
# Quick Start Guide

## Phone at a Glance

1 All the pictures in this guide are for your reference only. Your phone's actual display features may be different to those described here, depending on its software version.



## Key Functions at Your Fingertips

- · Press and hold to power on your mobile phone.
- When your mobile phone is powered on, press and hold this button to display the options menu. You can then choose to power off the phone or perform shortcut operations.
  - · Press to lock the screen when your mobile phone is active.
- Touch to open the menu on an active screen.
  - · Touch to return to the Home screen.
  - · Touch and hold to display recently used applications.

- Touch to return to the previous screen or exit the application you are running.
  - · Touch to hide the keyboard.

## Inserting a SIM card

To install a SIM card, perform the operations shown in the following figures.





- 1. Remove the battery cover.
- Insert the SIM card into the SIM card slot with its metal contacts facing down.

## Installing the microSD card

You can insert a microSD card to expand your phone's storage capacity. To do so, perform the operations shown in the following figure.



To remove the microSD card:

- 1. On the home screen, touch (:::) > Settings and then the All tab.
- 2. Touch Storage > Unmount SD card.
- 3. Carefully remove the microSD card.

## Installing the battery

To install the battery, perform the operations shown in the following figures.





- Align the battery's metal contacts with those at the bottom of the battery compartment (refer to position a in the preceding figure).
- Press the other end of the battery (position b in the preceding figure) against your phone to fix it to the battery compartment.
- 3. Close the battery cover.

## Charging the battery



- 1. Connect your charger to the provided USB cable.
- Connect the charger to a power outlet.
- 3. Connect your phone to the USB cable to start charging.

#### Battery indicator light

The battery indicator shows your phone's battery level.

- Blinking red: The battery level is lower than 10%.
- Steady red (when charging): The battery level is lower than 10%.
- Steady yellow (when charging): The battery level is higher than 10%.

Steady green (when charging): The battery level is almost or already full.
 The charging is complete when the screen shows that the battery level is 100%

### Gestures



Touch: Touch to select an item or open an application.



Touch and hold: Touch and leave your finger on the screen for 2 seconds or longer. You can touch and hold an application, a widget, or a blank area to display the related option menu.



Flick: Where applicable, swipe your finger in the direction you want the screen to move. For example, you can flick left or right across the notification panel to dismiss a notification.



Drag: Touch and hold an item and then drag it to another position. You can re-arrange icons on the home screen this way.




**Pinch**: Pinch two fingers together to zoom out or stretch them apart to zoom in on a map, web page, or picture.

### Home Screen

You can set up the Home screen according to your own preferences, for example by adding a shortcut or a widget to your Home screen, changing the wallpaper, or setting the number of Home screen extensions.

To return to the Home screen from any of its extensions, press



When a new notification icon appears on the notification bar, place your finger on the notification bar and flick down to open the notification panel.

#### Moving an Application Icon

- 1. On the Home screen, touch and hold the icon you want to move.
- 2. Drag the icon to the desired location and release it.
- To move additional icons, repeat the preceding steps.

## Copying contacts

- On the home screen, touch (::) > People.
- 2. On the **People** screen, touch = .
- 3. Touch Manage contacts > Copy contacts.
- From the displayed option menu, select where the contacts you wish to copy are from.
- Touch the contact you wish to copy or touch Select all to select all contacts
- Touch Copy and select the account to which you wish to copy the contacts

## Adding a Contact

- In the contact list, touch \$\mathbb{L}\_\alpha\$.
- From the screen displayed, create a contact in your mobile phone, SIM card or your account. Add a new account if you do not have one.
- Enter the contact's name, and then add detailed information such as phone numbers and address.
- 4. Touch **DONE** to save the contact information.
- To save a contact from your call log, touch and hold the desired phone number to display the options menu, and then touch **Add to contacts**.

## Smart dialing

Smart dialing lets you quickly find contacts by entering their names or numbers.

