3) Equipment Function and Testing Procedures

The EUT is a 902-928 MHz radio transmitter used to transmit data to and from remote locations to a central control panel. The unit is marketed for use to incorporate a wireless link to exchange data information from one point to another. For testing purposes the transceiver was powered from the supplied AC power supply and set to transmit a maximum data packet. The unit operates from external supplied 5 volt direct current supplied from the AC/DC adapter. The device utilizes a permanently connected antenna system with no provision for user replacement.

4) Equipment and Cable Configurations

Conducted Emission Test Procedure

The unit typically operates from a user supplied 5 volt supply. For testing purposes, the manufacturer supplied five-volt wall transformer was used to power the unit. The test setup including the EUT was arranged in a typical equipment configuration and placed on a 1 x 1.5-meter wooden bench, 0.8 meters high located in a screen room. The power lines of the system were isolated from the power source using a standard LISN with a 50 - mHy choke. EMI was coupled to the spectrum analyzer through a 0.1 mF capacitor internal to the LISN. The LISN was positioned on the floor beneath the wooden bench supporting the EUT. The power lines and cables were draped over the back edge of the table.

Radiated Emission Test Procedure:

The EUT was placed on a rotating 1 x 1.5-meter wooden platform, 0.8 meters above the ground plane at a distance of 3 meters from the FSM antenna. EMI energy was maximized by equipment placement, raising and lowering the FSM antenna, changing the antenna polarization, and by rotating the turntable. Each emission was maximized before data was taken using a spectrum analyzer. Refer to photographs in the exhibits for EUT placement.

5) List of Test Equipment

A Hewlett Packard 8591EM Spectrum Analyzer was used as the measuring device for the emissions testing of frequencies below 1 GHz. A Hewlett Packard 8562A Spectrum Analyzer was used as the measuring device for testing the emissions at frequencies above 1 GHz. The analyzer settings used are described in the following table. Conducted EMI: The AC power line conducted emissions tests were performed in a shielded screen room located at Rogers Labs, Inc., 4405 W. 259th Terrace, Louisburg, KS.

Radiated EMI: The radiated emissions tests were performed at the 3 meters, Open Area Test Site (OATS) located at Rogers Labs, Inc., 4405 W. 259th Terrace, Louisburg, KS.

8) SUBPART B – UNINTENTIONAL RADIATORS

Conducted EMI

The EUT was arranged in a typical equipment configuration and placed on a 1 x 1.5 - meter wooden bench 80 cm above the conducting ground plane, floor of a screen room. The bench was positioned 40 cm away from the wall of the screen room. The LISN was positioned on the floor of the screen room 80-cm from the rear of the EUT. The manufacturer supplied AC power adapter for the EUT was connected to the LISN. A second LISN was positioned on the floor of the screen room 80-cm from the rear of the supporting equipment of the EUT. All power cords except the EUT were then powered from the second LISN. EMI was coupled to the spectrum analyzer through a 0.1 mF capacitor, internal to the LISN. Power line conducted emissions testing were carried out individually for each current carrying conductor of the EUT. The excess length of lead between the system and the LISN receptacle was folded back and forth to form a bundle not exceeding 40 cm in length. The screen room, conducting ground plane, analyzer, and LISN were bonded together to the protective earth ground. Preliminary testing was performed to identify the frequency of each radio frequency emission displaying the highest amplitude. The cables were repositioned to obtain maximum amplitude of measured EMI level. Once the worst-case configuration was identified, plots were made of the EMI from 0.15 MHz to 30 MHz then the data was recorded with maximum conducted emissions levels. Refer to figures one and two for plots of the conducted emissions.

