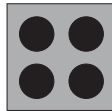

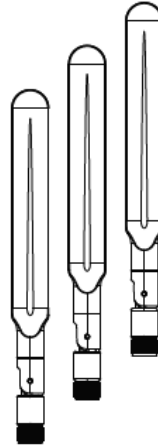

Device Guide

Product Description

All FEX-201E/211E and 202E/212E products feature the same FEX-200E chassis with one or two LTE FEM-06-AMEU or FEM-12-GBL modem(s) pre-installed, as highlighted below.

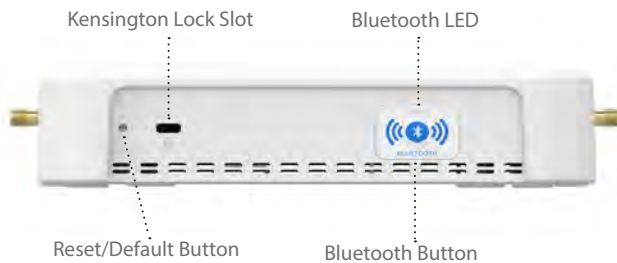
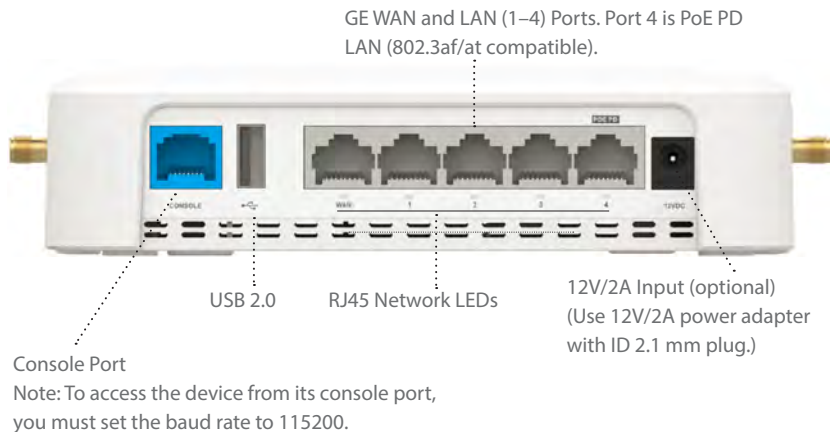

- FEM-06-AMEU LTE CAT 6 modem (Downlink: 300Mbps; Uplink: 50Mbps; Region: North America and Europe only).
- FEM-12-GBL LTE CAT 12 modem (Downlink: 600Mbps; Uplink: 150Mbps; Region: worldwide).
- FEX-201E/211E and 202E/212E only support MicroSIM (3FF) SIM cards, which are not included. You must purchase your own SIM cards.





Ports, LEDs, and Buttons





LED Behavior

LED	Behavior and Description
RJ45 Network LEDs	Green Steady: 1G network connected. Green Flashing: 1G network activity. Amber Steady: 100M network connected. Amber Flashing: 100M network activity. Off: No network connection.
Bluetooth LED	Green Steady: The Bluetooth configuration window is open. Blue Flashing: Bluetooth configuration is in progress. Blue Steady: Bluetooth configuration is completed. The LED turns off in 5 seconds. Off: No Bluetooth configuration is allowed.



Control Button Usage

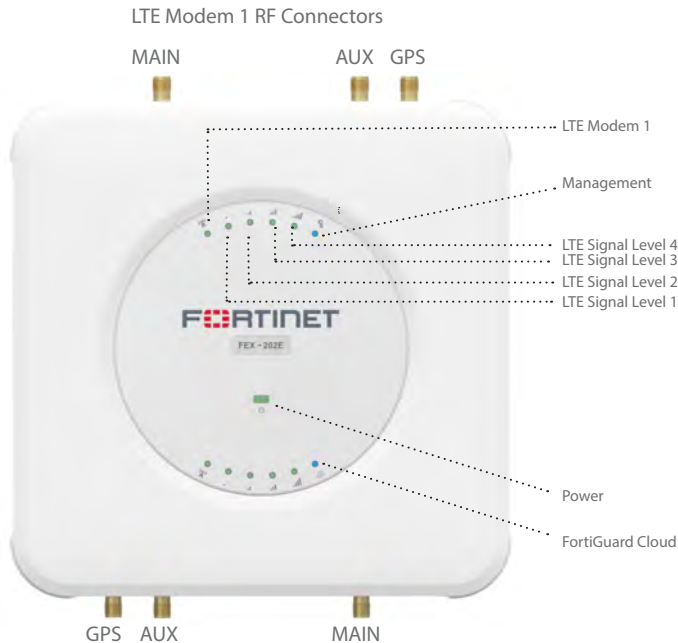


Button	Operating Instructions
Reset/Default Button	Press and hold for less than 5 seconds: Reset/Reboot the device. Press and hold for more than 5 seconds: Restore the device to its factory default settings.
Bluetooth Button	Press and hold for less than 3 seconds: Ignored. Press and hold for more than 3 seconds: Opens a window (period) of time for Bluetooth configuration, and turns on the Bluetooth LED. Note: The “window” closes if no Bluetooth configuration activity occurs within 30 seconds. Re-pressing the button has no effect while Bluetooth configuration is in progress or if it is completed within 5 minutes.

