Taking a Photo

- Open the camera and frame the photo you want to take on the viewfinder screen. Before taking a photo, you can customize the camera settings or select a picture effect.
 When you are customizing the settings, the image displayed on the viewfinder screen changes accordingly.
- 2. Press the volume buttons to zoom in or zoom out.
- Touch anywhere on the viewfinder screen to focus the camera.
- 4. Touch o to take a photo.
- You can also touch and hold o to focus your camera. When the frame in the center of the capture screen turns green, the photo is in focus. Release your finger to take a photo.

You can then touch the thumbnail in the lower right corner of the viewfinder screen to view the photo you just took. When viewing a picture, you can:

- Touch lo enter the gallery.
- Touch so to send the photo via a multimedia message, an email. Bluetooth and more.
- Touch = > **Delete** to delete the photo.
- Flick left or right across the screen to scroll between photos in the gallery.

Enabling the GPS Tag Function

To tag location information to your photos:

1. On the viewfinder screen, touch > to display the camera settings screen.

Select the GPS tag check box. will be displayed on the viewfinder screen.

To save location information with your photos, enable the GPS location function on your phone. To do so, on the Home screen touch (**): > Settings > Location services, and select the GPS satellites check box.

Video Camera

On the Home screen touch (iii) > Camera to activate the video camera. Switch to camcorder mode to start recording.

On the capture screen, touch \hookrightarrow to exit the camera.

Video Camera Mode



1 Switch between camera and video capture modes.

2 Touch to start recording.

- Thumbnail of the previous recording. Touch to view the video you just recorded.
- 4 Viewfinder screen.

Touch to display the options menu as follows:

- Set the video size.
- Adjust the white balance.
 - : Select a video effect.
 - Enable or disable video review, GPS tag, and more.
- 6 Set the light mode.

7 Switch between the front and rear cameras.

Recording a Video

- Open Camera and switch to video capture mode. Customize the video capture settings if necessary. When you are customizing the settings, the image displayed on the viewfinder screen changes accordingly.
- Align the lens with the scene to be framed and customize the settings.
- 4. Touch () to stop recording.

After recording a video, the thumbnail of the video is displayed in the lower right comer of the capture screen. Touch the thumbnail to view the video. When playing a video, you can:

• Touch **[** to enter the gallery.

- Touch discrete to send the video via a multimedia message, an email, or Bluetooth.
- Touch ≡ > **Delete** to delete a video.
- Flick left or right across the screen to switch between videos.

Gallery

Your **Gallery** application is a great tool for managing photos and videos.

Viewing Photos or Videos

- On the Home screen touch (iii) > Gallery to open the media library. In Gallery, touch the desired folder to view its contents.
- 2. Touch the photo or video you want to view.

Editing a Picture

1. When viewing a picture, touch = > Edit.

2. On the picture editing screen, you can:



- 1 Save the changes.
- 2 Undo the last step or redo the canceled step.
- 3 Crop or rotate the picture, or remove red eye.
- Adjust the hue or saturation, or set the picture to black and white.
- Change filtering effects such as **Lomo**, **Documentary**, or **Vignette**.
- Set exposure compensation, brightness, and shade.

Rotating a Picture

- When viewing a picture, touch == to display the options menu.
- Touch Rotate Left or Rotate Right. The picture will be saved with the new orientation.

Cropping a Picture

- When viewing a picture, touch ≡ > Crop.
- 2. Use the cropping tool as follows:
 - · Drag the inside of the cropping tool to move it.
 - Drag of the cropping tool to resize the area to be cropped.
- 3. Touch SAVE or CANCEL to save or discard the changes.

Music Player

With a built-in music player, your phone enables you to play your favorite songs at any time.

Opening the Media Library

On the Home screen touch : > Music+ to access your media library.

Music+ provides seven tabs to help organize your music: Playlists, Artists, Songs, Albums, Genres, and Folders. Flick left or right across the screen to display the content of each tab.

Adding an Audio File to a Playlist

- 1. Choose a tab from the media library.
- Touch and hold the audio file you want to add to a playlist, and choose Add to playlist from the displayed options menu.
 - To add the audio file to a new playlist, touch New playlist.
 - To add the audio file to an existing playlist, touch the desired playlist.
- Touch and hold an audio file and the phone displays the options menu. From here you can:
- Send the audio file via DLNA, Compose, or Bluetooth: Touch Share.
- · Set the audio file as the ringtone: Touch Set as ringtone.

