After a review of the submitted information, I have a few comments on the above referenced Application.

- 1) The information regarding the card installed in the device shows that it was originally approved at 375 mW, while this device is approved only for 51 mW. This is an 8.6 dB difference in output power. This implies that the device was not tested at full output power for FCC testing and would require additional testing. Further information such as retesting or explanation for this power difference must be provided and how it will be controlled/limited to the approved power must be provided. Additionally, please note that once approved the device is specified to have a maximum output power which can not be adjusted. Please review and provide information as necessary.
- 2) Page 45 still mentions measurements < 1 GHz were made at 10 m. However limits appear to be shown at 3 meters and test photos seem to support 3 meter. Please explain at what distance measurements were made and if made at 10 meters, where are correction factors applied.
- 3) Page 46 still mentions measurements > 1 GHz were made at 10 m. Due to FCC rules, limits, and dynamic range issues this is highly unusual. Additionally, limits are cited as 3 meter. Please explain.
