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Safety and General Information

[Driving]

Please do not use a phone while driving. If you want to use your phone, please use a hands-free kit or please park the car first.

[Hospital]

Please turn off the phone when you are in hospital. Mobile phones can cause possible interference to medical devices such as hearing aids or pacemaker.

[Aircraft]

Please turn off the phone when you are in an aircraft. It is prohibited to use phone in the aircraft.

[Blasting Area]

Please turn off the phone when you are near a blasting area.

[Battery and accessory]

Use only approved battery and accessories.

[When refuelling]

Do not use the phone at refuelling point(service station) or near fuel or chemicals.

Safety and General Information

[Disassembly]

Do not disassemble your phone or any of its accessories. Only certified service center can disassemble and repair your phone.

[Children]

Keep all accessories or batteries out of the reach of small children or babies. Please instruct children the proper ways of handling phone during usage. Shock circuit or breakdown may occur and may cause severe danger to user due to improper usage.

[Battery]

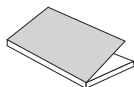

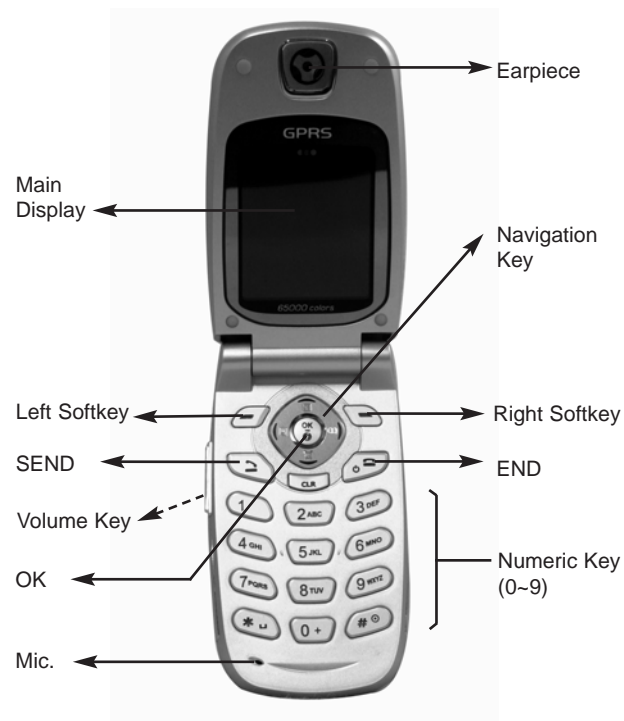

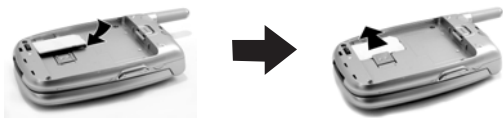

Installing and Removing SIM card

SIM (Subscriber Identity Module) is a "Smart Card" that holds user phone number, service details, and memory for Phone Book numbers and messages. You can use your SIM in any GSM phone and will be charged for the calls.

1. Installing SIM card

1. Power off the phone first.
2. Pull out the battery.
3. Insert the SIM card.
4. Slide the latch over the SIM card to lock it in place.



2. Removing SIM card

1. Slide the latch to the right.
2. Remove your SIM card from the phone.



* Protect your SIM card from scratches, water, dirt and static electricity.

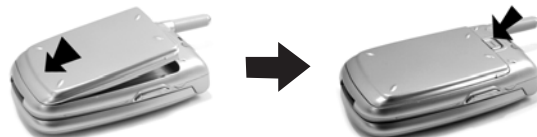
* Careful!

If you disregard the matters which above mentioned, it could be erase information which stored on the your IM card.

Installing and Removing battery

1. Installing the battery

Insert the battery into the battery compartment at a slant angle and press the top of the battery until the battery locks in the place.



2. Removing the battery

Slide up the battery latch and then pull out the battery from the phone.



Power on/off

1. Power on

Press [END] key for a while.

- * If PIN is activated, please enter 'PIN code'.
If 'Lock' is activated, please enter password.
Initial password is set to '0000'
If security of SIM card is enabled, the phone requests the PIN code every time when the phone is turned on.

2. Power off

Press and hold [END].

