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## Safety and General Information

Please read these simple guidelines and safety instructions carefully before using the phone.

### **[Driving]**

Please do not use a phone while driving. If you want to use your phone, please use a hands-free kit or please park the car first.

### **[Hospital]**

Please turn off the phone when you are in hospital. Mobile phones can cause possible interference to medical devices such as hearing aids or pacemaker.

### **[Aircraft]**

Please turn off the phone when you are in an aircraft. It is prohibited to use phone in the aircraft.

### **[Blasting Area]**

Please turn off the phone when you are near a blasting area.

### **[Battery and accessory]**

Use only approved battery and accessories.

### **[When refuelling]**

Do not use the phone at refuelling point(service station) or near fuel or chemicals.

## Safety and General Information

### **[Disassembly]**

Do not disassemble your phone or any of its accessories. Only certified service center can disassemble and repair your phone.

### **[Children]**

Keep all accessories or batteries out of the reach of small children or babies. Please instruct children the proper ways of handling phone during usage. Shock circuit or breakdown may occur and may cause severe danger to user due to improper usage.

### **[Battery]**







### Installing and Removing SIM card

SIM (Subscriber Identity Module) is a "Smart Card" that holds user phone number, service details, and memory for Phone Book numbers and messages. You can use your SIM in any GSM phone and will be charged for the calls.


#### 1. Installing SIM card

- (1) Before installing the SIM card, always make sure that the phone is switched off.
- (2) Remove the battery.
- (3) Insert the SIM card into the SIM card slot. Make sure that the golden connectors are facing downwards.
- (4) Slide the latch over the SIM card to lock it in place.



#### 2. Removing SIM card

- (1) Slide the latch to the left.




#### \* Caution!

Information stored in the SIM card can be damaged by scratches, water, dirt or static electricity, so be careful when handling, inserting or removing the card.

### Installing and Removing battery


#### 1. Installing the battery

- (1) Align the golden connectors on the battery with the corresponding connectors on the phone.
- (2) Insert the battery into the battery compartment at a slant angle
- (3) Press down the battery at the top till the battery locks in place.



#### 2. Removing the battery

- (1) Slide up the battery latch and then pull out the battery from the phone.



### Power on/off

#### 1. Power on

Press and hold [END] key.

- \* If PIN is activated, please enter 'PIN code'.  
If 'Lock' is activated, please enter password.  
Initial password is set to '0000'  
If security of SIM card is enabled, the phone requests the PIN code every time when the phone is turned on.

#### 2. Power off

Press and hold [END]key.

### Ø Making an emergency call

Your mobile phone supports international emergency number which can be used with or without a SIM card inserted as long as the GSM network is within range.

Some networks may require that a valid SIM card is properly inserted in the phone and some may require you to input a PIN as well. Consult the local network service provider when in doubt. If certain features are in use (eg. Keypad lock, etc.) you may first need to turn those features off before making your emergency call.

#### \* To make an emergency call :

If the phone is not switch on, switch it on.

- With SIM card inserted : Dial the emergency number.
- Without SIM card inserted : Press [SOS] or dial the emergency number direct.

### About PIN/PUK

#### 1. PIN (Personal Identification Number)

It is a personal code (4 to 8 digits) provided by your network operator against unauthorized use of your SIM card.

The PIN code is usually supplied with the SIM card. Set the phone to request the PIN code each time the phone is switched on.

If you key in an incorrect PIN code 3 times in succession, the SIM card will be blocked and you will be requested to enter the PUK code.

#### 2. PIN2

It is a personal code (4 to 8 digits) supplied with the SIM card to access specific functions, such as charge detail setting display and other functionalities.

If you key in an incorrect PIN2 3 times in succession, the SIM card will be blocked and you will be requested to enter the PUK2 code.

#### 3. PUK (PIN Unblocking Key)

It is a personal code (8 digits) to unblock the PIN code in your SIM card. The PUK code may be supplied with the SIM card. In the event that you cannot remember the PIN code, contact your network provider. If an incorrect PUK code is keyed in 10 times in succession, it will invalidate the SIM card. Contact your network provider if such event occurs.

