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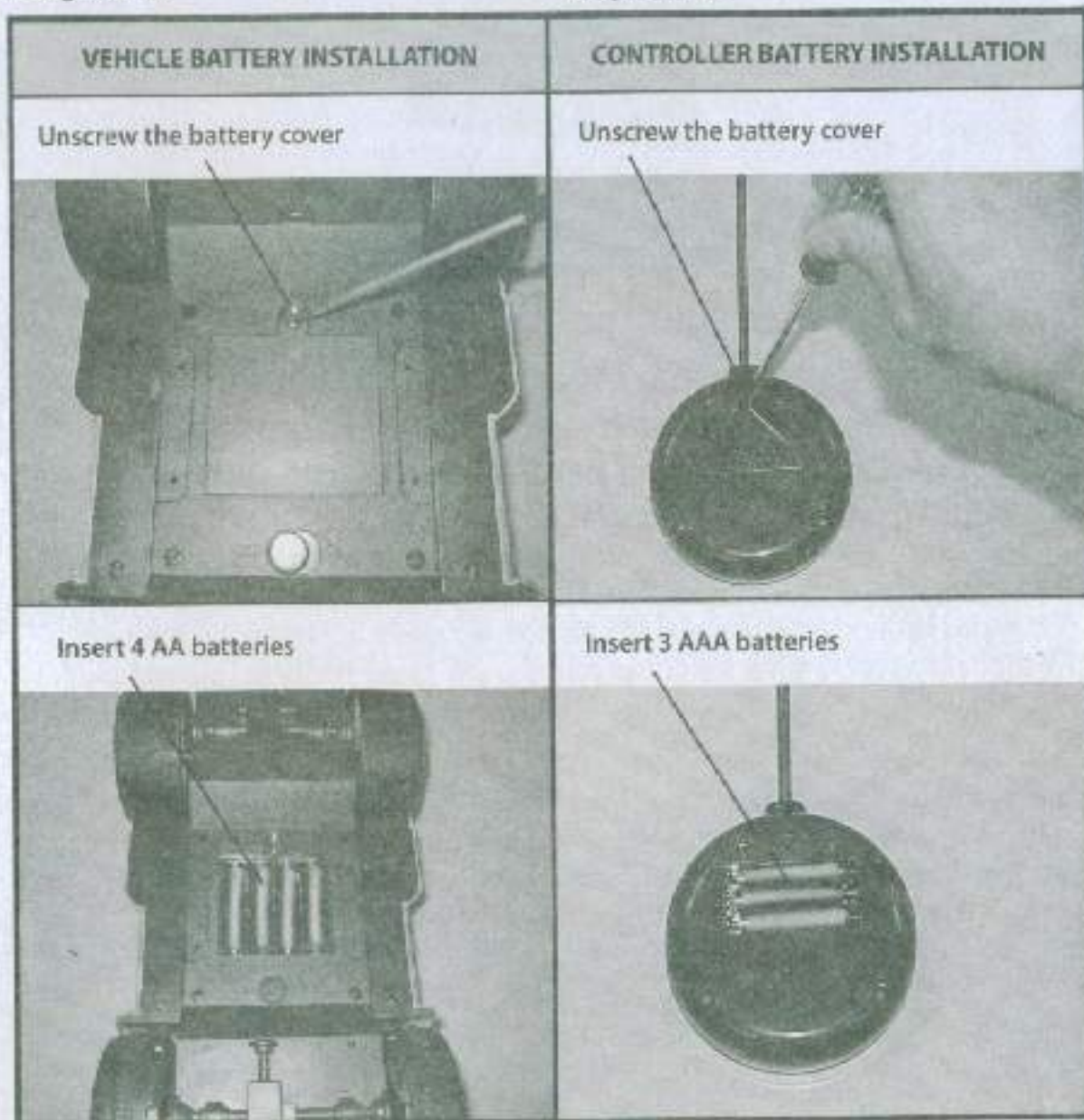


## START UP:

Unscrew and remove the battery covers on both the controller and the vehicle. Insert 4AA batteries into the vehicle and 3 AAA batteries into the controller unit. Replace both battery covers and tighten the screws. (See Diagram #1 & #2)

