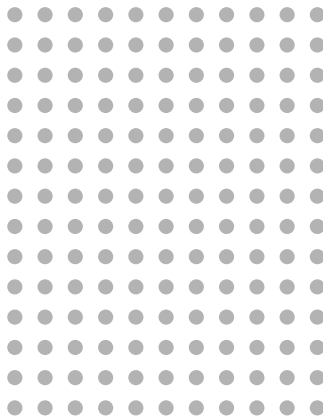
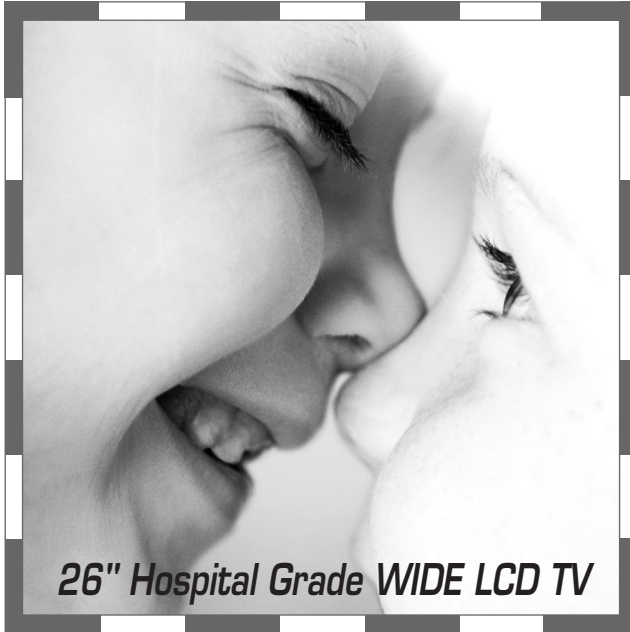

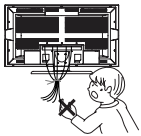
The AC-DC adaptor operates from an AC wall outlet.



a. Connect the DC plug of the AC-DC adaptor to the 24V socket on back of the set.

b. Connect the AC-DC adaptor and its power cord.

c. Connect the hospital-grade power cord to an AC outlet.



In the event of thunderstorms or power outages, please unplug the AC-DC adaptor from the wall outlet and unplug the cable TV coax. Do not allow anything to rest upon or roll over the power cord, and do not place the power cord where it is subject to damage.

To avoid damage to the injury of the patient, Output cable of AC-DC adaptor shall be fixed on bracket.

Controls

1. ON/OFF switches TV set on or off.

2. MENU

Displays a menu.

3. + CH - (Program Up/Down)

Selects a program or a menu item.

4. + VOL - (Volume Up/Down)

Adjusts the volume./ adjusts menu settings.

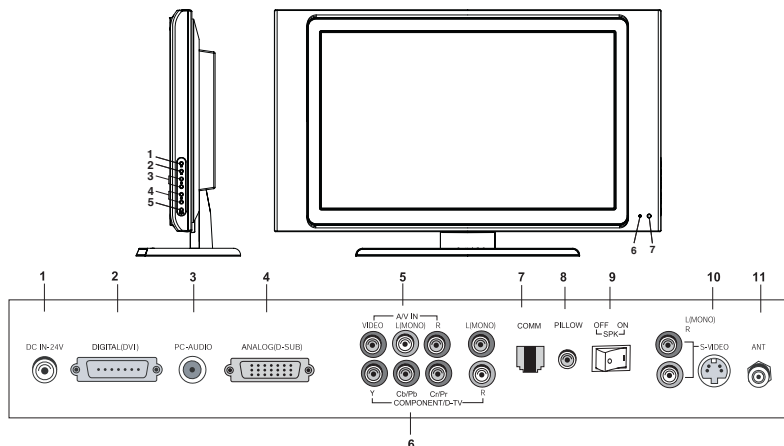
5. TV/AV selects TV, video, s-video, radio (only when set is radio-on), PC analog, PC digital or component mode. Clears the menu from the screen.

6. Power Indicator

Illuminates in red when the TV is in standby mode. Illuminates in green when the TV is switched on. Illuminates in amber when in power save-mode (only PC mode).

