Signal Word Definitions

NOTE: These are definitions only and may not pertain to the product purchased.

Features and Controls



Battery Installation

1. Open the Battery Compartment by pressing in the tab on the Battery Compartment Cover and removing it.
2. Insert two "AAA" alkaline batteries (not included) into the Battery Compartment, observing the proper polarity (+/-) as indicated inside the Battery Compartment.
CAUTION: Use "AAA" alkaline batteries only.
3. Reattach the Battery Compartment Cover.
CAUTION: To prevent product damage, remove the batteries when the product will not be used for an extended period.

To Use

1. Connect the Audio Input Cord of the unit to the headphone jack or line out jack (preferred, if available) of a compatible portable audio device (e.g., CD or MP3 player).
2. Press the Power Button on the unit to turn it on; the red LED will illuminate indicating it is on.
3. Set the FM Band Selector on the unit to either: "88-92," "92-98," or "98-108," depending on which portion of the FM frequency band in the area has the fewest strong radio station signals; this will minimize interference.
4. Turn on the portable audio device and set the volume to a medium level.
5. Turn on the vehicle's radio and set it to a medium volume.
6. Slowly tune the radio through the FM band range selected in Step 2 until the audio from the portable audio device can be heard through the vehicle's speakers.
NOTE: For best performance, fine-tune the unit using the Fine Tuning Wheel located on the side.
Tip: It may take some time to find and fine-tune an open frequency on the radio, so it may be helpful to save the frequency to a radio preset (if available) to avoid having to repeat that process.
7. Adjust the volume of the portable audio device and/or the vehicle radio to a distortion-free level.