- On the home screen, touch (III) > Phone.
- Enter a phone number or contact name.
   Matching contacts in your phone and phone numbers in your call log are then displayed in a list.
- 3. From the list, select the contact you wish to call.

# Creating and Sending a Multimedia Message

You can use multimedia messages to make everyday communications very special. You can record a message and send it as an audio file, for example, sing "Happy Birthday" and send it to a friend, or send a slideshow of photographs of a special event. The possibilities are enormous.

- 1. Touch (:::) > Messaging, then =.
- Enter a phone number in the To field, or touch to select a contact from People.
- 3. Touch the composition text box to start composing your message.
- Perform the following steps to convert a text message into a multimedia message:
  - Touch = > Add subject to add the message subject. Your mobile phone is now in multimedia message mode.
  - Touch to attach a picture, an audio file, or a video clip to the message.
- 5. When you are ready to send the message, touch Send MMS.

## Connecting Internet

Get online using your phone's Wi-Fi to save your money.

### Connecting to a Wi-Fi® network

- 1. On the home screen, touch (iii) > Settings and then the All tab.
- In the WIRELESS & NETWORKS area, touch the Wi-Fi switch to turn on Wi-Fi.
- In the WIRELESS & NETWORKS area, touch Wi-Fi.
   Your phone then scans for available Wi-Fi networks and displays them if any.

- Choose the Wi-Fi network you wish to access and touch Connect.
   For an encrypted Wi-Fi network, enter the password when prompted.
- ① If Wi-Fi and mobile data are both enabled, your phone connects to the Wi-Fi network preferentially. When Wi-Fi becomes unavailable, your phone automatically switches to the mobile data connection.

#### Browsing web pages

- On the home screen, touch ( > Browser.
- Enter a website address in the address box.
   Your phone displays matching websites as you type.
- 3. Touch the website you wish to visit to open it.

## Enabling data services

- On the home screen, flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- Touch to enable your phone's data services.
- (1) When you don't need to access the Internet, disable data services to save battery power and reduce data usage.

## Play Store

Play Store is application market provided by Google, where you can download applications, games, and view and update downloaded content.

#### Installing an application

- On the home screen, touch (::) > Play Store.
- 2. Find the desired application.
- 3. Follow the onscreen instructions to download and install it.


## Uninstalling an Application

- You cannot uninstall the applications that are pre-installed on the system.
- 1. On the home screen, touch (::) > Settings and then the All tab.
- 2. Touch Manage apps
- 3. Touch an application, and then touch Uninstall.

## **Opening Your Camera**

You can take and share photos using the camera. Your camera supports multiple capture modes and photo effects. After taking a picture, access the Gallery to view it. For information on how to share photos and videos, see the User Guide.

#### Photo taking screen

- Drag the slider to o to switch to photo mode.
- Drag the slider to to switch to video mode.

- Touch to take a photo.
- Touch and hold ot focus the camera. Then release your finger to take a photo.
- Touch the thumbnail to view photos you just took.
- Touch an object on the viewfinder to focus the camera on it.
- Drag the slider to zoom in or out.

Drag > to display an option menu, from which you can:

- Touch \_\_\_\_\_\_ to select a capture mode.
- Touch ★ to select a filter.
  - Touch to select a white balance.
  - Touch to set the capture scenario, ISO, and more.
- Touch to toggle between the rear and front cameras.
- Touch of to set the flashlight mode.


## Connecting your phone to a computer

When you connect your phone to a computer using a USB cable, select a USB connection type when prompted.

Media device (MTP)	Send multimedia files, such as photos, songs, and videos, between your phone and the computer.
Camera (PTP)	Export photos from your phone to the computer.
USB storage device	Use your phone as a mass storage device.

## Playing Music

- 1. From the music library, select a way to view your music.
- 2. Touch the music file you want to play.



