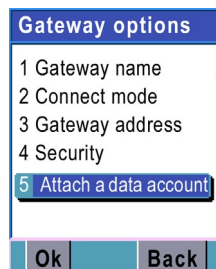
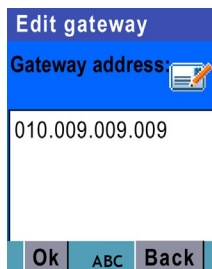


11. Enter the IP Address→ Attach a Data Account

16.3 About the WAP Browser

WAP Browser is WAP1.2.1 and 2.0 compliant. It has a timeout timer to automatically stop connection when gateway and browser fail to connect.

During WAP Connection

- Calls are forwarded to voicemail box.
- SMS forwarded to Inbox for later viewing.
- Alarm flashes instead of ring.
- SIM Toolkit events shuts down WAP connection and take control of phone.

Using WAP Browser

- Press Left...key to access WAP Browsing menu.
- Press Right...key to access WML card.
- Press SEND to confirm link.
- Press END to return to previous page.
- Press and hold END to disconnect.
- Use Arrow key to navigate.

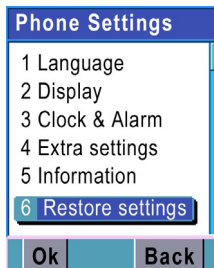

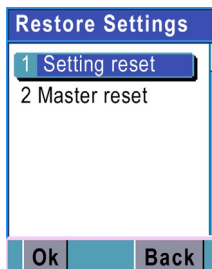

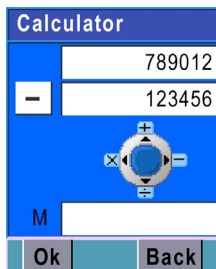
18. Tools

Tools menu contains additional features: Calculator, Currency Converter, Memo and To Do Lists.

18.1 Calculator

Using Calculator for simple operation (+, -, x, /)

1. Go to Tools → Calculator.
2. Enter number in first line.
3. Press Arrow key for corresponding operation.
4. Enter number in second line.
5. Press **OK** for results or **Clr** to delete entry.
6. Repeat to continue with second operation.
7. Press **BACK** to return to first operation and **Clr** to delete entry.
8. Press **BACK** to return to menu.



Arrow key for 4 operations:

Arrow Key	Operation
UP	- (subtraction)
RIGHT	+ (addition)
DOWN	/ (division)
LEFT	X (multiplication)

Using Calculator for extended operation (memory, negative features)

1. Perform operation as above.
2. Press # and enter memory operations.

N.B. Memorised number (if any) will be displayed at the bottom of display.



Arrow key for memory operations:

Arrow Key	Operation
UP	MR (memory reset)
RIGHT	+/- (add or remove negative sign)
DOWN	MS (memory store)
LEFT	MC (memory clear)

Entering numbers

Enter number using keypad numbers 0-9 and * key for decimal point.

N.B. Some results may be rounded off and some computation may be impossible.

18.2 Currency converter

This function allows conversion from one currency to another as follows:

1. Enter abbreviation of currency to be converted (3 letters) e.g. USD (US Dollar)
2. Enter abbreviation of result currency (3 letters) e.g. FRF (French Franc).
3. Press **Rate** to enter currency exchange rate, using numbers 0-9 and * for decimal.
4. For conversion from USD into FRF, press UP Arrow key and enter USD amount. The equivalent FRF is automatically displayed.
5. For conversion from FRF into USD, press DOWN Arrow key and enter FRF amount. The equivalent USD is automatically displayed.

18.3 Memos

Memo is a text-based note taking function. After writing the memo, press **Save** to store the memo. Press **Menu** to view, edit, add, delete memo. Up to maximum 50 memos can be stored, to check capacity, choose Check capacity in menu.

18.4 To do list

Up to 50 to-do-lists can be stored as the reminder.
The menu gives the following options:

Option	Description
View	View to-do-list and check to-do-list.
Edit	Edit the content of to-do-list, set the priority as high/low, the date of to-do-list and the status of checking.
Add	Add new to-do-list
Delete	Delete the selected to-do-list
Delete all	Delete all the to-do-lists
Display all	Display the to-do-list according to the type, e.g. all to-do-list, all checked to-do-list, all unchecked to-do-list, all low priority to-do-list or all high priority to-do-list.
Check capacity	Check capacity used and remaining.
Uncheck	Uncheck to-do-lists.