7. Remote Control Sensor

Accepts the IR signal of remote controller.



1. DC24V IN

2. PC DIGITAL IN (DVI-D)

3. PC AUDIO IN

Connect the audio cable from the PC to the PC AUDIO IN of the set.

4. PC ANALOG IN (D-SUB)

5. AV IN

Connect the Audio/Video outputs of external equipment to these inputs.

6. COMPONENT -DTV IN

7. COMM - UART communication port

It is possible to read and write are available when be connected with clone box

8. PILLOW - Digital pillow speaker output

9. SPK - Set main speaker on or off

10. S-VIDEO IN

Connect the output of the S -VIDEO on the VCR to the S-VIDEO input.

Connect the audio outputs of the S-VIDEO on the VCR to the Audio IN (L(MONO), R).

11. Ant. (Antenna input)

Controls

All the functions can be controlled with the remote controller. Some functions can also be adjusted with the buttons on the side panel of the set.

Remote Control

Before you use the remote controller, please install the batteries.

1. POWER

Turns the TV on from standby or off to standby mode.

2. MUTE

Turns the sound on and off.

3. NUMBER buttons

Selects program numbers.

4. TV/AV

Selects TV, VIDEO, S-VIDEO, RADIO (Only when the set is Radio On), PC ANALOG, PC DIGITAL or component mode. Clears the menu from the screen.

5. MENU

Displays a main menu.

6. LIST

Displays the program list menu.

7. SAP

Adjusts the MTS-STEREO, MONO, SAP.

8. SLEEP

Sets the sleep timer.

9. Q.VIEW

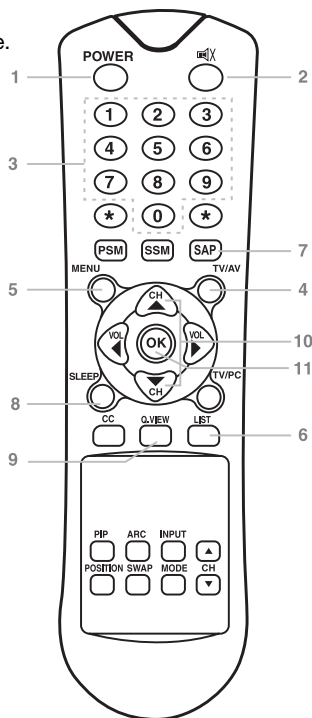
Returns to the previously viewed program.

10. CH▲▼ (Channel Up/Down)

Selects next channel or a menu item.

11. OK

Accepts your selection or displays the current mode.



Controls

12. VOL◀▶ (Volume Up/Down)

Adjusts the sound level. Adjusts menu settings.

13. TV/PC

Selects TV or PC mode directly.

14. PSM (Picture Status Memory)

Recalls your preferred picture setting

15. SSM (Sound Status Memory)

Recalls your preferred sound setting

16. ARC

You can watch TV in various picture formats; **16:9**, **14:9**, **4:3**, **16:9 Zoom**, **14:9 Zoom**, **4:3 Zoom**. Repeatedly press the **ARC** button to select a picture format.

Note: 16:9 and 4:3 in PC mode are available.

17. CC

Sets the caption function.

18. INPUT

Selects the AV source of the sub picture in PIP mode.

19. PIP

Displays a PIP (picture-in-picture) screen. The PIP function is available in PC Analog, PC Digital or DTV mode.

20. POSITION

Selects the position of the PIP screen.

21. SWAP

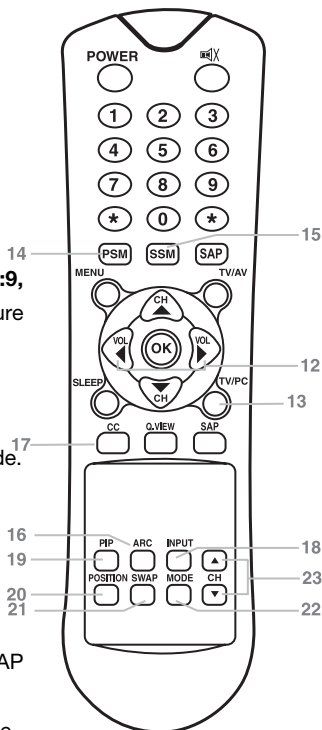
Switches the main and sub pictures in PIP mode. The PIP screen disappears after pressing the **SWAP** button.

