1. For your Safety and Notice

Please read these safety guidelines before using your mobile phone to assure the safe and obey the law.

For driving safety

- n** While driving please obey local laws and regulations with regard to mobile phone use. Under very rare circumstances using the mobile phone in certain model cars may negatively effect the internal electronic equipment. In order to assure your safety under such circumstances please do not use the mobile phone. If your car is equipped with an airbag, please do not place your phone on top of, or within the contact area of the airbag in order to avoid seriously harming the driver or passenger when the airbag inflates.

Please turn off your mobile phone on airplanes

Please turn off your mobile phone on airplanes, where restricted mobile phone use, otherwise the normal operation of electrical equipment will be affected.

Near volatile area

Please obey laws, regulations and signs, turn off your cell phone when near an area of volatile materials.

Near danger materials area

Please obey laws, regulations and signs, turn off your cell phone when near an area storing fuel, chemicals.

In hospital

Telecommunication key ( calling key,  end key)

 **Calling Key:** Dial a phone number (when had input the numbers or on the phonebook mode) and answer a call; in standby, show all call lists.



 **End Key:** End or reject a call; return to standby mode;






Function icon:

Navigation key and Function key/OK key ( Navigation Key,  Left soft key /

 Right soft key)

To set up the navigation key in the 'settings/Shortcut settings' menu,

 **Left Soft key** /  **Right Soft key**: Carry out the function at the down right of display. Their function is related with the current status of phone.










- I **Number Keys**: 0-9 Number Keys,  and  keys: enter numbers and characters; select menus directly; input the PIN, symbols and Chinese, etc...
- I **When edit phonebook, can press**  **to input different symbols.**
- I **When make an international call**, continually press “ key” for 2 times can input the “+”symbol and 3times can input the “P” symbol.
- I Press 2-9 number keys for 2 seconds, can set as speed dials shortcut.
- I Long press , can input the “+”symbol.
- I Press **Ok key** to open **Menu** in a call.

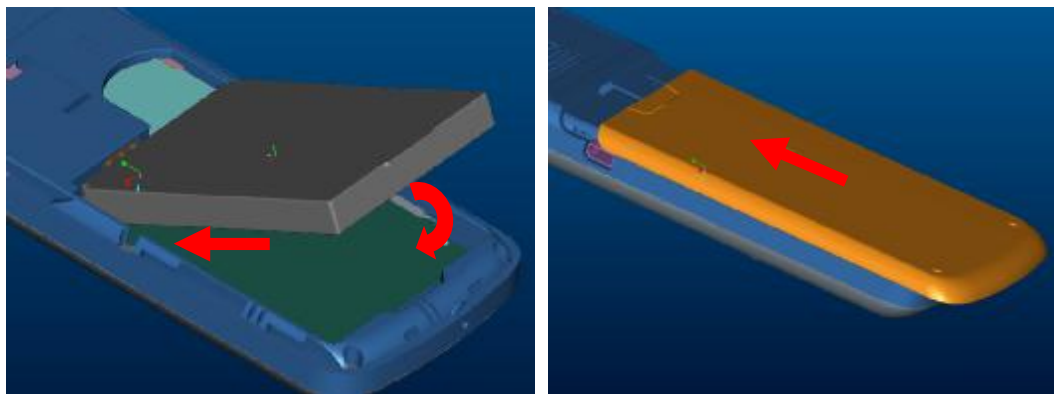

5. Before use

5.1 Battery

Insert Battery: Slide down the battery cover; Insert the gold-colored contactor end of the battery, into the battery slot. Push down on the other end of the battery to snap the battery into place. Slide the back cover towards the top of the device until the back cover is securely in place.

Remove Battery: Turn back and push down the battery cover to remove the battery, put up the battery along the gap of the mechanical structure.



Battery Charging

* With the rechargeable battery for this model. New batteries may require a longer charge time about 12 hours for 3 days. It's best to use out of the battery and then to charge it.

Notice: The standby time and calling time provided by the factory are based on ideal working conditions. During actual use, the work time of the battery may change according to the network situation, work environment and mode of use.