☎ Making an emergency call

Your phone supports the international emergency number. This means that these numbers can normally be used to make an emergency call in any country with or without a SIM card inserted, if a GSM network is within range.

(Some network operators may require that a SIM card is inserted, and in some cases that the PIN has been entered as well)

- * To make an emergency call, proceed as follows.

If the phone is not on, switch it on.

- With SIM card inserted : Dials the emergency call number
- Without SIM card inserted : Press [SOS] or dials the emergency call number directly.

About PIN/PUK

1. PIN (Personal Identification Number)

It is a personal code (4 to 8 digits) provided by your network operator in order to prevent other people from using your SIM card.

It is usually supplied with the SIM card. The PIN is usually requested each time when the phone is switched on. If you enter an incorrect PIN three times consecutively, the SIM card is blocked and cannot be used until you unblock it by entering the PUK.

2. PIN2

It is a code composed of 4 to 8 digits and is supplied with some SIM cards to access specific function such as setting the charge detail display and access other additional functions.

If you enter an incorrect PIN2 three times consecutively, the SIM card is blocked and you cannot access the functions until you unblock it by entering the PUK2.

3. PUK (PIN Unblocking Key)

It is composed of 8 digits and used to unblock a SIM card. The PUK may be supplied with the SIM card.

If you forget the code, please contact your service provider. If you enter an incorrect PUK ten times consecutively, the SIM card becomes invalid.

Please contact your service provider for a new card.

4. PUK2

It is composed of 8 digits and is supplied with some SIM cards to unlock PIN2.

If you forget the code, please contact your service provider. If you enter an incorrect PUK2 ten times consecutively, you will not be able to access the additional functions provided by PIN2. Please contact your service provider for a new card.

5. Change PIN or PIN2 code

You can change the PIN or PIN2 code to any 4 to 8 digits number.

6. Set PIN Check

This feature asks for the PIN code whenever the phone is powered on.

Note: If you enter the wrong PIN code three times consecutively, the SIM card is automatically blocked.

7. PUK/PUK2 Code

The PUK and PUK2 codes are 8-digit codes that usually provided by your service provider along with the SIM card. Their purpose is to unlock SIM cards after wrong PIN has been entered repeatedly.

Making a call**1. Using Digit Keys**

Enter the phone number in Idle mode, then press [SEND].

2. Using Turbo Dial

Press and hold a location number in Idle mode to connect a call to the corresponding number of the appropriate location.

If the location number is '2', press and hold [2].

If the location number is '21', press [2] and press and hold [1].

- * It is possible to use Turbo dial numbers stored in your SIM card. You can switch Turbo dial settings between Phone entry and SIM entry.
Please see details for Turbo set in phone book.

3. Using Phone Book entry

Search for a number in the phone book, then press [SEND] to make a call.

- * Use Redialing : If the connection of the call fails, your Phone will redial the number automatically.
Press [END] to abandon Auto-calling attempt.
(if Redial is set to 'On')

Receiving a call

When you receive a call, the phone rings or vibrates and displays an incoming call notice.

Flip open to receive the call. (if [Folder open] is selected)

When the flip is opened and the phone rings, press any key to answer. (if [Anykey press] is selected)

- * Except [END] key
- * You cannot receive calls when PIN is locked.
- * Please enter your PIN number to unlock your phone, before receiving your phone.

Missed a call

If you are unable to answer a call, the number of missed call is displayed.

1. Time and number (if CLI is supported) is displayed.
2. The latest call information appears on the display.

In call menu

You can access different menus during a call. Press [Menu] (left softkey) during a call to connect some of the In-call menu. Menu selection depends on the state of the call, the type and setting of your SIM card and subscription to these services.

I. Phone book

This option displays the Phone book menu.

1. Press [Menu], then move to "Phone Book".
2. Press [OK].
3. Scroll to the desired item and press [OK].
All the phone book functions are displayed.
(see "Phone book" on Main Menu)

II. Message

This option displays the Message menu.

1. Press [Menu], then move to "Message".
2. Press [OK].
3. Select the desired item and press [OK].

III. Mute On/Off

You can mute any active call. Muting means that you can hear the other person's voice but he/she cannot hear your voice.

During a call, press [Menu], then scroll to 'Mute on'.

Press [OK]. 'Mute' icon appears on screen.