22. MODE

Selects a PIP screen mode – 16:1, 9:1 and 3:1 mode.

23. ▲CH▼

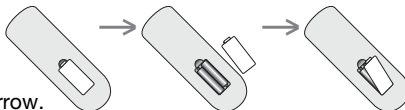
Selects a program when an RF signal is displayed in PIP mode.



Battery installation

■ Inserting batteries

1. Remove the battery cover by pulling it upward in the direction shown by the arrow.
2. Insert the batteries with correct polarity ("+" to "+", and "-" to "-").
3. Replace the battery cover.



* Install two high-quality 1.5V "AAA" alkaline batteries. Don't mix old batteries with new batteries.

* Remove batteries when you won't use the remote controller for a long time. Liquid leakage from old batteries may cause operation failure.

■ Notes for using the remote controller

- Ensure there are no objects between the remote controller and its sensor.
- Do not place the remote control near a heater or in damp place. Strong impact to the remote control may cause operation failure.
- Signal from the remote control may be disturbed by sunlight or other bright light. In this case, darken the room or move the TV.

Basic Operation

Turning the TV On and Off

Standby Setup: The AC-DC adapter and the AC power cord must be setup and connected to place the TV in standby mode ready to be turned on. Press the **ON/OFF** button on the side panel of the TV to go into standby mode.

1. If the TV is in standby mode, press the **POWER** button on the remote controller or the TV to turn the TV on.
2. Press the Power button again on the remote controller or the **ON/OFF** button the TV to turn the TV off.

Note : If the TV is on and the **POWER** button is pressed to turn the TV off, the TV goes into standby mode.

Program Selection

You can select a program number with the **CH▲▼** button or number buttons.

Volume Adjustment

Press the **VOL◀▶** button to adjust the sound level.

Quick View

Press the **Q.VIEW** button to view the last program you were watching.

Sound Mute Function

Press the **MUTE**() button. The sound is switched off and the mute display  appears.

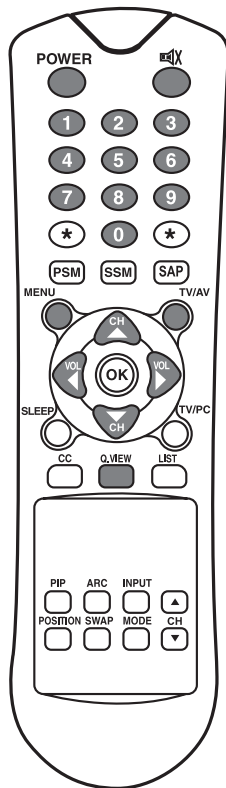
To cancel mute mode, press the **MUTE**() button again, the **VOL◀▶**, or the **SSM** button.