- I Plug the charger into the electrical outlet.
- I Plug the charger connector into the bottom of the phone (with the arrow pointing upward).
- I At this time the charge icon will be shown at the top right corner of the mobile phone's screen; if the mobile phone is charging while power off, a charging indication will appear on the screen. If the mobile phone was used even after there was insufficient power, it might take some time after having begun charging until indication of charging appears on the screen.
- I When the battery level icon indicates that the battery is full, this means that the battery is fully charged. If charging while power off, there will still be an indication on the screen shows that the charging is complete. It is normal that the mobile phone and charger will become warm during charging.
- I When charging is complete, unplug the charge connector from the electrical outlet and the mobile ph

5.2 SIM Card

Insert SIM card: Turn off the phone;

- 1、 with the back of the phone, remove the battery and unplug other external power sources.
- 2、 Turn the metal interface contact of SIM card down place, Insert SIM card into card slot until it completely fixes in slot.
- 3、 Slide the back cover towards the top of the device until the back cover is securely in place.




Remove SIM card: Turn off the phone;

- 1、 with the back of the phone, remove the battery and unplug other external power sources.
- 2、 Hold the SIM card down and slip it out of the slot.



6. Basic Operation

6.1 Turn Your Device On / Off

Make sure of your battery put on. Press  and hold on about 3 seconds to turn you device On/ Off.


If you turn on the phone without inserting SIM card, the phone will indicate “No SIM Card”. After insert SIM card, the phone will check automatically whether the card can use or not.


Then the display will show following indication one by one:


Enter Password — If you have set Phone Lock. Default is 0000.

Enter PIN — If you have set SIM Lock. If you do not know the PIN, please contact with the network operator.


6.2 Key locks and unlock

Manual set the key lock: Under the standby condition, long press the  key , you can lock the key.

Unlock the key: Press the **left Soft key**, then press the  key continually to unlock the key.

P.S. Coming a call, you can press the  key to get your call even the keys are locked. But as soon as you reject or finish the call, the keys will be locked again just as they are locked before the call's coming.

So, if you want to set the lock to be automatically, you can find some suggestions in the chart about “Settings—Phone setting—Keypad locking settings”.

Furthermore you can make emergency call by inputting the relative numbers and then press the  key even the keypad is locked.


P.S. The number will be shown when the last number is input.


6.3 Make a dial

When the network operator's name shows on the display, you can dial numbers. The signal on the up- left corner screen, it will show the strength of signal (when there are **five** bands, it shows the best signal).


Barriers influence the talking quality. Moving in small areas can improve the talking quality.

Making Domestic Calls

Press number keys to enter the telephone number, and then press calling key . If you need to change the phone number, please press **Right soft key** to delete a character at left of the cursor. The dialing animation will appear on the screen during dialing. When the other party picks up the phone, the screen will display information about the call.

Press  to end the call.

Making International calls

Making international calls you should press the  key two times until the international phone prefix “+” appears on the screen. It will allow you to call from any countries when you don't know the local international call prefix (e.g. 86 stands for China).

After entering the prefix, enter the country code and full number you wish to call. The country code is according to convention: Germany is 49, England 44, Sweden 46 and so


on.

When making international calls, you should omit the initial 0 of area codes.

For example: + Country code area code telephone number calling key

Calling Fixed Line Extensions

Some fixed phone extensions cannot be called directly. You must go through the switchboard before dialling the extension. When you enter the telephone number, you may add the pause code "P" between the switchboard number and the extension number, this phone will automatically connect you with the extension. The "P" is entered by

pressing  key three times (at this time the screen will display the letter "P").


For example:

Area code switchboard number P extension number calling key

Dialing Calls from the Call Records


All the calls you make, receive and miss on your phone are saved in the call records of your mobile phone. The recently dialled and received calls are found at the top of the call records. The call records are categorized into dialled, received and missed calls. Your mobile phone also allows you to look up all recorded calls. When the call records are full, the old numbers are automatically erased. To look up numbers in the records you must follow the key sequences:

n On standby press calling key  to see the record of all numbers.




n All the numbers in the records may be dialled directly by using Calling key .

When the call records appears, you can press the **Left Soft key** "Option" to carry out following functions on numbers in the call records: "**Dial to**", "**Send Message to**", "**Delete**", "**Save number**", "**Delete all**", "**Show Number**"

Make a call from Phone book

Click "**Phone Book**" or press **Right Soft key** to access Phone Book menu. Then you can look up the right number to make a call. Finding it you can press calling key .

Dialing the voice message box:

Under the condition of standby, press continually the  key or press  and then the  key to get into the **voice message box**. If the box numbers are necessary, just input them.