#### 4. PUK2

It is a personal code (8 digits) to unblock the PIN2 code in your SIM card. The PUK2 code may be supplied with the SIM card. In the event that you cannot remember the PIN code, contact your network provider. If an incorrect PUK2 code is keyed in 10 times in succession, you will be denied access to the additional functions provided by PIN2. Contact your network provider if such event occurs.

#### 5. Change PIN or PIN2 code

You may change the PIN or PIN2 code to any 4 to 8 digits of your choice.

#### 6. Set PIN Check

PIN check request for your PIN code whenever your phone is powered on.

\* **Note** : If you key in an incorrect PIN2 3 times in succession, the SIM card will be blocked and you will be requested to enter the PUK2 code

## Making a call

### 1. Using Number Keys

Key in the phone number, including area code, then press [SEND].

### 2. Using Turbo Dial

Before you can use Turbo dialing, assign a phone number to the number keys starting from [1] to [9].

To make a using turbo dial, simply press and hold the corresponding turbo dial key until the call is started.

- If the turbo key is '2', press and hold [2].
- If the turbo key is '21', press [2] and hold [1]

\* **Note** : You can use turbo dial stored in your SIM card simply by switching the turbo dial settings to SIM.  
See **Turbo set** under [Phone book] for more details.

### 3. Using Phone Book entry

Search for the name/number saved in your phonebook then press [SEND].

\* **Note** : If the Redial is set to 'On', your phone will automatically redial the number is the call fails.  
Press [END] to abort the auto redial attempt.

## Answering a call

Answering or rejecting incoming call,  
Press [SEND] key to answer a incoming call and [END] key to end the call.  
Press [END] key to reject an incoming call.

\* **Note** : Enter your PIN code to unlock before answering an incoming call if your phone is PIN code protected.

## Missed a call

If you are unable to pick up an incoming call, the number will be displayed as **[@Missed call]** with

- The time and date of the missed call.
- Photo Caller ID (if supported) and number

## In call menu

You may access different In-call options during your conversation by simply selecting [Menu] using the [Left softkey].  
The available selection will depend on the stage of call, the settings and type of SIM card as well as subscription of network services.

### I. Phone book

This option displays the Phonebook menu.

1. Press [Menu]
2. Select [Phone book] and press [OK].
3. Scroll to the desired item and press [OK].  
All the phonebook functions are displayed.  
See *Phone book* for more details.

### II. Message

This option displays the Message menu.

1. Press [Menu].
2. Select [Message] and press [OK].
3. Scroll the desired item and press [OK].

### III. Mute On/Off

You can mute your phone's microphone during any active call. Muting means that you can hear the other party's voice but he/she cannot hear your voice.

#### To Mute

During a call, press [Menu].  
Select [Mute on] and press [OK].  
**Mute icon** will appear on screen.

#### To Unmute

During a call, press [Menu].  
Select [Mute off] and press [OK].  
**Mute icon** will disappear.

### IV. Hold

You can put a current call on hold and accept an incoming call, or start a second call.

To hold :

1. During a call, press [ANS].
2. Select [Hold & Ans] then press [OK].  
To return to the first call, press [Switch].

\* **Note** : During a call, press the [Right softkey] for the following pop-up options :

- End call : End the current active call.
- End held call : End the call you put on hold.
- End all : End all connected calls.

Select the desired and press [OK].

#### Making a conference call

This feature allows *multiple* people to join in a call.  
Conference call has to be supported by network services.

- (1) While in a call, press [SEND] to answer a new call.  
(Select [END] to reject the new incoming call)
- (2) Press [Menu] for the following option : Drop & Answer / Hold & Answer / Reject
- (3) Select [Hold & Answer] the screen will display both 'In call' and 'Held call'.
- (4) Press [Join]. The phone will then display active call indicator with the new active call.

## Basic Function

### V. Hold & Switch

Switch between an active call and the held call.

