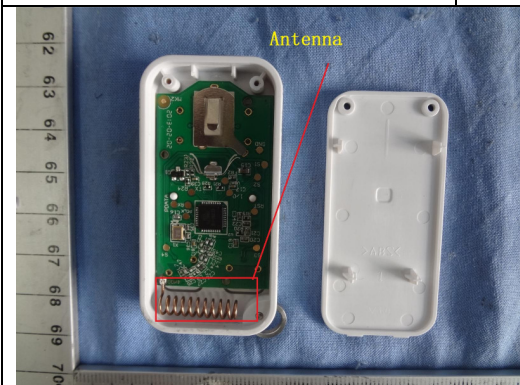



Test Procedure:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) The mains terminal disturbance voltage test was conducted in a shielded room.</li><li>2) The EUT was connected to AC power source through a LISN 1 (Line Impedance Stabilization Network) which provides a <math>50\Omega/50\mu\text{H} + 5\Omega</math> linear impedance. The power cables of all other units of the EUT were connected to a second LISN 2, which was bonded to the ground reference plane in the same way as the LISN 1 for the unit being measured. A multiple socket outlet strip was used to connect multiple power cables to a single LISN provided the rating of the LISN was not exceeded.</li><li>3) The tabletop EUT was placed upon a non-metallic table 0.8m above the ground reference plane. And for floor-standing arrangement, the EUT was placed on the horizontal ground reference plane,</li><li>4) The test was performed with a vertical ground reference plane. 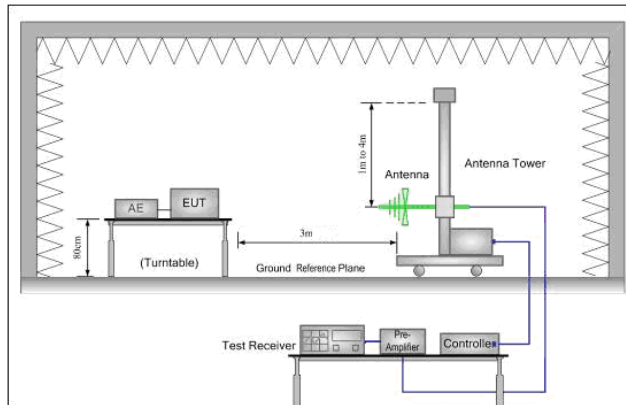


Figure 1. 30MHz to 1GHz

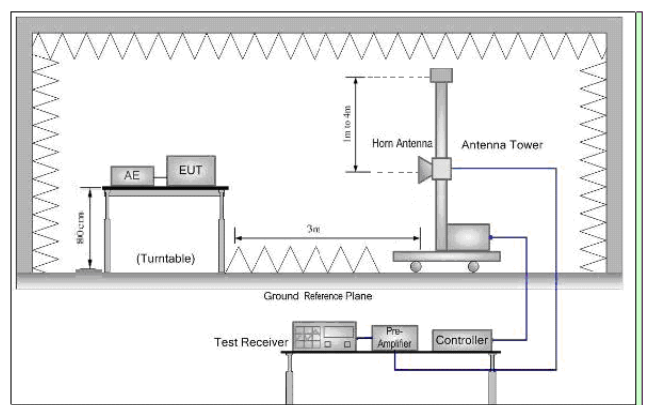


Figure 2. Above 1 GHz

Test Procedure:	<p>a. The EUT was placed on the top of a rotating table 0.8 meters above the ground at a 3 meter semi-anechoic chamber. The table was rotated 360 degrees to determine the position of the highest radiation.</p> <p>b. The EUT was set 3 meters away from the interference-receiving antenna, which was mounted on the top of a variable-height antenna tower.</p> <p>c. 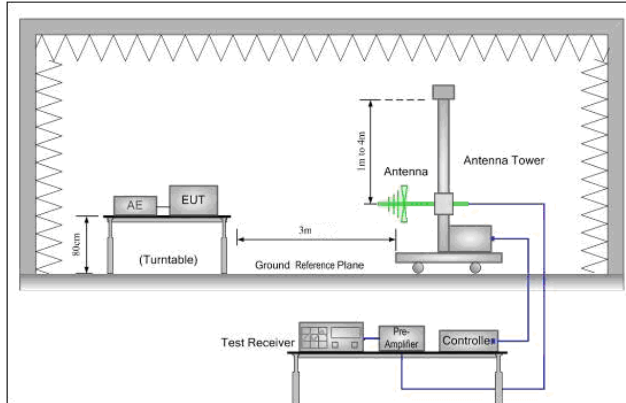


Figure 1. 30MHz to 1GHz

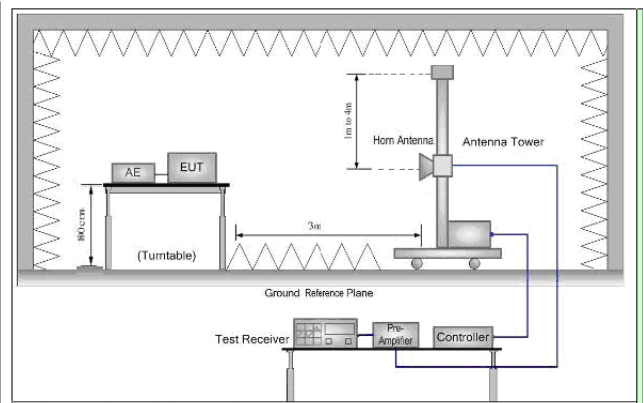


Figure 2. Above 1 GHz