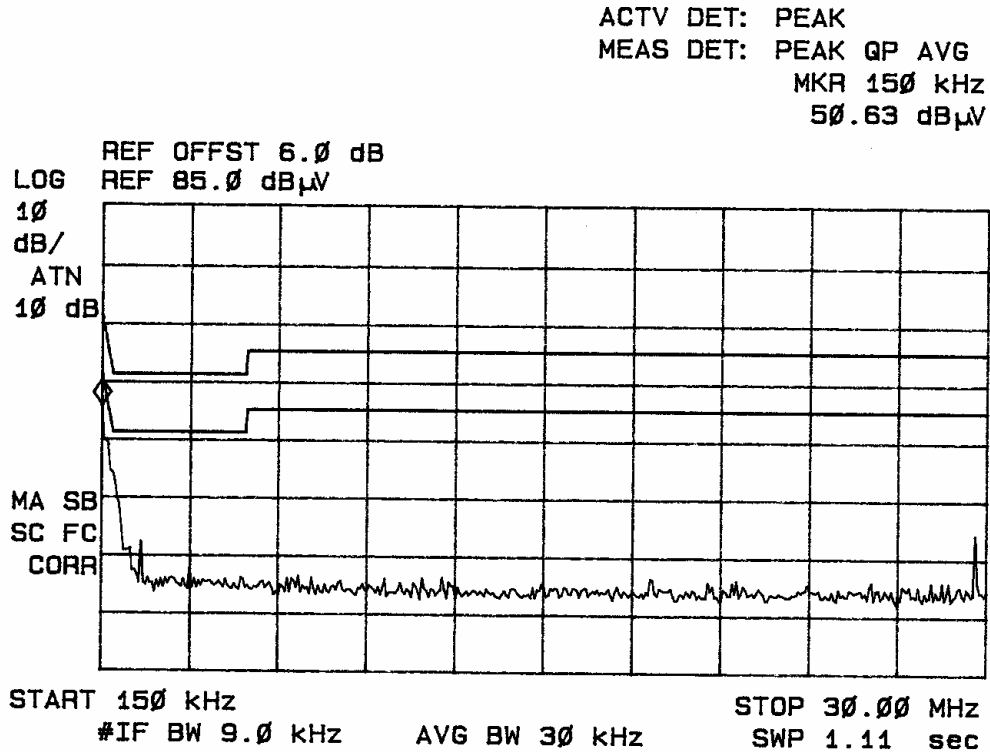


Figure 1 Conducted Emissions Line 1.

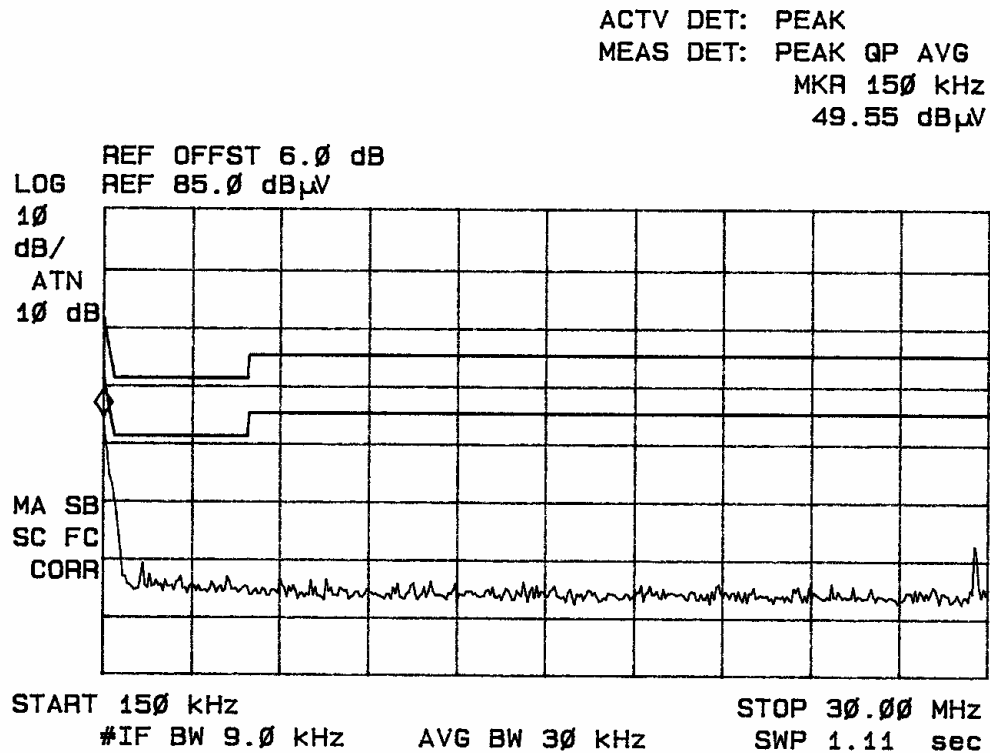


Figure 2 Conducted Emissions Line 2.