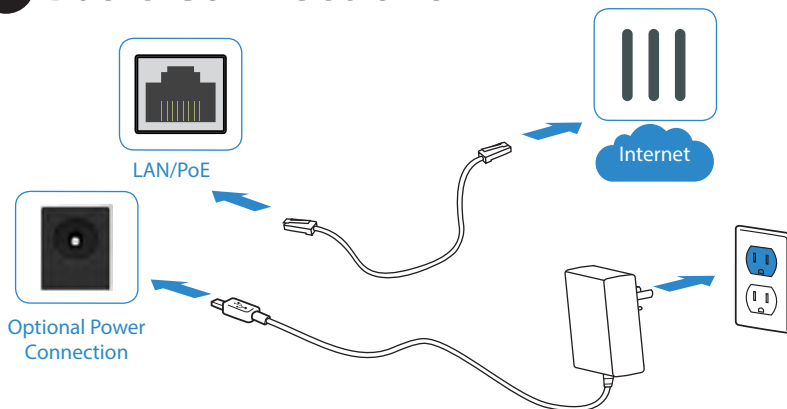

LTE Modem 1	Green Steady: Connected to carrier and working properly. Green Flashing: Booting up and connecting to carrier. Green Rapidly Flashing: SIM or firmware error. OFF: No LTE Modem 1.
LTE signal level 1	Green: LTE signal strength <25% (LED 1 on).
LTE signal level 2	Green: LTE signal strength 25%–50% (LED 1 & 2 on).
LTE signal level 3	Green: LTE signal strength 50%–75% (LED 1, 2, & 3 on).
LTE signal level 4	Green: LTE signal strength >75% (LED 1, 2, 3, & 4 all on).
LTE Modem 2	Same as LTE Modem 1. See above.
Power	Green Steady: Booted up and working properly. Green Flashing: Booting up. Amber Steady: System error. OFF: No power.
Management	Blue Steady: Managed by FortiGate or FortiExtender Cloud. Blue Flashing: Connecting to a managing device. OFF: No management connection.
FortiGuard Cloud	Blue Steady: Connected to FortiGuard Cloud (FGC). Blue Flashing: Connecting to FGC. Blue Rapidly Flashing: Error in connecting to FGC. OFF: No connection to FGC.





1 Basic Connections



1. Insert one end of an Ethernet cable into the LAN/PoE port on the device.
2. Insert the other end of the Ethernet cable into the PoE LAN port on your FortiGate appliance. Ensure that FortiGate and FortiExtender are on the same subnet.
3. Optionally, if you are not using PoE, connect the device to a power outlet using a power adapter.

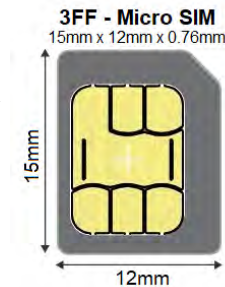
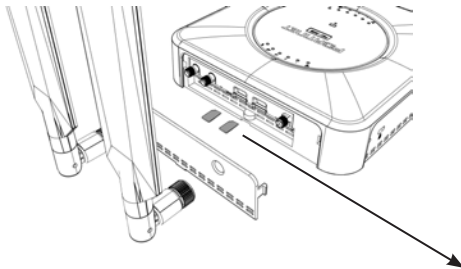
You must provide adequate grounding to the PoE injector of the FortiExtender unit, if required, in compliance with your local electrical code or regulations. This device complies with IEEE 802.3af/at PoE specification. Do not use a PoE injector that is not IEEE 802.3af/at compliant as it might damage your device.





2 Assembly

1. Remove the dust cover that protects the SIM sockets and fits over the antenna posts.
2. Insert your MicroSIM (3FF) SIM card(s) into the SIM socket(s).
3. Observe the following guidelines:
 - If installing one SIM card, you can insert the card into either SIM socket.
 - If installing two SIM cards, use SIM1 as the primary socket and SIM2 as the secondary.
4. Insert the SIM card(s) into the SIM socket(s), making sure that the card is facing down with the cut corner on the left. (If necessary, press the card again to remove it.)
5. Replace the cover, and then attach the antennas.
6. (FEX-202E/212E only) Repeat Steps 1 through 4 above to assemble the LTE Modem 2 side.





3 IP Configuration

After you have connected the FortiExtender network interfaces, the device automatically attempts to obtain an IP address from a DHCP server. If you do not use DHCP, you can configure a static IP address.

