[Driving]

Please do not use a phone while driving. If you want to use your phone, please use a hands-free kit or please park the car first.

[Hospital]

Dispose of used batteries in accordance with local regulations. Always recycle. Do not dispose of batteries in a fire.

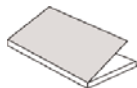

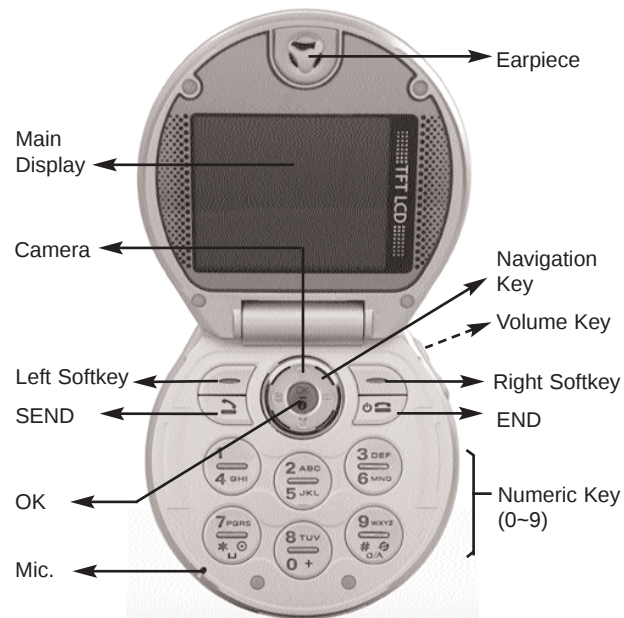

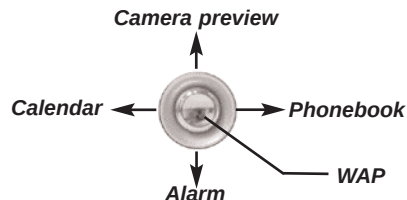

Time & Date

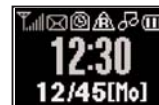
Soft key

Indicators shows the current functions assigned to the soft keys.

[Sub LCD]

When there is a new message or an incoming call, you can see caller number on sub LCD.

When the flip is closed, press the side key to turn the sub lcd light on. After backlight is turned on, press upper or lower volume key to toggle different clock types.

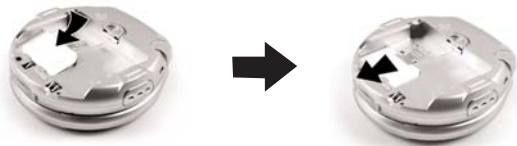

Installing and Removing SIM card

SIM (Subscriber Identity Module) is a "Smart Card" that holds user phone number, service details, and memory for Phone Book numbers and messages. You can use your SIM in any GSM phone and will be charged for the calls.

1. Installing SIM card

- (1) Insert the SIM card into the holder.
- (2) Make sure that the SIM card is inserted properly and that the gold contact area on the card is facing downwards.



2. Removing SIM card

1. Slide the latch to the right.
2. Remove your SIM card from the phone.



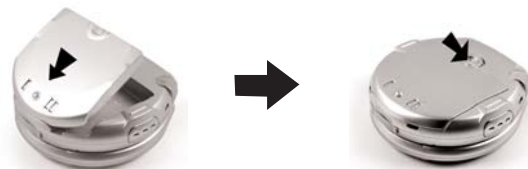
* Caution!

Information stored in the SIM card can be damaged by scratches, water, dirt or static electricity, so be careful when handling, inserting or removing the card.

Installing and Removing battery

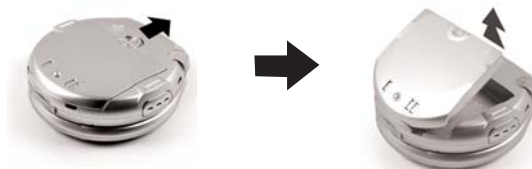
1. Installing the battery

- (1) Position the lugs on the bottom of the battery into the retaining holder.
- (2) Then, push the top half of the battery into position until the latch clicks.



2. Removing the battery

- (1) Press the battery release latch up and remove the battery from the phone.



* Note :

Make sure the power is off before you remove the battery. Removing the battery from the phone when the power is on may cause the phone to malfunction.

Charging the battery

The battery pack is not fully charged when purchased. Fully charge it for 8 hours the first time before using. Unplug the charger when not in use.



