## 1:18 RC Military User's Manual

### Read this before using your Radio control Vehicle

#### 1. Install Battery In Controller

- Pull and lift up the the battery cover of the controller.
- Insert 1 x 9V 6F22 size alkaline battery following the indicated polarity ("+" and "-"). (See Diagram 1)
- Replace the battery cover secure it pushing the cover back.

#### 2. Install Battery In Vehicle

- Loosen screw with a screwdriver (not included) and lift up the battery cover of the vehicle.
- Insert 6 x AA size alkaline battery following the indicated polarity ("+" and "-"). (See Diagram 2)
- Replace the battery cover secure it with the screw.

#### 3. Operating RC vehicle

- Switch "ON" both the vehicle and the controller.
- Operating light on the controller will turn on.
- The vehicle can be switch on to either silent mode and sound mode by pushing the On/Off button towards "ON" or "Speaker".
- Make sure the antenna of controller is fully extended to get the best transmission.
- Push the left and right control sticks forward at the same time, vehicle moves forward.
- Push only the left control stick forward, vehicle turns right.
- Push only the right control stick forward, vehicle turns left.
- Press the button in between the control stick to fire (sound).
- Press the left/right ends of button below the operating light to turn the turret left and right. (This is for tank item)
- Do not let the vehicle get out of transmitting range, as you will have no control of the car. The range varies due to surroundings.
- Turn all switches "OFF" and remove all batteries when it is not used. Car operation varies from 25 - 35 minutes, it depends on how the car is used, and the age of the batteries.

#### 4. Wheel Alignment



- Occasionally the car may sway left or right while moving forward or backward.
- The steering can be adjusted with the trim switch at the bottom of chassis area. Push either left or right until you have made the adjustment to maintain a straight path of movement.

#### 5. Things You Should Know


- Radio interference can cause the car to react strangely.
- Another car operating on the same frequency can disrupt your controlling of the car.
- CB's cellular telephones, two way radios and other transmitting devices as well high tension wire may cause interference with operation.
- The car sometimes cause interference with television or even radio reception.
- Do not use the car in mud, water, snow or sand.
- Do not crash the car into any object at high speed.
- When the car slows down, it is time to charge new batteries.
- When the operating light on the controller becomes weaks, it is time to change new battery.
- Do not leave the car in direct sunlight for lengthy periods.

#### Warning:


- Non-rechargeable batteries are not to be recharged.
- Rechargeable batteries are to be removed from the toy before being charged.
- Rechargeable batteries only to be charged under adult supervision.
- Different types of batteries or new and used batteries are not to be mixed.
- Only batteries of the same or equivalent type as recommended are to be used.

- Batteries are to be inserted with the correct polarity.
- Old battery are to be removed from the toy.
- The supply terminals are not to be short-circuited.
- To providing the use of your vehicle, after long continuous play, the RC Vehicle may shut down to self cool.