On Screen Menu Language Selection

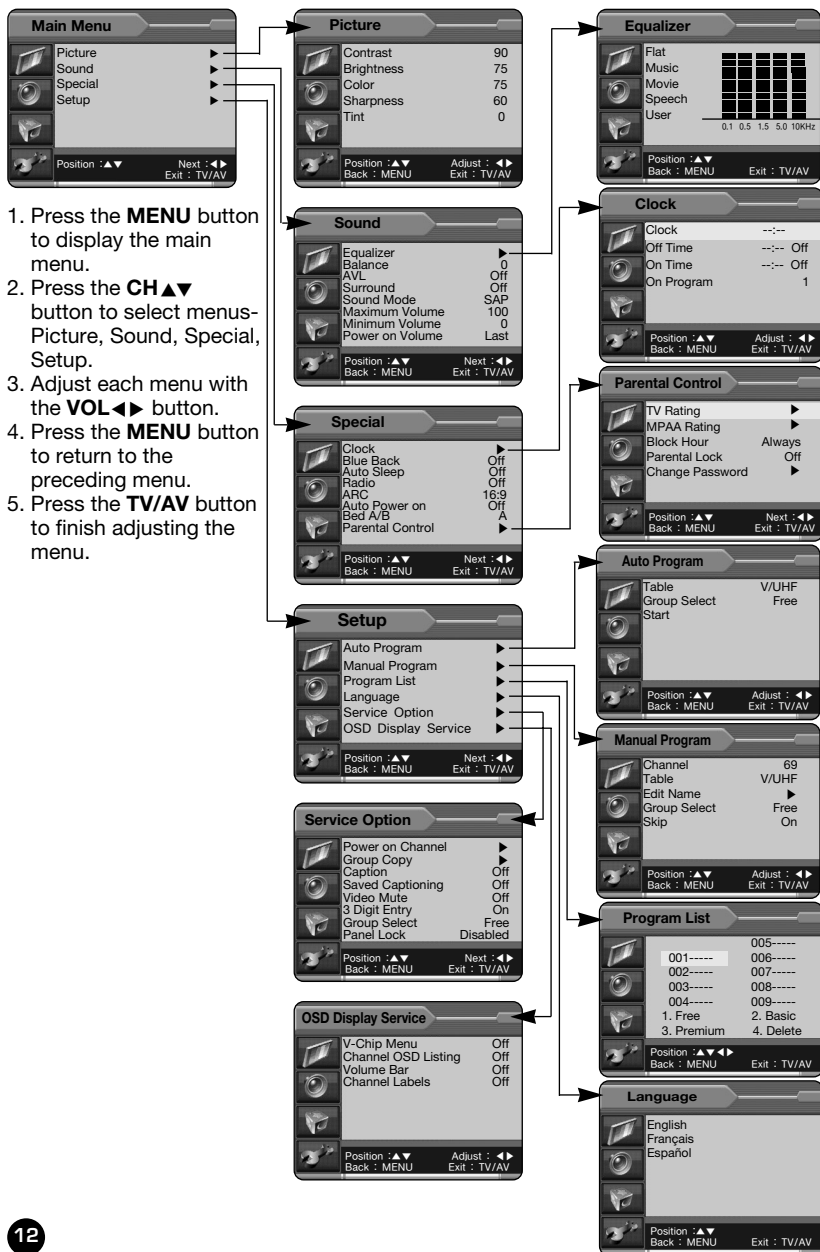
The menu can be displayed on the screen in desired language. First, select your language.

1. Press the **MENU** button.
2. Select the **Setup** menu.
3. Select the **Language** menu.
4. Press the **CH▲▼** button to select a language.
5. Press the **TV/AV** button.

All the on screen displays appear in the selected language.

Setting up a TV Programs

Once you have preset the programs, you can use the **CH▲▼** or **NUMBER** buttons to scan the programs. Programs can be tuned using automatic or manual modes.

Auto Program

Automatically memorizes all of the receivable channels on a hospital's cable TV system.

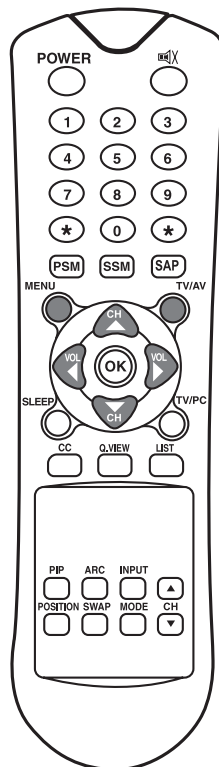
Press the **MENU** button on the remote.



1. Press the **CH▲▼** button to select **Table**.
2. Press the **VOL◀▶** button to select the TV cable system in your hospital.
Table = V/UHF is used for a cable system that has a master antenna and usually can receive only local TV stations.
Table = Cable is used when a hospital cable system has both local and satellite TV channels available. Cable Table is most common in hospital TV cable systems.
3. Select the **Group Select** menu with the **CH▲▼** button. Press the **VOL◀▶** button to select a group.
4. Press the **CH▲▼** button to select the **Start** menu.
5. Press the **VOL◀▶** button to an auto program-selected group. The TV searches all available channels looking for signals and memorizes active channels. Occasionally, strong over-the-air stations sneak onto the cable system.
To remove unwanted channels, see **Manual Program**.
6. Press the **MENU** button to finish auto programming.
7. Press the **TV/AV** button to return to normal TV viewing.