1. Connect the power plug to the wall socket outlet.
2. Insert the power cable jack into the connector at the lower part of the phone.

* **Hint**

Insert a charger after the connector cover turn sideways, and you will be able to charge easily .

* **Note**

- When the battery is weak, an empty battery icon flashes, you hear a warning tone.
- The phone can be used while the battery is being charged, but the causes the battery to charge more slowly.
- Because of safety reason, when the temperature of battery is over the safety value, battery will be protected, handset does not charge the battery. When the temperature of battery is come back to normal, handset will charge the battery again.

Power on/off

1. Power on

Press [END] key for a while.

- * If PIN is activated, please enter 'PIN code'.
If 'Lock' is activated, please enter password.
Initial password is set to '0000'
If security of SIM card is enabled, the phone requests the PIN code every time when the phone is turned on.

2. Power off

Press and hold [END].

iØ Making an emergency call

Your phone supports the international emergency number. This means that these numbers can normally be used to make an emergency call in any country with or without a SIM card inserted, if a GSM network is within range.

(Some network operators may require that a SIM card is inserted, and in some cases that the PIN has been entered as well)

- * To make an emergency call, proceed as follows.

If the phone is not on, switch it on.

- With SIM card inserted : Dials the emergency call number
- Without SIM card inserted : Press [SOS] or dials the emergency call number directly.

About PIN/PUK**1. PIN (Personal Identification Number)**

It is a personal code (4 to 8 digits) provided by your network operator in order to prevent other people from using your SIM card.

It is usually supplied with the SIM card. The PIN is usually requested each time when the phone is switched on. If you enter an incorrect PIN three times consecutively, the SIM card is blocked and cannot be used until you unblock it by entering the PUK.

2. PIN2

It is a code composed of 4 to 8 digits and is supplied with some SIM cards to access specific function such as setting the charge detail display and access other additional functions.

If you enter an incorrect PIN2 three times consecutively, the SIM card is blocked and you cannot access the functions until you unblock it by entering the PUK2.

3. PUK (PIN Unblocking Key)

It is composed of 8 digits and used to unblock a SIM card. The PUK may be supplied with the SIM card.

If you forget the code, please contact your service provider. If you enter an incorrect PUK ten times consecutively, the SIM card becomes invalid.

Please contact your service provider for a new card.

4. PUK2

It is composed of 8 digits and is supplied with some SIM cards to unlock PIN2.

If you forget the code, please contact your service provider. If you enter an incorrect PUK2 ten times consecutively, you will not be able to access the additional functions provided by PIN2. Please contact your service provider for a new card.

5. Change PIN or PIN2 code

Your can change the PIN or PIN2 code to any 4 to 8 digits number.

6. Set PIN Check

This feature asks for the PIN code whenever the phone is powered on.

Note: If you enter the wrong PIN code three times consecutively, the SIM card is automatically blocked.

7. PUK/PUK2 Code

The PUK and PUK2 codes are 8-digit codes that usually provided by your service provider along with the SIM card. Their purpose is to unlock SIM cards after wrong PIN has been entered repeatedly.

Making a call

1. Using dial Keys

Enter the phone number in Idle mode, then press [SEND].

2. Making a call from the Phone book

Once you have stored a number in Phonebook, you can dial the number by selecting it from Phonebook .

3. Making a call using the call list

In idle mode, press the [SEND] key, and the latest outgoing phone number will be displayed.

Select the desired number, press [SEND].

4. Making an international call

In idle mode, press and hold the [0]key for the international prefix. The '+' character automatically selects the international access code. Enter the country code, area code and the phone number then press [SEND].

5. Using Turbo Dial

Press and hold a location number in idle mode to connect a call to the corresponding number of the appropriate location.

(Example)

If the location number is '2', press and hold [2].

If the location number is '21', press [2] and press and hold [1].

Answering call

When you receive a call, the phone rings and the flashing phone icon appears on the screen. If the caller can be identified the caller's phone number (or name if saved in the phone book) is displayed. To answer an incoming call, press [SEND]key.

* **Note** : If answer option has been set as other option, please see the 'Answer option' on the [Phone set].

* **Note** : Enter your PIN code to unlock before answering an incoming call if your phone is PIN code protected.

* **Note** : To reject an incoming call, close the phone or press [END].

Missed a call

If you are unable to answer a call, the number of missed call is displayed.

- Time and number (if CLI is supported) is displayed.
- The latest call information appears on the display.