To configure a static IP address:

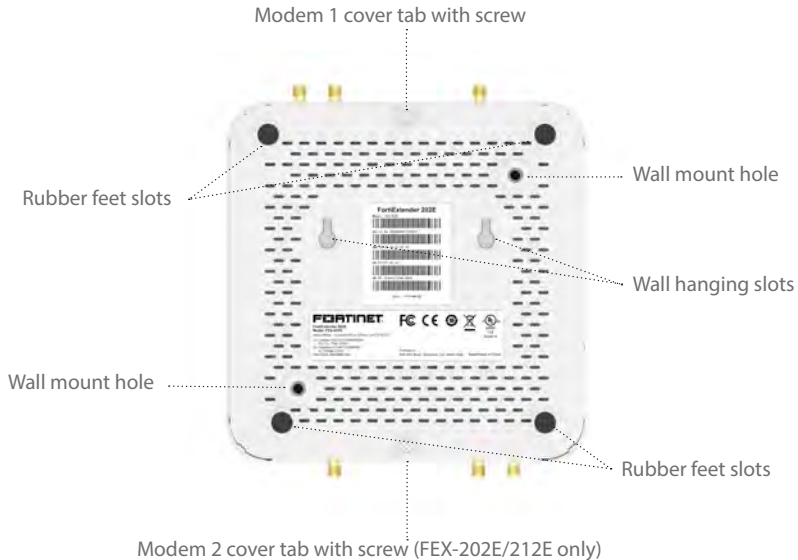
1. Use an Ethernet cable to connect one of the LAN ports in the back of the FortiExtender to the Ethernet port of your computer.
2. Configure the computer to be on the same subnet as the FortiExtender by changing its IP address to 192.168.1.1 and the netmask to 255.255.255.0.
3. Open your web browser and point to the default FortiExtender web GUI address: <http://192.168.1.2>
4. In both the username and password fields, type **admin** and press Enter.
5. Go to Network Configuration.
6. For address mode, select **Static**.
7. Specify the IP address, netmask, and gateway; and then click **APPLY**.





4 Installation

The FortiExtender device is designed for placement near a window (desk or wall mount) to achieve the best 3G/4G signal strength. Refer to the diagram below for proper placement and mounting.



Install SIM card(s)

1. Unscrew the modem cover screw on the bottom of the unit.
2. Push the screw tab outwards, and unlock the cover from one end to remove it.
3. Insert your MicroSIM (3FF) SIM card(s) into the SIM socket(s).
4. Replace the modem cover, and fasten it onto the unit housing with the screw.





Place on top of a desk or flat surface

1. Attach the rubber feet to the four corners on the bottom of the unit.
2. Place the unit on the desk or flat surface.
3. Secure the unit in place with a Kensington lock.
4. Attach the antennas.





Hang on a wall

1. Peel off the drill template sticker, and stick it onto the wall in a desired location.
2. Use the template to mark and drill the pilot holes.
3. Insert the anchors into the holes.
4. Insert the screws into the anchors and tighten, leaving around a 5-mm gap between the screw head and the wall.
5. Position the device so that the mounting holes line up with the screws.
6. Place the mounting slots over the screws and slide the device down until the screws fit into the slots.



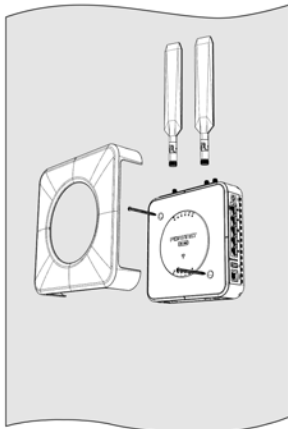
Tip:

Use bear claw screws. The screw heads of bear claw screws have a built-in gap that fits well with the hanging holes. You can purchase bear claw screws from a local or online hardware store.

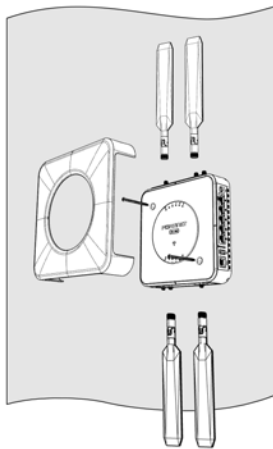
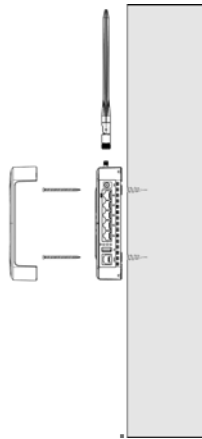
Fasten onto a wall

1. Peel off the drill template sticker, and stick it onto the wall in a desired location.
2. Use the template to mark and drill the pilot holes.
3. Insert the anchors into the holes.
4. Snap off the plastic cover over the LEDs on the front to reveal the long screw holes.
5. Insert the long screws through the device from front to back.
6. Insert the long screws into the anchors on the wall and tighten.
7. Replace the cover over the LEDs on the front. Refer to the illustrations on the next page.

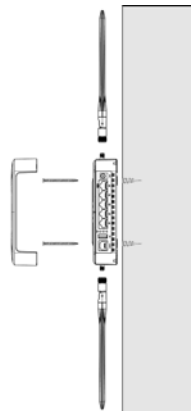




FEX-201E/211E Wall Mount
