BABBLE BAND™ WEARABLE DIGITAL AUDIO MONITOR

IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

- 1) Read Instructions - All the safety and operating instructions should be read before the product is operated.
- 2) Retain Instructions - The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.
- 3) Heed Warnings - All warnings on the product and in the operating instructions should be adhered to.
- 4) Follow Instructions - All operating and use instructions should be followed.
- 5) Cleaning - Unplug this product from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.
- 6) Attachments - Do not use attachments not recommended by the product manufacturer as they may cause hazards.
- 7) Water and Moisture - Do not use this product near water - for example, near a bath tub, wash bowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub; in a wet basement; or near a swimming pool; and the like.

PROBLEM SOLVING:

No sound coming from the parent unit

- Make sure the Baby Unit is plugged in and powered on.
- Make sure electrical outlet is working.
- Set volume to a higher setting.

Squealing Noise

- Move the Parent Unit and Baby Unit farther apart, the squealing sound indicates the units are too close together
- Turn down the volume on Parent Unit.

Weak reception or no reception

- Make sure both Parent Unit and Baby Unit are turned on.
- Move the Parent Unit closer to the Baby Unit.
- Make sure the battery in the Parent Unit is fully charged.

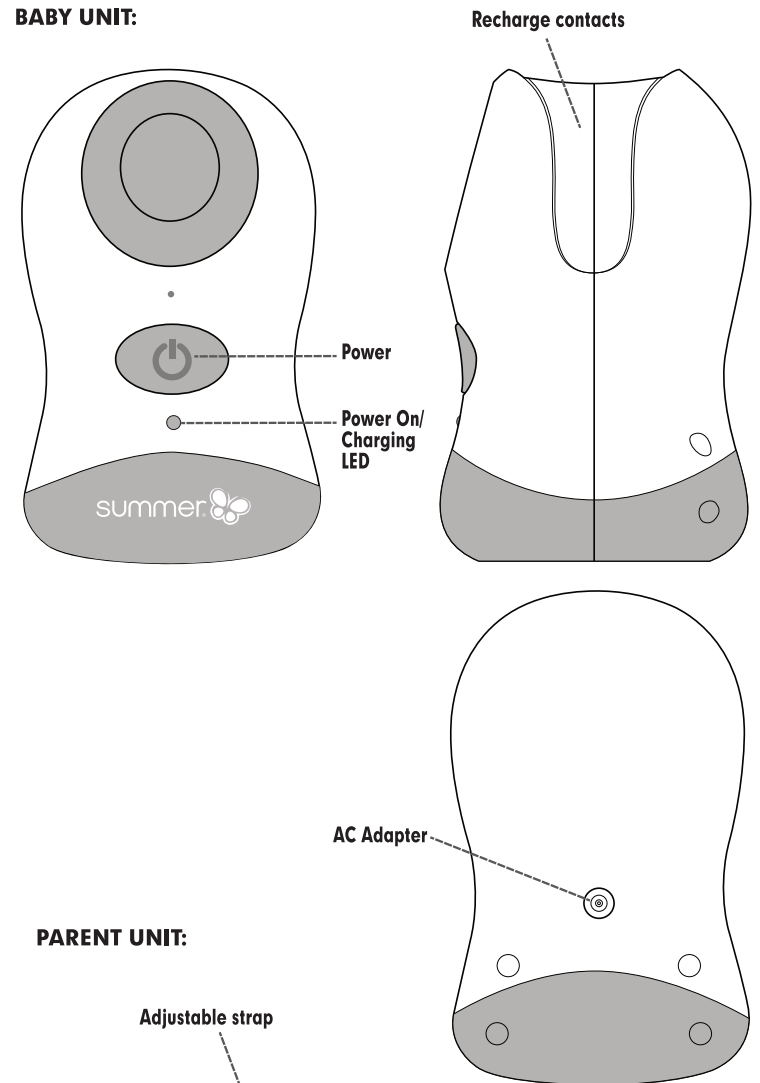

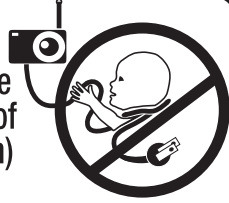

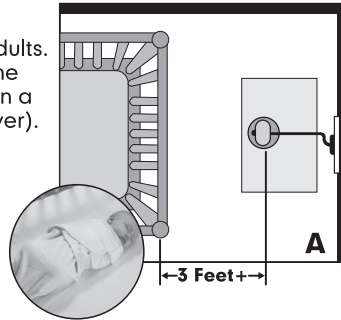

Baby unit setup in nursery:

To set up the system, you will need two adults. One adult should be in the nursery with the Baby Unit (transmitter) while the other is in a different room with the Parent Unit (receiver).

