

Central Door Locking and Remote Keyless Entry (RKE) System

Central locking system

Your vehicle security system monitors the vehicle doors, hood and ignition for unauthorized operation. When unauthorized operation is encountered, the vehicle security alarm will be activated. It gives both audible and visible signals; the horn will sound and hazard lamps will flash for 90 seconds.

Auto arming

After pressing Unlock through RKE, if any of the doors is not opened within 45 seconds, all doors will be re-locked and vehicle will be armed.

Re-arming the System

If unauthorized operation triggers the vehicle security alarm and no action is taken to disarm it for 90 seconds, horn and hazard lamps will turn off, security system will re arm the vehicle

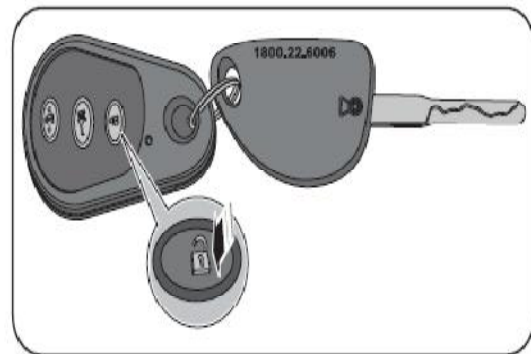
To Disarm the System press the UNLOCK button on the RKE or turn the ignition ON

To lock and arm the vehicle with RKE

When the vehicle is unlocked and disarmed using RKE, hazard lamps will flash twice. If there was an unauthorized attempt by someone from the time you have locked and armed the vehicle to the time you press the unlock button of RKE, hazard lamps will flash and alarm will chirp four times, to alert about unauthorized entry attempt.

To unlock the vehicle with RKE

When the vehicle is unlocked and disarmed using RKE, hazard lamps will flash twice. If there was an unauthorized attempt by someone from the time you have locked and armed the vehicle to the time you press the unlock button of RKE, hazard lamps will flash and alarm will chirp four times, to alert about unauthorized entry attempt.



NOTE NOTICE

Using the key when the vehicle is locked and armed with RKE will be treated by the system as unauthorized.

When vehicle is armed, opening the door from inside by operating door inner handle will activate the vehicle security alarm. If this occurs, press the UNLOCK button on the RKE to disarm the Vehicle Security Alarm.

To activate the security system, always lock the vehicle with RKE.

Panic Alarm

To turn the Panic Alarm feature ON or OFF, press the PANIC button on the RKE for at least one second and release.

When the Panic Alarm is ON, the hazard lamps will flash, the alarm will chirp and interior lamps will come ON. The Panic Alarm will stay on for 30 seconds unless you turn it OFF by pressing the PANIC button for the second time.

RKE operating range

Using RKE, you can lock and arm or unlock and disarm your vehicle from distances of up to 30 ft (9 m). you can set or remove panic alarm from distances of up to 30 ft (9 m)

Battery replacement

If your Remote Keyless Entry (RKE) fails to operate from a normal distance, check for these two conditions.

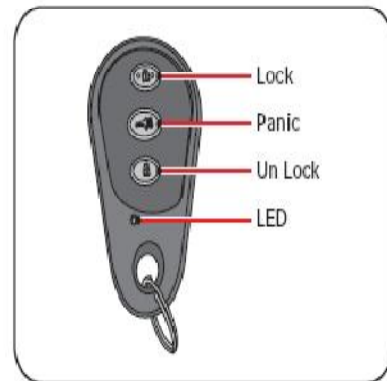
1. A weak battery in the RKE.
2. Closeness to a radio transmitter such as a radio station tower, airport transmitter, and some mobile or CB radios.

NOTICE

After opening the remote, do not touch the battery terminals that are on the back housing or the printed circuit board.

Replacement of RKE

1. Lock Button
2. Panic Button
3. Unlock Button
4. LED



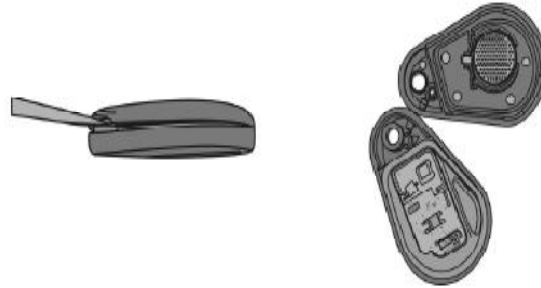
The front side of the RKE has control buttons and an LED. If the LED is not flashing when any of the buttons are pressed or when it flashes once when a button is pressed continuously, it indicates that the Remote Battery is low..

The rear side of the RKE has a screw fitted near the key chain hole. Use a screwdriver to remove this screw. There is a slot on one side of the RKE. Using a coin or a small screw driver, pry and separate the two halves of the casing.



One part contains the circuit and buttons and the second part has the battery.

In the battery side of the casing, insert a sharp object in the slot provided for removal of battery and take the battery out. Insert the new battery. The battery is of 3v type. While fitting the new battery, ensure the positive side of the battery faces downwards.



NOTE

Only RKE transmitters programmed to the vehicle electronics can be used for remote locking and unlocking of the vehicle.

If RKE is lost

If you have lost the programmed RKE, contact Mahindra USA authorized dealer for procuring a new RKE