Emergency Calls

If you are located within the network area (you can find this out by referring to the network strength indicator located on the upper left-hand corner of your mobile phone screen), you should be able to make emergency calls. If your network operator does not provide roaming where you are, "**Emergency only**" will appear on the screen. If you are located within a network area, even if you do not have a SIM card, you will be able to transmit emergency calls.

With the operator's support, you can use this function. There are different of emergency numbers in different countries. So the emergency number of the mobile will not work in everywhere.

Receiving Calls

You can choose different ways to receive calls. If the earphone has been inserted, you

can press keys in earphone to answer a call. If you set **Any key answer** as **On**, any key can receive calls except **End Key**, **Right Soft key**.



Settings when calling

When there's a coming call, you can press  to avoid the ring or vibrate and press



to set the volume.

Call Waiting

If your network operator support and you had activated it, you will hear the waiting voice if there's a new call during talking.

Con-call

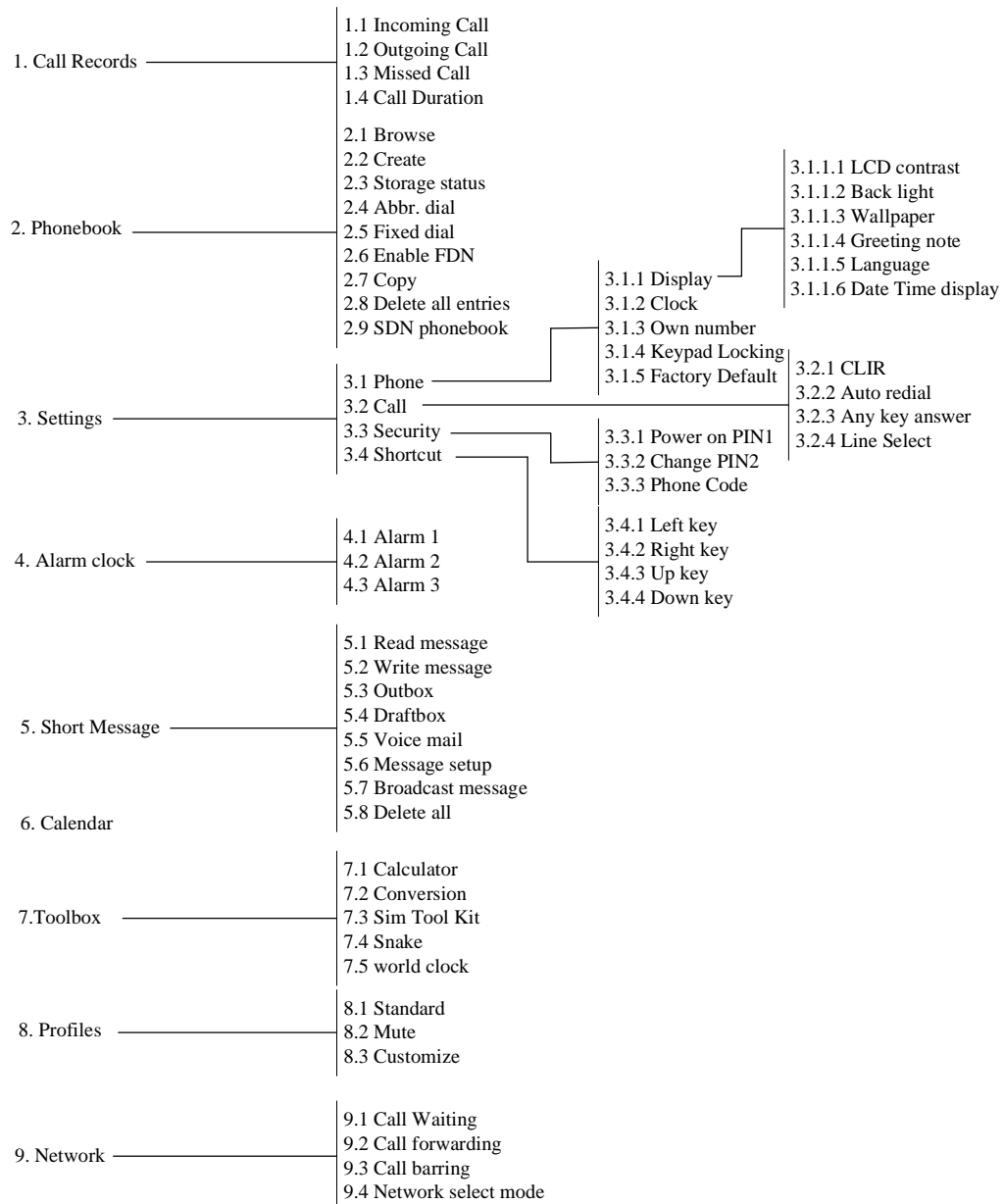
It depends on the network suppliers' support.

