Taxeia Technology Co., Ltd. requests acceptance of the labeling proposal described below for cell phone bearing FCC identifier RHLTT230.

The subject device are compact handheld model as shown in figure 1, authorized under 47CFR Part 15C for 2.4G services.

Because the majority of the presenter housing is composed of keys, operating controls and a removable battery pack, there is extremely limited space available to attach the required label carrying the FCC identifier. Attaching the label to the battery pack is not acceptable because the battery pack is a removable item. For this reason, Taxeia Technology Co., Ltd. proposes placing the label carrying the FCC identifier beside the battery compartment as shown in figure 2.

The consumer packaging for these models includes the battery pack as a separate item, NOT installed on the radio. As such, the FCC identifier will be readily visible to the user before the battery pack is installed and whenever the battery pack is removed or replaced. In this location, the label will also be protected from physical abuse and remain readable for the anticipated life of the device.

The consumer packaging for these models is a "gift box" which does not allow the transceiver to be seen at time of purchase. In order to meet the requirements of 47CFR Part 2.925 (d), Taxeia Technology Co., Ltd. will add the FCC identifier " RHLTT230 " to the outside of the consumer "gift box" packaging.
