

** MPE Calculations **

(a) FCC limit at 751MHz

The MPE calculation for this exposure is shown below.

Limits for Occupational/Controlled Exposure

The peak radiated output power (EIRP) is calculated as follows:

Maximum permissible exposure is $\text{Freq. (MHz)}/300 = \text{MPE mW/cm}^2$

$$751 \text{ MHz}/300 = 2.50 \text{ mW/cm}^2$$

The following calculations determine at what distance from the antenna the power density is
 $=2.50 \text{ mW/cm}^2$

Max Tx output power = 40.05dBm

numeric Gain = 11dBi

MPE Calculation

Estimated safe separation:

$R = \sqrt{(PG / 4\pi 2.50)}$ $R = \sqrt{(10115.79 * 11 / 4 \pi 2.50)}$ $R = 59.51 \text{ Cm}$	<p>Where,</p> <p>P = Power input to the antenna (mW)</p> <p>G = Numeric power gain of the antenna</p> <p>R = Distance to the center of the radiation of the antenna</p>
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The minimum safe distance for Occupational/Controlled exposure is 59.51cm for the antenna when installed.