Radiated EMI

The EUT was arranged in a typical equipment configuration and operated through all of its various modes. Preliminary testing was performed in a screen room with the EUT positioned 1 meter from the FSM. Radiated emissions measurements were performed to identify the frequencies, which produced the highest emissions. Plots were made of the frequency spectrum from 30 MHz to 10,000 MHz for the preliminary testing. Refer to figures three through six for plots of the radiated emissions spectrum taken in a screen room. The highest radiated emission was then re-maximized at the OATS location before final radiated emissions measurements were performed. Final data was taken with the EUT located at the OATS at a distance of 3 meters between the EUT and the receiving antenna. The frequency spectrum from 30 MHz to 10,000 MHz was searched for radiated emissions. Measured emission levels were maximized by EUT placement on the table, rotating the turntable through 360 degrees, varying the antenna height between 1 and 4 meters above the ground plane and changing antenna position between horizontal and vertical polarization. Antennas used were Broadband Biconical from 30 to 200 MHz, Biconilog from 30 to 1000 MHz, Log Periodic from 200 MHz to 5 GHz and or, pyramidal horns and mixers from 4 GHz to 10 GHz, notch filters and appropriate amplifiers were utilized.

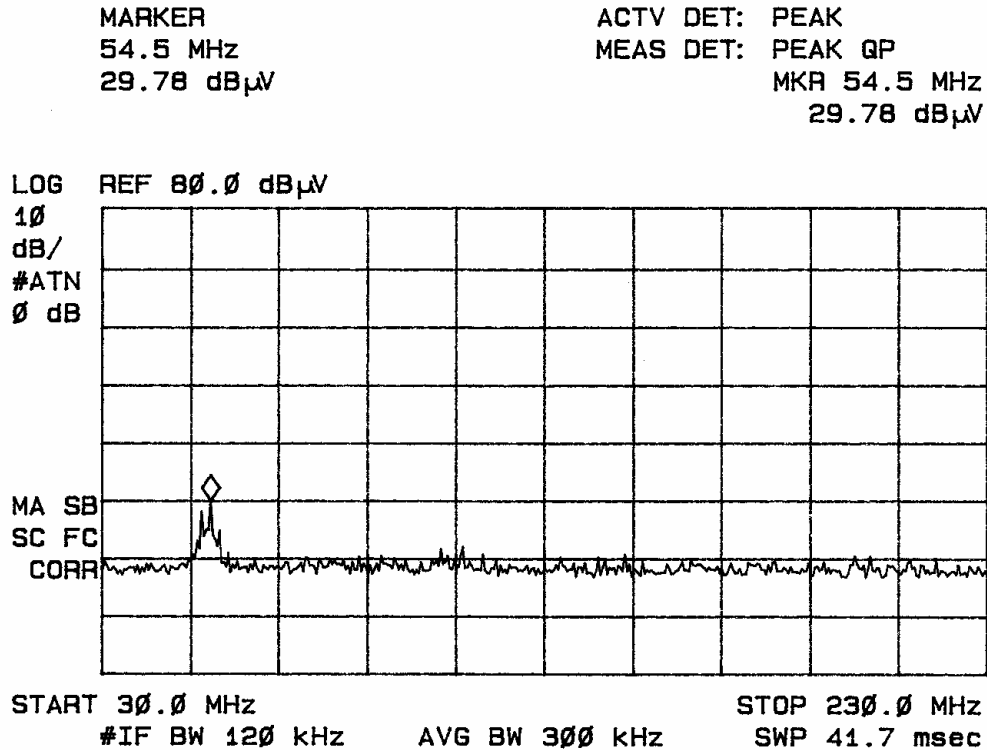


Figure three Radiated Emissions taken at 1 meter in screen room.