Note: The Parent Unit includes a rechargeable battery and it should be charged for 4-5 hours before using the monitor in portable mode. Only charge the battery when the battery is low to achieve optimal battery life.



Step 1: Place the Baby Unit in the nursery near the crib, on a flat surface, and ensure the cord is more than 3-feet from the crib and out of baby's reach (Fig A). Plug the AC adapter into a standard electrical outlet.

Step 2: Press the power button on the front of Baby Unit for 4-seconds to turn the unit on.

Step 3: Place the Parent Unit in the room from which you want to monitor baby.

Step 4: Press the power button on the side of the Parent Unit for 4-seconds to turn it on.

Step 5: Have the adult in the baby's room speak at different levels to adjust the volume to the desired setting. The volume can be adjusted up or down using the Volume Control buttons on the side of the Parent Unit.

SETUP & USE (continued):

Pairing Baby Unit and Parent Unit:

The monitor is paired at the factory for privacy reasons. There are instances when the Baby Unit and Parent Unit may require pairing:

Step 1: Connect the Baby Unit to its power supply and make sure unit is powered OFF.

Step 2: Turn ON the Parent Unit.

Step 3: Press and hold the "VOL +" button and at the same time press the POWER button and hold for about 4 seconds. A continuous audible BEEP and red flashing lights will occur. The Parent Unit is now ready to be paired.

Step 4: Within 20 seconds, turn on the Baby Unit. A single BEEP will emit from the Parent Unit to signify successful syncing.

If this is unsuccessful, you should repeat steps 1-4.

SPECIAL FEATURES:

• **Wearable:** Audio monitoring goes wearable tech with a soft, wristband featuring an adjustable strap that fits both Mom and Dad comfortably, and allows them to move throughout the house and hear baby's sounds right at their wrist

• **Digital Technology:** The parent unit/ band and baby unit are paired at the factory for security reasons. The units function on a digital signal which provides a private connection to baby at all times.

• **Audio Mode:** Monitoring sounds in the nursery is the audio monitoring mode ())) allows parents to hear any sounds coming from baby. The baby unit has a highly sensitive microphone to pick up even very low level sounds coming from baby. Volume adjustments allow parents to set the level of audio to their desired level. Sound lights provide a visual cue to the level of noise in the nursery, too.

• **Voice Operated Transmitter (VOX):** To conserve battery, where there is no noise detected, the monitor goes into power-save mode. It is voice-activated and "wakes up" when sound is detected and remains in active monitoring mode for 3 minutes or, longer if the noise continues.

• **Vibration Mode:** Vibration mode is available for those times when parents do not want to use active audio monitoring ({}). The band will vibrate when sound is detected in baby's room. Sound lights continue to function in this mode.

• **Sound Lights:** Sound-activated lights provide a visual cue to the level of noise coming from baby's room. These lights can be especially helpful for parents when they are in a noisy room, or if parents want to use the band without any volume (A)

• **Listen-In:** To listen in on little ones at any time, parents can simply press and hold the center button on the wristband to hear sound coming from baby's room. This mode will remain active until button is released.

• **Rechargeable Battery:** The parent unit/ band features a rechargeable battery. Normal use will provide up to 8-hours of continuous use before charging is necessary. To recharge the parent unit/ band, place the band on the top of the baby unit for 4-5 hours.

• **Out Of Range Alert:** If the parent unit/ band is too far away from the baby unit, it will be "out of range" and the monitor will emit 5 consecutive beeps. The beeps will continue until the parent unit/ band is moved back within range of the baby unit.

• **Low Battery Alert:** If the parent unit/ band is low on battery power, the unit will emit a beeping sound. The low battery indicator beep will continue until the unit is plugged in.

MISPLACED/LOST BABBLE BAND:

Locating wristband if lost

- Turn off baby unit.
- Parent unit will emit 5 consecutive beeps.
- Please Note: Parent Unit must be on in order to locate.

CARE & CLEANING:

Step 1: Power off watch before every clean.

Step 2: Push out plastic housing unit inside watch from above.

Step 3: Wipe clean with a damp cloth or sponge. Wipe dry or air dry. Do not immerse in water.

Step 4: Do not use babble band if strap is still wet. Ensure it is dry before placing housing unit back onto strap.

Step 5: Push plastic housing unit back onto strap from below. Make sure to align the dots located on the bottom of the band before use.
