1.4 Test Configuration of Equipment under Test

Antenna port conducted and radiated test items were performed according to KDB 971168 D01 Power Meas. License Digital Systems v02r02 with maximum output power.

Radiated measurements were performed with rotating EUT in different three orthogonal test planes to find the maximum emission.

Radiated emissions were investigated as following frequency range:

- 1. 30 MHz to 9000 MHz for GSM850 and WCDMA Band V.
- 2. 30 MHz to 20000 MHz for GSM1900 and WCDMA Band II.

All modes and data rates and positions were investigated.

Test modes are chosen to be reported as the worst case configuration below:

Note: The maximum power levels are chosen to test as the worst case configuration as follows:

GSM mode for GMSK modulation,

EDGE multi-slot class 8 mode for 8PSK modulation,

RMC 12.2Kbps mode for WCDMA band V,

RMC 12.2Kbps mode for WCDMA band II, only these modes were used for all tests.

1.5 Measurement Results Explanation Example

For all conducted test items:

The offset level is set in the spectrum analyzer to compensate the RF cable loss and attenuator factor between EUT conducted output port and spectrum analyzer. With the offset compensation, the spectrum analyzer reading level is exactly the EUT RF output level.

The spectrum analyzer offset is derived from RF cable loss and attenuator factor.

Offset = RF cable loss + attenuator factor.

Following shows an offset computation example with cable loss 7dB and 10dB attenuator.

Example:

Offset (dB) = RF cable loss(dB) + attenuator factor(dB).
=
$$7.5 + 10 = 17.5$$

A system simulator was used to establish communication with the EUT. Its parameters were set to enforce EUT transmitting at the maximum power. The measured power in the radio frequency on the transmitter output terminals shall be reported.

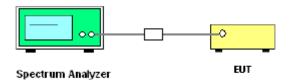
2.1.2 Measuring Instruments

The measuring equipment is listed in the section 3 of this test report.

2.1.3 Test Procedures

- 1. The transmitter output port was connected to the system simulator.
- 2. Set EUT at maximum power through system simulator.
- 3. Select lowest, middle, and highest channels for each band and different modulation.
- 4. Measure and record the power level from the system simulator.

2.2 Peak to Average Radio

2.2.1 Definition

Power Complementary Cumulative Distribution Function (CCDF) curves provide a means for characterizing the power peaks of a digitally modulated signal on a statistical basis. A CCDF curve depicts the probability of the peak signal amplitude exceeding the average power level. Most contemporary measurement instrumentation include the capability to produce CCDF curves for an input signal provided that the instrument's resolution bandwidth can be set wide enough to accommodate the entire input signal bandwidth. In measuring transmissions in this band using an average power technique, the peak-to-average ratio (PAR) of the transmission may not exceed 13 dB.

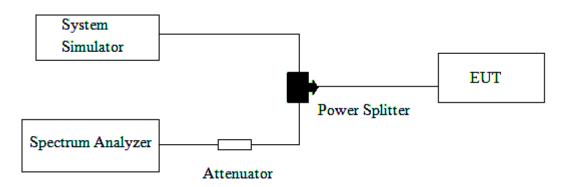
2.2.3 Test Procedures

- 1. The testing follows FCC KDB 971168 D01v02r02 Section 5.7.1.
- 2. The EUT was connected to the spectrum analyzer and system simulator via a power divider.
 - 3. For GSM/EGPRS operating modes:
 - a. Set EUT in maximum power output.
 - b. Set the RBW = 1MHz, VBW = 3MHz, Peak detector on spectrum analyzer for first trace.
- c. Set the RBW = 1MHz, VBW = 3MHz, RMS detector on spectrum analyzer for second trace.
- d. The wanted burst signal is triggered by spectrum analyzer, and measured respectively the peak level and Mean level without burst-off time, after system simulator has synchronized with the spectrum analyzer.
 - 4. For UMTS operating modes:
- a. Set the CCDF (Complementary Cumulative Distribution Function) option on the spectrum analyzer.
- b. The highest RF powers were measured and recorded the maximum PAPR level associated with a probability of $0.1\,\%$.
 - 5. Record the deviation as Peak to Average Ratio.