To unmute the call, press 'Mute Off' and press [OK].

'Mute' icon disappears.

IV. Hold

You can put a current call on hold and accept an incoming call, or start a second call.

1. During a call, press [ANS].
2. Select "Hold & Ans", then press [OK].
To return to the first call, press "Switch".

* During a call, press [right soft key], then popup menu appears. It shows "End on call / End held call / End all" options. You can select the following items:

- [End on call : End a call you put on hold.
- [End held call : End the current active call.
- [End all : End all connected calls.

If supported by service provider, more people can take part in a call.

1. When there is an incoming call, press [SEND] to enter into Answer mode.(select "Reject" to reject the incoming call)
2. Press [Menu], it has 'Drop & Answer / Hold & Answer/ Reject' menus.
Select 'Hold & Answer', the screen will display both 'In call' and 'Held call'.
3. Press [Menu], then Select "Join".
4. The phone displays active call indicator with the new active call.

V. Hold & Switch

Switches between the active call and the held call.

1. When there is an incoming call, press [SEND] to enter into Answer mode.
(If you selects 'Reject', the call will be rejected and the phone will return to Idle mode.)
2. Press [Menu] to display 'Drop & Answer / Hold & Answer / Reject' menus.
Select 'Hold & Answer', then the screen displays both 'Active call' and 'Held call'.
3. Press "Switch" to switch between the active call and the held call.

* Reject waiting call

- You can reject an incoming call by pressing "Reject".
- During a call, press "Reject" to display the pop-up menu.
 - Move to the desired item and press [OK].

VI. Split

Allow you to talk privately with one of the persons in a conference call.

1. During a conference call, select "Menu".
2. Press "Navigation key" to move to the desired call, then press [OK].

* To end a connected or held call etc.. press right softkey to select 'End a call' option.
For ending a call, press [Menu] to select the desired item, then press [OK].

* It has "End on call / End held call / End all call" options.

Sub LCD

When there is a new message or an incoming call, you can see caller number on sub LCD.
When the flip is closed, press the side key to turn the sub LCD light on.



Side keys function

Controls the bell volume when an incoming call.
Controls the earpiece volume during a phone call.

[Upper side key]

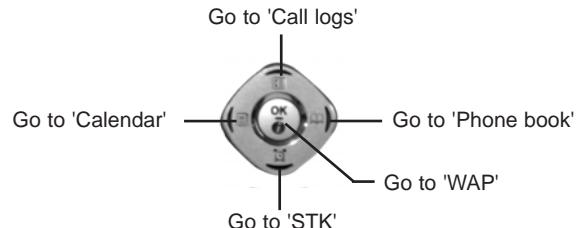
If you press and hold the key repeatedly, you can select the clock shape of analog or digital

[Lower side key]

If you press and hold the key repeatedly, you can enjoy the simple game.

Quick access in idle mode

In Idle mode, you can access designated menu by pressing designated navigation key.



Storing number

You can store phone numbers in your phone or SIM card.
It is possible to store up to 300 phone number entries in your phone book.

* The total number of entries in your SIM card are dependent on your SIM card capability.

1. Enter a number in idle mode
2. Press [STO]
3. Select [SIM] or [Phone]
4. Press [OK]
5. Enter content and then press [STO]

* Also, you can store phone numbers through the 'New Entry' of 'Phone book' or 'Store' of 'Call list'.

Selecting main menu item

Press [Main].

You may select the following 9 menus with navigation keys:

Once you select the menu, then press [OK] key.

Phone Book

Phone book

You can store phone numbers and names in the memory of your SIM card or your phone.

You can store up to 300 numbers in your phone.

SIM card memory size depends on your SIM card capability.

I. Access to Phone book**By main menu**

- (1) Press [Main] in the idle mode.
- (2) Scroll to [1.Phone book] by pressing the navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 1)

By shortcut

Press the [Right side navigation key] in idle mode.

II. Storing Number

1. Through the Phone book menu
 - (1) Press [Main] in the idle mode.
 - (2) Scroll to [Phone book] by pressing the navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 1)
 - (3) Scroll to [1.Phone book] by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 1)
 - (4) Press [Menu] then select [1.New entry] .
 - (5) Select the storage memory to be store either SIM or Phone, then press [Save].
 - (6) Enters content of each categories, then press [Save].