* **Note** : If the [Auto redial] has been set, your phone turn the automatic redialing to the unsuccessful call number.

In call menu

You may access different In-call options during your conversation by simply selecting [Menu] using the [Left softkey]. The available selection will depend on the stage of call, the settings and type of SIM card as well as subscription of network services.

Phone book

This option displays the Phone book menu.

1. Press [Menu]
2. Select [Phone book] and press [OK].
3. Scroll to the desired item and press [OK].
All the phonebook functions are displayed.
See *Phone book* for more details.

Message

This option displays the Message menu.

1. Press [Menu].
2. Select [Message] and press [OK].
3. Scroll the desired item and press [OK].

Mute On/Off

You can mute any active call. Muting means that you can hear the other person's voice but he/she cannot hear your voice.

During a call, press [Menu], then scroll to 'Mute on'. Press [OK]. 'Mute' icon appears on screen.

To unmute the call, press 'Mute Off' and press [OK]. 'Mute' icon disappears.

Hold/ Unhold

You can put a current call on hold and accept an incoming call, or start a second call. This means that both you and the other party will hear a holding tone.

During the call, Press [Menu] then 'Hold'.
The words 'Call hold' will appear on the call screen.
To resume the call, press [Menu], then press 'Unhold'.
The call will resume.

Incoming call while in call

If supported by the service provider, you can accept a second call while in a call.

1. During a call, press [ANS].
2. Select 'Hold & Ans', then press [OK].
To return to the first call, press 'Switch'.

1. When there is an incoming call, press [SEND] to enter into Answer mode.(select 'Reject' to reject the incoming call)
2. It has 'Drop & Answer / Hold & Answer/ Reject' options.
Select 'Hold & Answer', the screen will display both 'In call' and 'Held call'.

Active call and call on hold

Switch

This allows you to switch between an active call and a call on hold.

Press [Menu], then press 'Switch'.

The active call will be put on hold and the call on hold will become the active call.

Join

This allows the call on hold to join the conversation.

Press [Menu], then press 'Join'.

Now all three parties are in the teleconference.

Transfer

This allows you to transfer the active call to the call on hold. Press [Menu] and then press 'Transfer'.

Now, you will be disconnected from these calls automatically.

The active call party and the party on hold will be able to talk to each other.

* During a call, press [End : right soft key], then popup menu appears.

It shows "End on call / End held call / End all" options.

You can select the following items:

- End on call : End a call you put on hold.
- End held call : End the current active call.
- End all : End all connected calls.

If supported by service provider, more people can take part in a call.

1. When there is an incoming call, press [SEND] to enter into Answer mode.(select 'Reject' to reject the incoming call)
2. Press [Menu], it has 'Drop & Answer / Hold & Answer/ Reject' menus.
Select 'Hold & Answer', the screen will display both 'In call' and 'Held call'.
3. Press [Menu], then Select 'Join'.
4. The phone displays active call indicator with the new active call.

Hold & Switch

Switch between the active call and the held call.

1. When there is an incoming call, press [SEND] to enter into Answer mode.
(If you select 'Reject', the call will be rejected and the phone will return to Idle mode.)
2. Press [Menu] to display 'Drop & Answer / Hold & Answer / Reject' menus.
Select 'Hold & Answer', then the screen displays both 'Active call' and 'Held call'.
3. Press 'Switch' to switch between the active call and the held call.

- * Reject waiting call :
You can reject an incoming call by pressing 'Reject'.
 - During a call, press 'Reject' to display the pop-up menu.
 - Move to the desired item and press [OK].

During a teleconference

Split

Allow you to talk privately with one of the persons in a conference call.

1. During a conference call, press select [Menu] and then press 'Split'.
 2. Press "Navigation key" to move to the desired call, then press [OK].
- * To end a connected or held call etc.. press right softkey to select 'End a call' option.
For ending a call, press [Menu] to select the desired item, then press [OK].
 - * It has "End on call / End held call / End all call" options.

Storing number

You can store phone numbers in your phone or SIM card. It is possible to store up to 300 phone number entries in your phone book.

- * The total number of entries in your SIM card are dependent on your SIM card capability.
1. Enter a number in idle mode
 2. Press [Save]
 3. Select [SIM] or [Phone]
 4. Press [Save]
 5. Enter content and then press [Save]
- * Also, you can store phone numbers through the 'New entry' of "Phone book" or 'Save' of "Call list" .

