

FCC RF EXPOSURE INFORMATION

Read this information before using your phone

In August 1996 the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the United States with its action in Report and Order FCC 96-326 adopted an updated safety standard for human exposure to radio frequency (RF) electromagnetic energy emitted by FCC regulated transmitters. Those guidelines are consistent with the safety standard previously set by both U.S. and international standards bodies. The design of this phone complies with the FCC guidelines and these international standards.

Use only the supplied or an approved antenna. Unauthorized antennas, modifications, or attachments could impair call quality, damage the phone, or result in violation of FCC regulations.

Do not use the phone with a damaged antenna. If a damaged antenna comes into contact with the skin, a minor burn may result. Please contact your local dealer for replacement antenna.

Body-worn Operation




This device has been tested for body-worn operation and meets FCC RF exposure guidelines when positions the handset at a minimum of 2.0cm from the body.

Body-worn operations are restricted to belt-clips, holsters or similar accessories that have no metallic component in the assembly and must provide at least 2.0 cm separation between the device and the user's body. Use of other accessories may not ensure compliance with FCC RF Exposure guidelines.

CHAPTER 1. Getting Started

1. Safety Precautions

To avoid personal injury and loss of property, please read and follow the safety label precautions carefully.

	Warning Label	If you do not follow the directions marked with this label, it may cause personal injury or loss of property to be severe or fatal.
	Caution Label	If you do not follow the directions marked with this label, it may cause personal injury or loss of property to be slight or serious in nature.

Warning

Do not use the mobile phone while driving a vehicle.

To use a phone, park the vehicle first. Always secure the phone in its holder; do not place the phone on the passenger seat or where it can break loose in a collision or sudden stop. Remember road safety always comes first!

Avoid long use of the phone near any parts of the body for long-term health issues.

This product complies with the EMI regulations of the government, but the consumer should be advice to practice a policy of prudent avoidance to any health issues that can be cause by electromagnetic wave.

Switch off your phone near flammable liquids, gases or explosive materials and obey all signs and instructions.

Users are advised to switch off the phone while at a refueling point (service station). Users are reminded of the need to observe restrictions on the use of radio equipment in fuel depots (fuel storage and distribution areas), chemical plants or where blasting operations are in progress.

Areas with a potentially explosive atmosphere are often but not always clearly marked. They include below deck on boats; chemical transfer or storage facilities; vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas (such as propane or butane); areas where the air contains chemicals or particles, such as grain, dust or metal powders; and any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle engine.

Do not touch the lower side of the battery on the phone and the exposed power connector of the charger with wet hands.

Be careful not to place any conducting materials such as rings, necklaces, and coins on the exposed power connector of the charger. There is a danger of electrical short, which may cause fires or electric shocks.

Do not impact or puncture the battery with sharp devices such as nail, etc.

Do not impact or throw the phone.

Do not cover the charger with any cloth or bedding while charging the battery. There is a danger of over heating, or fires.

Keep the phone out of fires, high temperatures, and, direct sun for long period of time, which may cause damage to the phone.

Do not leave the phone in a vehicle during the hot summer, and do not dry the phone in a heater, or microwave oven. There is a danger of explosion, or fires.

Do not use the phone during a thunderstorm. There is a danger of lightening damage, or electric shocks, therefore, unplug the power cord from the charger.

Do not pull the power cable forcibly, and do not place heavy object especially equipment on the cable. The damaged power cable may cause fires and electric shock.

Plug the power cable firmly, and unplug the cable holding the plug properly. Damage cable may cause over heating and fires.

The liquid from the inside of the battery will burn the eyes. If the liquid makes contact to the human eye, it can cause damage to the eyes including blindness. In this case, do not rub them without rinsing them first with clear water, and consult your doctor.

Do not stick your phone's earpiece into the ear. There is danger of damaging your hearing by loud sounds such as ring tone, the voice of your correspondent, etc.

Do not speak too loud into the phone. There is a danger of damaging the hearing of your correspondent.

Do not look into the beam of light emitted from the infrared light unit during the operation. There is a danger of damaging your eyes.



Caution

Remember to follow any special regulations in force in any area and always switch off your phone whenever it is forbidden to use it, or when it may cause interference to electronics or equipment.