## **FAQs**

#### How can I free up additional phone memory?

- Move files and email attachments from your phone memory to your microSD card.
- Open the Browser application, and delete locally cached content.
- · Uninstall applications you no longer use.
- · Restore your phone to its factory settings.

#### How can I save battery power?

- When you do not need Internet access, open the notification panel and touch to turn off your mobile data connection.
- When you do not need to use wireless data services, such as GPS, Bluetooth, or Wi-Fi, open the notification panel, and touch , III, or to turn off these services.

- Touch (iii) > Settings > All > Display to reduce the screen brightness
  and screen timeout period. Turn off the screen (press ()) when your
  phone is not in use.
- · Close applications that are not in use.
- · Decrease tone volumes.

## How can I use a microSD card to import contacts from another phone?

Your phone supports contact files in .vcf format only.

- Save the contacts you want to import as a .vcf file and save the file to a microSD card.
- Insert the microSD card into your phone. Touch File Manager then SD card to find the .vcf file.
- 3. Touch the .vcf file. The phone displays a message asking whether you want to import the contacts.
- 4. Touch **OK** to import the contacts.
  - ① Compatibility problems may occur with .vcf files created by other phones and certain contact information may be lost during the import.

#### How can I disable the Auto-rotate screen function?

On the home screen, touch (iii) > Settings then All > Display, and clear Auto-rotate screen.

#### How can I set a screen unlock pattern?

On the home screen, touch (iii) > Settings, and then touch General > Screen lock > Screen lock > Pattern, and follow the onscreen instructions to set a screen unlock pattern.

#### How can I switch the input method?

When you write text, open the notification panel and touch  $\bf Select \ input \ method \ to \ select \ the \ input \ method \ you \ want.$ 

#### How can I stop the song playing in the background?

Open the notification panel, touch .

#### How can I return to the call screen?

To return from another screen, open the notification panel, and touch the ongoing call.

#### How can I move an application icon on the home screen?

On the screen, touch and hold the application icon you want to move, and drag it to a new position.

#### How can I forward a message?

Touch and hold the message you want to forward, and choose **Forward** from the displayed option menu.

#### How can I restart my phone?

Press and hold (I), and touch **Restart > OK** to restart your phone.

## Safety information

This section contains important information about the operation of your device. It also contains information about how to use the device safely. Read this information carefully before using your device.

#### Electronic device

Do not use your device if using the device is prohibited. Do not use the device if doing so causes danger or interference with other electronic devices.

#### Interference with medical equipment

- Follow rules and regulations set forth by hospitals and health care facilities. Do not use your device where prohibited.
- Some wireless devices may affect the performance of hearing aids or pacemakers. Consult your service provider for more information.
- Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum distance of 15
  cm be maintained between a device and a pacemaker to prevent
  potential interference with the pacemaker. If using a pacemaker, hold
  the device on the side opposite the pacemaker and do not carry the
  device in your front pocket.

#### Protecting your hearing when using a headset

To prevent possible hearing damage, do not listen at high volume levels for long periods.

- Using a headset at high volumes may damage your hearing. To reduce this risk, lower the headset volume to a safe and comfortable level.
- Exposure to high volumes while driving may cause distraction and increase your risk of an accident.

#### Areas with flammables and explosives

- Do not use the device where flammables or explosives are stored (in a gas station, oil depot, or chemical plant, for example). Using your device in these environments increases the risk of explosion or fire. In addition, follow the instructions indicated in text or symbols.
- Do not store or transport the device in containers with flammable liquids, gases, or explosives.

#### Traffic security

- Observe local laws and regulations while using the device. To reduce the risk of accidents, do not use your wireless device while driving.
- · Concentrate on driving. Your first responsibility is to drive safely.
- · Do not hold the device while driving. Use hands-free accessories.
- When you must make or answer a call, pull of the road safely and park the vehicle first.
- RF signals may affect the electronic systems of motor vehicles. For more information, consult the vehicle manufacturer.

