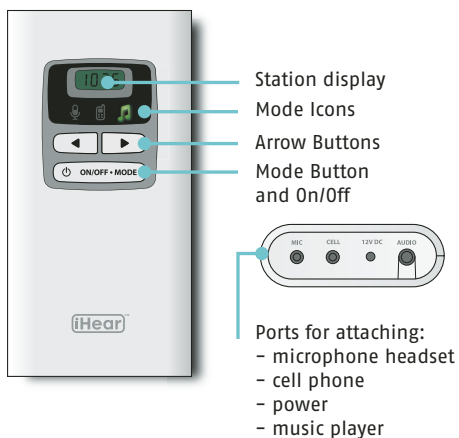


HOW TO USE iHEAR

1. To turn on, tap the ON/OFF button.
2. Tune your car radio to an open station with no broadcast.
3. Connect iHear to the car radio by pressing the arrow buttons until the station displayed on iHear is the same as the radio.
4. Tap the Mode button until the icon for the mode you want is highlighted.

iHEAR KNOW-HOW

Setting the station.

Find any open radio station and then use the iHear arrow buttons to match the open station. If a local radio station interrupts iHear, simply find another open station as instructed above.

Using your cell phone*.

To answer your phone, press EITHER the button on the headset OR the answer button on your phone. You can make or answer a call in ANY mode (📞, 🎵, 📱, 📞📱). If your music is playing, it will continue. If you are in Voice mode (📞), your voice will continue through the speakers. Your phone call will not be affected.

PRIVATE CALL.

When '📱' is highlighted, your call will be a regular hands-free phone call through the headset.

SPEAKER CALL.

When '📞📱' is highlighted, the caller's voice will be heard through the car speakers.

Turning iHear ON or OFF.

Tap to turn on; tap and hold for 3 seconds to turn off.

Memory.

iHear remembers the last used Mode and Radio Station.

Power.

Use batteries or ONLY the power adaptor provided with iHear.

What you can do with iHear

You can choose from 4 modes: Voice, Music, Private Call or Speaker Call. One or two icons will be highlighted, depending on what you want to do.



VOICE

Broadcast your voice through the car speakers so that passengers can hear you.



MUSIC

Listen to music from your iPod or music player through the car speakers.



PRIVATE CALL

Talk hands-free on your cell phone using the headset.



SPEAKER CALL

Talk hands-free on your cell phone through the headset, with the caller's voice heard through the car speakers.
