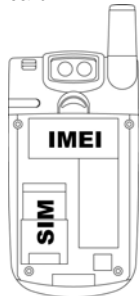
Security

If your phone is lost or stolen, you must report it to your network operator or service provider so that they can restrict the phone from use.

This is important, as you may be liable for the cost of unauthorized calls until the equipment is restricted.

You can help prevent mobile phone crime by taking the following pre-cautions:

- Set the SIM PIN in lock mode.
- Sets call restrictions.
- Don't leave your phone visible in a vehicle when you leave it. Take the phone with you or lock it in the trunk or glove compartment of your car.
- Make a note of the IMEI no. This number will be found on the box your T503F came in and on the phone near to the SIM card.



- Make a note of the SIM card number.

Body-worn Operation

This device was tested for typical body-worn operation with the back of the phone kept 1.5 centimeters from the body. To comply with FCC RF exposure requirements, a minimum separation distance of 1.5 centimeters must be maintained between the user's body and the back of the phone, including the antenna, whether extended or retracted. All belt-clips, holsters and similar accessories used by this device must not contain any metallic components. Safety Information

The internal wireless radio operates within guidelines found in radio frequency safety standards and recommendations, which reflect the consensus of the scientific community. Beaucom therefore believes the internal wireless radio is safe for use by consumers. The level of energy emitted is far less than the electromagnetic energy emitted by wireless devices such as mobile phones. However, the use of wireless radios may be restricted in some situations or environments, such as aboard airplanes. If you are unsure of restrictions, you are encouraged to ask for authorization before turning on the wireless radio.

Mobile phone Use

computers, may cause interference. Once again, please turn your phone off when entering a Hospital; Medical Equipment can be affected.

Battery Use

- Do not short-circuit the battery terminals. This will damage the battery, produce heat and may cause a fire.
- Never dispose of batteries in a fire as it can cause them to explode. Return dead batteries to your supplier or an approved recycling centre. DO NOT dispose along with household waste.

WARNING: If the battery case breaks, avoid contact with the contents. Wash contaminated skin with lots of water and seek medical attention. Discard the battery in a safe way and seek advice from your dealer.

On the Road

- Before making or receiving calls, acquaint you thoroughly with the applicable local laws and guidelines regarding the use of mobile radiotelephones and observe them at all times. Only use an Ear-Microphone, which is also known as a "personal hands free".
- Air safety bags, anti-lock brakes, speed control and fuel injection systems are normally immune to radio transmissions but if you experience problems, consult your vehicle dealer.
- Turn off your mobile phone when refuelling or where there are signs restricting the use of 2-way radio equipment. Do not store or carry flammable or explosive materials in the same compartment as your mobile phone, internal sparks could cause ignition.

Inside Aircraft

- Switch off your mobile phone when in an aircraft. The use of mobile phones in an aircraft may be dangerous to the operation of the aircraft, disrupt the cellular network and is illegal.

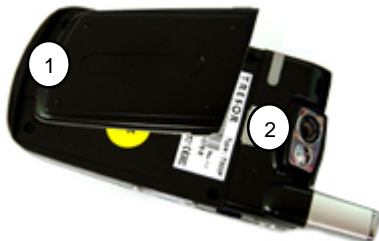

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Battery

Insert and remove battery

- Insert battery at the bottom of the phone ① and press inward until it clicks into place ②.
- Switch off the phone before you remove the battery.
- To remove the battery, unlock the battery ②, and then remove ①.



Fully Charge the Battery.

Failure to do this will affect the life of the battery and reduce operating times between recharges. Best battery performance will be achieved after fully charging and discharging the battery two or three times.

Charging Battery.

- Connecting the TRC (Travel Charger) plug into charger jack of phone.
- Battery charging time takes approximately 1.5 – 2 hours.
Supplied battery type is MBL-0720T 720mAh Li-Ion battery.