Note;

- Press the **CH▲▼** buttons to review the memorized channels after auto programming is finished.
- If you press the **MENU** button during auto programming, the function stops and only channels programmed up to that point in remain.



Setting up a TV Programs

Manual Program

Manual Program lets you manually add or delete channels.

1. Tune to the channel you want to add or delete.

Press the **MENU** button.

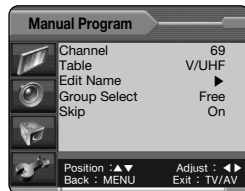
2. Select the **Setup** menu.

3. Select the **Manual Program** menu.

4. Press the **VOL** ◀▶ buttons or number buttons to select a channel.

5. Press the **CH** ▲▼ button to select **Table**.

6. Press the **CH** ▲▼ button to select **Edit name** and press the **VOL** ◀▶ button repeatedly to edit the program name.



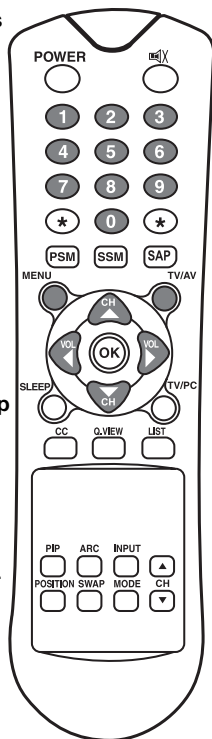
You can use 0 to 9 and A to Z(capital and lowercase), space, and hyphen(-).

7. Select the **Group Select** menu with the **CH** ▲▼ button. Press the **VOL** ◀▶ button to select group.

8. Select **Skip** On or Off with the **VOL** ◀▶ button. With **Skip** On, the current channel is be removed from the TV's memory and is not be available for viewing.

With **Skip** Off, the current channel is be saved in the TV's memory. The deleted channel can still be viewed by directly entering the channel's number using the IR remote's keypad.

9. Press the **TV/AV** button to return to normal TV viewing.



Setting up a TV Programs

Program List

The program list displays channel information and a select group of channels.

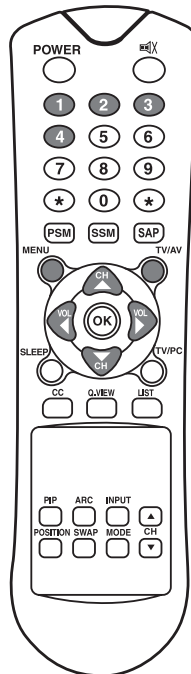
1. Press the **MENU** button.
2. Select the **Setup** menu.
3. Select the **Program List** menu with the **CH▲▼** and **VOL◀▶** buttons.
4. Select a group of channels with the **CH▲▼** or **VOL◀▶** button.
5. Press the digit number of each corresponding group.
6. Press the digit number of each deleted corresponding group.



Paging through a Program list

When the set is in TV mode, there are seven program table pages that contain 69 programs. When the set is cable mode, there are 13 program table pages that contain 125 programs.

Pressing the **CH▲▼** or **VOL◀▶** button repeatedly to turn the pages.



Picture Control

You can adjust picture **Contrast**, **Brightness**, **Colour**, **Sharpness** and **Tint** to the levels you prefer.

Manual Picture Control

1. Press the **MENU** button.
2. Select the **Picture** menu.
3. Press the **CH▲▼** button select a picture item.
4. Press the **VOL◀▶** button to adjust the picture condition as you want.
5. Press the **TV/AV** button to store for the picture **User**.

Contrast	More darkness VOL◀ 0~100 ▶VOL More light
Brightness	Less bright VOL◀ 0~100 ▶VOL More bright

Auto Picture Control

*The Picture options - Dynamic, Standard, Mild and Game are programd for good picture reproduction at the factory and cannot be changed.