Only qualified personnel should service the phone, or install the phone in a vehicle. Faulty installation or service may damage the unit or the user and may invalidate any warranty, which may apply to the unit.

Check regularly that all mobile phone equipment in your vehicle is properly mounted and operating properly.

Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases or explosive materials in the same compartment as the phone, its parts or accessories.

For vehicles equipped with an air bag, remember that an air bag inflates with great force. Do not place objects, including installed or portable wireless equipment in the area over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. If in vehicle wireless equipment is improperly installed and the air bag inflates, serious injury could result.

Switch off your phone before boarding an aircraft. The use of mobile phones in aircraft may be dangerous to the operation of the aircraft, and may be illegal.

Failure to observe these instructions may lead to the suspension or denial of telephone services to the offender, or legal action, or both.

Be careful not to swallow the parts of the phone including antenna, earphone, rubber covers, especially for children. There is a danger of suffocation and injury.

Since swallowing or winding the earphone around the neck may cause suffocation and injury, do not use the earphone for other purpose except for phone call.

Keep the phone and all its parts and accessories out of the small children's reach. There is a danger of injuring the children or damaging the phone.

If a child has to use the phone, please tell him how to use it with precautions.

Putting the phone or battery in the mouth or using damaged battery may have an affect on the human body, and it may cause electric shocks, and exposure to the electromagnetic wave.

Be careful not to wet the phone, battery, charger and other accessories. There is a danger of heat, electric shocks, and damage to the product. Pressing the power button of the wet phone may cause serious damage to the internal circuit of the phone.



Note

Carrying the phone by wearing the necklace connected to the phone may cause injury including disc of the neck.

Use the phone in the right posture as with other mobile radio transceivers to ensure operation for your safety.

This mobile phone does not guarantee phone call connection in all conditions. This phone, like any other mobile phone, operates using radio signals, wireless and landline networks as well as user-programmed functions, which cannot guarantee connection in all conditions. Therefore, you should never rely solely upon any mobile phone for essential communications (for example, medical emergencies).

Remember, to make or receive any calls the phone must be switched on and in a service area with adequate signal strength. Emergency calls may not be possible on all mobile phone networks or when certain network services and/or phone features are in use. Check with local service providers.

Before attempting emergency calls, please check that the phone has been charged appropriately. If the phone is discharged completely, you cannot make a call including emergency call. In this case, replace the battery with charged one to make a call.

Switch off your phone in medical facility and hospital.

Operation of any radio transmitting equipment, including phones, may interfere with the functionality of inadequately protected medical devices. Consult a physician or the manufacturer of the medical device to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF energy or if you have any questions. Switch off your phone in health care facilities when any regulations posted in these areas instruct you to do so. Hospitals or health care facilities may be using equipment that could be sensitive to external RF energy.

Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum separation of 20 cm (6 inches) is maintained between a mobile phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. These recommendations are consistent with the independent research by and recommendations of Wireless Technology Research.

Persons with pacemakers:

- Should always keep the phone more than 20 cm (6 inches) from their pacemaker when the phone is switched on.
- Should not carry the phone in a breast pocket.
- Should use the ear opposite the pacemaker to minimize the potential for interference.
- If you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place, switch off your phone immediately.

Some digital mobile phones may interfere with some hearing aids. In the event of such interference, you may want to consult your hearing aid manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

Pulling the hand string with strength while the hands string is connected to the phone may cut the string and may cause damage to the phone, injury such as bruise and bone fracture, and damage to properties.

Be careful when you using the phone necklace because it may caught in a door of a building or vehicle such as car and subway as it closed and may cause injury

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic systems in motor vehicles (for example electronic fuel injection systems, electronic anti-skid (anti-lock) braking systems, electronic speed control systems, and air bag systems). Check with the manufacturer or it's representative regarding your vehicle. You should also consult the manufacturer of any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Note that standing up, sitting down, falling down while carrying the phone in your pocket may cause injury to yourself or other person or may cause damage to the phone.

The performance of mobile phones might be affected by radio interference.

Use only accessories and batteries authorized or provided by the phone manufacturer.

Do not connect incompatible products to the phone.

Before connecting the phone with a device, please read safety instructions in the manual of the device.