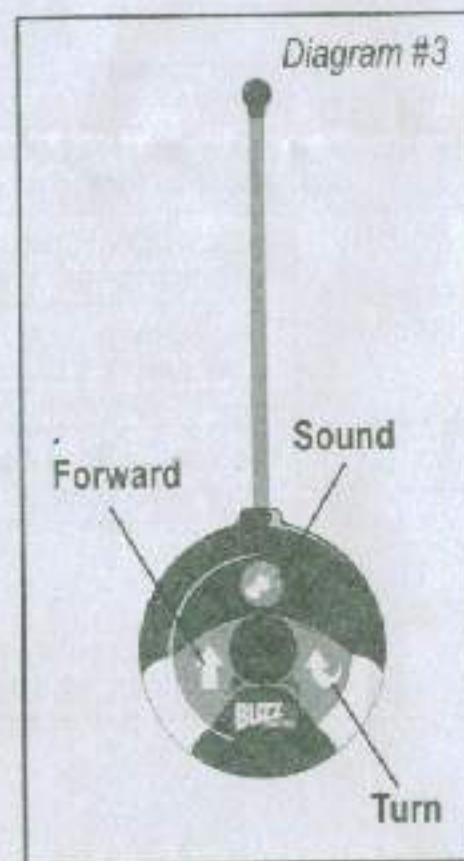
## OPERATING THE VEHICLE:

1. Switch on the vehicle.
2. Press the buttons to control the vehicle to go forward and turn. ( See Diagram #3)
3. Press the horn button to play sounds. (See Diagram #3)
4. After use, switch off the vehicle.
5. If the vehicle is to be "parked" for a relatively long time, remove all batteries from the vehicle and controller unit.

A) When operating the controller, please do not touch the antenna, as the control, distance and speed will be affected.

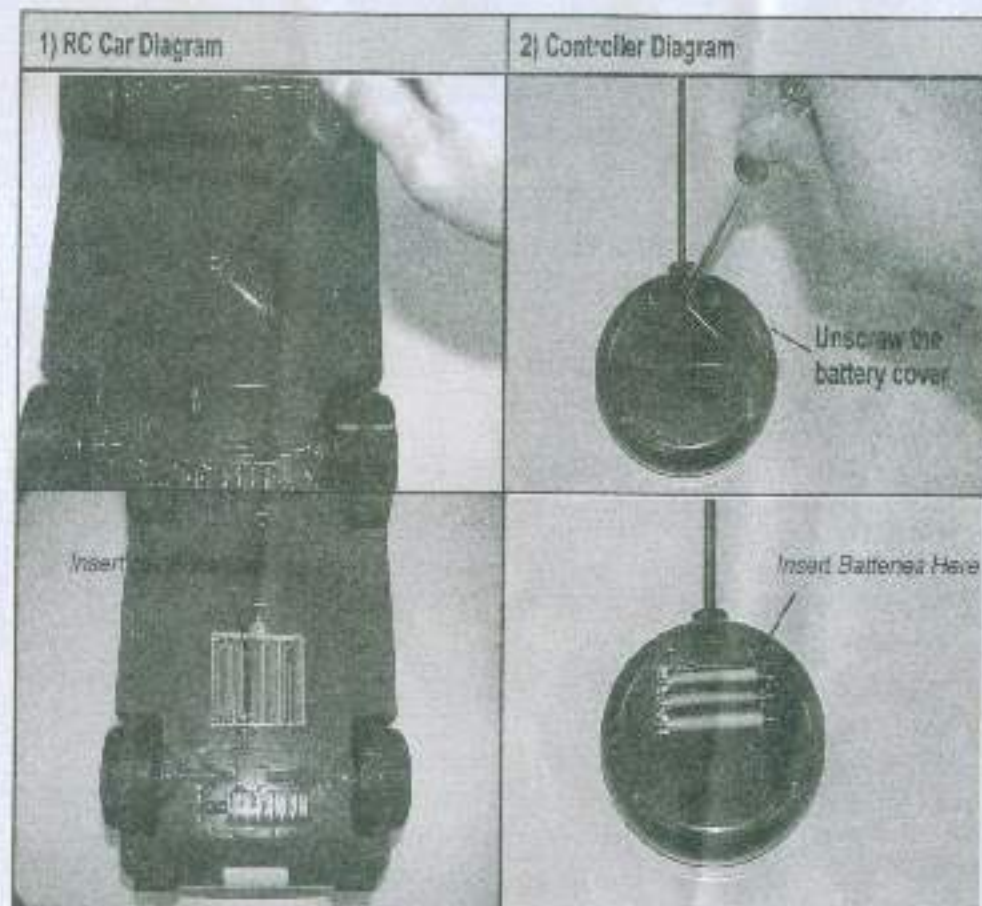
B) If you notice a reduction in speed and control, please be prepared to replace the batteries per the instructions detailed on page 2.





