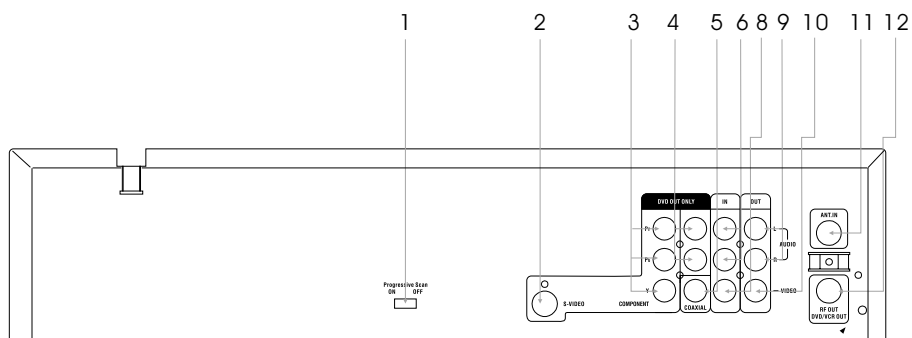

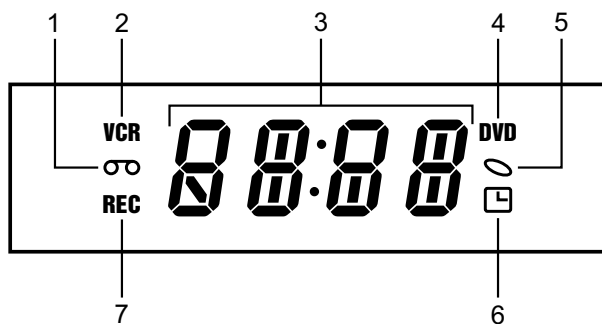

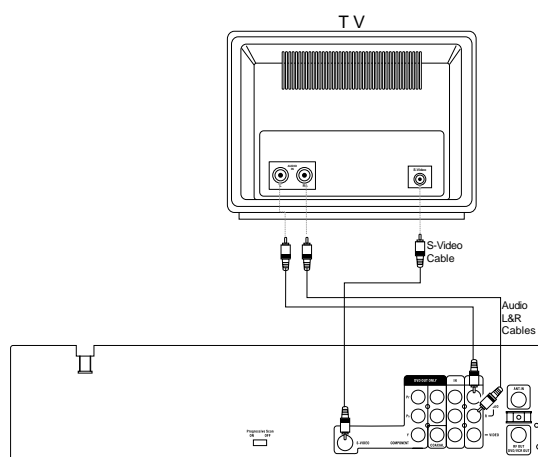

NOTES FOR CONNECTING TO A TV:

- TV must have Y, PB and PR input jacks.
- Set the VIDEO OUT Option (on the GENERAL Menu Page) to YUV if using the component Video Out jacks.
- When connecting the DVD ,refer to the owner's manual of the TV, as well as this manual.
- When connecting the DVD to the TV, make sure the power is off and both units are unplugged before making any connections.
- Component Y,Pb,Pr,Jacks can only be used for DVD Playback, not for VCR playback.
- If using a TV with a blue screen option, turn the option off on the TV for best results.

PROGRESSIVE (Y, PB, PR) VIDEO OUT:

Use these jacks to connect to a TV with progressive video input jacks, set the progressive scan switch to 'ON'. Progressive scan is a video scanning system that displays all lines in a frame in one pass, as opposed to the traditional system, interlaced scan. This connection provides optimum quality. To ensure maximum picture quality, use three video-grade cables for connections. Note that it is essential to match the color-coded connectors with a compatible TV.

Notes: When "Component Video Out" is set to "Progressive Select", there is no video output from the "Video Out(Composite)" and "S-Video" jacks.

525 LINE DIGITAL PROGRESSIVE-SCAN COMPONENT VIDEO OUTPUT.

Compared to standard interlaced video, progressive scan effectively doubles the amount of video information fed to your TV or monitor. The result is a stable, flicker-free image. (Check your TV/monitor for compatibility with this feature).