Do not connect incompatible products.

Before making a call, switch the phone on and ensure that you are in the service area.

If it is not in idle mode, press "Exit" to go to idle mode, input emergency call number, and press "Send" button. Say your location, and do not cut off the call until given permission to do so.

Keep it dry. Precipitation, humidity and liquids contain minerals that will corrode electronic circuits.

Do not use or store it in dusty, dirty areas as the moving parts of the phone or accessories can be damaged.

Do not store it in hot areas. High temperatures can shorten the life of electronic devices, damage batteries, and warp or melt certain plastics.

Do not store it in cold areas. When the phone warms up (to its normal operating temperature), moisture can form inside the phone, which may damage the phone's electronic circuit boards.

Do not drop, knock or shake it. Rough handling can break internal circuit boards.

The battery can be charged and discharged repeatedly but it will eventually wear out. When the operating time (talk-time and standby time) is shorter than half of the normal, it is time to buy a new battery.

For higher call quality, do not touch or hold the antenna with your body during call connection.

Note that shaking or rolling the antenna when it is up may cause the damage to the phone or antenna, degrade signal sensitivity, cause personal injury, and cause loss of property.

Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents, or strong detergents to clean it. Since it may cause discoloration of the phone or may cause affect to the performance of the phone or accessories, wipe it with a soft cloth slightly dampened in a mild soap-and-water solution.

Do not paint it. Paint can clog the device's moving parts and prevent proper operation.

If the phone, battery, charger, or any accessory is not working properly, take it to your nearest qualified service facility.

Storing the phone with magnetic materials may cause abnormal operation, and keeping magnetic cards such as credit and transport card close to the phone may cause loss or damage of the information of the cards.

Since broken antenna may cause injury, replace the broken parts at your nearest qualified service facility.

Using unauthorized antennas may affect the operation of the phone and invalidate warranties.

Be careful using this phone because long usage may generate heat.

Be careful using this phone for messaging or game using because long term use of the phone may cause personal injury such as crick.

Do not throw or stab yourself or any other person with the phone. There is a danger of serious injury by the projecting part of the phone such as antenna.

If you use any other personal medical devices, you should not carry the phone in a breast or inside pocket because the radio signal of the phone may affect the operation of the medical device.

Be careful because the part of your body such as finger may be caught in the phone, which may cause slight personal injury such as bruise and scratch.

Note that storing the phone with installed battery may discharge the battery.

For persons with weak heart or poor health, please check the configuration of inbound vibration and ring tone before use.

Do not remove the rubber covers of the phone except servicing the unit. The purpose of the rubber covers is to prevent dirt contamination.

Do not attempt to open it. Non-expert handling of the device may damage it. If you require assistance, contact your local service facility.

If the phone, battery, charger or any accessory is not working properly, take it to your nearest qualified service facility.

Only qualified service personnel may install or repair the equipment.