Talking Options

During talking, press **left soft key** to enter options, to pause or restore talking, open phonebook, view SMS, etc...

During talking, you can press it enter the **Hands free** mode.

8. Call Records

Your phone keeps lists of the numbers from calls you recently received and dialed, even if the calls did not connect. The call phone can save 20 pieces of Missed calls, Dial calls and Received calls. The lists are sorted from newest to oldest entries. The oldest entries are

deleted as new ones are added. Each entry tells you the person's number (or name, if available), date and time. You can call, store, or delete the numbers on these lists. In main menu interface, scroll **Navigation Key** to select one of the following. Press **Left Soft key "Accept"** to go directly to the corresponding list:

Incoming Call

Access **Incoming Call** menu, will show received calls list which includes date, time and name (if the number has been saved in phone book). Select one of the lists and press **Left Soft key "Option"** to do some operations such as **Dial to**、**Send message to**、**Delete**、**Save Number**、**Delete all**、**Show Number**.

Outgoing Call

Access **Outgoing Call** menu, will show dialed calls list which includes date, time and name (if the number has been saved in phone book). Select one of the lists and press **Left Soft key "Option"** to do some operations such as **Dial to**、**Send message to**、**Delete**、**Save Number**、**Delete all**、**Show Number**.

Missed Call

Access **Missed Call** menu, will show missed calls list which includes date, time and name (if the number has been saved in phone book). Select one of the list and press **Left Soft key "Option"** to do some operations such as **Dial to**、**Send message to**、**Delete**、**Save Number**、**Delete all**、**Show Number**.

Call Duration

In this menu, you can view call time log of phone up to now.

9. Phonebook

Note: The phone can store 100 pieces of entry, and the storage of SIM card depends on the card's capacity.

Click **"Phone Book"** or press **Right Soft key** to access Phone Book menu.

Browse: Browse the phonebook

Create: Add new entry of Phone Book to **SIM card** or **phone**.

Storage status: show you the relative storage state about all the numbers in the phone

and SIM card.

Abbr. dial: You can dial pre-programmed numbers stored on your phone. Your service provider may program your phone with one or more quick dial numbers, such as the customer service number. You can call them by selecting them from the quick dial list. Access this function, you can see the quick dial list.

If the list item is “invalid record”, you can press “confirm” to go to settings/edit.

Fixed dial: When you turn on fixed dial, users can only call numbers stored in the fixed dial list. Fixed dial list entries can be any length. If there is a fixed dial entry for the digits 138, users can call any number that starts with 138. You must enter your SIM PIN2 code, from your network service provider, to edit fixed dial entries.

In the fixed dial list, you can create, edit, delete, and sort entries just like in the phonebook list. Fixed dial list entries are stored on your SIM card.

Note: Employers can use fixed dial to limit employees' phones to a predefined list of numbers, country codes or other prefixes.

Enable FDN: To activate fixed dial.

Copy: Selecting **From SIM** can copy all number entries to phone while selecting **From Phone** can do reversed operation.

Delete all entries: selecting **Delete all SIM entries** or **Delete all ME entries** can delete all entries from SIM or from phone respectively.

SDN phonebook: Dial pre-programmed numbers stored on your SIM card. Your service provider may program your SIM card with numbers for services such as taxi companies, restaurants, and hospitals.

10. Setting

This menu includes all kinds of individuation settings. In it, you can set your mobile phone in the menu according to your using habit including **Phone**、**Call**、**Security**、**Shortcut** .

10.1 Phone

10.1.1 Display

LCD contrast: You can set the amount of contrast in your display. Press **Left/Right Key** to change it.

Back light: You can choose whether the backlights will be always on, or on for a specific amount of time such as 5 seconds ,10 seconds, 20 seconds, 30 seconds.

Wallpaper: to set your wallpaper under standby condition.