PSM (Picture Status Memory)

1. Press the **PSM** button.
2. Press the **PSM** button repeatedly to select [PSM].

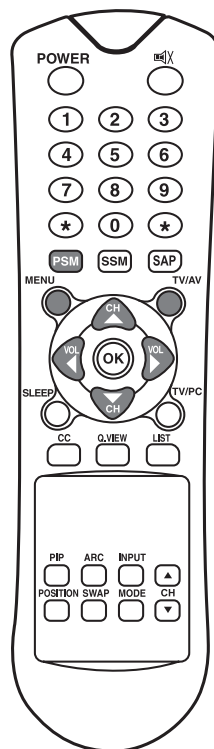
Each press of the button changes the screen display as below.

Dynamic → Standard → Mild → Game → User



- **Dynamic** : Vivid Picture Appearance
- **Standard** : Standard Picture Appearance
- **Mild** : Softer Picture Appearance
- **Game** : External Video Game Picture Setup
- **User** : Manual Picture Setup

Note. In PC mode, **PSM** function isn't available.

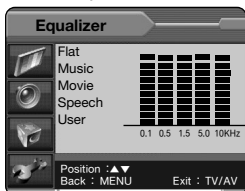


Sound Control

You can select your preferred sound setting- Flat, Music, Movie, Speech

Equalizer

1. Press the **MENU** button on the remote.
2. Select the **Sound** menu.
3. Press the **CH▲▼** button and select **Equalizer**.
4. A listing of available frequency bands and current settings will be displayed.
5. The Flat, Music, Movie, and Speech settings are factory preset sound modes and cannot be adjusted. Select **User** to adjust and customize the sound equalization.



6. Press the **VOL◀▶** button to select the desired sound band.
7. Press the **CH▲▼** button to adjust the strength of sound for that particular sound band. Alternately, press **VOL◀▶** to select the next desired sound band and adjust with the **CH▲▼** button.
8. Press the **MENU** button to return to the preceding Menu and the **TV/AV** button to return to normal TV viewing.

SSM-Sound Status Memory

Selection of the factory preset sound modes and user mode is available directly using the remote control.

1. Press the **SSM** button to display the current Sound Equalizer setting.
2. Press the **SSM** button repeatedly to advance and select a different equalizer setting.

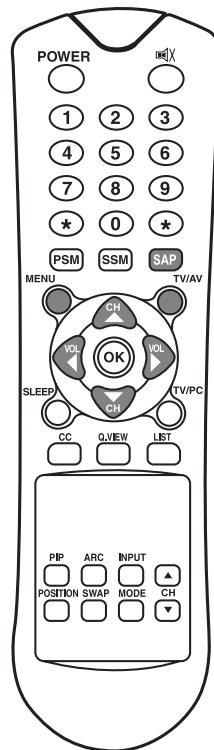
Flat → Music → Movie → Speech → User

3. Press the **OK** button to accept the current selection.

Balance

Adjusts the sound balance from the left and right speakers mounted in the TV. Balance has no effect on the pillow speaker.

1. Press the **MENU** button.
2. Select **Sound** from the menu.
3. Press the **CH▲▼** button and select **Balance**.
4. Press **VOL◀▶** to adjust the sound balance from the TV. (L50~0~R50)
5. Press the **MENU** button to return to the preceding Menu and the **TV/AV** button to return to normal TV viewing.



Sound Control

AVL

Automatic volume level control is available through this setting. If you switch AVL on, the TV automatically maintains the volume level, even when you change the channel. It is limited to two-thirds of maximum loudness. This feature prevents sound blasting during commercials.

1. Press the **MENU** button.
2. Select **Sound**.
3. Press the **CH ▲▼** button to select **AVL**.
4. Press **VOL ◀▶** to select **On** or **Off**.
5. Press the **MENU** button to return to the preceding menu and the **TV/AV** button to return to normal TV viewing.

Sound Mode

You can select the type of sound generated by the television.

1. Press the **MENU** button.
2. Select **Sound** from the menu.
3. Press the **CH ▲▼** button and select **Sound Mode**.
4. Press **VOL ◀▶** to select the type of sound generated by the television TV.

STEREO	Discrete left and right audio channels heard through both the left and right TV speakers.
MONO	Single channel of sound heard through both the left and right TV speakers.
SAP	Secondary Audio Program – Used for bi-lingual programs. Note: The viewed program channel must be encoded with a SAP signal for this mode to work.