## START UP

Unscrew and remove the battery covers on both the controller and the car. Insert 4 AA batteries into the car and 3 AAA battery into controller unit. Then replace the battery covers and tighten the screws (see diagram #1 & #2)

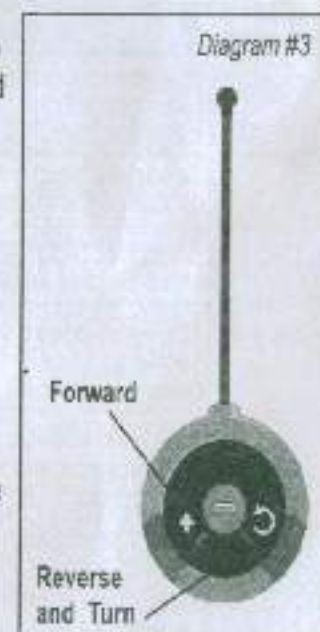

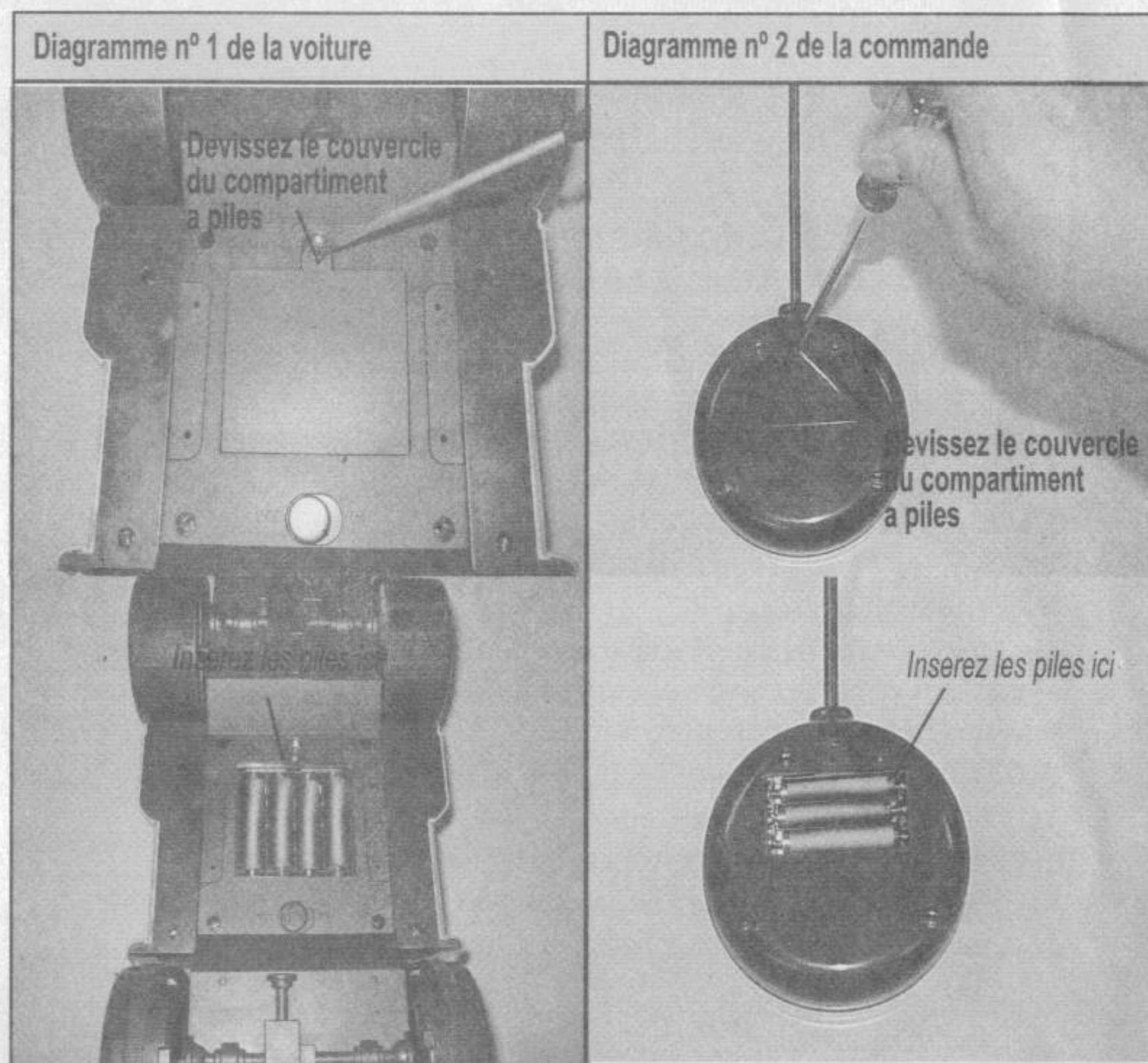

## DÉMARRAGE