Greeting note: It is allowed to change greeting text displayed when you turn on the device.

Language: You can select a different language for your phone's display.

Date Time display: Set whether display the date and time in the idle screen.

10.1.2 Clock

Date & Time Settings: Input the current time and date directly.

Date display format: Set date format as one of the following: **M-D-Y** and **D-M-Y**, according to your fondness.

Date separator

Time display format: Set your time format as 12-hours or 24-hours.

Note: When you remove the phone battery, the stored time and date is displayed the next time you turn the phone on. You may need to reset the time and date, depending on how long the phone is without power.

10.1.3 Own number

Enter your phone number here.

10.1.4 Keypad locking

Set the auto keypad lock function of mobile phone, confirm to enter keypad lock setting interface, you can select respectively **disable** (Auto Keypad Lock will be unavailable to lock the keypad), **10/15, 30/60 seconds**. In standby mode, the keypad will be locked if there is no operation in relevant time. Press the key# to unlock the keypad. The default setting is to disable the auto lock.

10.1.5 Factory Default

Under this menu, enter Phone lock password and confirm it. when the handset is powered on again, some relevant parameters will be reset to the factory settings. Default password is 0000.

10.2 Call

CLIR: This service depends on the service provider's support. You can select on to disable your phone number display on the phone you dial.

Auto redial: You can select ON to set the phone to auto redial the phone number while the call was unconnected or busy.

Any key answer: When you activate Any key answer, you can press any key to answer the call.

Line Select: This function need network support .

10.3 Security

Enter this menu and you can set the safety options of the phone to avoid the phone or the SIM card being used illegally.

-Power on PIN1:

The PIN1 code can protect your SIM card and prevent your SIM card being used illegally. You can set the following:

● **On:** If currently the PIN1 code is set to off, select on. Input the correct PIN1 code and this function will work. Next time when you power on the phone, you need to input the correct PIN1 code before you can enter. The SIM card is protected by the PIN1 code.

● **Off:** If currently the PIN1 code is set to on, select off. Input the correct PIN1 code and you can turn off the PIN1 code protection.

● **Change PIN1:** If you want to change the initial PIN1 code, Select **Change PIN1**, and input the correct initial PIN1 code. The phone will prompt the new PIN1 code for two times. Finally, it will prompt whether the change is successful. You can change the PIN1 code only when PIN1 code is set to on. If it is set to off, this function is ineffective.

Attention: If you have input a wrong PIN1 code for three times in sequence, the SIM card will be locked. At this moment, you need a PUK code to unlock the SIM card. The PIN1 code and the PUK code may be provided to you with the SIM card. If none, please contact your network operator.

-Change PIN2:

Input the correct old PIN2 code, and then you can set the PIN2 code.

-Phone Code:

This function can lock/unlock the phone. If you select on, you can select **Verify** when power-on or **Verify with new SIM**. It also can be set to on, off, and change. The default phone lock code is “0000”.

10.4 Shortcut



can be set to be the shortcut key to access different menu items from the idle display quickly and directly. The menu items for setting include **Inbox**, **Calendar**, **Call records** and **Alarm**.



11. Alarm clock

You can set **three alarm clocks** in this menu. The alarm is effective even though

you turn off the phone.

12. Short Message

You can send and receive short message by SMS center.

The phone supports long SMS. If there is new SMS, the icon  will appear at the top of the screen. If the inbox is full, a flash icon  will appear at the top icon area. You should delete some of them to receive new SMS.

12.1 Read message

Access **Read message** to view the received SMS list. If no any SMS, indicate with blank. Select one of the lists and press **Left Soft key "Accept"** to view the details. You can also do some more operations such as delete, text reply, forward, edit, dial back by press **Left Soft key** to pop the submenu.

Delete: Delete current message.

Text Reply: You can choose the following way to reply: Only send、Only save、Send and Save

Forward: Forward current message.

Edit: Edit the message.

Dial back: Dial the sender.

Extract number: Save the number of the message into the phone or the SIM card.

12.2 Write message

Please check whether the right number of message service center has been set before you write a new message.

Accessing **Write Message**, you can edit short message.

n Input Method The phone provides 5 input methods for you to select.

n After edition is done, you can select **Only Send** and then enter number, or press **Left Soft key "Search"** to select the receiver's number; or select **Only Save**, then the message will be saved into drafts, or select **Send and Save**, the message will be saved into outbox after it is sent.