For the very highest picture quality, try watching a movie on DVD-Video on a progressive-scan compatible TV.

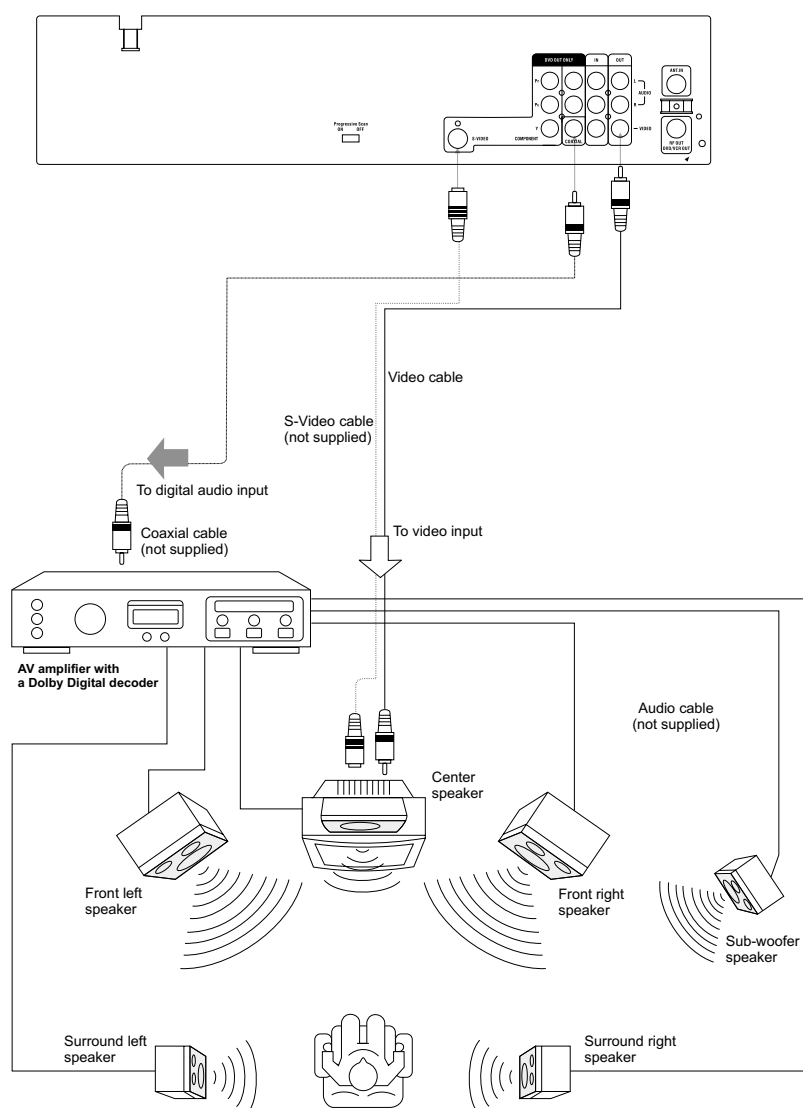

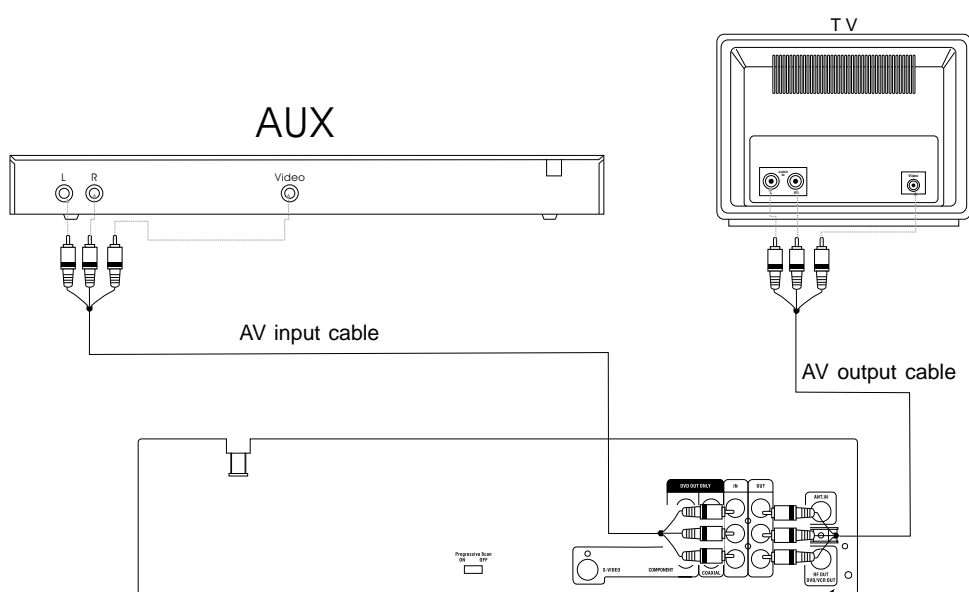

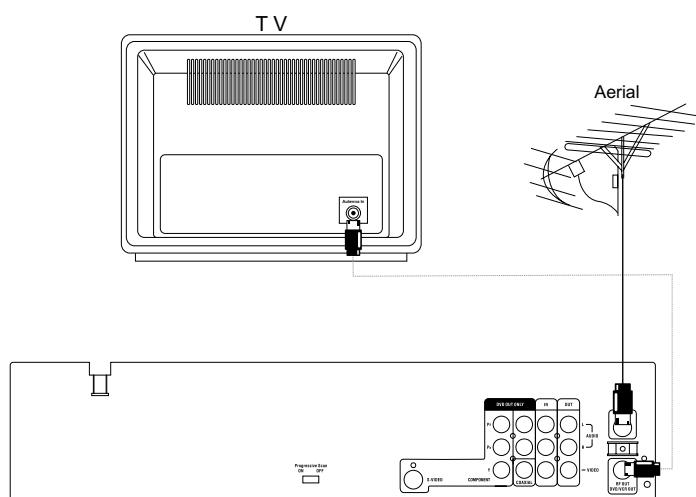

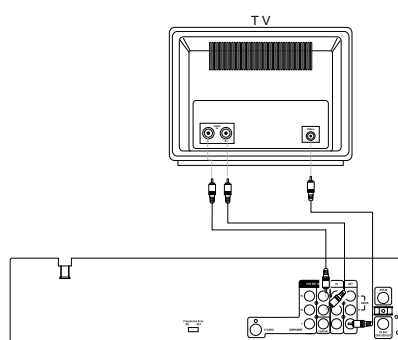

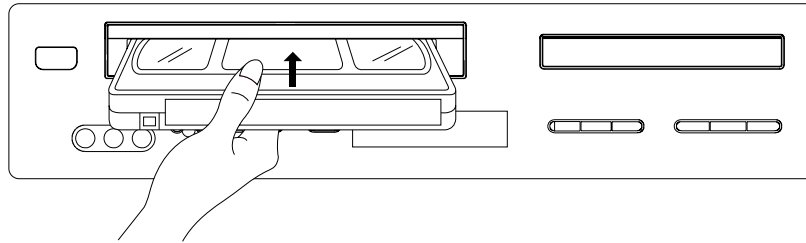

VCR PLAYBACK

1. Press the [⏻ / POWER] button to power on.
2. Press the VCR button of remote control or the SELECT button of the front panel to enter VCR mode.
3. Insert the desired videotape.



4. Press the INPUT button of the remote control to select PROGRAM 1 of the VCR mode.
5. Press the PLAY button to play the videotape.
6. To stop the playback, press the STOP button.
7. To pause the playback, press the PLAY/PAUSE button.

To Copy from DVD to Videotape

3. Connect the AV (Video and Audio L&R) Jacks with the RCA cords according to colors to the TV display.
4. Press the DVD button of the remote control to select DVD mode and play the disc.
5. Go to the desired DVD chapter of the disc and press the RECORD button of the remote control or of the front panel to start recording desired DVD chapter.
 - DVD plays and VCR starts recording.
6. To exit copy, press the STOP button.
7. Press the VCR button to select the VCR mode.
8. Press the F.R (Rewind) button of the remote control to go back to the beginning of the recording track. Press the STOP button and press the PLAY button to play the recording portion.