2.3 99% Occupied Bandwidth and 26dB Bandwidth Measurement

2.3.1 Definition

The 99% occupied bandwidth is the width of a frequency band such that, below the lower and above the upper frequency limits, the mean powers emitted are each equal to a specified percentage 0.5% of the total mean transmitted power.

The emission bandwidth is defined as the width of the signal between two points, located at the 2 sides of the carrier frequency, outside of which all emissions are attenuated at least 26 dB below the transmitter power.

The measuring equipment is listed in the section 3 of this test report.

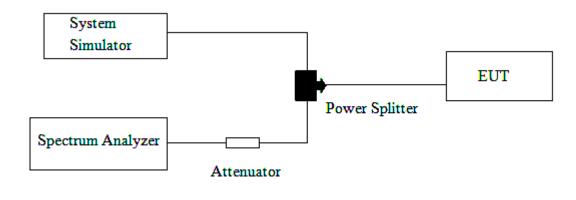
2.3.3 Test Procedures

- 1. The testing follows FCC KDB 971168 D01v02r02 Section 4.2.
- 2. The EUT was connected to the spectrum analyzer and system simulator via a power divider.
- 3. The RF output of the EUT was connected to the spectrum analyzer by RF cable and attenuator.

The path loss was compensated to the results for each measurement.

- 4. The 99% occupied bandwidth were measured, set RBW= 1% of span, VBW= 3*RBW, sample detector, trace maximum hold.
- 5. The 26dB bandwidth were measured, set RBW= 1% of EBW, VBW= 3*RBW, peak detector, trace maximum hold.

2.4 Frequency Stability

2.4.1 Requirement

The frequency stability shall be measured by variation of ambient temperature and variation of primary supply voltage to ensure that the fundamental emission stays within the authorized frequency block. The frequency stability of the transmitter shall be maintained within $\pm 0.00025\%$ (± 2.5 ppm) of the center frequency.

2.4.2 Measuring Instruments

The measuring equipment is listed in the section 3 of this test report.

2.4.3 Test Procedures for Temperature Variation

- 1. The testing follows FCC KDB 971168 D01v02r02 Section 9.0.
- 2. The EUT was set up in the thermal chamber and connected with the system simulator.
- 3. With power OFF, the temperature was decreased to -30°C and the EUT was stabilized before testing. Power was applied and the maximum change in frequency was recorded within one minute.
- 4. With power OFF, the temperature was raised in 10°C steps up to 50°C. The EUT was stabilized at each step for at least half an hour. Power was applied and the maximum frequency change was recorded within one minute.

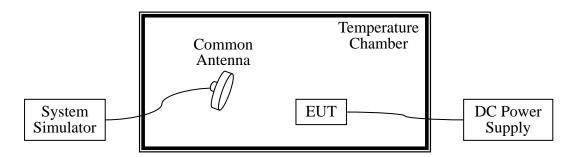
2.4.4 Test Procedures for Voltage Variation

- 1. The testing follows FCC KDB 971168 D01v02r02 Section 9.0.
- 2. The EUT was placed in a temperature chamber at 25±5° C and connected with the system simulator.
- 3. The power supply voltage to the EUT was varied from BEP to 115% of the nominal value measured at the input to the EUT.
- 4. The variation in frequency was measured for the worst case.