12.3 Outbox

Access **Outbox** to view the messages you saved (including SIM and phone).

In **Outbox** list, you can press **Up/ Down Key** to scroll through messages, press **OK** to

read message detail, and then press **Option** to access following operations:

Delete Delete current message.

Forward Forward current message.

Edit Write message.

Dial back Dial back the sender .

Extract Number Save the phone number of the sender into the phone or the SIM card.

12.4 Draftbox

Drafts save unfinished SMS which can be revised and sent.

Press **Accept** to access **Drafts** submenu and the phone will show SMS list in **Drafts**. Scroll **Up/ Down** to view SMS and press **Left Soft key “Option”** to make following operation:

Delete: Delete current message.

Forward: Forward current message.

Edit: all SMS in Drafts.

12.5 Voice mail

You can listen to your voicemail messages by calling your network voicemail phone number. Voicemail messages are stored on the network—not on your phone. Contact your service provider for more details. Store your voicemail number in your phone to make it faster and easier to use voicemail. Your voicemail number is provided by your service provider.

Once you store your voicemail number, you can listen to your voicemail messages at any time: Your phone calls the voicemail phone number you stored. If you do not have a voicemail number stored, the phone guides you through storing a number.

12.6 Message Setup

Before using SMS function, you must make relative setting. Accessing **Message Settings**, you can select one of the following functions:

n Service Center: Edit and save the SMS center number (this number can be obtained from the network operator).The messages can be sent successfully only by saving the center number correctly.

n Protocol Type: It can be set as Text, Fax and Email.

n Validity Period: It can be set valid period as: 1 hour, 12 hours, 24 hours, 1 week, 1 month, 3 months, Maximum.

Note: Valid Period of message need the support of network operator.

n Status Report: Press **Left Soft key** to **On/ Off** the function. If **On** the setting, the SMS center will send delivery report to tell your message has been sent or not been sent by some reasons.

Note: Realization of the function needs support of network operator.

n Reply Path: Press **Left Soft key** to **On/ Off** the function.

n Storage media: It can be set **SIM preferred** or **Phone preferred**

n Storage status: Show the memory status of SIM card and phone as n/m form, of which n is current amount of message; m is maximum capacity of SIM card or phone. The message saving number of SIM card depends on the capacity of card.

12.7 Broadcast Message

Broadcast Message is sent by network operator. Using the service, you can receive various subjects of message, such as weather, taxi, hospital, etc. For further information you can contact network operator.

n There're three options: **Topic, Languages and service status** in the **Broadcast Message** submenu. You can select one of them to do some correlative operations.

n You can gain the current received broadcast messages through reading messages.

n Access **service status**, you can turn on/off the function.

Note: The realization of Broadcast Message need the support of network operator.

12.8 Delete all

This setting can delete all the SMS of the inbox, drafts box, and outbox. You can delete one of them or all of them.

13. Calendar

Enter "Calendar", Monthly view provides an overview of the selected month and weeks. It also allows you to jump to a specific date. Press **Up/Down/Left/Right Key** to change the date, the calendar in the bottom of screen will update accordingly.

14. Toolbox

14.1 Calculator

Your mobile phone provides a calculator with 4 basic functions to facilitate simple calculations.

Enter the “**Calculator**” submenu to display the operation interface of the calculator:

- n Use the **Number keys** from **0** to **9** to enter the numbers you wish to enter. Use the **# key** to enter the decimal point. By pressing **Left soft key** or *** key** to choose the mathematical operators +, −, x or ÷, or change the flip sign of the numbers.
- n By pressing **Menu key** or **OK key**, you can get the compute result.
- n By pressing **Right soft key** you can delete the last entry or result. Press the **Right soft key “Cancel”** to exit the calculator.
- n During the calculating, you can press Menu key to choose exchange rate conversion, square, square root if you need or you can choose **Compute result** to calculate the result.

14.2 Conversion

You can use your phone as a conversion.

14.3 Sim Tool Kit

STK is value-added service supplying by network operator.

You can't use the function if SIM card and network operator don't support the service. You can consult with network operator for more information.

14.4 Snake

See the help on the phone.

14.5 World Clock

You can use your phone look over the other country time.

