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


Phone Overview

Getting Started with Your Phone





* For best performance, do not touch this area when using your cellphone.

**1. Earpiece****2. Main Display****3. Microphone****4. Left Soft Key**

Press to display the Message submenu or access the function listed above the key.

5. Camera/Video Key

With the flip open, press for quick access to the Take Picture mode or press and hold to access the Record Video mode.

6. Send Key

Press to place or answer calls. From the idle screen, press to access the All Calls list.

7. Voicemail Key

From the idle screen, press and hold to connect to your Voicemail server.

8. Clear/Voice Commands Key

From the idle screen, press to access the Voice Commands function. Press and hold from the idle screen to access the Sound Recorder function. When entering a phone number or text, press to delete a single space or character. Press and hold to delete entire words. Press this key once in a menu to go back one level.

9. Shift Key

Press to enter an asterisk (*) character for calling features. In text entry mode, press to change the character input type. Press and hold to display the plus sign (+) for international dialing.

10. Next Key

In T9 Word or T9 Palabra mode, press to display other matching words.

11.  Directional Key

Allows you to scroll through cellphone menu options and provides a shortcut to cellphone functions from the idle screen.

12.  Center Select Key

Press to access the MENU from the idle screen. It also allows you to accept choices when navigating through a menu.

13.  Right Soft Key

Press to display Contacts or to access the function listed above the key.

14.  Speakerphone/Flashlight Key

With the flip open, press to turn Speakerphone on/off, press and hold to turn the flashlight on/off.

15.  End/Power Key

Press and hold to turn the cellphone on/off or press to end a call or browser session. Within a menu, press to return to the idle screen.

16. Alphanumeric Keypad

Use these keys to enter numbers, letters, and characters or to select menu items.

17.  Vibrate Mode Key

Press and hold to activate/deactivate vibrate mode in the idle screen. Press to enter the number sign (#) character for calling features. In text entry mode, press to accept the word and add a space.

18. One-touch Open Button

Push to open up the flip when it is closed.

19. Charging Terminals

20. Charging/Data Port

**21. Headset Jack**

Allows you to plug in a headset (sold separately) with a standard 2.5mm plug to your cellphone.

22.  PTT Key

Press and hold to utilize Push to Talk (PTT) when the cellphone is in PTT mode.

23.  Volume Keys

Allows you to adjust the master volume in the idle screen (with the flip open) or adjust the voice volume during a call.

24.  G'zGEAR Key

From the idle screen, press to launch G'zGEAR application.

25. Speaker**26. Charge Indicator**

Turns red while charging. Turns green when fully charged.

27. Front Display**28.  Rewind key**

With the flip closed and music playing, touch and hold to rewind music. Tap to go to a previous song.

29.  Fast Forward key

With the flip closed and music playing, touch and hold to fast forward music. Tap to go to the next song.

30.  Play/Pause key

With the flip closed and music playing, Tap to play or pause a song.






Bluetooth® Icons

Feature Overview

Water Resistance

The G'zOne ROCK™ is water resistant. It provides reliable performance for outdoor life, in such conditions as driving rain or high humidity.

The tested device meets the requirements of MIL-STD-810 (Rain & immersion 1m, 30min) standard.

NOTE

To maintain water resistance:


- Securely fasten the Charging/Data Port cover and the Headset Jack cover.
- Completely close the battery cover and rotate the battery lock to the LOCK position.

Shock Resistance

The rugged construction of the G'zOne ROCK™ provides outstanding shock and vibration resistance. The tested device meets the requirements of MIL-STD-810 (Drop 1.5m) standard.

Warning!

The shock and vibration resistance features do not guarantee protection against every type of shock and vibration. Your cellphone may be damaged and malfunction depending on the severity of received shock or vibration.



Dust Resistance

For additional peace of mind, the G'zOne ROCK™ is also dust resistant. The device was tested using silica flour at a temperature of 95F and meets the MIL-STD-810 (Dust) standard.

NOTES

- Your cellphone can be rinsed with clean water when dirty. To ensure water resistance, make sure that all covers are securely closed before rinsing.
- Periodically, clean the Charging Terminals with a dry cloth or cotton swab. Dust may cause some electrical connection problems. Avoid wiping with excessive force, which can disfigure the terminals.



Device Lock Tool

The screw type battery cover lock can be locked or unlocked by inserting the tip of the corner of the Device Lock Tool into its groove and rotating to FREE position or LOCK position. For how to close or open the battery cover, see page XX.

The Battery

The cellphone comes with a rechargeable battery. Keep the battery charged while not in use in order to maximize usage and standby time.

Warning!

- Use only approved batteries for the G'zOne ROCK™. Wipe your cellphone before opening the battery cover to prevent moisture or dust from entering.
- Failure to follow the below directions for installing/removing the battery could result in product failure.
- Fully charge the battery before using the cellphone for the first time.

Installing the Battery

Warning!

Do not install the battery where water or liquid may fall directly on the cellphone or battery or in a humid place such as a bathroom. Otherwise, the electrical circuits may short or erode and cause the cellphone to malfunction.

1. Insert the tip of the corner of the Device Lock Tool into the groove of the screw type battery cover lock and rotate in the direction indicated by the arrow in the figure to the right. Rotate the battery lock as far as it will go towards the FREE position.





2. Insert your finger in the groove (① in the figure to the right) on the left side of the cellphone and pull up the battery cover in the direction of the arrow ② in the figure to the right.



3. Insert the two tabs on the left side of the battery into the cellphone (in the direction of the arrow ① in the figure to the right) and insert the battery into the cellphone (in the direction of the arrow ② in the figure to the right).



4. Insert the three tabs at the bottom of the battery cover into the cellphone (in the direction of the arrow ① in the figure to the right) and insert the battery cover into the cellphone (in the direction of the arrow ② in the figure to the right).



5. Press four locations on both sides of the battery cover in the direction of the arrow in the figure to the right.



6. Slide your finger over both sides of the battery cover in the direction of the arrow and check that the battery cover is firmly in place.