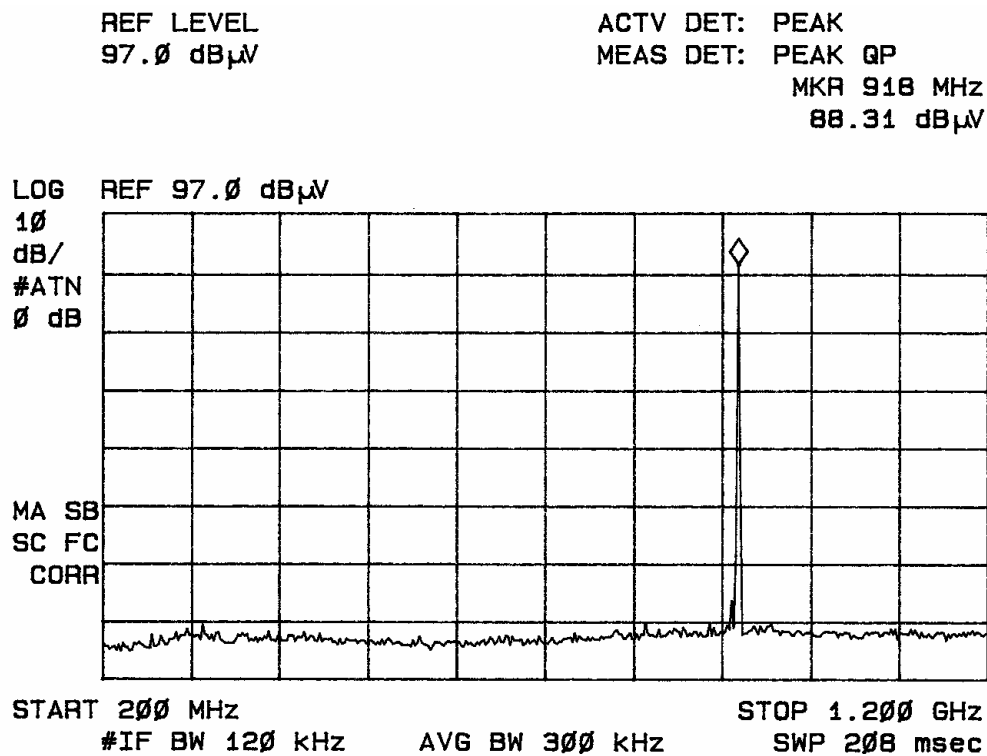


Figure four Radiated Emissions taken at 1 meter in screen room.

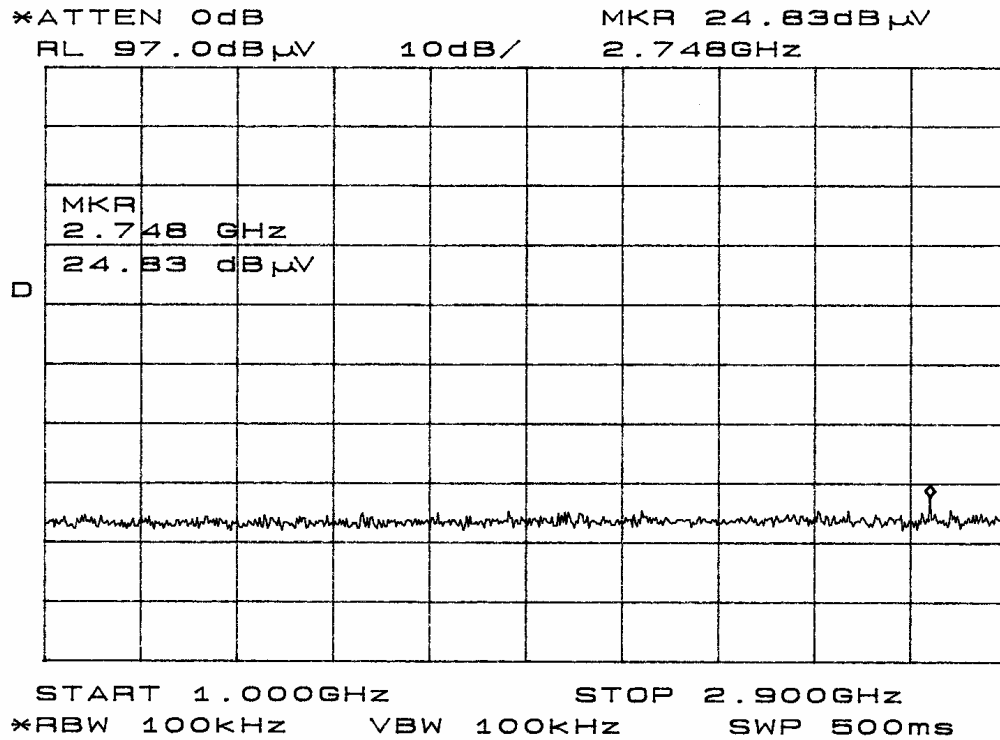


Figure five Radiated Emissions taken at 1 meter in screen room.