19. Security

Activate/Deactivate Phone Lock

1. To deactivate Phone Lock, enter 4 digit phone code (default : 0000).
2. Press **Clr** to delete current digit and then **Ok** confirm the phone code.

Phone Code change

1. Enter current phone code (default : 0000), press **Ok**.
2. Enter new phone code and press **Ok** to validate.
3. Enter new phone code again to confirm, then press **Ok** to store new phone code.

PIN Options

1. The SIM card is protected from unauthorised usage by PIN code (PIN1).
2. This code is supplied by the service provider and must be kept secret.
3. Once PIN1 is enabled, user will have to enter PIN1 code to operate phone. PIN1 can be disabled or changed by the user.
4. PIN2 code is an extension of the PIN1 used to access to some SIM related functions. PIN2 is supplied by network operator and cannot be disabled.

Activate/Deactivate PIN1

1. To deactivate PIN1, enter 4 digit phone code.
2. Press **Clr** to delete current digit and the **Ok** confirm the phone code.

N.B. Some SIM card does not allow the user to deactivate the PIN1 code.

PIN1 change

1. Enter current PIN1 code, press **Ok**.
2. Enter new PIN1 code and press **Ok** to validate. Enter new PIN1 code again to confirm, then press **Ok** to store new PIN1 code.
3. Press **Back** to end change procedure.

PIN2 change

1. Enter current PIN2 code, press **Ok**.
2. Enter new PIN2 code and press **Ok** to validate. Enter new PIN2 code again to confirm, then press **Ok** to store new PIN2 code.
3. Press **Back** to end change procedure.



Keypad lock

1. Protects against unintentional calls.
2. To quick lock keypad, press # key in the main menu.
3. To unlock keypad (if lock code is activated), press Lock Icon, then enter lock code and press **Ok**.
4. To unlock keypad (if lock code is not activated), press **Lock Icon**, then press # key.



Manual lock

1. Enable keypad to be manually locked.
2. To unlock manual lock, press # key. Opening and closing the slider cannot unlock the manual lock.

Automatic lock

1. Enable keypad to be automatically locked after 30 seconds in idle mode.
2. Select (On/Off) from menu to activate this function. Use Arrow keys to select.
3. Press **Ok** to activate/deactivate this function and the **Back** to return to Keypad lock menu.

Lock code

1. Select (On/Off) from menu to activate this function. Use Arrow keys to select.
2. Press **Ok** to activate/deactivate this function and the **Back** to return to Keypad lock menu.

Fixed dialing

1. Controls which outgoing calls can be made from phone.
2. Availability depends user's subscription and the SIM card used.
3. Press **Ok** to activate/deactivate this function and the **Back** to return to menu.



Closed User Group (CUG)

- Enables subscribers to form closed user groups to and from which access is restricted.
- Each CUG is identified by a unique number (CUG index) of up to 5 digits between 0 and 32767. A user can be a member of up to 10 CUG and the CUG index are given by the service provider.

Select group

1. Enter and select the group.
2. Use Arrow keys to display the stored indexes.
3. Press **Back** to return to CUG menu.
4. To activate, modify or delete a group, press **Menu** and select action.
5. Press **Ok** to confirm action or **Back** to cancel.

Preferential

- Subject to user subscription to Preferential CUG option.

Suppress options

- Subject to user subscription to Outgoing Access or Preferential CUG option, allows suppress options.

Outgoing access

1. Select from menu to activate/deactivate this function.
2. Press **Ok** to activate/deactivate this function and the **Back** to return to Suppress options menu.

Preferential

1. Select from menu to activate/deactivate this function.
2. Press **Ok** to activate/deactivate this function and the **Back** to return to Suppress options menu.

None

1. Subject to user subscription to Outgoing Access.
2. Press **Ok** to activate/deactivate this function and the **Back** to return to Security menu.



20. Network Services

Call divert

Allows incoming calls to be automatically diverted to another number upon particular conditions.