5. Press the **MENU** button to return to the preceding menu and the **TV/AV** button to return to normal TV viewing.
Alternately, the type of sound can be set using the remote control's **SAP** button.

Maximum Volume

If you set Maximum Volume, the volume cannot be higher than the maximum volume.

1. Press the **MENU** button.
2. Select **Sound** from the menu.
3. Press the **CH ▲▼** button and select **Maximum Volume**.
4. Press the **VOL ◀▶** button to determine the allowable maximum volume level.

Minimum Volume

If you set Minimum Volume, the volume cannot be lower than the minimum volume.

1. Press the **MENU** button.
2. Select **Sound** from the menu.
3. Press the **CH ▲▼** button and select **Minimum Volume**.
4. Press the **VOL ◀▶** button to determine the allowable minimum volume level.

Power on Volume

1. Press the **MENU** button.
2. Select **Sound** from the menu.
3. Press the **CH ▲▼** button and select **Power on Volume**.
4. Press the **VOL ◀▶** button to determine your preferred volume when the TV turns on.

Special Functions

Clock

You must set the clock in order to use the timer features.
You can set an automatic TV **On** or **Off** time.

1. Press the **MENU** button.
2. Press the **CH▲▼** button to select the **Special** menu.
3. Press the **VOL◀▶** button to select the **Clock** menu.



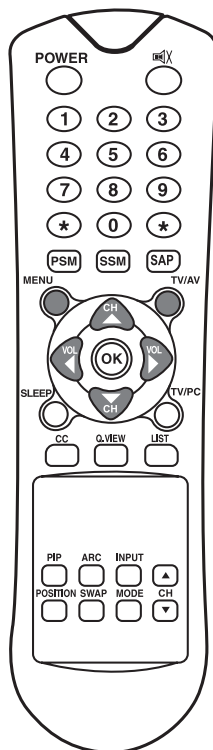
4. Set the present time with the numeric buttons and the **CH▲▼** button on the remote controller. Store a time value between 00:00 ... 23:59(hours:minutes)
5. Press the **CH▲▼** button to select **Off Time**.
6. Set the TV off time with the numeric buttons and the **CH▲▼** button and press the **VOL◀▶** button. Select **On** or **Off** with **CH▲▼** button.(When the setting is off, the TV set is be switched off to stand-by mode.)
7. Press the **CH▲▼** button to select **On Time**.
8. Set the TV on time with the numeric buttons and the **CH▲▼** button and press the **VOL◀▶** button. Select **On** or **Off** with **CH▲▼** button. When the setting is On, the set is switched On automatically to the last selected program.
9. Press the **CH▲▼** button to select **On Program**.
You can select the first displayed program with the **VOL◀▶** button when the set is automatically switched on.
10. Press the **TV/AV** button to return to normal TV viewing.

Note. To use the clock function, the current time must be set.

Blue Back

If no signal is received or if the signal is weak, a blue screen automatically replaces the noisy picture background.

If you want to continue viewing the poor picture, you select **Blue Back On**.
(Press the **VOL◀▶** button to alternate between on and off)



Special Functions

Auto Sleep

If you select **Auto Sleep On**, the set automatically switches to standby mode approximately ten minutes after a TV channel stops broadcasting.

1. Press the **MENU** button.
2. Select the **Special** menu.
3. Press the **CH ▲ ▼** button to select **Auto Sleep**.
4. Press the **VOL ◀ ▶** button to select **On**.
5. Press the **TV/AV** button to return to normal TV viewing.

Note. If the set connects with the external input source in the middle of a lapse of 10 minutes after a TV channel stops broadcasting, the auto sleep function is automatically canceled.

Radio

You can listen to the radio over the TV.

1. Press the **MENU** button.
2. Press the **CH ▲ ▼** button to select the **Special** menu and press the **VOL ◀ ▶** button.
3. Press the **CH ▲ ▼** button to select Radio.
4. Press the **VOL ◀ ▶** button to select Radio **On** or **Off**.