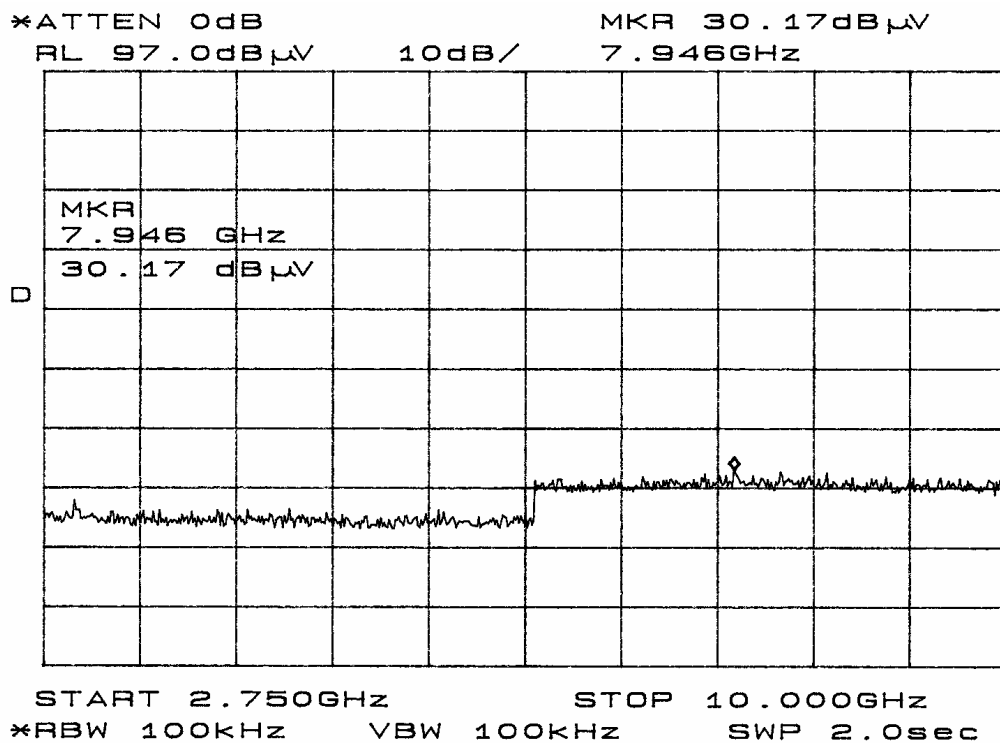


Figure six Radiated Emissions taken at 1 meter in screen room.

Other emissions present had amplitudes at least 20 dB below the limit.

Summary of Results for Conducted Emissions

The conducted emissions for the EUT meet the requirements for CISPR 22 and FCC Part 15B CLASS B Digital Devices. The EUT had a 21.5 dB (Quasi-Peak) minimum margin below the limit, and a 21.1 dB minimum margin below the CISPR average limit.

Measurements were taken using the peak, quasi peak, and average, measurement function for each emissions amplitude and were below the limits stated in the specification. Other emissions were present with recorded data representing worst-case amplitudes.

Summary of Results for Radiated Emissions

The general radiated emissions for the EUT meet the requirements for CISPR 22 and FCC Part 15B CLASS B Digital Devices. The EUT had an 11.3 dB minimum margin below the quasi-peak limit. Other emissions were present with amplitudes at least 20 dB below the limit.

Statement of Modifications and Deviations

No modifications to the EUT were required for the unit to meet the CISPR 22 or FCC Part 15B CLASS B emissions standards. There were no deviations or exceptions to the specifications.

9) Subpart C - Intentional Radiators

As per CFR Part 15, Subpart C, paragraph 15.249 the following information is submitted.