Activate Call Divert

1. Select conditions of divert

- All calls (unconditional divert),
- Busy (when the line is busy),
- No reply (ringing but no answer),
- Unreachable (phone is switched off outside network coverage).
- Use UP / DOWN keys to select conditions.
- Press **Ok** to confirm conditions and **Back** to return to Call divert menu.

2. Type of calls to transfer

- For each condition, user can divert incoming call to different number depending on the type of call received i.e. All calls (voice, fax and data calls),
- Voice calls (only), Fax calls (only), Data calls (only).
- Use UP / DOWN keys to select call type.
- Press **Ok** to confirm call type and **Back** to return to previous menu.

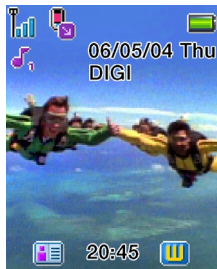
3. Divert number

- Enter the number to which the calls will be transferred.
- Use **Clr** to delete, press **Ok** to confirm and **Back** to return to previous step menu.

N.B. When the condition 'unconditional divert' is activated, a specific call divert icon indicator is displayed in idle mode.

Status

- Allows the user to check the status of activated diverts.
- Use Arrow keys to check information.
- Press **Back** to return to Call divert menu.





Call barring

- A network feature which bars outgoing/incoming calls to/from phone.
- To activate, requires a network code supplied by network provider.

Activate / Deactivate Call Barring

1. Select conditions of call barring:

- All outgoing calls,
- International outgoing calls (outgoing call to a foreign country),
- All incoming calls,
- Roaming calls (when the phone is registered on a foreign network),
- International but to home country (Only allows calls to the user's home country).
- Use Arrow keys to select conditions.
- Press **Ok** to confirm conditions **Back** to return to Call barring menu.

2. Type of calls to bar

- For each condition, user can bar calls depending on the type i.e. All calls (voice, fax and data calls), Voice calls (only), Fax calls (only), Data calls (only).
- Use Arrow keys to select call type.
- Press **Ok** to confirm call type and **Back** to return to previous menu.
- Wait for activation request from network, enter code supplied by network provider.
- Press **Ok**.

Status

- Allows the user to check the status of activated barring.
- Use Arrow keys to check information.
- Press **Back** to return to Call barring menu.

Change network code

- Call barring is protected by a network code.
- To change, user will have to enter his current network code, then enter the new code and finally to confirm this new code.
- Use **Clr** to delete, press **Ok** to confirm.



Call waiting

- Subject to user subscription.
- Feature may be activated/deactivated.

Status

- Allows the user to check the status of call waiting.

Caller ID

- Subject to used subscription, can choose to withhold phone identity/number on outgoing calls.
- Use Arrow keys to select:
- Default,
- Withhold ID,
- Send ID.
- Press **Ok** to confirm option and **Back** to return to the Net services menu.

Status

- Allows the user to check the status of Caller ID
- Press **Ok** to return check Caller ID status and **Back** to return to the Net services menu.

Preferred Networks

- Allows user to select preferred networks list

Network selection

- 2 networks selection modes where a list of the existing network in the area is displayed.

Automatic

- If phone is not subscribed to selected network, the phone will automatically search for others networks and automatically register with most appropriate network.

Manual

- Phone will attempt to register with selected network, the phone will not automatically search for others networks.
- If unable to register with selected network, the phone will stay in Emergency calls only mode.



Network access mode

GSM only

- Phone will operate on GSM features only. The SMS access, GPRS data accounts and WAP with GPRS menus won't appear.
- Useful if GPRS service is not available.

GSM and GPRS

- Phone will operate on GSM and GPRS features.

21. SIM Application Tool Kit

Allows users to access to the SIM applications.

Refer to network operator for more detailed information.



22. TROUBLESHOOTING

UNABLE TO SWITCH ON

- Press and hold On/Off key for 3 seconds.
- Charge battery for minimum 15 minutes.
- Battery charging icon should appear on screen when battery is charging. If not, disconnect and plug in again.
- If problem persist, contact authorised dealer.

BATTERY STATUS UNKNOWN

- Check if battery is correctly installed.

LOW BATTERY

- Phone will switch off automatically.
- Charge battery.

