

### Disc Playback Compatibility


- Some DVDs are not available for playback due to the nature of their software.
- A DVD is typically composed of several titles, each of which consists of several chapters. A single disc recorded in DVD format corresponds with a single title with several scenes (chapters). There may be some discs, however, that are configured not according to the general specifications as mentioned above, but according to the DVD producer's intentions.
- The contents of a video (or audio) CD consist of tracks. Typically, each track corresponds with a piece of music in a song. For some discs, a track consists of a single index.
- For a video CD with a PBC (Playback Control) function, the user can use menus to execute the playback feature. However, repeat or search functions may not be available.

## Mount Method for Products (Headrest & Roof)

### 1. Headrest Mounting

a) Fix ①, ②, ③ and ④, as illustrated below.

b) Fix ⑤, leaving a space for the headrest, as illustrated below.




\* As shown in the figure at the right, ①, ②, ③ and ④ are screw holes for mounting the headrest and ⑥, ⑦, ⑧ and ⑨ are locks for mounting the roof.



Using the filter box and the cigar jack, connect the power supply to this product before using the product.



Be careful not to be injured by Anchor Bracket A after the headrest is mounted.



Prior to mounting the roof, check to see if the direction of Anchor 'Bracket C' is properly set. Mounting the roof may not be so simple.






a) Remove the vehicle roof, as illustrated in ①.

b) Place Anchor Bracket C and Anchor Bracket D towards the inside of the vehicle and the roof surface, respectively.

To ensure that they are securely fixed, make a hole in the roof, as shown in ②.


c) As illustrated in ③, restore the vehicle roof to its original shape, from which it will not be changed.

d) As illustrated in ④, have this product fixed.  
(Ensure that ⑥, ⑦, ⑧ and ⑨, as illustrated at the bottom of page 6, and the protrusion of Anchor Bracket C are combined.)


### 1. Main Menu






- Move to PICTURE from the MAIN MENU screen using the button (see page 10). If you push the button , "PICTURE MENU" will appear on the screen.
- BRIGHT: This function allows you to move the cursor to BRIGHT so that you can adjust the screen by pressing the button .(0~20)  
☞ This function lets you adjust the screen's brightness.
- CONTRAST: This function allows you to move the cursor to CONTRAST so that you can adjust the screen's contrast by pressing the button .(0~20)  
☞ This function lets you adjust the screen's contrast.
- COLOR: This function allows you to move the cursor to COLOR so that you can adjust the screen's color by pressing the button .(0~20)  
☞ This function lets you adjust the screen's color settings.
- SHARP: This function allows you to move the cursor to SHARP so that you can adjust the sharpness of the screen's color by pressing the button .(0~7)  
☞ This function lets you adjust the sharpness of the screen's color.

- If channels are stored, pressing the button   on the remote control lets you use the stored channels.

### 3. Seeking and Storing (Deleting) Channels

- SEEK (searching channels): By pressing the button   on the remote control, it allows you to search channels that are currently broadcasting.
  - : Searching while increasing channel numbers
  - : Searching while decreasing channel numbers
- Random storage: To store the channel being watched, press the button  on the remote control lengthily (for more than three seconds).
- Stored channel deletion: To delete the channel being watched, press the button  on the remote control lengthily (for more than three seconds).
- PS: If this button  on the remote control is pressed briefly, the stored channels are displayed one by one every five seconds.
- AS: If this button  on the remote control is pressed lengthily (for more than three seconds), automatic search is started, beginning with the current channel. Channels searched are memorized. (Memorized channels are displayed in yellow, whereas unmemorized channels are displayed in violet).



### 4. Frequency Retrieval

- SEEK (frequency retrieval): By pressing the button on the remote control, you can search channels that are currently broadcasting.  
: Searching while increasing frequencies  
: Searching while decreasing frequencies

When frequency retrieval starts, the statement "SEARCHING" will appear, as shown in the figure above. The statement will disappear when the frequency retrieval ends.