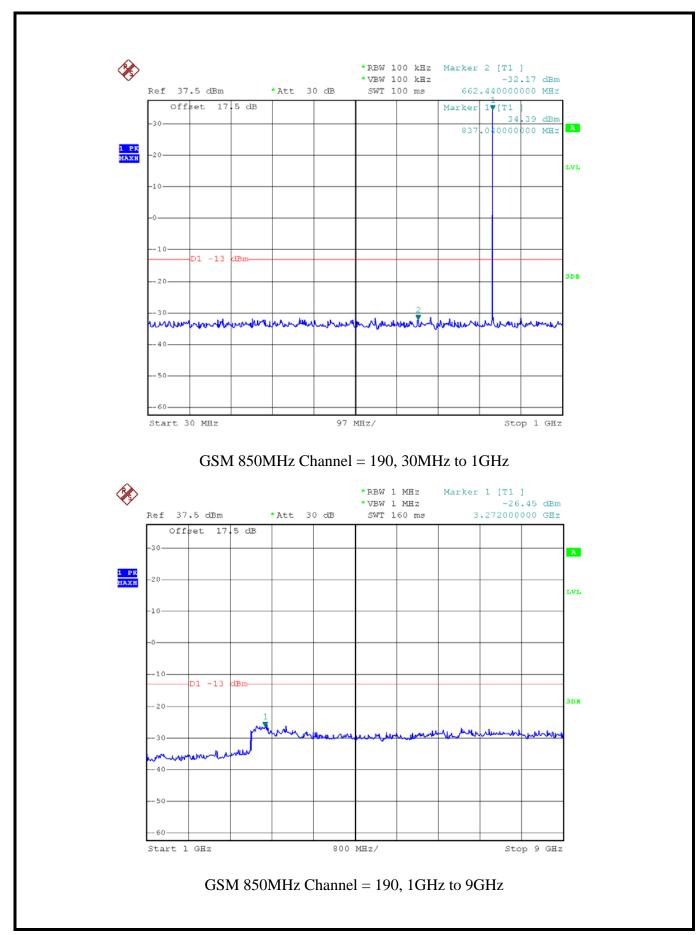


GSM 850MHz Channel = 128, 30MHz to 1GHz



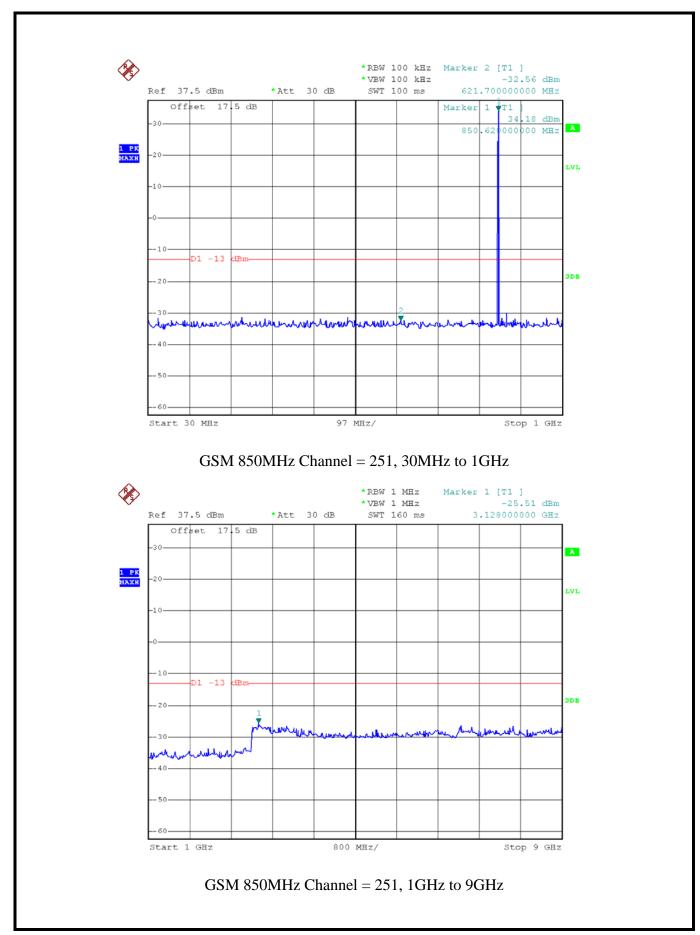

2.7 Transmitter Radiated Power (EIRP/ERP)

2.7.1 Requirement

The substitution method, in ANSI / TIA / EIA-603-D-2010, was used for ERP/EIRP measurement, and the spectrum analyzer configuration follows KDB 971168 D01 Power Meas. License Digital Systems v02r02. The ERP of mobile transmitters must not exceed 7 Watts (Cellular Band) and the EIRP of mobile transmitters are limited to 2 Watts (PCS Band) and 1 Watts (AWS Band).

2.7.2 Measuring Instruments

The measuring equipment is listed in the section 3 of this test report.