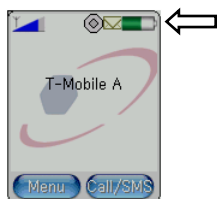
WARNING: Charge the battery in a well-ventilated area between 0°C and +40°C using the supplied or approved charger. The use of a non-approved charger could result in a fire or injury through an electrical shock.

Battery Performance.

Any quoted stand-by or talk times are subject to network conditions.

Battery Power Level

The battery power level is shown in the top right corner of the display when you switch the phone ON. Six levels are displayed from full (all green) to empty (all white).

- Above times are talk only and stand-by only times. In normal use the time shall be lower because a large amount of battery power shall be consumed by initiating and receiving calls between intervals of standby.
- Times may vary, depending on the network condition set by base station.
- Usable time of battery may vary; depend on the operating conditions such as charge conditions, temperature, user's habit or the location's radio wave conditions.
- Usable time of battery shall decrease over time as they age.

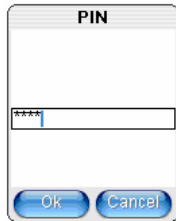
Switching ON and OFF & PIN entry


When the phone is switched ON, the phone will wake-up and a stand-by screen will be displayed. The following pages explain the displayed message and symbols.

Switching ON and OFF

- Hold down  key to switch on or off.

PIN entry



- After power-up, following PIN entry screen appears if the PIN lock has been enabled.
- The SIM card can be protected with a 4 digit PIN code.
- Enter your PIN code and press  key.
- Failure to enter correct PIN code three times will result the SIM card blocked.
- For a SIM card that has been blocked, please read SIM card manual or contact with your service provider to unlock it.

Emergency call (SOS)

- Even if the phone is locked with PIN code, you can still dial
- Note: 112 is the international emergency number used in most countries.





The phone must be switched on to make a call.

Enter the digits of the telephone number you wish to reach:



Use  key to clear and correct any wrongly entered number(s)

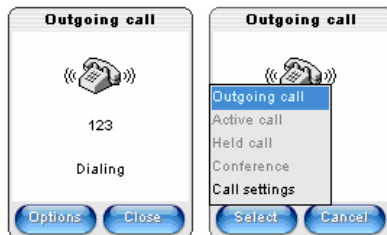
The  button simply closes the sub-menu and returns to the parent screen.


When you are happy with the entered number, press  or the  key to initiate the call.

Note that the **<International code>** and **<Country code>** are optional.

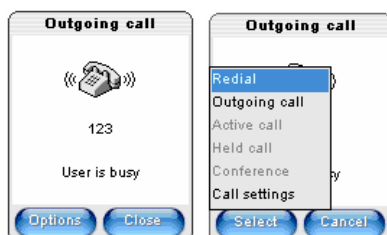



Call Settings	Shortcut to the Call Settings. This is the same screen that is accessible via "Settings"/"Calling" from the main menu.

Terminating a call

To hang up at the end of the call, press  key

Last Number Redial

Press  to recall the last number dialled, if correct, press  again to dial the number.

You could use the  key to browse the last dialled numbers then press  to make the call.

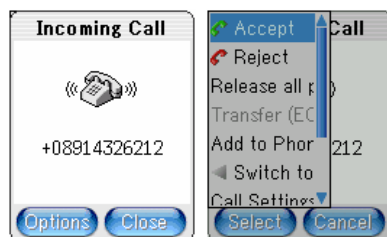
Emergency Call

- Your national emergency services numbers are stored in a special memory in the phone to enable the calls to be made even when the phone is locked, the restrict feature is set or when no SIM is fitted.
- Ignore any phone/SIM locked or restricted messages and dial as normal. The call should be successful if you are within network coverage and there is sufficient signal strength




Answering Calls

The phone must be switched on to receive calls.



Press  key or  &  to answer the call at any time during the ringing.

- If the "any key answer" feature has been activated, press any key to answer the call except  or  key.
- During the ring tone, the caller's number or name may be displayed (if this is supported by the network).
*Caller's name will only be displayed if the caller's number has been previously stored on the phone book.