Playing a Playlist

- 1. On the media library screen, touch the Playlists tab.
- 2. Touch and hold the playlist you want to play.
- 3. From the displayed menu, touch Play.

Playing an Audio File

- 1. Select a tab on the media library screen.
- 2. Select a playlist and touch the desired audio file to play.

 When playing the music, you can:



1 Enter the media library.

- 2 Activate or deactivate the Dolby Mobile sound effect.
- 3 Display the playlist.
- Progress slider, showing the playback progress of the current song.

Copying an Audio File

Audio files can be copied to a microSD card using MTP and HiSuite, or by setting your phone as a mass storage device and transferring files from your PC using a USB connection.

Copying an Audio File Using MTP

Media Transfer Protocol (MTP) is closely related to Windows Media Player. Ensure that Windows Media Player 10 or a later version is installed on your PC.

- 1. Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the PC.
- Open the notification panel, touch Connected as an installer to display the USB computer connection screen, and then select the Media device (MTP) check box.
- Your PC will automatically install the driver. After the installation is complete, the MTP management page opens.

You can access files saved in the phone memory and on the microSD card from the PC and copy music to the microSD card.

Copying an Audio File Using HiSuite

With HiSuite you can manage and synchronize data on your phone.

- 1. Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the PC.
- Open the notification panel, touch Connected as an installer to display the USB computer connection screen, and then select the HiSuite check box.
- 3. Your PC will automatically install the driver. After the installation is complete, the HiSuite management page appears. You can access files saved in the phone memory and on the microSD card from the PC and copy audio files to the microSD card.

Copying Audio Files to USB Mass Storage Devices

Before using this function, ensure that a microSD card is correctly installed.

- 1. Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the PC.
- Open the notification panel, touch USB connected to display the USB Mass Storage screen, and then touch Turn on USB storage.
- The phone will now appear as a removable storage device in My Computer. Locate and open the device.
- Create a folder in the root directory of the microSD card, for example, a folder named Music.
- Copy audio files from the PC to the folder you have just created.

When the data is transferred, open the notification panel on your phone. Touch Turn off USB storage to display the USB Mass Storage screen, and then touch Turn off USB storage to disconnect your phone from the PC.

Accounts and Synchronization

You can use certain applications to synchronize data such as contacts and emails with Internet services.

To use an application to synchronize data, on the Home screen touch (**) > Settings > Accounts & sync to open the accounts and synchronization application.

Adding an Account

- On the Accounts & sync screen, touch ADD ACOUNT, and then select the account type you want to add.
- Follow the onscreen instructions to enter account information.

- Configure the account, and set the type of data you want to synchronize.
- 4. When the configuration is complete, the account is displayed on the **Accounts & sync** screen.
- The types of data you can set to synchronize to your phone vary according to the account type.

Removing an Account

- On the Accounts & sync screen, touch the account you want to remove.
- 2. Touch = > Remove account.
- 3. Touch Remove account.

Synchronizing Data

On the **Accounts & sync** screen, enable the account synchronization function, and your phone will synchronize your data in the background automatically.

Changing the Account Synchronization Settings

- On the Accounts & sync screen, choose the account whose synchronization settings you want to change.
- The displayed Accounts & sync section shows a list of data that can synchronized.
- Select the items to be synchronized. Your phone will start synchronization immediately.

More Applications

All Backup

All Backup enables you to speedily and frequently back up, restore data and applications.

To open All Backup, touch : > All Backup on the Home screen.

Backing Up Data on Your Phone

- 1. On the All Backup screen, touch Backup.
- In the FILE NAME field, enter a file name. You can also use the default file name.
- In the BACKUP CONTENTS section, select the data you want to back up.

4. Touch BACKUP to back up the data you have selected.

If a microSD card is inserted into your phone, the files backed up are stored in the HuaweiBackup folder on the card by default; if no microSD card is inserted, the backup files are stored in the HuaweiBackup folder in the phone memory.

Restoring Data

- 1. On the All Backup screen, touch Restore.
- 2. Find the file you want to restore from the backup file list.
- 3. Select the file.
- Touch RESTORE, and follow the onscreen instructions to complete data restoration.

Backing Up Data Quickly

1. On the All Backup screen, touch Quick backup.

- 2. A dialog box is displayed, showing data that can be backed up quickly. Touch **Backup**.
- 3. Wait until the system completes automatic backup. Touch \mathbf{OK}

If a microSD card is inserted into your phone, the files backed up are stored in the HuaweiBackup)quick folder on the card by default; if no microSD card is inserted, the backup files are stored in the HuaweiBackup)quick folder in the phone memory.