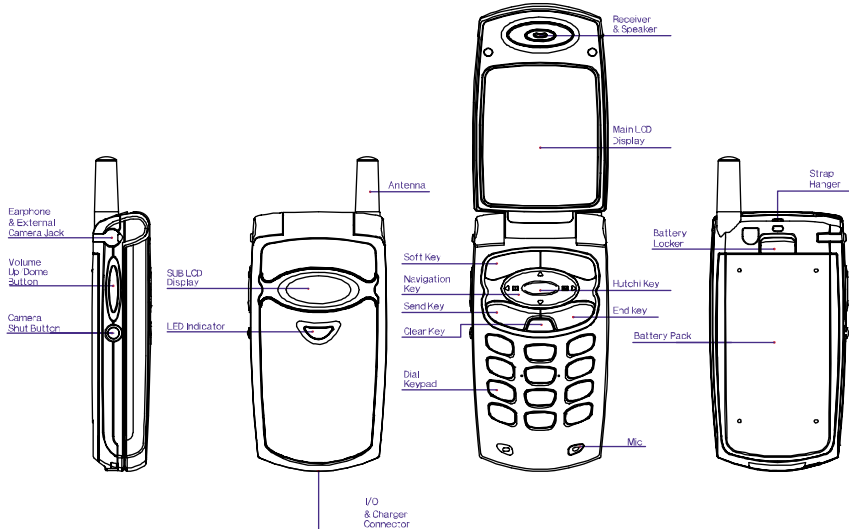

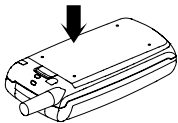
4. Status Display

	• Menu key: Pops up menu, and performs as a left soft key in each function
	• Previous Key: Performs as a right soft key in each function
	• Send Key: Makes or answers a call
	• End Key: Ends a call. Also switches the phone on and off
	• Phonebook key: Performs as a hot key to the Phonebook menu, and a left navigation key
	• Message key: Performs as a hot key to the Message menu, and a right navigation key
	• Dialed Call Log key: Performs as a hot key to the dialed call log and a up navigation key
	• Received Call Log key: Performs as a hot key to the received call log and a down navigation key
	• Clear key: Deletes characters from the display, and performs as a previous key
	• Etiquette key
	• Lock key
	• Hutch key: Hutchison service key

- Signal Strength: Shows the received signal strength. The greater the number of bars, the better the signal strength.
- Roaming: Appears when you are out of the service area of your service provider, and in the service area of another service provider.
- Out of Service: Appears when service is unavailable.
- Service: Appears when a call is in progress
- New Message: Appears when a new voice or text message has been received.
- Ring Tone On: Appears when the ring tone mode is on.
- Vibrator On: Appears when the vibrate mode is on. An incoming call will vibrate the phone rather than ring it.
- Battery Strength: Shows the level of your battery. The more bars you see, the more power you have left.
- Alarm On: Appears when you set an alarm.
- Etiquette Mode: Appears when the current mode is etiquette mode.

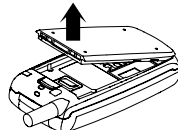
5. Installing and remove the Battery

How to install the battery



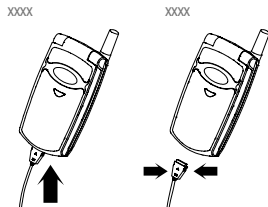
- Place the battery back in the phone. First insert the metal contact on the bottom of the battery into the corresponding slots.
- Push the battery against the back of the phone according to the direction indicated by the arrow, until it clicks into place.

How to remove the battery



- Pull and hold the latch above the battery.
 - Lift the battery out of its holder.
- Note: Always make sure that the phone is switched off and then remove the battery.

Using a Travel Charger



Since the battery is not fully charged when you purchased the phone, you must fully charge the battery before using your phone for the first time.

- Connect the charger to a standard AC wall outlet.
- Open the rubber packing on the bottom of the telephone, and connect the lead from the travel charger to the bottom of the phone. Check that the arrow on the lead connector is facing towards the front of the phone. Note that it is the customer's responsibility to insert the battery correctly. If the unit is not working properly, please check to see if the battery is inserted correctly.
- When finished charging, disconnect the charger from the power outlet. Disconnect the charger from the phone by pressing the tabs on either side of the connector and pulling the connector out.

6. Battery Charge and Use Time

- Since your batteries are not fully charged when you purchased the product, charge your batteries fully before using your phone.

- Depending on the status of the battery, the charging and use time may be different.
- The presented time is measured by us according to the Measurement and declaration standard for mobile phone battery use time' developed by the Customer Protection Bureau of Korea.

7. Instructions for Efficient Battery Use

1. **Charge your battery only with a charger approved by the phone manufacturer.**
★ Never use the battery not approved by the phone manufacturer because it may cause damage to your phone, or explosion.
2. **Do not leave the battery near fire. Do not disassemble, or short-circuit the battery.**
★ There is a danger of explosion.
3. **Do not impact the battery with strength or do not drop it.**
★ It may affect and reduces the battery lifetime.
4. **The battery can be charged and discharged repeatedly but it will eventually wear out.**
★ When the operating time (talk-time and standby time) is shorter than half of the normal operating time, it is time to buy a new battery.
5. **Keep the battery room temperature for charge efficiency.**
★ Keep the battery out of direct rays and the hot air from heaters when you charge the battery. In extreme temperatures, the battery may not be charged completely, and it will be charged subsequently when it warms up to room temperature.
6. **Temperature extremes affect the ability of the battery. Keep the battery in room temperature.**
★ Leaving the battery in a hot or cold place such as in a closed car in summer or winter conditions will reduce the capacity and life of the battery.