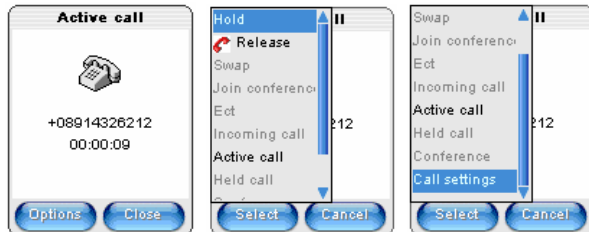

From here, the  button may be used to return the call.





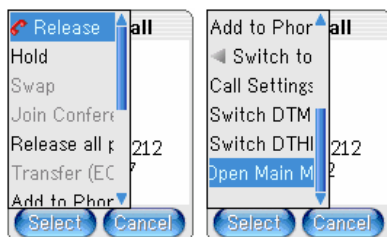
- If you have a new incoming call whilst you are in conversation or call on hold, the following screen is displayed

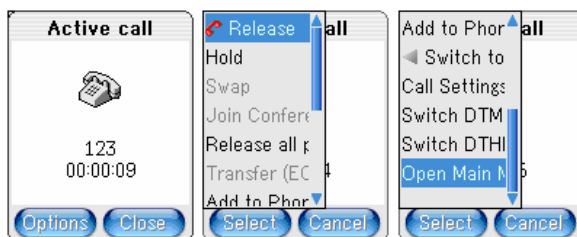
Ear Piece Volume

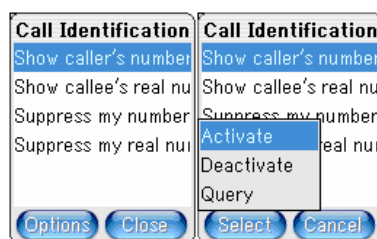
Use  key to browse the Settings options then press the  key to toggle the state of the highlighted item.

Fixed numbers	Activate the Fixed number dialling option of the T503F. Please refer to the Phonebook FDN screen for details of maintaining the list of permissible outgoing numbers.
Minute beep	Activate the "minute beep" option. When active, the phone will play a short tone every minute during a telephone call. This is particularly useful for "pay-as-you-go" subscriptions where call cost may be a concern.
Any key answer	When active, this allows you to answer incoming calls by pressing any digit on the keypad. When disabled, you can only answer incoming calls by pressing the  key.
Redialing	When your call can't reach because your party is busy or there are some trouble in network, retry dialling automatically.

To close this screen and return to the parent screen, press the  key.

"Call Identification" screen

The Call line ID option allows you to prevent your phone number from being displayed on the phone of the person being called. For each of the settings below concerned with incoming calls, if enabled, the telephone number is displayed and, if the number exists in your phonebook, the associated name is also displayed on the screen before the call is answered. (Note, however, that this also subject to the caller enabling call identification for outgoing calls).




Use  key to browse the Settings options then press the  key.

Show caller's number	Display the callers details for incoming calls.
Show callee's real number	Display the details of the number being called for incoming calls (i.e. your own number).
Suppress my number	Allow the person you are calling to see your telephone number before the call is answered.
Suppress my real number	If the person you are calling exists in your phonebook, this will allow the person's name to be displayed on your screen.

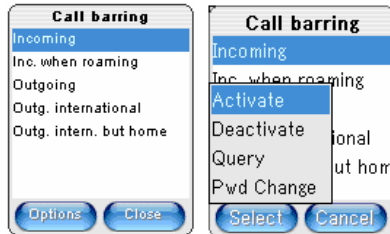



You can set any combination of the call barring to help manage network usage and increase security. The Service Provider will supply a special four-digit code of your choice if you find it difficult to remember or think someone else may know it



Security Settings

Phone and SIM card are protected against misuse by several security codes.

- PIN1: Protects your SIM card (personal identification number)
- PIN2: Needed to set for additional functions of special SIM card.
- PUK: Used to unlock SIM card after incorrect PIN input.
- Phonecode: (Also known as SIM Lock) This protects your phone. Must be entered at the first security setting (4-8digits). The default Phonecode is 0000.