1. While in a call, press [SEND] to answer a new call.  
(Select [END] to reject the new incoming call)
2. Press [Menu] for the following option : drop & Answer / Hold & Answer / Reject
3. Select [Hold & Answer] the screen will display both 'In call' and 'Held call'.
4. Press [Switch] and select. The phone will switch between the active call and the held call.

### Reject waiting call

You can reject an incoming call by pressing [Reject].

During a call, press [Reject] for the following pop-up options

- End call : End the current active call.
- End held call : End the call you put on hold.
- End all : End all connected calls.

Select the desired and press [OK].

### VI.Split


Allow you to have a private conversation with one of the participants.

1. During a conference call, select [Menu].
2. Select [Split] and scroll to the desired participants, then press [OK].

## Basic Function

### Quick access in idle mode

In Idle mode , you can have quick access to the following menu by pressing the joy stick in the direction as shown .



### Storing number

You can save names and phone numbers in the phone's memory and in the SIM card's memory.

The phone's memory may save up to 300 contacts.

- \* The total number of entries in your SIM card are dependent on your SIM card capability.

1. Enter a number in idle mode
2. Press the [Save] key to store number.
3. Select the [SIM] or [Phone] icon, and press [Save]
4. Enter contents of each step and press [Save]

**\* Note :**

- Other ways to store phone number will include
- [New entry] in the *Phone book*. (Please see the *Phone book* for details.)
  - [Save] in the *Call list* menu

### Selecting main menu item

1. Press [Main].
2. Using the joy stick you may select the following 9 menus ;

3. Press the [OK] to confirm selection.

# Phone Book

### Phone book

You can save names and phone numbers in the phone's memory and in the SIM card's memory. The phone's memory may save up to 300 contacts. SIM card memory depends on your SIM card capacity

#### I. Access to Phone book

##### By Main Menu

- (1) Press [Main].
  - (2) Select [1.Phone book] and press [OK].
- \* **Tip :** Press [1]key after [Main]

##### By Shortcut

In idle mode, move the [Joy stick] to the right.

#### II. Storing Number

1. Through the Phone book menu
  - (1) Press [Main] in idle mode.
  - (2) Select [1.Phone book] then press [OK].
- \* **Tip :** Press [1]key for shortcut
- (3) scroll to [1.Phone book] then press [OK].
  - \* **Tip :** Press [1]key for shortcut
  - (4) Press [Menu] to select [1.New entry] .
  - (5) Select your storage memory in either SIM or Phone.
  - (6) Key in the necessary detail and press [save].

2. Through the idle mode

- (1) Enter the number in the idle mode to be store.
- (2) Press the [Save].
- (3) Select the storage memory to be stored either SIM or Phone, then press [Save].
- (4) Enter contents and then press [Save].

### **\* Included detail of [Phone book] :**

1. Name : Enter the name
2. Location : Enter the location
3. Photo / Avatar / Picture : You can add an image in supported format(Photo, Avatar or Picture) to a name or number saved in the phone.
4. Number(Home / Cellular / Office / Other) : Enter the various contact numbers
5. E-mail : Enter the e-mail address
6. Group : Group your contact (General / Family / Work / Friend / Group1 / Group2 / Group3)
7. Ring tone : Assign a ring tone to the contact.
8. Anniversary : Enters an anniversary date(e.g. birthday, wedding anniversary. etc.)

\*For reference..

In case of phone stored over 250 phone numbers, your phone requires a little time during loading information of phone memory

### **\* About the [Menu]**

(The following options are available)

- (1) New entry : Add a new entry to the Phone book.

- (2) Send a MSG. : Send a message(SMS, EMS) to the selected entry. (\*See the [9.Message] for details)
- (3) Send a MMS : Send a message(MMS) to selected entry. (\*See the [9.Message] for details)
- (4) Copy to SIM (or Phone) : Select the copying direction from either SIM to Phone or from Phone to SIM
- (5) Delete : Delete the selected entry
- (6) Delete all : Delete all entries in the Phone book.
- (7) Find by name : Search through all entries by name.
- (8) Find by Pinyin : Search through all entries by Pinyin.
- (9) Find by number : Search through all entries by number.

