For the Tune Up information from the applicant, the maximum output power is 1.51mW, so the worst case of Conducted Power and EIRP will be still less than FCC SAR exemption threshold.

Threshold at which no SAR required is 10mw.

Maximum Tx power is 9.12mw EIRP

Conclusion: No SAR is required.
