4. How to Use Battery

① Inserting the Battery




Insert the bottom of the battery into the slot.




Push the battery in the direction of the arrow until it clicks into place.

② Removing the Battery



Pull the catch in the direction of the arrow.



Lift the battery away in the direction of the arrow.



5. How to Charge the Battery

If you charge the battery while it is attached to your phone.



 TTA licensed standard charger

- Make sure to charge the battery fully before using the phone for the first time after purchase, because it is not fully charged at purchase.
- Make sure to charge and keep the battery at room temperature.
- Install the charger where it is convenient for you to use.
- Separate the battery from the charger or unplug the charger if you have finished using it after the charging lamp turns green(charging completed).

What's TTA?

TTA (Telecommunications Technology Association) is a IT standards organization in South Korea. It develops new standards and provides one-stop services for the establishment of IT standards as well as providing testing and certification for IT products.

Switching the Phone On/Off

1 To Switch the Phone On



- The following screen will appear after the animation when the phone is in service.

Answering a Call

① To Answer an Incoming Call



- ① When you hear a ring
- ② Open the flip and start to talk. When you finish, close the flip or press .

Caller ID Identification Service Function

Your service provider should be contacted if you want to use the Caller ID Identification Service. Caller ID Identification Services may differ or may not be provided depending on the caller's call service status. Contact your local service provider for more details.

② To not answer an Incoming Call

Press and hold .

- If you fail to answer a call within a period of time, it will switch to the voice message system.
- Switches to Mute (Mamp) even if your phone is set to ring, vibration or etiquette function
- Open the flip if you want to answer a call. Press any key if the flip is already open. (Except the End key)

③ If Voice Answer function is set (see pages 114~117)


Switches to Voice Answer mode after a given time when the caller makes a call to you.

What is the Manage Message Function?

You can use functions such as text message, voice message, phone page, and message box setup with your phone.

Message Box – You can check incoming text and voice messages.
– Stores the message created in the New Message menu, or messages that couldn't be sent.