"Security" screen



Enable PIN1

This is also often referred to as "**PIN lock**". If enabled, you will be prompted to enter your PIN1 each time the phone is switched on. You will be prompted to enter your PIN before being allowed to proceed with this function. This option is disabled (greyed) if PIN1 is already enabled.

Disable PIN1

You will be prompted to enter your PIN before being allowed to proceed with this function. This option is disabled (greyed) if PIN1 is not enabled.

Change PIN

Please refer to the "Change PIN" screen below. You will be prompted to enter your PIN before being allowed to proceed with this function.

Change PIN2

Please refer to the "Change PIN" screen below. You will be prompted to enter your PIN2 before being allowed to proceed with this function.

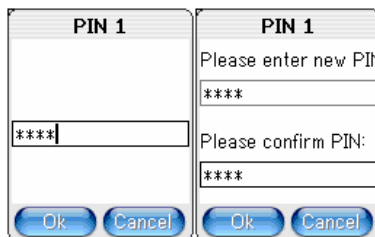



"Change PIN2" screen

You can change the PIN2 to any 4digits number (This option is enabled only when PIN2 is available).

Phonebook

Everything you need to know about the phone book has been grouped together in this section, from storing names and numbers to recalling and dialling.

The T503F Tri band GSM phone is capable of storing phonebook entries in both its main memory and in the SIM. The main phonebook (in the phone memory) has additional storage and information capability. It is advised that this be used wherever possible. On the SIM, the number of phone book numbers allowed is determined by the capacity of the SIM, and differs from one SIM to the next.. In both phonebooks, recalling of entries is by location number, by name, or by browsing through the phone book one by one.



As mentioned, the T503F offers two phonebook implementations:

The basic Phonebook consists of:

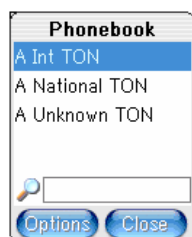

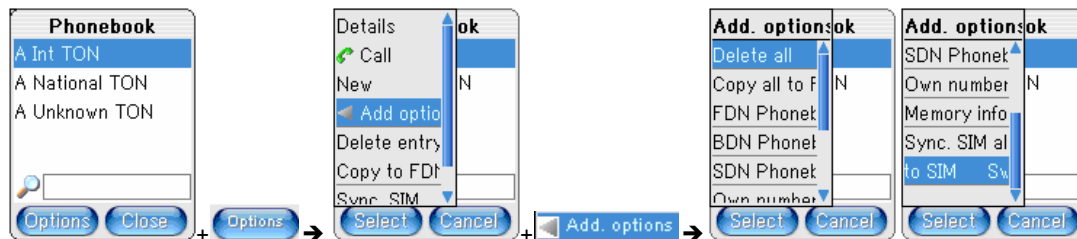
2. If the name for the phonebook entry is known, start typing the name using the keypad as normal. The characters typed

appear in the quick search  text box, and the list automatically scrolls to the appropriate location in the list. If there is no entry in the list corresponding exactly to the characters typed, then the highlight is positioned to the entry that would follow such an entry, if it did exist.

Use  key to clear and correct any wrongly entered characters. As you get close to the entry, you can also use the

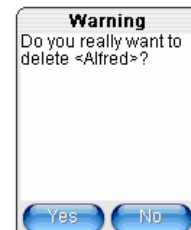

FDN & BDN Phonebooks



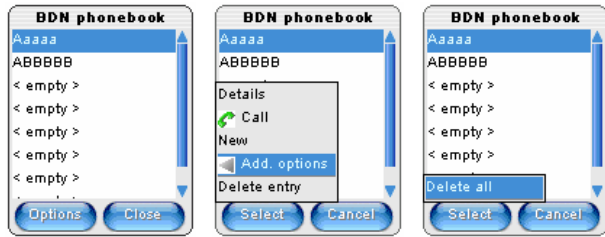
Any additions, changes or deletions to the FDN list is regarded as a security sensitive function, so as such requires entry of your SIM PIN2. This is the code that controls fixed dialling on your T503F phone. For details on changing your PIN2, see the section on Security.