#### Operating environment

- Ideal operating temperatures are 32 °F (0°C) to 104 °F (40°C). Ideal storage temperatures are -4 °F (-20°C) to 158 °F (70°C). Extreme heat or cold may damage your device or accessories.
- Do not expose your device to direct sunlight (such as on a car dashboard) for prolonged periods.
- To protect your device or accessories from fire or electrical shock hazards, avoid rain and moisture.
- Keep the device away from sources of heat and fire, such as a heater, microwave oven, stove, water heater, radiator, or candle.
- Do not place sharp metal objects, such as pins, near the earpiece or speaker. The earpiece may attract these objects and result in injury.
- Stop using your device or applications for a while if the device is overheated. If skin is exposed to an overheated device for an extended period, low temperature burn symptoms, such as red spots and darker pigmentation, may occur.
- Do not use your device's camera flash directly in the eyes of people or pets. Otherwise temporary loss of vision or damage to the eyes may occur.
- Do not touch the device's antenna. Otherwise, communication quality may be reduced.
- Do not allow children or pets to bite or suck the device or accessories.

#### Child's safety

#### Charger safety

#### Battery safety

- Do not connect battery poles with conductors, such as keys, jewelry, or other metal materials. Doing so may short-circuit the battery and cause injuries or burns.
- Keep the battery away from excessive heat and direct sunlight. Do not place it on or in heating devices, such as microwave ovens, stoves, or radiators. Batteries may explode if overheated.

#### Cleaning and maintenance

#### **FCC Regulatory Compliance**

#### Body worn operation

The device complies with RF specifications when used near your ear or at a distance of 0.59 inch (1.5 cm) from your body. Ensure that the device accessories, such as a device case and device holster, are not composed of metal components. Keep the device away from your body to meet the distance requirement.

#### Certification information (SAR)

This device is also designed to meet the requirements for exposure to radio waves established by the Federal Communications Commission (USA). The SAR limit adopted by the USA is 1.6 W/kg averaged over one gram of tissue. The highest SAR value reported to the FCC for this device type complies with this limit.

The highest SAR value reported to the FCC for this device type when using at the ear is 1.314 W/kg, and when properly worn on the body is 0.837 W/kg.

#### FCC statement

#### Hearing Aid Compatibility (HAC) regulations for mobile phones

In 2003, the FCC adopted rules to make digital wireless telephones compatible with hearing aids and cochlear implants. Although analog wireless phones do not usually cause interference with hearing aids or cochlear implants, digital wireless phones sometimes do because of electromagnetic energy emitted by the phone's antenna, backlight, or other components.

Your phone is compliant with FCC HAC regulations (ANSI C63.19). While some wireless phones are used near some hearing devices (hearing aids and cochlear implants), users may detect a buzzing, humming, or whining noise.

Some hearing devices are more immune than others to this interference noise, and phones also vary in the amount of interference they generate. T-Ratings: Phones rated T3 or T4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to be more usable with a hearing device's telecoil ("T Switch" or "Telephone Switch") than unrated phones. T4 is the better/higher of the two ratings. (Note that not all hearing devices have telecoils in them.) Hearing devices may also be measured.

Your phone meets the M4/T4 level rating. Hearing devices may also be rated. Your hearing device manufacturer or hearing health professional may help you find this rating.

This phone has been tested and rated for use with hearing aids for some of the wireless technologies that it uses. However, there may be some newer wireless technologies used in this phone that have not been tested yet for use with hearing aids. It is important to try the different features of this phone thoroughly and in different locations, using your hearing aid or cochlear implant, to determine if you hear any interfering noise. Consult your service provider or the manufacturer of this phone for information on hearing aid compatibility. If you have questions about return or exchange policies, consult your service provider or phone retailer.

To ensure that the Hearing Aid Compatibility rating for your device is maintained, secondary transmitters such as Bluetooth and/or Wi-Fi components must be disabled during a call.