Backing up an Application

On the **All Backup** screen, touch **Application** to display the application backup list. Here you can:

- Backup: Back up an application installed on your phone.
- Restore: Restore an application you have previously backed up.

 Manage: Manage an application you have previously backed up.

If a microSD card is inserted into your phone, the files backed up are stored in the HuaweiBackuplapk folder on the card by default; if no microSD card is inserted, the backup files are stored in the HuaweiBackuplapk folder in the phone memory.

Calendar

Calendar enables you to easily manage and arrange events.

To open the calendar, touch (iii) > Calendar on the Home screen.

Creating an Event

- Open the calendar application, touch = , and then select
 New event from the displayed options menu.
- You can also touch any date on the screen to create an event on that date.
- 2. Edit event details such as the event name, time, and location.
- 3. Touch \checkmark to save the event.

Viewing a Calendar Event

On the Calendar screen, you can touch any of the events you want to view.

To switch between the days, weeks, months, and schedule views, touch the time on the upper left corner of the screen. Alternatively, you can flick your finger left or right or flick up and down across the screen.

Customizing Calendar Settings

On the Home screen, touch **Calendar**, then \equiv > **Settings** to customize your calendar settings.

Setting an Event Reminder

- You can touch any event on a calendar screen to view the event details.
- To add a reminder for an event, touch Add reminder. To delete a reminder, touch X.
- 3. To set how long before the event you want to be reminded, touch the reminder period, and then select a desired time period in the displayed dialog box. You will be notified about the event at the reminder time.

Synchronizing and Displaying Calendar Events

Calendar events in your accounts (such as an email account) on your phone can be synchronized to and displayed on the **Calendar** application.

- 1. In any calendar view, touch \equiv > Calendars to display.
- (1) If you have an account to be synchronized to your phone, the account will be displayed in the Calendars to display list.
- 2. Touch **Calendars to sync** to enable or disable the synchronization function.

Managing File Manager

The **File Manager** application acts like a pocket-sized personal assistant, letting you organize, edit, and delete files and folders.

On the Home screen, touch :: > File Manager to open the File Manager screen.

Creating a Folder

- On the File Manager screen, select Internal or SD card.
 Touch = > New folder to create a folder.
- 2. Enter the folder name, and then touch **Save** to save the folder.

Copying or Moving a File

 On the Internal or SD card screen, touch and hold the file you want to move or copy.

- 2. Select Cut or Copy in the displayed options menu.
- Select Internal or SD card, and then touch to copy or move the selected file to Internal or SD card.
- Touch = > Select item(s) to select multiple files, and then touch to copy or cut the files.

Searching for a File

- 1. On the Internal or SD card screen, touch Q.
- 2. Enter part or all of the desired file name, and then touch Go on the lower right corner of the keyboard (note that Go may not be the word displayed on your keyboard depending on the input method you are using). The phone will then search for the file in all folders and display the search results in a list.

Compressing or Extracting Files

Your phone supports compressing files and extracting compressed files.

(1) Files and folders can be compressed into .zip files, but can be extracted from both .zip and .rar files.

Compressing a File

- On the File Manager screen, touch to display the Internal or SD card list.
- 2. Touch and hold the file you want to compress, and then choose **Compress** from the displayed options menu.
- In the displayed dialog box, edit the save path and name of the file compressed if necessary. Touch OK to start compressing the file.

Extracting a File

- Touch and hold the compressed file you want to extract, and then choose Extract from the displayed options menu.
- In the displayed dialog box, edit the save path and name of the file extracted if necessary. Touch **OK** to start extracting the file.

Checking the Memory Status

On the **File Manager** screen, touch **> Storage** to check the memory status of the phone memory and the microSD card.

Adding an Alarm

On the Home screen, touch (iii) > Clock, then (5).

- 1. On the alarms screen, touch Add alarm.
- 2. To set the alarm time, touch **Time**.
- To set the alarm to repeat on certain days, touch Repeat and set the desired intervals.
- To set a ringtone for the alarm, touch Ringtone and select the desired ringtone.
- To set your phone to vibrate when the alarm goes off, select the Vibrate check box.
- 6. To name the alarm, touch Label.
- 7. To save your alarm, touch OK.

The alarms will ring even when your phone is powered off.

Customizing Alarm Settings

On the alarms list screen, touch \equiv > Settings to customize the existing alarms.