SIM NOT PRESENT

- Ensure SIM card is properly inserted, check for any damage.
- If problem persists, contact authorised dealer.

INCORRECT PIN

- Incorrect PIN keyed in.
- Caution: after 3 attempts, SIM card will be locked.

SIM LOCKED

- Enter PUK code to unlock the SIM card and key in the following sequence:
**05*PUK*PIN*PIN#
- Caution: after 10 attempts, SIM card will be permanently locked.
- If problem persists, contact network operator.

SIM (NETWORK) LOCK

- Phone usage limited to particular network operator only.
- Insert compatible SIM card supplied by network operator.
- If problem persists, contact network operator.

NO CALL CONNECTION

- Ensure correct number dialled, with proper prefix e.g. area code.
- Check the status of your credit.
- Ensure SIM Card in use offers the service you are requesting and check its validity.
- Check and deactivate any outgoing calls restriction.
- Network overload. Try later.



- If the text "Emergency call only" appears, only emergency services can be called.
- If problem persists, contact Network Operator.

NO CALL RECEPTION

- Make incoming call to phone to check if phone and network are operational.
- Check and deactivate permanent call forwarding.
- Check and deactivate incoming calls restriction.
- If problem persists, contact your Network Operator.

UNABLE TO SEND MESSAGES

- Ensure that SIM card in use offers this service.
- Make incoming call to phone to check if phone and network are operational.
- Check if Message Centre number is properly configured according to Network Operator requirement. (Refer to Messages section of this menu).

NO VOICE MESSAGE

- Ensure that SIM card in use offers this service.
- Check that Voice mailbox number is properly configured according to Network Operator requirement. (Go to the Messages menu → Voicemail).

WAP USAGE:

SERVER NOT ANSWERING

- Switch phone off and on again.

UNABLE TO LOG ON TO HOMEPAGE

- Go to WAP Services menu and clear the cache.

OPERATOR NAME DOES NOT APPEAR ON SCREEN

- Go into the Settings menu → Networks → Selection → select preferred operator.

SWITCH TO SILENT MODE

- Press and hold * key until ringing icon changes to silent icon.

ENVELOPE ICON ON SCREEN

- Envelope icon indicates unread message(s).
- To remove icon, go to Messages menu to read messages.

INCREASING PHONE EFFICIENCY

- Perform memory de-fragmentation regularly (Go to Multimedia menu → Defragmenter).



23. FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ)

What is roaming?

Roaming allows subscribers to move from one cell to another or from one network to another on one account.

What is APN?

Access Point Name and is basically an URL address on the Mobile Internet.

What is GPRS?

General Packet Radio System is a service protocol built on GSM technology. GPRS allows several mobile phone users to share the same connection. Charges are based on the amount of data transferred rather than on airtime.

What is CSD? (This phone uses 'GSM' instead of CSD)

Circuit Switched Data is a wireless service protocol used for WAP. CSD will enable continuous connection and payment based on the duration of the data call.

What is SIM?

Subscriber Identity Module is the chip embedded plastic card provided by your network operator containing data identifying the subscriber.

What is PIN?

Personal Identification Number controls access to your phone. Your SIM card comes with a default PIN that you can set to your personalised PIN.

What is PUK?

Personal Unblocking Key is a code that unblocks your SIM card. Your SIM Card can be blocked if an incorrect PIN is entered 3 times in a row.

What is IMEI?

International Mobile Equipment Identifier and is a system that identifies each phone by a specific number. If a phone is stolen, the IMEI system is able to block its usage on all network operators that support the system.

What is DTMF?

Dual Tone Multi Frequency is a paging and remote control protocol that allows you to control certain functions via your phone, e.g. listening to your answering machine.

**What is CB?**

Cell Broadcast is a service from your network operator. With CB, you can receive traffic information, weather reports, news, sports, etc. sent to you as text messages.

What is WAP?

Wireless Application Protocol is a standard that allows you to access parts of the Internet, known as "Mobile Internet" via your cell phone. Using WAP will open many services to you, i.e. ordering services and goods, accessing databases, etc.

What is an URL?

Uniform Resource Locator is an address system used on the Internet. All WAP homepages have a unique address, allowing browsers to distinguish one from the other. An URL always starts with the text string: <http://wap> followed by the address.
