QUICK TIPS

1. When your vehicle starts to lose power, it may lose functions of performance. It's them for fresh battery.
2. Your vehicle's running time may change depending on your driving style.
3. Radio interference can make your vehicle run badly. interference can be caused by other R/C vehicles running on the same frequency, electrical wires, large buildings; or CB radios. Try to stay away from these!
4. Point your transmitter antenna up-not down toward your vehicle. If your vehicle gets too far away, it won't work properly.
5. Don't drive your vehicle in sand or through water or snow.

5. Don't store your vehicle your near heat or in direct sunlight. Always turn switches OFF and remove all batteries storage.

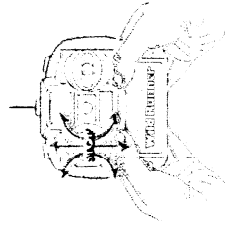

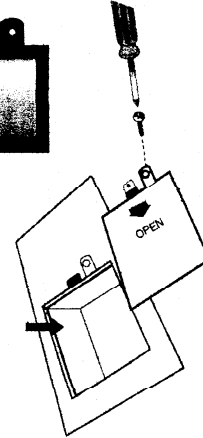
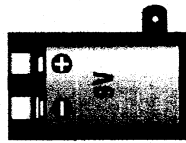
TURN TO 'ON' FOR START THE UNIT

BATTERY REPLACEMENT

- REMOVE BATTERY COVER INSTALL 5 'AA' SIZE BATTERIES (FOR VEHICLE) AND 1 9 VOLT SIZE BATTERY (FOR RADIO CONTROLLER) (BATTERIES ARE NOT INCLUDED).
- DO NOT MIX OLD AND NEW BATTERIES
- DO NOT MIX ALKALINE, STANDARD (CARBON - ZINC) OR RECHARGEABLE (NICKEL-CADMIUM) BATTERIES
- BATTERIES ARE TO BE INSERTED WITH CORRECT POLARITY
