I request permanent confidentiality on the schematics pursuant to CFR47 Part 0.457 as a TRADE SECRET. Dishtronix is applying for patent protection on a number of engineering and design features and technology developed in this solid state amplifier. This amplifier is unique in a number of ways and there is no other unit like it on the market. This unit represents a significant financial investment of 7 calendar years of research and development and the associated costs of many failures. To disseminate the schematic diagrams, internal photographs, manuals, parts list, test results, etc. would give a competitor an unfair advantage and very great head start on developing a competing unit and cause certain financial damage and loss of sales to Dishtronix Incorporated.

I request short term confidentiality on the user manual because it contains information that could be helpful to business competitors and this product is obviously not on the market yet, because it must be Type Certified by you and because we are not ready for production. Hence this information is not in the public domain at least until the first unit is sold.