The T503F Tri band GSM/GPRS phone is capable of sending and receiving SMS messages including service provider dependent email and fax transmission and reception through the SMS.

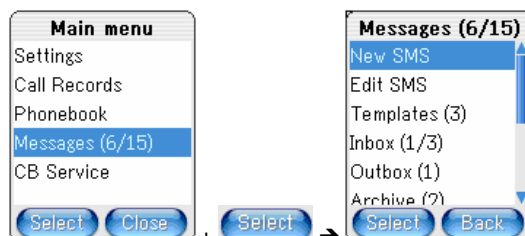
The T503F supports concatenated SMS messages, so your messages are NOT restricted to the 160 character limit of many other phones.

"Write SMS" screen




This is where you can compose and send SMS messages.


Your message may contain texts. As you are typing, the text will automatically wrap to the next line, keeping each word intact (where possible).



In order to compose messages (or indeed phone book entries) you will use the numeric keypad of your phone to enter text, numbers, spaces and punctuation.

Each keypad number is also used to enter several alpha characters. For message entry, you must repeatedly press the key that shows the character that you want, until it appears on display. You must wait a short while for the phone to accept this character if the next character you wish to enter is located on same key that you have just pressed.



Some notes on message size:

Most network operators charge for text messages on a "per segment" basis, where one segment is equivalent to approximately 160 characters. Typically, each segment is a chargeable text message.

Please refer to your Network Operator for information regarding charging and cost of text messages.

Each time a special format is selected (eg different font, colour etc - see [Format] below), this takes up an equivalent of 8 characters internally. i.e. each special format reduces the effective message length by 8 bytes. Each image or sound entered takes up an additional 6 characters of the message.


The top line of the screen shows information about the size of your current message. Specifically, the line shows how many segments comprise the current message, and how much space is remaining in the current segment. eg "Seg.: 1, Free: 157" indicates that your message is made up of a single segment, and you have space for an additional 157 characters.



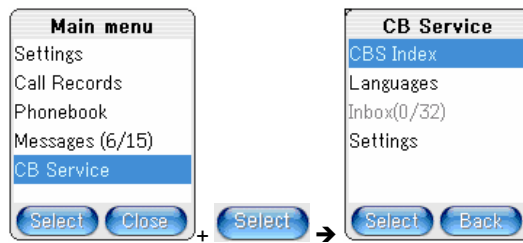
CB (Cell Broadcast Service)



The T503F Tri band GSM/GPRS phone is capable of receiving Cell Broadcast messages.

Cell broadcast is a Tele-service which enables an Information Provider to broadcast short messages to a specified area within the network. Although each message is typically broadcast many times, your phone is designed to receive each message only once. Furthermore, you are able to configure your Cell Broadcast service to filter those messages which are not interesting to you. Reception of Cell broadcast messages is only possible in idle mode, and typically each message is limited to 93 characters.

Your T503F Cell Broadcasting Service application offers the following features:

- Inbox
- Language filtering
- Topic/Channel filtering
- User defined Topics/Channels
- Enhanced index format
- Optional reception of Index messages
- Optional display of messages on the idle screen as they arrive
- Optional receipt of Cell Broadcast messages

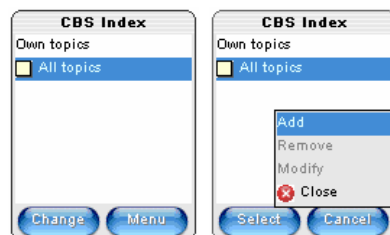

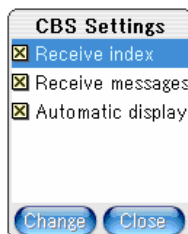