2. Through the idle mode

- (1) Enter the number in the idle mode to be stored.
- (2) Press the [Save].
- (3) Select the storage memory to be store either SIM or Phone, then press [Save].
- (4) Enter contents and then press [Save].

*** Phone book detail**

- (1) Name : Enters the name
- (2) Location : Enters the location
- (3) Picture / Avatar : Changes the Picture or Avatar.
- (4) Number(Home / Cellular / Office / Other):
Enters the contact numbers
- (5) E-mail : Enters the e-mail address
- (6) Group : Selects the group type. (General / Family / Work / Friend / Group1 / Group2 / Group3)
- (7) Bell : Selects the desired ring tone when there is an incoming call.
- (8) Indicator : Selects the indicator color when there is an incoming call. (None / 7 Color / White / Red / Yellow / Green / Blue green / Blue / Pink)
- (9) Anniversary : Enters the anniversary date
(e.g. birthday, wedding anniversary. etc.)

*** About the [Menu]**

(The following options are available)

- (1) New entry : Adds the new entry
- (2) Send a MSG. : Sends the message(SMS, EMS) to selected number. (*Refer to the [9.Message])
- (3) Send a MMS : Sends the message(MMS) to selected number. (*Refer to the [9.Message])

- (4) Copy to SIM (or Phone) : Copies the selected number from any of both memories. (SIM card or Phone)
- (5) Delete : Deletes the selected number.
- (6) Delete all : Deletes all entry which is displayed in the selected group.
- (7) Find by name : Searches the entries by name.
- (8) Find by number : Searches the entries by number.

Group edit

You can arrange names and phone numbers saved in the phone book into groups.

For each group, you can set the specific ring tone when receiving a call. Basically, 7groups are provided. 4 groups of them (General, Family, Work, Friend) have fixed group names while the group names of the other 3 groups can be changed.

1. Press [Main] in the idle mode.
2. Scroll to [Phone book] by pressing the navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 1)
3. Scroll to [2.Group edit] by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 2)
4. Selects the desired group to edit, then press [Edit].

*** About the [Edit]**

(The following options are available)

- (1) Rename : With this menu you can edit group name.
(It does not displayed in the General, Family, Friend, Work group mode)
- (2) Group bell : With this menu you can edit the ring tone of the group when you receive a call from a person in the group.

Turbo set

In the idle mode, simply by pressing the assigned number key, you can make a call easily . Also you can set the location of your SIM or Phone as the default memory for using turbo dial.

1. Press [Main] in the idle mode.
2. Scroll to [Phone book] by pressing navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 1)
3. Scroll to [3.Turbo Set] by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 3)
4. Selects the [SIM] or [Phone]

* When you use the memory from 001 to 009 :
Press and hold the last digit key.

* When you use the memory from 010~300 :
Press the assigned number, provided that you have to press and hold the last key

Memory status

You can check how many entries are stored in your SIM card and phone's memory. If [Memory is full!] message appears, you cannot save any more entry until you have delete other item

1. Press [Main] in the idle mode.
2. Scroll to [Phone book] by pressing navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 1)
3. Scroll to [4.Memory status] by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 4)

My number

You can see phone number which stored in your SIM card, also you can edit your own name.

1. Press [Main] in the idle mode.
2. Scroll to [Phone book] by pressing navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 1)
3. Scroll to [5. My number] by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 5)
4. Select the number press [OK], then you can save your own number with editing name.

My profile

You can enter your personal information in My profile.

1. Press [Main] in the idle mode.
2. Scroll to [Phone book] by pressing navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 1)
3. Scroll to [6.My profile] by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 6)

*** My profile detail**

- (1) Name : Enters the name
- (2) Picture / Avatar : Changes the picture or avatar
- (3) Job title : Enters the job title
- (4) Address : Enters the address
- (5) Home : Enters the home number
- (6) Cellular : Enters the cellular phone number
- (7) Office : Enters the office phone number
- (8) Other : Enters the other number
- (9) E-mail : Enters the e-mail address
- (10) Birthday : Enters the birthday

Call logs

You can check the record of missed, answered and dialed calls only if the network supports CLI (Calling Line Identification) within the service area. In the Idle mode, you can access the this menu by pressing [SEND] key then call list will appear.

