The maximum antenna gain is 32 dBi at 5.8 GHz.

RF exposure evaluation distance calculation

EUT with 32 dBi antenna

Freq (MHz)	Output Power to Antenna (dBm)	Antenna Gain (dBi)	r (cm)
5785	28.37	32	294.4

As shown above, the minimum distance where the MPE limit is reached is 294.4 cm from the EUT.