15. Profiles

Your phone rings or vibrates to notify you of an incoming call, message, or other event. This ring or vibration is called an *alert*. Your phone has various user profiles for which you can customize the phone tones for different events and environments. The following profiles are available: Standard, Mute and Customize. You can modify the settings in each profile.

Standard Be available in normal setting.

Mute keep the phone to be quiet.

Customize You can customize a profile by changing the alerts used for specific events (such as incoming calls, text messages, etc.). Your phone includes a variety of preset alert tones and vibrations. Any changes you make are saved to the current alert profile.

Note: Three profiles have been set by the factory, and defaulted to active **Standard** mode.

Press **Up/ Down Key** to scroll to the profile you want to use and press **“Accept”**:

Set as default: Active the profile you select.

Personalise: you can change the settings of the selected profile.

Reset: you can reset the profile to default.

Title: you can change the name of the profile.

16. Network

Access the submenu of **“network”**, you can set up **Call waiting, Call forwarding, Call barring and Network select mode.**

16.1 Call Waiting

If you subscribe to call waiting, an alert tone sounds while you are on a call to indicate that you have received a second call.

n **Interrogate** Query Status of this function

n **Activate** Activate the mode

n **Deactivate** Deactivate the mode

16.2 Call Forwarding

“Call Divert” network service allows the business incoming call to be diverted to your named telephone number based on some preplanning. You can set and cancel this function which needs the network supporting. Please contact with the network operators.

“Call Divert” include : Unconditional divert, Busy divert, No answer divert, No service divert.

n **Interrogate** Query Status of the mode.

n **Activate.** Set up the current incoming diverted number

n **Deactivate** Deactivate Call Divert

When you don't need this service, you can cancel Call Divert to stop the above function.

16.3 Call Barring

Access “**Call Barring**” submenu; you can setup any following barring combination to increase security. Some network operators can't provide such service, for detailed information, please contact with local network operator. Network operators provide “Call-bar Password” with four numbers so that you can activate “Barring Code”. In this menu, you can restrict the following callings respectively.

- n **All Outgoing Calls** It may **Activate**, **Deactivate**, or **Interrogate** all the outgoing calls. Once all outgoing calls are barring, the device can not dial any numbers except emergent number.
- n **All Int'l call** Restrict dialing international long distance phone numbers
- n **Int'l except to home** | Restrict dialing international long distance phone numbers except to home.
- n **All incoming call** Restrict all the incoming calls and incoming calls when roaming. When this is turned on, you will be restricted by the network operator and can not receive any incoming call.
- n **Incoming while roam** Restrict international incoming calls when roaming. When this is activated, you will be restrict by the network operator and can not receive any international incoming call when roaming.

16.4 Network Select Mode

Operate the following two ways to select communications networks.

Automatic Automatically select the service operator according to **SIM information**.








Manual Select network service manually. The mobile phone will search the current list of service operators for users according to the SIM Styles.

18、 Appendix

18.1 Battery Safety

- n Do not disassemble or modify the battery, as this will cause the battery to leak, overheat, crack and catch fire.
- n Do not dispose of old batteries with everyday domestic garbage. Please dispose of old batteries at the directed places with specific rules for their disposal.
- n Please do not put/throw batteries into a fire, as this will cause the battery to catch fire and explode.
- n When installing the battery, do not use force or pressure, as this will cause the battery to leak, overheat, crack and catch fire.
- n Please do not use wires, needles or other metal objects to short-circuit the battery. Also, do not put the battery near necklaces or other metal objects, as this will cause the battery to leak, overheat, crack and catch fire.
- n Please do not solder the contact points of the battery, as this will cause the battery to leak, overheat, crack and catch fire.
- n If the liquid in the batteries goes into the eyes, there is a risk of blindness. If this occurs do not rub the eyes, but immediately rinse eyes with clear water and go to the hospital for treatment.
- n Please do not use or place the batteries near high temperature places such as near a fire or heating vessel, as this will cause the battery to leak, overheat, crack and catch fire.
- n If the battery overheats, changes colour, or becomes distorted during use,

- n In order to prevent damage to your mobile phone, only accessories, designated by your manufacturer such as batteries and charge, may be used with your mobile phone. The use of other batteries or chargers could result in battery leakage, overheating, cracking, fire or other malfunctions.
- n Please do not use your mobile phone near low signal or precision electronic equipment. Radio wave interference may cause the malfunctioning of such electronic equipment and other problems.