15.203 Antenna Requirements

The unit is produced with a permanently attached antenna and has no provision for user service, replacement, or antenna modification. The requirements of 15.203 are fulfilled and there are no deviations or exceptions to the specification.

15.205 Restricted Bands of Operation

Spurious emissions falling in the restricted frequency bands of operation were measured at a distance of three meters at the OATS. The EUT utilizes frequency, determining circuitry, which generates harmonics falling in the restricted bands. Emissions were checked at the OATS, using appropriate antennas or pyramidal horns, amplification stages, and a spectrum analyzer. No other significant emission was observed which fell into the restricted bands of operation.

Other emissions present had amplitudes at least 20 dB below the limit.

Summary of Results for Radiated Emissions in Restricted Bands:

The radiated emissions for the EUT meet the requirements for FCC Part 15C Intentional Radiators. The EUT had an 8.1 dB minimum margin below the limits. Both average and peak amplitudes were checked for compliance with the regulations. No other emissions were found in the restricted frequency bands. Other emissions were present with amplitudes at least 20 dB below the FCC Limits.

15.209 Radiated Emissions Limits; General Requirements

Radiated EMI

The EUT was arranged in a typical equipment configuration and operated through all of its various modes. Preliminary testing was performed in a screen room with the EUT positioned 1 meter from the FSM. Radiated emissions measurements were performed to identify the frequencies, which produced the highest emissions. Emissions were checked in the screen room from 30 to 10,000 MHz and plots were made of the frequency spectrum from 30 MHz to 10,000 MHz for the preliminary testing. The highest radiated emission was then re-maximized at this location before final radiated emissions measurements were performed. Final data was taken with the EUT located at the open area test site at a distance of 3 meters between the EUT and the receiving antenna. The frequency spectrum from 30 MHz to 10,000 MHz was searched for radiated emissions. Measured emission levels were maximized by EUT placement on the table, rotating the turntable through 360 degrees, varying the antenna height between 1 and 4 meters above the ground plane and changing antenna polarization between horizontal and vertical. Antennas used were Broadband Biconical from 30 MHz to 200 MHz, Biconilog from 30 MHz to 1000 MHz, Log Periodic from 200 MHz to 5 GHz, and/or Pyramidal Horns from 4 GHz to 10 GHz.

Summary of Results for Radiated Emissions:

The radiated emissions for the EUT meet the requirements for FCC Part 15C Intentional Radiators. The EUT had an 11.3 dB minimum margin below the limits. Other emissions were present with amplitudes at least 20 dB below the FCC Limits.

