

## OPERATION MANUAL

### Operations:

1. Fully extend the aerial on the transmitter.
2. Set the power switches underneath the transmitter and the chassis to ON.
3. Use the control levers on the transmitter to control the car to run or perform various stunts.

### Notes:

- a. If the car slows down during actions or becomes unable to roll over smoothly, it may be caused by insufficient power. Charge the batteries when necessary.
- b. Make sure the power switch underneath the car is turned off after use. Otherwise, power of the batteries in the car may be soon consumed.

### Charging:

- Multi-channel and Multi-functional, can perform rollover and other stunts.
- Use 4AA rechargeable batteries or alkaline batteries.
- Direct charging possible using charging jack under the chassis.

1. Plug the charger to an indoor 110V AC power socket.
2. Plug the outlet line of the charger to the charging jack underneath the car.
3. Set the power switch underneath the car to ON.

(Note: This step is necessary. Otherwise, charging won't be possible.)

4. Optimum charging time is 6 hours.

### Cautions:

1. Charge only with our special 6V charger. Charging with other unspecified charges may cause damages to the circuits in the car.
2. Make sure the power switch underneath the car is set to ON when charging.
3. Don't charge for too long. (6 hours is sufficient for charging. Overcharging may shorten battery's useful life or may even totally destroy the battery.)
4. Never try to charge batteries that are not rechargeable ones.

### Safety Cautions

- Never give this toy to children under 3.
- After the power of this car is turned on, keep your fingers, hair, and clothes away from the wheels to avoid accidental damages.
- Don't try to catch the car by hand while it is action.
- Keep the transmitter and the car away from any heat sources, such as electric stove, gas stove, or strong sunlight.
- Don't play with it in a dangerous place, such as on a road, or on a slope.
- Don't wet the car. Don't play with it outdoors in a rainy day.
- Don't play with it on the sands.
- Avoid bumping into any other articles, such as other people or glass, when playing.
- Don't allow children to disassemble the transmitter or the car by themselves.
- If the car is broken during use, it should be checked by adult or repaired, when necessary, by professional technician before it can be reused.

Modifications not authorized by the manufacturer may void users authority to operate this device.