1. Dialed call

This menu lets you view the last 30 dialed call numbers In the Idle mode, press [SEND] key then dialed call list will appear. The name, photo (or Avatar) if you saved, displays together with the date and time when the call was made.

1. Press [Main] in the idle mode.
2. Scroll to [Phone book] by pressing navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 1)
3. Scroll to [7.Call logs] by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 7)
4. Scroll to [1.Dialed call] by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 1)

2. Answered call

This menu lets you view the last 30 answered call numbers. The name, photo (or Avatar) if you saved, displays together with the date and time when the call was made.

1. Press [Main] in the idle mode.
2. Scroll to [Phone book] by pressing navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 1)
3. Scroll to [7.Call logs] by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 7)
4. Scroll to [2.Answered call] by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 2)

3. Missed call

This menu lets you view the last 30 missed call numbers. The name, photo (or Avatar) if you saved, displays together with the date and time when the call was made.

1. Press [Main] in the idle mode.
2. Scroll to [Phone book] by pressing navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 1)
3. Scroll to [7.Call logs] by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 7)
4. Scroll to [3.Missed call] by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 3)

* About the [Edit]

(The following options are available)

- (1) Save : Saves the selected number.
- (2) Delete : Deletes the selected item after confirmation.
- (3) Delete all : Deletes the entire Dialed call list after confirmation.

4. Call time

This menu lets you view the timers for calls made and received.

1. Press [Main] in the idle mode.
2. Scroll to [Phone book] by pressing navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 1)
3. Scroll to [7.Call logs] by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 7)
4. Scroll to [4.Call time] by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 4)

- * Total Call time : Shows the total length of all calls made call since the timer was last reset.
- * Last Call time : Shows the length of the last call.
- * Pressing "Reset" will reset all the call timers.

Sound

Ring tone

With this menu, you can change the ring tone when a call is received. When ring tone is scrolled, the ring tone is played.

1. Press [Main] in the idle mode.
2. Scroll to [Sound] by pressing navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 2)
3. Scroll to [1.Ring tone] by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 1)
4. Selects the desired group by pressing left or right navigation key .
5. Scroll to desired item by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK]

Adjust volume

With this menu, you can adjust the volume from one to five levels using up or down navigation key. You can adjust volume of Keypad / Earpiece / Bell volume.

1. Press [Main] in the idle mode.
2. Scroll to [Sound] by pressing navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 2)
3. Scroll to [2.Adjust volume] by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 2)
4. Selects the desired group by pressing left or right navigation key.
5. Selects the desired level by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [Save]

Ringer type

With this menu, you can change the ringer type when a call or message is received.

1. Press [Main] in the idle mode.
2. Scroll to [Sound] by pressing navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 2)
3. Scroll to [3.Ringer type] by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 3)
4. Selects the desired item by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK].

Incoming calls or message	
Bell	The ringing tone is played
Vibrator	The phone vibrates without ringing
Vib then Bell	Phone first vibrates and then start ringing
Vib and Bell	Phone vibrates and rings simultaneously
Sliding Bell	Phone ring becomes louder
Lamp	Only the light indicator operate

Alert tone

With this menu, you can set the alert tone

1. Press [Main] in the idle mode.
2. Scroll to [Sound] by pressing navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 2)
3. Scroll to [4.Alert tone] by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 4)

4. Selects the desired item by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK].
5. Select the [Enable] or [Disable]

Alert Tone	Type Description
Connection	Alert tone rings when a call is connected
Out of SVC	Alert tone rings when the phone is out of range
1 min alert	Alert tone rings before 10 seconds when call time reaches 1 minute
Confirm	Alert tone rings when an item is confirmed
Menu sound	Alert tone rings scrolling through the menu
Power on	Alert tone rings when the phone is powered on
Power off	Alert tone rings when the phone is powered off

key tone

With this menu, you can change the key tone when pressing keys on the keypad. You can select one of Water or Drum or DTMF Tone as the key tone.

1. Press [Main] in the idle mode.
2. Scroll to [Sound] by pressing navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 2)
3. Scroll to [5.Key tone] by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 5)
4. Selects the desired item by pressing up or down

Setting

- * If you select the Water or Drum, the battery consumption will be increased than you select the DTMF tone
- * **Off** means keys do not make any sound.