STK

Phone Book

You can save names and phone numbers (Contacts) in the memory of your SIM card or your phone. The memory of SIM card & phone are physically separate, but they are used as a single entity called Phonebook. You can store up to 300 numbers in your phone. SIM card memory size depends on your SIM card capability.

To access this menu..

- (1) In idle mode, press [Main] to access the main menu.
- (2) Scroll to [1.Phone book] then press [OK].
- * **Tip** : Press [1]key for shortcut

By Shortcut

In idle mode, press [Right-navigation key].

Phone book
Storing a number..

- (1) In idle mode, enter a phone number then press [Save].
- (2) Select the storage memory, either [SIM] or [Phone] then press the [Save].
- (3) If you necessary, enter detail content then press [Save].

* **Tip** : You can also save phone numbers through the 'New entry' of "Phone book" or 'Save' of "Call list".

*** Included detail of [Phone book] :**

- (1) Name : Enters the name.
- (2) Location : Enters the location.
- (3) Picture / Avatar : Changes the Picture or Avatar.
- (4) Number : Enters the contact numbers as following - Home / Cellular / Office / Other.
- (5) E-mail : Enters the e-mail address.
- (6) Group : Selects the group type as following - General / Family / Work / Friend / Group1 / Group2 / Group3
- (7) Ring tone : Selects the desired ring tone when there is an incoming call.
- (8) Anniversary : Enters the anniversary date.
(e.g. Birthday, wedding anniversary. etc.)

*For reference..

In case of phone stored over 300 phone numbers,
your phone requires a little time during loading
information of phone memory

*** About the [Menu]**

(The following options are available)

- (1) New entry : Adds the new entry
- (2) Send a MSG. : Sends the message(SMS, EMS) to selected number. (*Refer to the [Message])
- (3) Send a MMS : Sends the message(MMS) to selected number. (*Refer to the [Message])
- (4) Copy to SIM (or Phone) : Copies the selected number from any of both memories. (SIM card or Phone)
- (5) Delete : Deletes the selected item

- (6) Delete all : Deletes all entry which is displayed in the selected group.
- (7) Find by name : Searches the entries by name.
- (8) Find by number : Searches the entries by number.

Group edit

You can arrange names and phone numbers saved in the phone book into groups. For each group, you can set the specific ring tone when receiving a call. Basically, 7 groups are provided. 4 groups of them (General, Family, Work, Friend) have fixed group names while the group names of the other 3 groups can be changed.

*** About the [Edit]**

(The following options are available)

- (1) Rename : Write a new name
(It does not displayed in the General, Family, Friend, Work group mode)
- (2) Group bell : With this menu you can edit the ring tone of the group when you receive a call from a person in the group.

Turbo set

In the idle mode, simply by pressing the assigned number key, you can make a call easily . Also you can set the location of your SIM or Phone as the default memory by using turbo dial

* When you use the memory from 001 to 009 :

Press and hold the last digit key.

* When you use the memory from 010~300 :

Press the assigned number, provided that you press and hold the last key

Memory status

You can check how many entries are stored in your SIM card and phone memory. If [Memory is full!] message appears, you cannot save any more entry until you have deleted other item.

My number

You can see phone number which stored in your SIM card, also you can edit your own name.

My profile

It shows information entered by you.

*** Included detail of [My profile] :**

- (1) Name : Enters the name
- (2) Picture / Avatar : Changes the picture or avatar
- (3) Job title : Enters the job title
- (4) Address : Enters the address
- (5) Home : Enters the home number
- (6) Cellular : Enters the cellular phone number
- (7) Office : Enters the office phone number
- (8) Other : Enters the other number
- (9) E-mail : Enters the e-mail address
- (10) Birthday : Enter the birthday

Call logs

You can check the record of missed, answered and dialed calls only if the network supports CLI (Calling Line Identification) within the service area. In the Idle mode, you can access this menu by pressing [SEND] key then call list will appear.

To access this menu..

- (1) In idle mode, press [Main] to access the main menu.
 - (2) Scroll to [2.Call logs] then press [OK].
- * **Tip** : Press [2] key for shortcut

Dialed call

This menu lets you view the last 30 dialed call numbers. In the idle mode, press [SEND] key then dialed call list will appear. The name, photo (or Avatar) if you saved, displays together with the date and time when the call was made.

Answered call

This menu lets you view the last 30 answered call numbers. The name, photo (or Avatar) if you saved, displays together with the date and time when the call was made.