Using the Calculator

- 1. On the Home screen, touch (ii) > Calculator.
- On the calculator screen, flick your finger left or right across the screen to switch between the Advanced panel and the Basic panel.

Using the Notes

- 1. On the Home screen, touch (iii) > Notes.
- 2. To create a note, touch 📃 .

To delete one or multiple notes, touch an on the notes screen. To delete all notes, touch **SELECT ALL**.

Weather Clock

You can use **Weather Clock** to check the date and time at cities around the world, to get the latest weather in any city and to share weather information with others.

On the Home screen, touch (III) > Weather Clock.

(1) Turn on the GPS and data service on your phone before using Weather Clock.

Setting the Default City

On the **Weather Clock** screen, flick your finger left or right across the screen to switch between cities. To set a city as the default city, touch = > Set as default city.

Adding a City

On the **Weather Clock** screen, touch \equiv > **Add city** to add a city.

When using Weather Clock, you can add up to four additional cities besides your current city and get weather information for all of them.

Changing a City

- 1. On the Weather Clock screen, touch = > Change city.
- Select a city from the list, or search for a city by entering its name in the search box.

Updating Weather

Weather Clock Weather information can be updated in two ways, manually or automatically. On the Weather Clock screen, touch ≡ > Refresh or to update the current city's weather.

You can also set your phone to update **Weather Clock** automatically:

- 1. On the **Weather Clock** screen, touch ≡ > **Settings**.
- 2. Select the Auto update check box.

Touch Update interval to set the interval for weather updates.

Sharing Weather Information

- On the Weather Clock screen, touch ≡ > Share weather.
- Enter a phone number in the To field, or touch to select a contact from People.
- 3. Touch to send weather information to the recipient.

FM Radio

The built-in FM radio enables you to listen to radio on your phone. Because the application uses the headset as its antenna, connect the headset to the phone before using the application.

Searching For and Saving Channels

- 1. On the Home screen touch (::) > FM Radio.
- If you are using the FM radio for the first time, touch **Auto** tuning, and your phone will then search for stations and save
 them to the station list.

FM Radio



- Tune the radio to the next station.
- 2 Access the station list.
- 3 Turn the FM radio on or off.
- 4 Activate or deactivate the speaker.
- 5 Tune the radio to the previous station.

YouTube

YouTube is Google's free online video streaming service for watching, searching for, and uploading videos.

Opening YouTube

On the Home screen, touch (iii) > YouTube.

Searching for a Video

- 1. On the **YouTube** screen, touch .
- Enter appropriate keywords in the search box, and then touch the search icon.
- The search results are displayed. Touch the video you want to watch.

Sharing a Video

From the video list on the **YouTube** screen, select a video clip and touch <a>d to share the videos.

Configuring Phone Settings

On the Home screen, touch :: > Settings to configure your phone settings.

Setting the Date and Time

- When your phone is using date and time settings automatically provided by the network, you cannot set the date, time, and time zone manually.
- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Date & time**.
- Clear the Automatic date & time and Automatic time zone check boxes.
- Touch Set date, then or to adjust the date. Touch Set.

- Touch Set time, then or to adjust the time. Touch Set.
- Touch Select time zone, and then select a desired time zone from the list. Scroll down to view more time zones.
- Select or clear the Use 24-hour format check box to switch between 12-hour and 24-hour time formats.
- Touch Select date format to select how you want the date to be displayed.

Configuring the Display Settings

On the **Settings** screen, touch **Display** to configure the following:

 Brightness: Adjust the brightness. Clear the Automatic brightness check box to adjust the brightness manually.

- **Wallpaper**: Change the background picture of the Home screen.
- Auto-rotate screen: If this function is enabled, when you
 rotate your phone while browsing a webpage, viewing a
 picture or composing a message, the screen display rotates
 to automatically fit the new screen orientation.
- Sleep: Set a sleep period for your screen. If no operation is performed on the phone within this period, the screen turns off.
- Font size: Set the font size.

Adjusting the Volume

To adjust the volume, you can press the volume keys on the Home screen or most application screens (for example, the call, music, or video playback screens).

The volume can also be adjusted as follows:

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Sound > Volume**.
- Drag the slider left to reduce the volume, or drag it right to increase the volume.
- 3. Touch **OK** to save the settings.

Setting the Call Ringtone

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Sound > Phone ringtone**.
- 2. From the displayed options menu, you can:
 - Touch Ringtone to select from preset ringtones.
 - Touch Local music to select from songs stored in the phone memory or on the microSD card.
- 3. Select the desired ringtone, and then touch OK.

