with.
- 5. Write your message in the text box at the bottom of the screen.
- 6. Select Send.

You can have several conversations going on at the same time.

See **⇒** 8.

# Photos and videos



### Take a photo

- 1. To open the camera, select Menu > Photos > Camera.
- 2. To zoom in or out, use the volume keys.
- 3. Select .

The photos are saved in Menu > Photos > My photos.



### Record a video

Besides taking photos with your phone, you can also capture your special moments as videos.

To open the camera, select Menu > Photos > Camera and ⊟ > Video camera.

- 1. To start recording, select ■.
- 2. To zoom in or out, use the volume keys.
- **3.** To stop recording, select **○**.

Videos are saved in Menu > Photos > My videos.



# Organise your photos

To make it easier to find a particular photo, organise your photos into albums.

- 1. Select Menu > Photos and My albums.
- 2. Select ≡ > Create album, then write a name for the album.
- 3. Select the photos to add to the album, then select  $\[ \]$



# Edit a photo

Is the photo you took too dark or not ideally framed? With your phone, you can easily do simple edits to the photos you have taken.

- 1. Select Menu > Photos.
- 2. Select a photo in My photos, Timeline, or My albums.
- 3. Select mand an effect.



# Print a photo

You can print your photos directly from your phone using a compatible printer.

- 1. Connect your phone to a PictBridge compatible printer with a USB data cable. If the printer has Bluetooth, you can also use that.
- 2. On your phone, select **Media transfer** as the USB connection mode.
- 3. Select the photo to print.
- 4. Select ≡ > Print.



# Send a photo or video

Send your photos and videos to your family and friends in a multimedia message, mail, or using Bluetooth.

#### Select Menu > Photos.

- 1. Select the folder where the photo or video is.
- Select and hold the photo or video, then select Send and how you want to send it.

#### Send several photos at the same time

- 1. Select the folder where the photos are.
- 2. Select > Mark, then mark what you want to send.
- 3. Select ≡ > Send marked and how you want to send them.

#### Send several videos at the same time

- 1. Select the folder containing the videos.
- 2. Select Options > Mark, then mark what you want to send.
- Select Options > Send marked and how you want to send them.

# Music and audio



# Copy music from your PC

Do you have music on your PC that you want to listen on your phone? Use Nokia Suite and a USB cable to manage and sync your music collection.

- 1. Connect your phone to your computer with a compatible USB cable. Make sure a compatible memory card is in your phone.
- 2. Select **Media transfer** as the connection mode.
- **3.** On your computer, open Nokia Suite. For more info, see the Nokia Suite help.

Some music files can be protected by digital rights management (DRM) and cannot be played on more than one phone.



# Play a song

You can use your phone's music player to listen to music and podcasts while on the move.

Select Menu > Music > My music.

- 1. Select a song.
- 2. To pause or resume playing, select ▮ or ▶.

Skip to the previous or next song Select ₩ or ₩.

Close the music player Press the end key.

**Tip:** You can buy music from Nokia Music. To learn more, go to **www.nokia.com/music**.



# Connect loudspeakers to your phone

Take the party with you – listen to the music on your phone through compatible loudspeakers (available separately). If the loudspeakers have Bluetooth, you can stream the music wirelessly.

### Connect wired loudspeakers

Connect the loudspeakers to the 3.5 mm headset connector in your phone.

### **Connect Bluetooth loudspeakers**

- 1. Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > Bluetooth and On.
- 2. Switch the loudspeakers on.
- 3. To pair your phone and the loudspeakers, select Conn. to audio acc..
- 4. Select the loudspeakers.
- **5.** You may need to type in a passcode. For details, see the user guide for the loudspeakers.

See ⇒ 2.



### Listen to the radio

Connect a compatible headset to your phone. The headset acts as an antenna.

Select Menu > Music > Radio.

### Change the volume

Use the volume keys.

Set the radio to play in the background

Press the end key.

# Close the radio

Press and hold the end key.

 $\mbox{\bf Tip:}$  To close the radio when it is playing in the background, press and hold the end key



### Record sound clips

You can record sounds from nature, such as birds singing, as well as voice memos or phone conversations.

Select Menu > Applications > Voice recorder.

- Select ●.
- 2. To stop recording, select

Record a phone conversation
During a call, select Options > More > Record.

Both parties hear a tone at regular intervals during the recording.

**Listen to your recordings**Select **Options** > **Recordings list**.

# Web



### Browse the web

Catch up on the news, and visit your favourite websites on the go.

Select Menu > Internet.

### Go to a website

Select Go to address, then write the address.

# Clear browsing history

#### Select Menu > Internet.

A cache is a memory location that is used to store data temporarily. If you have, or have tried to, access confidential info or a secure service, requiring passwords, clear the cache after each use.

#### Clear the cache or cookies

While browsing a website, select Options > Tools > Clear the cache or Clear cookies.

Prevent cookies from being stored Select Options > Settings > Security > Cookies > Reject.

# < Communities



### **Get social with Communities**

The Communities app is your gateway to social networking services.

- 1. Select Menu > Applications > Extras > Collection > Communities.
- 2. Select a service, then sign in.

**Tip:** Add Communities to your home screen to see the latest updates.

# Connectivity



### Connect to a wireless headset

Want to keep working at your computer during a call? Use a wireless headset. You can also answer a call, even if your phone's not directly at hand.

Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > Bluetooth.

- 1. Select Bluetooth > On.
- 2. Switch the headset on.
- 3. On your phone, select Conn. to audio acc..
- 4. Select the headset.
- 5. You may need to type in a passcode (such as 1234).

See **→** 6.



### Protect your phone

Do you want to control who can find and connect to your phone when Bluetooth is on?

Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > Bluetooth.

Prevent others from finding your phone Select Phone visibility > Hidden.

When your phone is hidden, others can't find it. However, paired devices can still connect to your phone.

Switch Bluetooth off Select Bluetooth > Off.

Do not pair with or accept connection requests from an unknown device. This helps protect your phone from harmful content.



# Copy content between your phone and a computer

You can use a USB cable to copy your photos and other content between your phone and a compatible computer.

#### Battery Battery and charger info

Your device is intended for use with a BL-4U rechargeable battery. Nokia may make additional battery models available for this device. Always use original Nokia batteries.

This device is intended for use when supplied with power from the

following chargers: AC-8, AC-10, AC-11. The exact Nokia charger model number may vary depending on the plug type, identified by E, X, AR, U, A, C, K, B, or N.

The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times, but it will eventually wear out. When the talk and standby times are noticeably shorter than normal, replace the battery.

#### **Battery safety**

Always switch the device off and unplug the charger before removing the battery. When you unplug a charger or an accessory, hold and pull the plug, not the cord.