To Select External Input

Press the INPUT button of the remote control to select between broadcasting mode, AV1, AV2 and AVF.



To Record from External Input

1. Insert a recordable tape.
2. Press the AV1/AV2 button of the remote control repeatedly to select desired external input.
3. Press the RECORD button to start recording.
4. Press the STOP button to exit the recording.

To Record from Antenna Input

1. Insert a recordable tape.
2. Press the INPUT button of the remote control repeatedly to switch to broadcasting mode.
3. Use the ▲/▼ or Number buttons to select your desired TV station.
4. If you cannot receive a TV station, follow the procedures of "Setting the Channel Set" page in this manual to automatically scanning all TV stations receivable.
5. After setting your desired TV station, press the RECORD button to start recording.
6. Press the STOP button to exit the recording.

ONE TOUCH TIMER RECORDING(OTR)

When your urgent business happens suddenly in watching TV or you want to record the current TV program for the desired time, follow the procedures below.

1. First, follow the steps 1 to 4 in "Recording With VCR".
2. Press [REC] button as much as you want.

3. To stop Recording mode, press [STOP] button more than 8 seconds.

To Enjoy Another TV Program During Recording

You may enjoy another TV program during recording, Press the TV/VCR button on the remote or front panel, "TV" will appear on the display. Now you may enjoy another TV program with your TV. Press the TV/VCR button again to return to VCR mode, "VCR" will appear on the display.



ABOUT VCR

VIDEO HEAD CLEANING

The video heads enable the VCR to read video information pictures from the tape during playback. In the unlikely event that the heads become clogged with dirt video playback will be impossible. This can easily be determined during playback of a known good tape, there is good sound, but the picture is extremely snowy.

If this is the case, have the video cassette recorder checked by qualified service personnel.

NOTES

During normal operation of the VCR, the video and audio heads can accumulate dirt over a period of time, especially when using an old or poor quality tape.

When the heads are dirty, the picture can get snowy and the tracking control will have little or no effect. If this condition occurs, head cleaning cartridges may take care of the problem and restore normal picture.

We recommend that head cleaning cartridges be used sparingly since they are very abrasive and can damage the video heads during prolonged use.

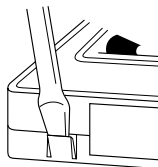
If the problem is not resolved with the head cleaning cartridge then the unit needs to be checked by a qualified service personnel.

ERASURE PROTECTION

Video cassettes are equipped with a safety tab to prevent accidental erasure. When the tab is removed, recording can not be performed.

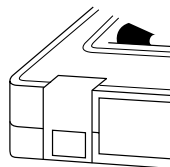
TO PREVENT ACCIDENTAL ERASURE

- After recording, break off the safety tab with a screwdriver if you don't want to record over the tape.



TO RECORD AGAIN

- Cover the hold with cellophane tape.

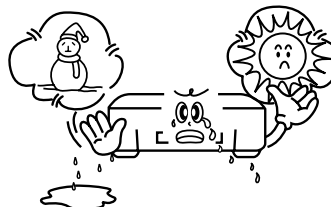


WHAT IS DEW CONDENSATION SYMPTOM?

If a VCR is moved from a cool place to a warm and damp place or a place facing a direct cool wind from air-conditioner and others, temperature varies sharply, which makes dew on head drums of VCR.

IF DEW CONDENSATION OCCURS,

1. First, turn it on for one or two hours before using it.
2. Do not use it because it may develop troubles of a VCR or videotape.

Playing Discs

Compatible Disc

This DVD Player is capable of playing the following types of discs: DVDs, Audio CDs, Video CDs, and Cds with mp3 files, WMA files (Windows Media Audio), and JPEG files on them. Before you put a disc in the player, make sure it is compatible.

You can't play the following types of disc: Laserdiscs, CD-1, CD-ROM (computer-only discs), DVD-ROM (computer-only discs), DVD-Rom, or discs recorded using other broadcast standards (i.e., PAL or SECAM); CD-G discs.