### **Group edit**

You can arrange the names and phone numbers saved in Phone Book into caller groups. For each caller group, you can assign specific ring tone for easy identification. There are a total of 7 caller groups in this phone. There are 4 caller groups with fixed group names and they are : 1.General / 2.Family / 3.Work / 4.Friend

The remaining 3 group name can be changed to your preference.

To group your caller..

1. Press [Main] in idle mode.
2. Select [1.Phone book] then press [OK].  
\* **Tip** : Press [1]key for shortcut
3. Scroll to [2.Group] then press [OK].  
\* **Tip** : Press [2]key for shortcut

4. Selects the desired caller group to edit, then press [Edit].

### \* About the [Edit]

(The following options are available)

- (1) Rename : You can key in a new name for the caller group or edit the caller group name.
- (2) Group bell : You can assign an incoming ring tone to this group.

## Turbo set

Turbo set allows you to define the speed dial memory you want to use, either SIM or Phone memory.

To select Turbo memory,

1. Press [Main] in idle mode.
2. Select [1.Phone book] then press [OK].  
\* **Tip** : Press [1]key for shortcut
3. Scroll to [3.Turbo Set] then press [OK].  
\* **Tip** : Press [3]key for shortcut
4. Select either [SIM] or [Phone] as your desired selection, then press [OK] to confirm.

### \* Note :

To call using Turbo dialing, press the assigned number and hold the last digit.

Eg.) Turbo Memory : 010, press [0],[1] and hold [0].  
(See page 23 under Turbo Dial for more details)

## Memory status

You can check the number of entries stored in your SIM card and phone memory.

To check the memory status,

1. Press [Main] in idle mode.
2. Select [1.Phone book] then press [OK].  
\* **Tip** : Press [1]key for shortcut
3. Scroll to [4.Memory status] then press [OK]. Both Phone & SIM card memory status will then be displayed.  
\* **Tip** : Press [4]key for shortcut

### \* Note :

If [Memory full] message appears, you will not be able to save a new entry till you delete some existing entries in the current memory. Alternatively, you may select another memory location for your new entry.

## My number

My number allows you to view the phone numbers assigned to your SIM card (if this is allowed by the card). You may edit your name under this selection

To view My Number..

1. Press [Main] in idle mode.
2. Select [1.Phone book] then press [OK].  
\* **Tip** : Press [1]key for shortcut
3. Scroll to [5.My profile] then press [OK].  
\* **Tip** : Press [5]key for shortcut
4. Select the number, followed by [OK].

5. Press [Edit] to edit your name, and save the entry by pressing [OK]

### My profile

You can key in your personal detail under My Profile.  
To key in your profile,

1. Press [Main] in idle mode.
2. Select [1.Phone book] then press [OK].  
\* **Tip** : Press [1]key for shortcut
3. Scroll to [6.My profile] then press [OK].  
\* **Tip** : Press [6]key for shortcut
4. Press[Edit] for edit.

#### \* [My profile] options include :

1. Name : Enters the name
2. Picture / Avatar : Changes the picture or avatar
3. Job title : Enters the job title
4. Address : Enters the address
5. Home : Enters the home number
6. Cellular : Enters the cellular phone number
7. Office : Enters the office phone number
8. Other : Enters the other number
9. E-mail : Enters the e-mail address
10. Birthday : Enter the birthday

## Call logs

The phone registers the names &/or phone numbers of your call. It also logs in the total and last call time. Thus you can check the record of missed, answered and dialed calls only if the network supports CLI(Calling Line identification) within the service area.

- \* Hint : At the idle Mode, you can have quick access to the **Dialed Call list** by simply pressing [ SEND] key.

### Dialed call

Dialed call allows you to view the list of the last 30 dialed numbers. Dialed call list includes the Name and Phone number, Photo or Avatar (if any), Date and Time of call. To access..