Note. When the setting is **On**, you can adjust the radio function in radio mode. (see page 29)

ARC (Aspect Ratio Control)

You can watch TV in various picture formats; **16:9**, **14:9**, **4:3**, **16:9 Zoom**, **14:9 Zoom**, **4:3 Zoom**.

Repeatedly press the **ARC** button to select a picture format.

16:9 For cinema or general TV programs.

The 16:9 screen is viewed as is but a 4:3 screen is magnified to the left and right so that the screen is filled.

14:9 The 14:9 screen is viewed as it. The 4:3 screen is magnified to the upper/lower and left/right.

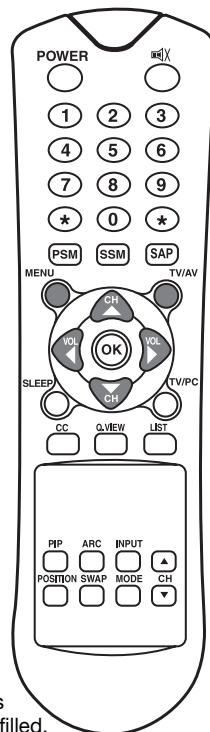
4:3 This picture format is standard 4:3.

16:9 Zoom Magnifies the size of the picture on screen 16:9.

14:9 Zoom Magnifies the size of the picture on screen 14:9.

4:3 Zoom Magnifies the size of the picture on screen 4:3.

Note. In **Zoom** mode, you can adjust the position of the picture with the **CH ▲ ▼** button. (The ARc information must be displayed on screen.)



Special Functions

Auto Power On

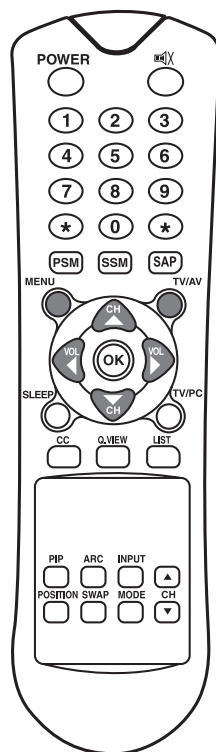
The TV turns on and stays on when stays electrical power is applied to the set.

1. Press the **MENU** button.
2. Press the **CH ▲▼** button to select the **Special** menu and press the **VOL ◀▶** button.
3. Press the **CH ▲▼** button to select **Auto Power on**.
4. Press the **VOL ◀▶** button to select on or off.

Bed A/B

You can select remote control A or B.

1. Press the **MENU** button.
2. Press the **CH ▲▼** button to select the **Special** menu and press the **VOL ◀▶** buttons.
3. Press the **CH ▲▼** button to select **Bed A/B**.
4. Press the **VOL ◀▶** button to select remote control A or B.



Parental Control

1. Press the **MENU** button.
2. Select the **Special** menu.
3. Press the **CH▲▼** button to select Parental Control, and press the **VOL◀▶** button. (Parental Control is displayed when the setting for the OSD Display service menu is V-Chip Off.)
4. The “Enter Password” screen is displayed. Enter your 4-digit password.

Note : The default Input password for a new TV set is “0000” the “Parental Control” screen is displayed.



5. Use the **VOL◀▶** and **CH▲▼** buttons to select and adjust or set the rating for the TV or MPAA.
6. Press the **VOL◀▶** button to select the TV rating and press the **CH▲▼** button to move to one of the six age-based categories, Press the **VOL◀▶** button to move to one of the levels in each row.
7. At this point, one of the TV-Ratings is selected. Press the **CH▲▼** button.
Depending on your existing setup, U or B is highlighted. (U=Unblocked, B=Blocked)
8. While the U or B is highlighted, press the **VOL◀▶** button to the block or unblock the category.
9. To select a different TV rating press the **CH▲▼** buttons with the cursor in the first column.
10. Press the **VOL◀▶** button to select the MPAA rating and press the **CH▲▼** buttons to select a particular MPAA rating.
Press the **VOL◀▶** button to change the U or B.
11. If you want to change your password, select the Change Password menu. Enter your new password.
Re-enter the same 4 digits. Press the OK button to memorize your new password.