Missed call

This menu lets you view the last 30 missed call numbers. The name, photo (or Avatar) if you saved, displays together with the date and time when the call was made.

* About the [Edit] of call options

(The following options are available)

- (1) Save : Saves the selected number.
- (2) Delete : Deletes the selected item after confirmation.
- (3) Delete all : Deletes the entire Dialed call list after confirmation.

Call time

This menu lets you view the timers for calls made and received.

- * Total Call time : Shows the total length of all calls made call since the timer was last reset.
- * Last Call time : Shows the length of the last call.
- * Pressing "Reset" will reset all the call timers.

Camera

This phone allows you to take photos & record videos with the phone's built-in camera and adjust its settings. The camera lens is at the back of the phone and the display of the phone works as a viewfinder. Photos taken are in jpeg format and they could be sent as a MMS, attached as a photo identification to caller as well as a wallpaper for your phone.

To access this menu..

- (1) In idle mode, press [Main] to access the main menu.
 - (2) Scroll to [3.Camera] then press [OK].
- * **Tip** : Press [3]key for shortcut

* Camera preview mode

You can edit your photo or video with the following options at the preview stage. To select these options simply move the [Navigation]key up and down to scroll through the available options and left, right to select your desired effect

- A. Zoom** : Adjust the zoom of the picture as appropriate.
- Right : Zoom in
 - Left : Zoom out
- B. Bright** : Adjust the brightness of the picture as appropriate
- Right : More bright.
 - Left : More darker.
- C. Effect** : Select the effect of your desired picture by moving [Navigation]key left or right.

- D. Frame** : Select the frame of your desired picture by moving [Navigation]key left or right. (**Note** : Frame function is not supported during Serial and Video shot mode)

Shooting

You can take a picture or record a video clip with this option.

[1] Photo shot

When the preview setting is on, you press [shot], then you can save the photo.

* About the [Menu]

(The following options are available)

By pressing [Menu], define the following options before your photo shoot

- (1) Self timer : Automatically takes a photo after specified time. Select either 5 sec / 7 sec / 9 sec / 12 sec / 15sec and press [OK]
- (2) Mode : Select from Auto / Sunny / Cloudy / Fluorescent / Tungsten and press [OK]
- (3) Size : Select the image capture resolution. Choose from the following resolution 160x120, 176x144, 320x240, 640x480 and press [OK]
- (4) Quality : Select how much the photo file will be compressed when saving the image. Choose either High / Mid / Low and press [OK].

To take a photo..

Press [Shot] to shoot once you are satisfied with the image that appears on the display.

To save the photo..

- (1) Press [Save]
- (2) Label your photo and press [Done]

[2] Serial Shot

This features allows you to take multiple sequential photos at a click.

*** About the [Menu]**

(The following options are available)

By pressing [Menu], define the following options before your photo shoot

- (1) Serial counter : Defines the number of photo shot per click.
Select either 3 times / 5 times / 7 times / 9 times and press [OK]
- (2) Self timer : Automatically takes a photo after specified time.
Select either 5 sec/ 7 sec / 9 sec / 12 sec / 15sec and press [OK]
- (3) Mode : Select from Auto / Sunny / Cloudy / Fluorescent / Tungsten and press [OK]
- (4) Size : Select the image capture resolution. Choose from the following resolution 160x120, 176x144, 320x240, 640x480 and press [OK]
- (5) Quality : Select how much the photo file will be compressed when saving the image. Choose either High / Mid / Low and press [OK]

To take a burst shot..

Press [Shot] to shoot once you are satisfied with the image that appears on the display.

To save the burst shot..

- (1) Press [save]
- (2) Label your photo and press [Done]

[3] Video Shot

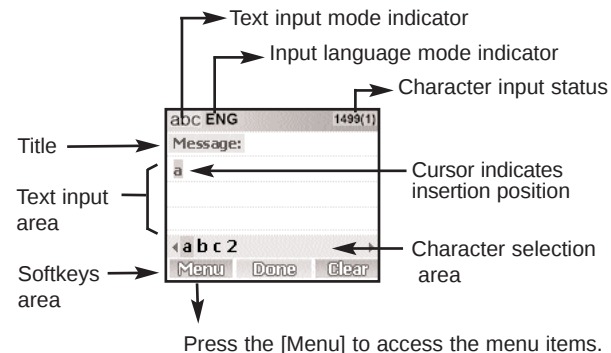