Message tone

With this menu, you can select different alert tones for incoming messages.

1. Press [Main] in the idle mode.
2. Scroll to [Sound] by pressing navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 2)
3. Scroll to [6.Message tone] by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 6)
4. Selects the desired item by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK].

Phone set

This menu illustrates different phone settings to suit your preferences.

1. Press [Main] in the idle mode.
2. Scroll to [Setting] by pressing navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 3)
3. Scroll to [1.Phone set] by pressing up or down navigation key, then press [OK]. (Or press digit 1)

1. Language

With this menu, you can select a display language. When you select [Auto], the language is automatically selected according to the language of the SIM card used

2. Phone mode

With this menu, you can customize the ringer type for various events and environments. The default mode is preset to Normal mode and it does not customize. But the other mode change the following phone modes:

1. Phone lock

Battery

About the battery

The battery pack is not fully charged when purchased. Fully charge it for 8 hours the first time before using. Use only batteries approved by the phone manufacturer. Recharge battery only with the chargers approved by the manufacturer. Unplug the charger when not in use.

Charging the Battery

1. Connect the power plug to the wall socket outlet.
2. Insert the power cable jack into the connector at the lower part of the phone.



* Tips

- When the battery is almost empty, you will hear 'Beep' sounds.
- It may take additional charging time if the phone is powered on.

Caution!

- Never use any charger or battery that is damaged in any way.
- Use the battery only for its intended purpose.
- Use only batteries approved by the phone manufacturer and recharge your battery only with the chargers approved by the manufacturer. If you use the non-approved batteries, it may cause fire or explosion. Unplug the charger when not in use .

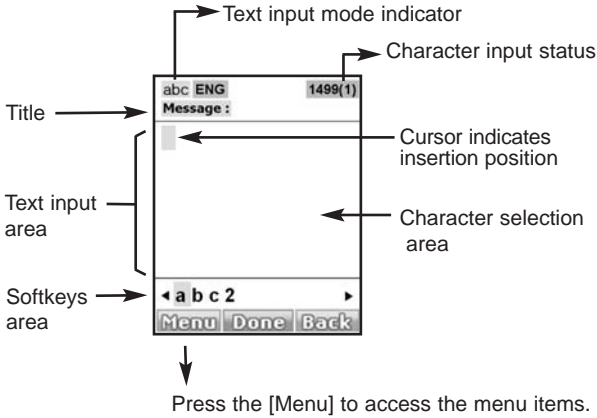

Troubleshooting

Check these questions first if you experience problems with your phone :

Q : I press the Power / End key, but nothing happened.

A : Be sure to press and hold ⏻ (the END/Power key) until the display appears. You will hear an audible alert. If nothing happens, check the battery pack.

Q : The display says "Insert SIM Card" or "Check SIM Card" even though I have inserted my SIM card in the hone.

A : The SIM card may be incorrectly inserted. Check the SIM card to make sure that it is inserted properly. Be sure to turn your phone off and turn it on again after your re-insert the SIM card.

Q : The display says "Locked" . How do I unlock my phone?

A : Try entering the 4 digit lock code 0000.

Q : The display says "SIM Blocked". How do I unblock my SIM card?

A : Call your service provider to obtain the PIN unblocking key(PUK) code.

Q : My phone does not ring.

A : If you see "Silent / Vibrator icon" in the display, then the ringer is turned off. Also, the ringer may be set to "Silent" even through your phone is set to a ring alert profile.

Q : I cannot send/receive calls.

A : Make sure that you have a phone network signal. Avoid electrical or radio interference, and obstructions such as bridges, parking garages, or tall buildings. Your phone also may have the "Call Barring" feature turned on. If you know the password, you can change this setting in the network setup menu. Also check and make sure your SIM card is installed and working properly.

Q : My battery didn't last as long as I expected. What can I do to extend battery life?

A : Your battery's performance is affected by charging frequency, feature use, temperature changes and other factors.

Q : I tried to place a call and heard an alternating high/low tone.

A : Your call did not reach the wireless system. You may have dialed the number too soon after turning the phone on. Wait until the display shows the name of your service provider before making a call.