8. Information on Battery Lifetime

1. The phone consumes more power when you are talking for a long time over the phone, it also reduces the standby time of the phone.
2. Battery lifetime is affected by the operation mode (slot mode) of the base station near the phone.
3. Being out of service area for a long time uses more power and result in reduced standby time.
4. Battery lifetime is affected by the operation environment such as charge status, and temperature, use habit, signal strength, and keypad light time setting.
5. **Battery is expendable supply, and the lifetime is reduced as you use the phone.**
(Warranty for the battery is 6 months)
6. Using the functions provided by the phone such as messaging, game, and Internet connection will use more power.

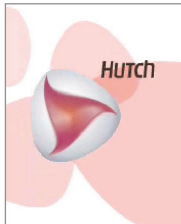
Slot mode?

When you moving by car or foot, the phone communicates with the base station to maintain best communication status. It is called slot mode. The more number of communications between the phone and base station, the shorter standby time of the phone.

9. Switching the Phone On

Hold down [End] key for a while until start screen appears.

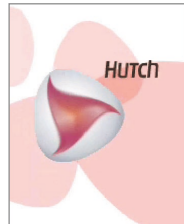
- The phone turns to idle mode after a while.



10. Switching the Phone Off

Hold down [End] key for a while.

- Exit screen appears and the phone is turned off.



- To switch the phone off, you have to use [End] key. Switching the phone off by separating the battery cannot guarantee saving phone information such as call time records.
- After switch the phone off, please wait about 5 seconds before switching it on again.

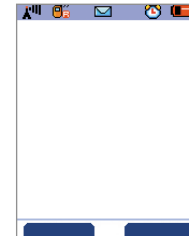
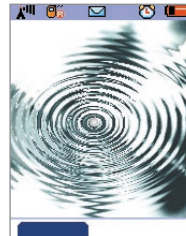
11. Making a Call

1) When the idle screen is displayed, input the area code and phone number. To delete the number, press [Clear] key.

2) When your correspondent answers the call, you can talk over the phone.

- To delete the number, press [Clear] key.
- To finish or cancel a call, press [End] key.

13. Using Etiquette Function

1. Enabling Etiquette Function

Hold down [] key for a while.



- Etiquette function enables your correspondent to hear clear voice even though you speak in a quiet tone.
- Etiquette function mutes all of the key tone, ring tone, alarm, alert sound, and connect tone, and turns your phone to vibration mode regardless of the current ring tone mode setting.

2. Disabling Etiquette Function

Hold down [] key for a while.






- Switching the phone off disables the etiquette function automatically.

CHAPTER 2. Phonebook — This menu provides the function of the phonebook needed for making a call.

1. Search

You can store phone numbers and their associated information in the memory of your phone and SIM card. This function allows you to find your desired number from the Phonebook by name, group, and number.





• Frequently Asked Questions about the Life of the Battery.

1. The life of the Battery is short

➤ The operation environment determines Battery life. Long calls, and weak signal strength consumes more power.

2. Battery life is short on certain day than usual.

➤ It may happen because radio environment of the base station near you could cause a drain of the battery for better signal. In this case, watch the battery life a few more days when using the phone.

3. Battery life decreases.

➤ Battery is expendable supply, and the battery life is reduced as you use the phone. When the operating time (talk-time and standby time) is shorter than half of the normal usage, it is time to replace a new battery. (Warranty for the battery is 6 months)

4. When you charge the battery, the charger lamp blinks.

➤ It may happen when the battery is not properly installed in the charger. Please ensure that there is no material between the battery and the charger, and reinstall the battery firmly in the charger.

5. My phone needs repair of short standby time. What should I do?

➤ When you visit the service center for repairing of your phone, please bring the phone, charger, and battery.

6. What should I ask to check at the service center?

➤ A mobile phone consumes a certain amount of power called power consumption. A mobile phone with high power consumption reduces capacity of the battery fast. Please be sure to ask to check the power consumption of your mobile phone at a service center.

• Before Contacting Service Center