## 5. Automatic Frequency Retrieval

- AS: If this button  on the remote control is pressed lengthily (for more than three seconds), automatic search is started, beginning with the current channel. Channels searched are memorized. Memorized channels are displayed as shown in the figure at the right. (As soon as frequency search begins the statement "A,SCAN" will appear on the frequency retrieval ends.)

- If more than 6 frequencies are being broadcasted during automatic search, up to 18 frequencies are continuously memorized through FM-2's/-3's memory space.

## 6. Memorized Frequency Retrieval

- PS: If this button  on the remote control is pressed briefly, memorized channels are heard one by one every five second. (As soon as memorized frequency search begins, the statement "P.SCAN" will appear on the screen. The statement will disappear when the retrieval ends.)

- If you press the  remote control while listening to the player, the memorized frequencies are switched by one step.


### 9. Switching between FM 1, 2 and 3

- If  this button is pressed, the radio channel is switched in the order of FM1, FM2, FM3 and FM1.

## DVD

### 1. Switching to DVD Mode

- Press the DVD button  on the device's remote control once or several times until "DVD" is displayed on the upper left side of the product's screen.

### 2. Main Functions

#### — TRACK(CHAPTER) UP/DOWN

Pressing this button  on the device's remote control when playing a DVD on the device lets you track the DVD (i.e., search the DVD's chapters).

#### — FAST FORWARD/REWIND

Pressing this button  on the device's remote control when playing a DVD on the device lets you FAST FORWARD/REWIND the DVD. Pressing this button several times lets you FAST FORWARD/REWIND the DVD faster (X2, X4, X8, X16 and X32).

#### — PLAY/PAUSE

Pressing this button  lets you play back a disc on the device or pause its playback.

#### — STOP

Pressing this button  on the device's remote control when playing a disc on the device lets you stop the playback.

#### — DISP

Pressing this button  on the device's remote control when playing a disc on the device displays information on what is being played back on the screen.

#### — A/B(Repeat Section)

To repeat a specified section, set the section's starting/ending points with this button  on the device's remote control when playing a disc on the device.

#### — 3D

To change the device's stereo sound, press this button  on the device's remote control when playing a disc on the device.

#### — M/M

To change the playback mode (such as to repeated playback), press this button  on the device's remote control when playing a disc on the device.

#### — EJECT

To remove a disc from the player, press this button  on the device's remote control when playing a disc on the device.



This function allows you to set the overall functions when using the DVD mode.

- Pressing this button  lengthily (for more than three seconds) displays SETUP MENU on the screen.



## DVD

### 3-1 GENERAL SETUP PAGE

- In SETUP MENU, this button  is used to move the cursor.
- In SETUP MENU, this button  is used to choose individual functions.



#### Description of individual menus in GENERAL SETUP

- **TV DISPLAY: PAN & SCAN, LETTER BOX, WIDE**
  - a. **PAN & SCAN:** This menu is selected to watch TV (or video) on an existing TV set. In imaging media formatted in PAN & SCAN to a 16:9 aspect ratio, only the center of a scene is played back.
  - b. **LETTER BOX:** In imaging media formatted in non-PAN & SCAN, a scene is played back such that a letter fits in a letter box. Black bands appear on the upper and lower sides of the screen.
  - c. **WIDE:** This menu is selected to watch TV (or video) on a wide-screen set. Playback can be performed on a full screen.  
(For wide-screen TVs, set the menu to the Full-Screen mode.)
- **ANGLE MARK (On/Off):** This menu is selected to indicate ANGLE when using the ANGLE function in a disc supporting the ANGLE function.
- **OSD LANG (English, Chinese):** This menu is selected to set a language for characters displayed on the screen during the operation of a DVD's features.