2.7.3 Test Procedures

- 1. The testing follows FCC KDB 971168 D01v02r02 Section 5.2.1. (for CDMA/WCDMA), Section 5.2.2.2 (for GSM/GPRS/EDGE) and ANSI / TIA-603-D-2010 Section 2.2.17.
- 2. The EUT was placed on a turntable 1.5 meters high in a fully anechoic chamber.
- 3. The EUT was placed 3 meters from the receiving antenna, which was mounted on the antenna tower.
- 4. GSM operating modes: Set RBW= 1MHz, VBW= 3MHz, RMS detector over burst;
 UMTS operating modes: Set RBW= 100 kHz, VBW= 300 kHz, RMS detector over frame,
 and use channel power option with bandwidth=5MHz, per KDB 971168 D01v02r02.
- 5. The table was rotated 360 degrees to determine the position of the highest radiated power.
- 6. The height of the receiving antenna is adjusted to look for the maximum ERP/EIRP.
- 7. Taking the record of maximum ERP/EIRP.
- 8. A dipole antenna was substituted in place of the EUT and was driven by a signal generator.

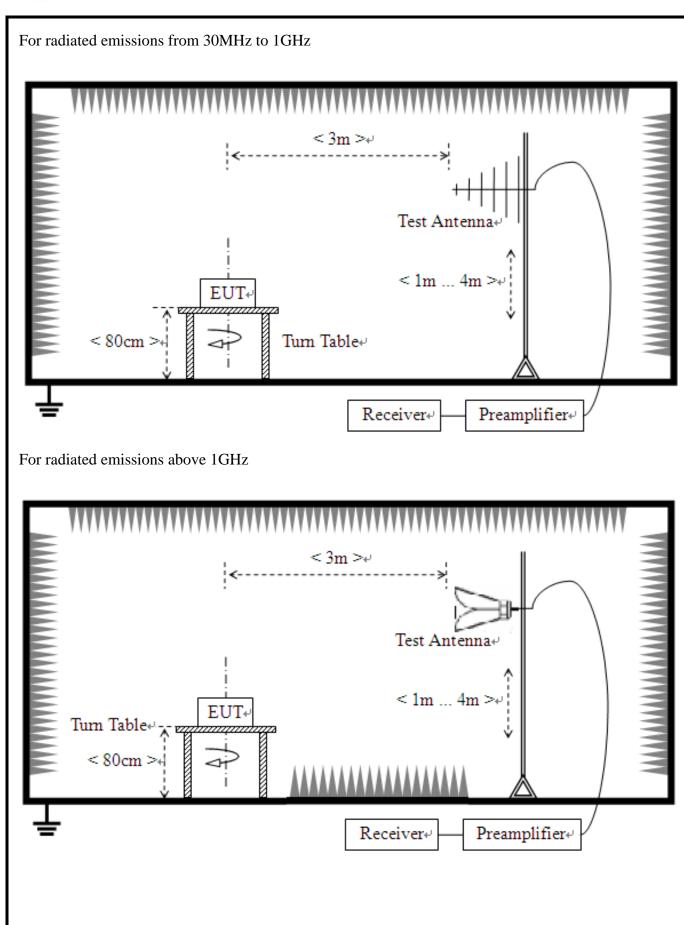

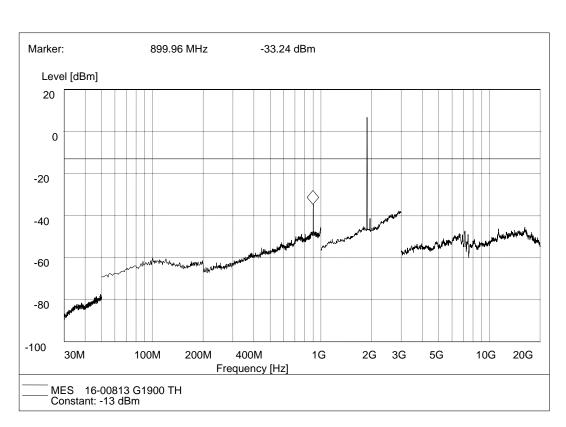
GSM 850MHz, Test Antenna Horizontal



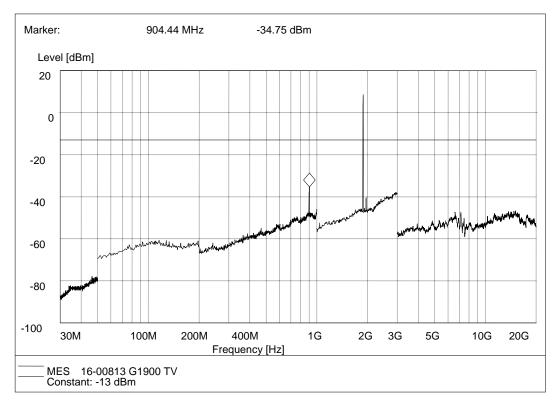
GSM 850MHz, Test Antenna Vertical

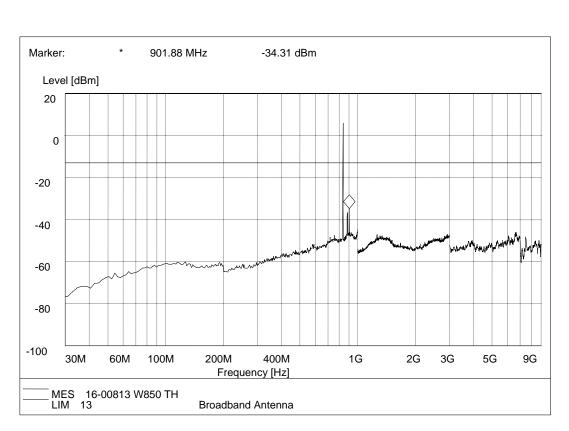
GSM 1900MHz, Test Antenna Horizontal



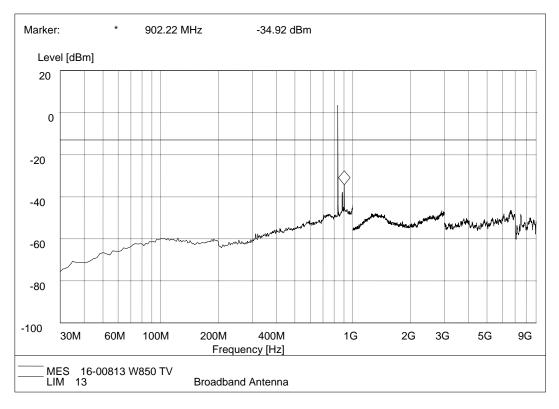
GSM 1900MHz, Test Antenna Vertical

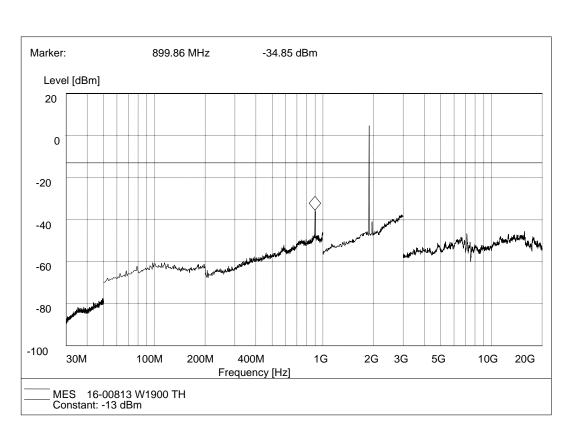
WCDMA 850MHz, Test Antenna Horizontal



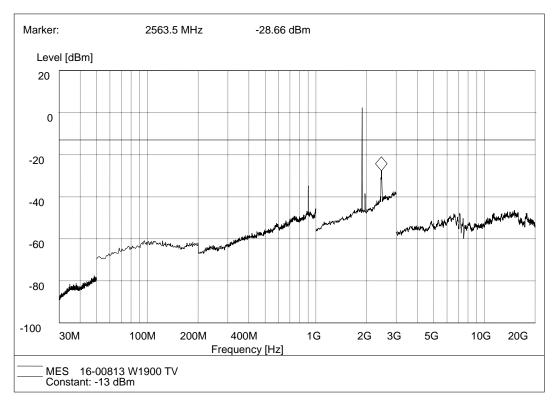
WCDMA 850MHz, Test Antenna Vertical