15.249 Operation in the Band 902-928 MHz

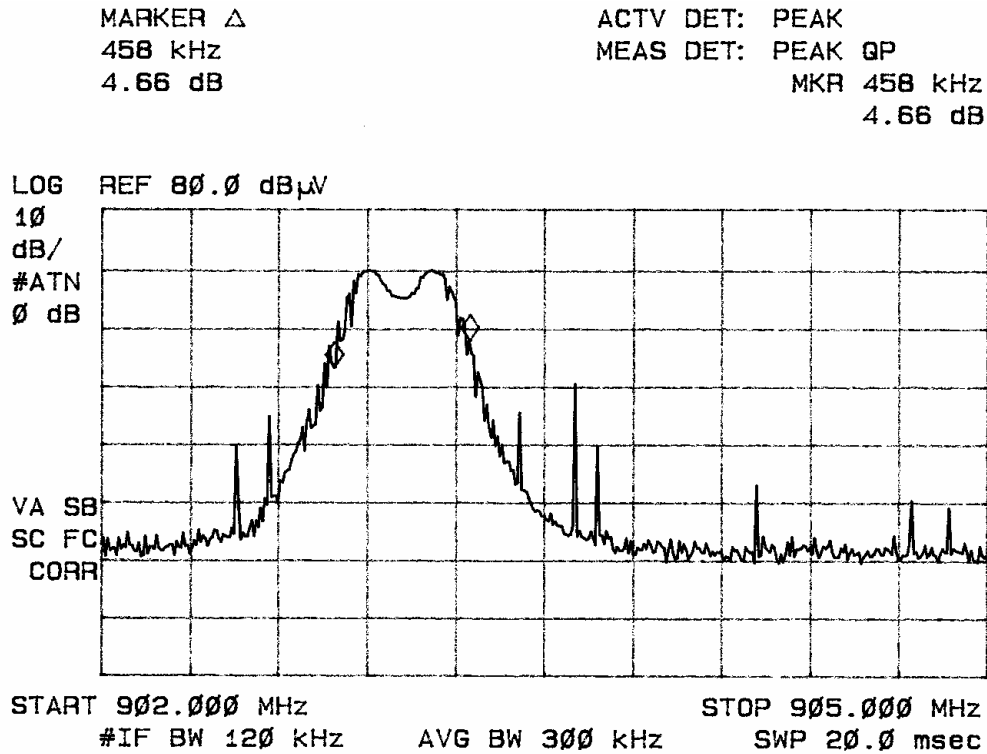


Figure 7 band edge plot taken in screen room.

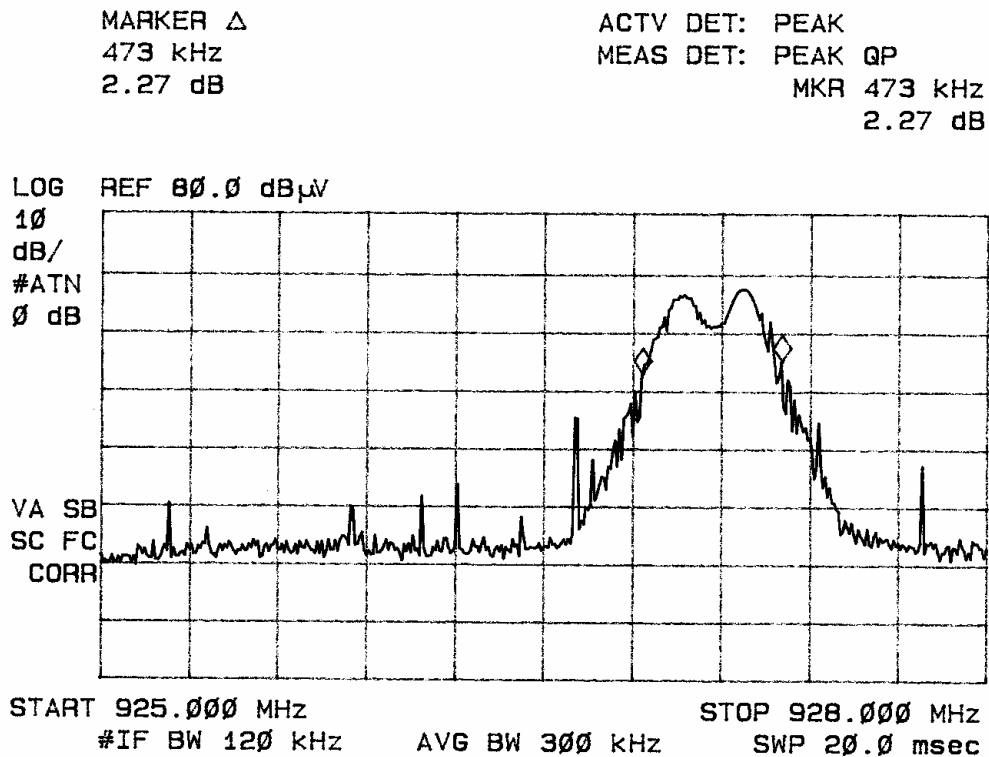


Figure 8 band edge plot taken in screen room.

The power output was measured at the open area test site at a three-meter distance. Data was taken per Paragraph 2.1046(a) and 15.249. Figures 7 and 8 demonstrate compliance with band edge operation.

Summary of Results for Radiated Emissions of Intentional Radiator

The EUT had the highest emission of 93.7 dBmV/m at 3 meters at the fundamental frequency of operation. The EUT had a worst-case of 8.1 dB margin below the limit for the harmonic emissions. The radiated emissions for the EUT meet the requirements for FCC Part 15.249 Intentional Radiators. There are no measurable emissions in the restricted bands other than those recorded in this report. Other emissions were present with amplitudes at least 20 dB below the FCC Limits. The specifications of 15.249 were met; there are no deviations or exceptions to the requirements.

Statement of Modifications and Deviations

No modifications to the EUT were required for the unit to meet the FCC Part 15C emissions standards. There were no deviations to the specifications.