Security Settings

Turning On the SIM PIN

from unauthorized use. If you incorrectly enter the PIN three consecutive times, the PIN will be blocked and the phone prompts you to enter the PIN Unblocking Key (PUK). If you incorrectly enter the PUK 10 consecutive times, your SIM card will become permanently invalid. If the PIN and PUK are not provided with the SIM card or you no longer have them, contact your network operator. When the SIM PIN is turned on, you will have to enter the correct PIN each time the phone if powered on.

A Personal Identification Number (PIN) protects your SIM card

- On the Settings screen, touch Security > Set up SIM card lock.
- 2. Select the Lock SIM card check box.

3. Enter the SIM PIN, and then touch OK.

?) To change the SIM PIN, touch Change SIM PIN.

Setting a Screen Unlock Pattern

To protect your data from unauthorized access, set a screen unlock pattern and require it to be used every time your screen is locked.

- On the Settings screen, touch Security > Screen lock > Pattern.
- Follow the onscreen instructions to set a screen unlock pattern.
- 3. Touch Continue.
- 4. Draw the screen unlock pattern again and touch Confirm.



Remember vour unlock pattern.

- 1 If you have set up a Google account, unlock your screen as follows if you forget the screen unlock pattern:
 - If you incorrectly draw the unlock pattern five times, a Forgot pattern? button is displayed. Touch this button to open the Google account login screen. Enter your user name and password, and then reset your screen unlock pattern.
 - If you incorrectly draw the unlock pattern 20 times, the Google account login screen is displayed. Enter your user name and password, and then reset your screen unlock pattern.

Turning On PIN Protection

You can set a PIN to lock your phone. When the phone screen is locked, the correct PIN must be entered to unlock your phone.

- On the Settings screen, touch Security > Screen lock > PIN.
- 2. Enter at least four digits. Touch Continue.
- 4. Re-enter the digits and touch OK.
- 1 To change the PIN, touch Security > Screen lock > PIN.

Restoring Factory Settings

Restoring your phone to its factory settings erases all your personal data from the phone memory, including information about your accounts, your system and application settings, and downloaded applications.

- 1. On the Settings screen, touch Backup & reset > Factory data reset
- Touch Reset phone according to the onscreen instructions. Touch Erase everything. The phone is reset to its factory settings, and then restarts.
- Back up important data on your phone before restoring factory settings. To do so, on the Settings screen, touch Backup & reset > Back up my data.

Online Upgrade

Your phone is preset with the online upgrade function for applications. You will be notified when updates are available. To upgrade manually, on the **Settings** screen, touch **About phone > Online update** to check for updates, and then follow the onscreen instructions to upgrade online.

- Back up your personal data before any upgrade. After the upgrade, all personal data will be erased.
- If you have installed a microSD card, the downloaded upgrade package will be stored in the root directory of the microSD card; if no microSD card is available, the upgrade package will be stored in the root directory of your phone memory. Ensure that enough storage space is available on your microSD card or in your phone memory for the upgrade package.

- Open HiSuite and follow the instructions to complete the installation.
- After the installation is complete, click **People**. Right-click the contact list and choose **Import**. Follow the instructions and select the .vcf file from which you want to import contacts.

Disconnect your phone from the PC after the contacts are imported.

How Do I Set a Screen Unlock Pattern?

On the Home screen, touch :: > Settings > Security > Screen lock > Pattern, and then follow the onscreen instructions to set a screen unlock pattern.

How Do I Change the Input Method?

On a text-composing screen, open the notification bar and touch **Select input method** to select a desired input method.

How Do I Stop the Music Playing in the Background?

Open the notifications panel, touch the music playing notification to go to the music playback screen, and then stop playing the song.

How Do I Return to the Call Screen?

Open the notifications panel, and then touch the ongoing call.

How Do I Create an Application Shortcut on the Home Screen?

Touch and hold an application icon from the application list until the Home screen is displayed. Then drag the icon to where you want to place it and release your finger.

How Do I Hide the Keyboard?

Touch ← to hide the keyboard.

How Do I Forward a Message?

Touch and hold the message you want to forward, and then choose **Forward** from the displayed options menu.

- Set your device screen to lock and create a password or unlock pattern to open it.

Electronic Device

Power off your device if using the device is prohibited. Do not use the device when using the device causes danger or interference with electronic devices.

Medical Device

- Follow rules and regulations set forth by hospitals and health care facilities. Do not use your device when using the device is prohibited.
- Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum distance of 15 cm be maintained between a device and a