Notes: Some discs may not be compatible due to laser pickup, recording formats, and software used.

Some technologies and methods used for mp3 file recording on CD-Rs can prevent optimal playback of these files on your DVD player by degrading the sound quality and / or the ability of the player to read the file.

Regional Coding

Both the DVD Player and the disc are coded by region. These regional codes must match in order for the disc to play. This player's code is Region 1.

Turn on VCR DVD Player

1. Plug the power cord into the outlet once the DVD player is connected to your TV.
2. Turn on the TV and Tune to its Video input Channel, if necessary.
3. Press the STANDBY/STOP on the DVD player or the ON/OFF button on the remote control to turn it on.
4. Press the DVD button on the remote control to choose DVD section.
5. Press the OPEN/CLOSE button on the front of the player or remote control to open the disc tray.
6. Place a disc gently into the tray with the disc's label facing up (double-sided discs have content on both sides, so you can place the disc with either side up.)
7. Press OPEN/CLOSE again to close the disc tray. Play starts automatically. If a menu appears one of its options can be selected to start playing the disc. Highlight it and press ok.
8. Press STOP to stop playback. The player remembers the point where disc was stopped. If you press PLAY again, playback resumes from this point. To stop playback completely or to start again from the beginning, press STOP twice. If the player is left in STOP mode for more than one minute without any user interaction, the screen saver activated.

Basic Playback Options

Search - To search a disc, you can use the FORWARD button or REVERSE button. you can also use the following search features:

Picture Scan - When you're playing a disc, each time you press FORWARD or REVERSE, your DVD player scans the disc faster until you reach the fastest scan speed. To resume normal playback, press PLAY or continue to press FORWARD or REVERSE.

Freeze Frame and Frame Advance - While a disc is playing, press PAUSE to freeze the picture. To advance one frame at a time, press STEP repeatedly. To resume normal playback, press PLAY.

Note : After approximately one minute in PAUSE with no user interaction, the player goes into screen saver mode.

Slow Motion - While a disc is playing. Press Slow/F (each time you press SLOW/F, the slow motion will get even slower until you reach the slowest speed). To resume normal playback, press PLAY.

Chapter/Track Advance - While a disc is playing you can skip forward or backward a chapter or track at a time by pressing the SKIP ► and skip ◀.

Note : To directly access a specific track or chapter number. Press search button, use the number buttons to enter track or chapter number. For single digit tracks or chapters, enter a 0 before single digit numbers; for example, enter 0, then 3 for chapter/track 3.

Zoom - While a disc is playing, press ZOOM (the player zooms in on the image). Each time you press ZOOM, the picture is magnified even more (until you get to the maximum zoom level). To see other parts of the picture when you've zoomed in on the image, try pressing the ◀ ▶ ▲ ▼ buttons to go in corresponding directions. This feature is called pan and scan.



Playback Modes

Repeat Playback

While the disc is playing, press REPEAT button repeatedly to select a play mode:

DVD play modes : Title repeat, chapter repeat, A-B repeat;

CD play modes : All tracks repeat, Track repeat.

A-B Repeat

To repeat a segment between two points (A and B), press the A-B button at the beginning of the segment you want to repeat. Allow the disc to play to the end of the segment or use FORWARD to advance to the end point(B). Press the A-B button again at the end of the segment. The segment plays repeatedly until you press A-B to resume normal playback.

Advanced Playback Features

Audio(DVD,VCD and CD)

Some discs have several audio tracks used for different languages or different audio formats. To change the language or audio format during play, press the AUDIO button one or more times to select one of the available audio formats or languages.

Notes: This option is only available if the disc offers a number of languages or formats.

Display

The Display appears across the top of the screen when you press the DISPLAY button on the remote while playing a disc. Press the DISPLAY button repeatedly to scroll through playback information.

Playback Control (PBC)

The Playback Control feature is available only on video CDs. Press PBC button to turn the PBC feature on and off. The playback Control feature supports the menus of the VCD format similar to a DVD menu.