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

- TV TYPE: This menu is used to select between NTSC and PAL video signal types. To ensure automatic conversion, select MULTI. (Due to the time that this device recognizes, your screen may flicker for some time while using MULTI.)
- AUDIO: This menu allows you to set a language for AUDIO during DVD playback. This menu is available only within the scope of the support provided by the disc being played back.
- SUBTITLE: This menu allows you to set a language for SUBTITLE during DVD playback. This menu is available only within the scope of the support provided by the disc being played back.
- DISC MENU: This menu allows you to set a language for the menu listed on the DVD.
- PARENTAL: This function enables you to limit access to graded discs. For discs for use in the player, one level out of eight levels can be set. However, all levels can be set for discs for adults.
- DEFAULT: This function enables you to initialize all DVD functions.

### 3-5 PASSWORD SETUP PAGE

- In SETUP MENU    this button is used to move the cursor.
- In SETUP MENU  this button is used to choose individual functions.



- \* Description of individual menus in PASSWORD SETUP
- PASSWORD MODE: This menu allows you turn the password function ON/OFF.

— If a button is pressed that is not available in the audio CD being played, the sign marked with "Ø" is displayed on the screen

### 5. MP3 CD



#### — File list and folder viewing

Pressing this button when playing a disc on the device after setting the disc to 'Folder Viewing' lets you convert the device's setting to "File List". To view the folder-type playback information one more time, press this button on the remote control one more time. A disc can recognize up to 300 folders of up to 650 files each.

#### — Playback using a music list

Pressing this button on the device's remote control while moving the yellow cursor to the desired button lets you play a piece of selected music. (The music currently being played is displayed by the sky blue cursor.)

#### — 3D (stereo sound) function

With regard to 3D functions, MP3 CDs are the same as audio CDs. (See p. 29.)

#### — M/M (playback mode) function

Pressing this button on the device's remote control when playing a disc on the device lets you change the device's playback mode as follows

RANDOM → SINGLE → REPEAT ONE → REPEAT FOLDER → FOLDER → SHUFFLE

— If a button is pressed that is not available in an MP3 CD being played, the sign marked with "Ø" is displayed on the screen.

### 6. Video CD



#### — PBC (playback control) function

Press  this button to turn the PBC function ON/OFF.

(However, this menu is available only within the scope of the support provided by the disc being played back.)

#### — 3D (stereo sound) function

With regard to 3D functions, video CDs are the same as audio CDs. (See p. 29.)

#### — ZOOM (in, out) function

Pressing  this button on the device's remote control when playing a disc on the device lets you zoom the display in or out.

(2X → 3X → 4X → 1/2 → 1/3 → 1/4 → NORMAL)

— If a button is pressed that is not available in a video CD being played, the sign marked with "Ø" is displayed on the screen.

#### — Changing Angles

Pressing  the ANGLE button on the device's remote control when playing a disc on the device lets you change the DVD's angle. (However, the angle is changed only within the scope of the support provided by the disc being played back.)

#### — Changing Subtitles

Pressing  the SUBTITLE button on the device's remote control when playing a disc on the device lets you change the DVD's subtitle. (However, the subtitle is changed only within the scope of the support provided by the disc being played back.)

#### — Changing Audios

Pressing  the AUDIO button on the device's remote control when playing a disc on the device lets you change the device's audio setting. (However, the audio setting is changed only within the scope of the support provided by the disc being played back.)

#### — 3D (stereo sound) function

Pressing  the 3D button on the device's remote control when playing a disc on the device lets you change the device's stereo sound as follows

ROCK → POP → LIVE → DANCE → TECHNO → CLASSIC → SOFT → OFF

#### — M/M (playback mode) function

Pressing  this button on the device's remote control when playing a disc on the device lets you change the device's stereo sound as follows

CHAPTER REPEAT → TITLE REPEAT → SHUFFLE

— If a button is pressed to perform a function that is not available in a DVD being played, the sign marked with 'Ø' is displayed on the screen.


— How to use the GO TO function

The GO TO function enables the user to operate the device smoothly during playback.

Pressing  this button on the remote control during playback displays the GO TO function on the screen. You can select a menu on the GO TO function using  these button on the remote control.

— There is a ROOT MENU function in DVDs. If a remote control is in place, use  its button. To play back a disc with the front panel button instead of a remote control, press the AS/PS button on the front of the product lengthily.