1. Press [Main] in idle mode.
2. Select [2.Call logs] then press [OK].  
\* **Tip** : Press [2]key for shortcut
3. Scroll to [1.Dialed call] then press [OK]. The list of dialed calls will be displayed.  
\* **Tip** : Press [1]key for shortcut
4. You may select an entry from the list by pressing [Menu] with the following options :

#### \* **About the [Menu]**

- (The following options are available)
- (1) Save : Save the selected entry.
  - (2) Delete : Delete the selected entry.
  - (3) Delete all : Delete the entire listing.

### Answered call

Answered call allows you to view the list of the last 30 numbers which you have most recently accepted calls. Answered call list includes the Name and Phone number, Photo or Avatar (if any), Date and Time of call. To access..

1. Press [Main] in idle mode.
2. Select [2.Call logs] then press [OK].  
\* **Tip** : Press [2]key for shortcut
3. Scroll to [2.Answered call] then press [OK]. The list of answered calls will be displayed.  
\* **Tip** : Press [2]key for shortcut
4. You may select an entry from the list by pressing [Menu] with the following options :

#### \* About the [Menu]

(The following options are available)

- (1) Save : Save the selected entry.
- (2) Delete : Delete the selected entry.
- (3) Delete all : Delete the entire listing..

### Missed call

Missed call allows you to view the list of the last 30 numbers which have tried to call you without success. Missed call list includes the Name and Phone number, Photo or Avatar (if any), Date and Time of call. To access ..

1. Press [Main] in idle mode.
2. Select [2.Call logs] then press [OK].  
\* **Tip** : Press [2]key for shortcut

3. Scroll to [3.Missed call] then press [OK]. The list of missed calls will be displayed.

- \* **Tip** : Press [2]key for shortcut
- 4. You may select an entry from the list by pressing [Menu] with the following options :

#### \* About the [Menu]

(The following options are available)

- (1) Save : Save the selected entry.
- (2) Delete : Delete the selected entry.
- (3) Delete all : Delete the entire listing.

### Call time

Call Time shows the approximate duration of your incoming and outgoing calls in hours, minutes and seconds.

To view call time..

1. Press [Main] in idle mode.
  2. Select [2.Call logs] then press [OK].  
\* **Tip** : Press [2]key for shortcut
  3. Scroll to [2.Answered call] then press [OK]. Total and last call time will be displayed.  
\* **Tip** : Press [4]key for shortcut.
- \* Total Call time : Aggregate duration of all calls since the last timer resets.
- \* Last Call time : Shows the duration of last call.
- \* Pressing [Reset] to "Reset" timer.

# Camera

This phone allows you to take photos & record videos with the phone's built-in camera and adjust its settings. The camera lens is at the back of the phone and the display of the phone works as a viewfinder. Photos taken are in jpeg format and they could be sent as a MMS, attached as a photo identification to caller as well as a wallpaper for your phone.

## Shooting

You can take a photo or record a video clip with this option.  
To shoot..

1. Press [Main] in idle mode.
2. Select [3.Camera] then press [OK].  
\* **Tip** : Press [3]key for shortcut
3. Scroll to [1.Shooting] then press [OK].  
\* **Tip** : Press [1]key for shortcut
4. Select your desired option, then press [OK].

### By Shortcut

At the Idle mode, move [Joy Stick] up.

#### 1. Photo Shot

Shoot and save your photos with this option

##### \* **About the [Menu]**

(The following options are available)

Define the following options before your photo shoot by pressing [Menu]

- (1) Self timer : Automatically takes a photo after specified time. Select either 5 sec/ 7 sec / 9 sec / 12 sec / 15sec and press [OK]
- (2) Mode : Select from Auto / Sunny / Cloudy / Fluorescent / Tungsten and press [OK]
- (3) Size : Select the image capture resolution. Choose from the following resolution 160x120, 320x240, 640x480 and press [OK]
- (4) Quality : Select how much the photo file will be compressed when saving the image. Choose either High / Mid / Low and press [OK]

### To take a photo..

Press [Shot] to shoot once you are satisfied with the image that appears on the display.