Playback of mp3, WMA, or JPEG files

Playing mp3, WMA, or JPEG files

mp3 is an audio file format which compresses recorded music. It was developed by fraunhofer Gesellschaft in collaboration with Thomson Inc. The main advantage of the mp3 format is the ability to store CD-quality music tracks on a personal computer in a user-friendly, compressed files. WMA(Windows Media Audio) is another audio file format, developed by Microsoft. JPEG files are image files (make sure they have a resolution of less than 5 megapixels.)

Note: the time taken for the contents of the disc to be displayed varies according to the size and number of JPEG files actually on the disc. If nothing is displayed after a few minutes, it is likely that certain files are too large. In this case, reduce the files resolution to less than 5 megapixels and write another disc

Before inserting a disc check that it is compatible with the player:

1. Turn on the DVD and open the disc tray by pressing OPEN/CLOSE.
2. Place the disc in the tray with the printed side facing up and close the tray.
3. Select a folder using the ▲ AND ▼ buttons on the remote control; press OK to see the folder's contents.
4. Select a track using the ▲ AND ▼ buttons on the remote control; press OK to start playback.
5. Press the STOP button to stop playback.
6. To go back to the folder list, press the ◀ button in stop mode.

Repeat Play Modes

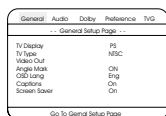

The DVD player menu system is not the same as the disc menu. The DVD player menu appears when there's no disc playing.

To access the DVD player menus:



- Press the SETUP button to display the main menu.
- Select a menu icon using the ◀ AND ▶ buttons.
- Use the ▲ AND ▼ buttons to select one of the options in the menu.
- Press the ▶ button to access the submenu.
- Use the ▲ AND ▼ buttons select one of the options in the submenu.
- Press OK to confirm your selection.
- Return to a previous menu using the ◀ button.
- To exit from the player menus, press the SETUP button repeatedly.

TV Display

You can choose a display that affects how a disc's content appears on your TV screen.

Normal/PS(4:3Standard):reproduces a 4:3 picture with some distortion,

Normal/LB(4:3 Letterbox):gives best reproduction of pictures recorded in this format(i.e., with horizontal bands at the top and bottom of the screen),

Wide(16:9 Widescreen): reproduces 16:9 format films in full, on a 16:9 screen.

TV Type: The TV type feature allows you to choose NTSV or PAL.

Video Out TV Format.

The Video Out feature allows you to select the type of signal you want to output to your TV for movies. Of course, your TV must be equipped with these jacks. Refer to the "Other Connection Options" of this User's Guide.

S-VIDEO:produces a better picture quality.

YUV (Component Y, Pb,Pr): Produces optimum picture quality.

Angle Mark : Select ON/OFF when angle mark is available.

OSD Lang (Language)

The OSD Lang feature enables you to set the preferred on -screen menu language: English or French.

Captions: Turn the hider subtitle ON or OFF.

Screen Saver: Turn the Screen Saver ON or OFF.

The Speaker Setup Menu:

Choose the LT/RT or stereo mode of the Downmix option.

The Dolby Digital Setup Menu:

The preferences Setup Menu:

The menu gives you options to change some aspects of your DVD player to fit your personal preferences.

Notes: Discs are created differently. The DVD player can't override some language preferences. If a disc's software was created to play the movie (title) in a preferred language, the preference you set might be ignored. Also, if the language isn't available on the disc you're playing the disc's default language will be chosen. if the disc wasn't created with subtitles, ou won't be able to use the Subtitle feature.

Password:Select this option for password changing. The factory default pawword is "1234".

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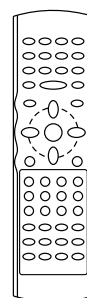
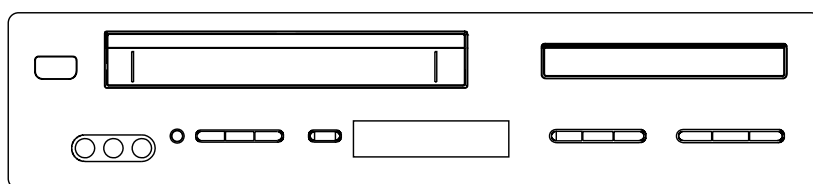