### To save the photo..

- (1) Press [Save]
- (2) Label your photo and press [Done]

#### 2. Serial Shot

This features allows you to take multiple sequential photos at a click.

##### \* **About the [Menu]**

(The following options are available)

Define the following options before your Serial shot by pressing [Menu]

- (1) Serial count : Defines the number of photo shot per click.  
Select either 3 times / 5 times / 7 times / 9 times and press [OK]
- (2) Self timer : Automatically takes a photo after specified time.

3. **Filters** : You can set the filters to your received message type. Select from the following : Immediate limit, Treat as delayed or Max size.

### \* USSD Service

USSD is a GSM service whereby users can send service requests by entering a service code(specific short digit or characters). For more details, contact your network provider.

# Battery

## About the battery

Your device is powered by a rechargeable battery.

You should charge your battery for at least 8 hours during the first charge. The full performance of a new battery is achieved only after two or three complete charge and discharge cycles.

## Charging the battery

1. Connect the power plug of your charger to an electrical point.
2. Twist the connector cover to the right to unveil the connector.
3. Insert the power cable jack into the connector at the bottom of the phone.



## \* Note

- You will hear a warning 'Beep' when your battery is running low.
- You may need a longer charging time if your phone powered on.

## Caution!

- Use only manufacturer approved rechargeable batteries and charger designated for this devise.
- Unplug the charger from the electrical point and the phone when not in use.
- Use the battery only for its intended purpose,
- Never use any charger or battery that is damaged.
- Do not leave the battery in hot or cold places such as in a closed car in summer or winter conditions as this will reduce the capacity and lifetime of the battery.
- Always try to keep the battery between 10°C to 55 °C.
- Do not short-circuit the battery. Short-circuiting the terminals may damage the battery or the connecting object.
- Keep all accessories and batteries out of small children's reach.
- Do not dispose of batteries in fire.



# Entering Text

You can key in English or simplified Chinese text using the phone keypad. English text can be input through normal mean or predictive text (eZi). Chinese text can be input either through Stroke or PinYin.

### Troubleshooting

Check these questions first if you experience problems with your phone :

**Q : I press the Power / End key, but nothing happened.**

A : Press and hold the [END] key till the display appears and you hear the power-on alert. If problem persists, check that you have inserted the battery pack properly.

**Q : The display says "Insert SIM Card" or "Check SIM Card" even through I have inserted my SIM card in the phone.**

A : The SIM card may be incorrectly inserted. Power off and re-insert your SIM card. Power on once again after you have re-inserted your SIM card.

**Q : The display says "Locked" . How do I unlock my phone?**

A : Try entering the 4 digit lock code 0000.

**Q : The display says "SIM Blocked". How do I unblock my SIM card?**

A : Call your service provider to obtain the PIN unblocking key(PUK) code.

**Q : My phone does not ring.**

A : If you see "Silent / Vibrator icon" in the display, then the ringer is turned off. Also, the ringer may be set to "Silent" even though your phone is set to a ring alert profile.

**Q : I cannot send/receive calls.**

A : Make sure that you have a phone network signal. Avoid electrical or radio interference, and obstructions such as bridges, parking garages, or tall buildings. Your phone also may have the "Call Barring" feature turned on. If you know the password, you can change this setting in the network setup menu.

Also check and make sure your SIM card is installed and working properly.

**Q : My battery didn't last as long as I expected.  
What can I do to extend battery life?**

A : Your battery's performance could be affected by charging frequency, feature use, temperature changes and other factors. Your battery could also have 'aged' which results in the noticeably shorter than normal standby and talk times. Buy a new battery under such circumstance.

**Q : I tried to place a call and heard an alternating high/low tone.**

A : Your call did not reach the wireless system. You may have dialed the number too soon after turning the phone on. Wait until the display shows the name of your service provider before making a call.
