Guidelines for safe and efficient use

Please read these simple guidelines. Not following these guidelines may be dangerous or illegal.

Should a fault occur, a software tool is built into your device that will gather a fault log. This tool gathers only data specific to the fault, such as signal strength, cell ID position in sudden call drop and applications loaded. The log is used only to help determine the cause of the fault. These logs are encrypted and can only be accessed by an authorized LG Repair centre should you need to return your device for repair.

Product care and maintenance



Only use batteries, chargers and accessories approved for use with this particular phone model. The use of any other types may void any approval or warranty applying to the phone and may be dangerous.

- Do not disassemble this unit. Take it to a qualified service technician when repair work is required.
- Repairs under warranty, at LG's discretion, may include replacement parts or boards that are either new or reconditioned, provided that they have functionality egual to that of the parts being replaced.
- Keep away from electrical appliances such as TVs, radios and personal computers.
- The unit should be kept away from heat sources such as radiators or cookers.
- Do not drop.
- Do not subject this unit to mechanical vibration or shock.
- Switch off the phone in any area where you are required to by special regulations. For example, do not use your phone in hospitals as it may affect sensitive medical equipment.

- Do not handle the phone with wet hands while it is being charged. It may cause an
 electric shock and can seriously damage your phone.
- Do not charge a handset near flammable material as the handset can become hot and create a fire hazard.
- Use a dry cloth to clean the exterior of the unit (do not use solvents such as benzene, thinner or alcohol).
- Do not charge the phone when it is on soft furnishings.
- The phone should be charged in a well ventilated area.
- Do not subject this unit to excessive smoke or dust.
- Do not keep the phone next to credit cards or transport tickets; it can affect the information on the magnetic strips.
- Do not expose the phone to liquid or moisture.
- Use accessories like earphones cautiously.
- Do not use, touch or attempt to remove or fix broken, chipped or cracked glass.

- Your phone is an electronic device that generates heat during normal operation.
 Extremely prolonged, direct skin contact in the absence of adequate ventilation may result in discomfort or minor burns. Therefore, use care when handling your phone during or immediately after operation.
- If your phone gets wet, immediately unplug it to dry off completely. Do not attempt
 to accelerate the drying process with an external heating source, such as an oven,
 microwave or hair dryer.
- The liquid in your wet phone, changes the colour of the product label inside your phone. Damage to your device as a result of exposure to liquid is not covered under your warranty.

Efficient phone operation

Flectronics devices

All mobile phones may receive interference, which could affect performance.

- Do not use your mobile phone near medical equipment without requesting permission. Avoid placing the phone over pacemakers, for example, in your breast pocket.
- Some hearing aids might be disturbed by mobile phones.
- Minor interference may affect TVs, radios, PCs etc.
- Use your phone in temperatures between 0 °C and 40 °C, if possible. Exposing your
 phone to extremely low or high temperatures may result in damage, malfunction,
 or even explosion.

Road safety

Check the laws and regulations on the use of mobile phones in the area when you drive.

- Do not use a hand-held phone while driving.
- · Give full attention to driving.
- Pull off the road and park before making or answering a call if driving conditions so require.
- RF energy may affect some electronic systems in your vehicle such as car stereos and safety equipment.
- When your vehicle is equipped with an air bag, do not obstruct with installed or
 portable wireless equipment. It can cause the air bag to fail or cause serious injury
 due to improper performance.
- If you are listening to music whilst out and about, please ensure that the volume is at a reasonable level so that you are aware of your surroundings. This is of particular importance when near roads.

Avoid damage to your hearing



To prevent possible hearing damage, do not listen at high volume levels for long periods.

Damage to your hearing can occur if you are exposed to loud sound for long periods of time. We therefore recommend that you do not turn on or off the handset close to your ear. We also recommend that music and call volumes are set to a reasonable level.

 When using headphones, turn the volume down if you cannot hear the people speaking near you, or if the person sitting next to you can hear what you are listening to.

NOTE: Excessive sound pressure from earphones and headphones can cause hearing loss.

Glass Parts

Some parts of your mobile device are made of glass. This glass could break if your mobile device is dropped on a hard surface or receives a substantial impact. If the glass breaks, do not touch or attempt to remove it. Stop using your mobile device until the glass is replaced by an authorised service provider.

Blasting area

Do not use the phone where blasting is in progress. Observe restrictions and follow any regulations or rules.

Potentially explosive atmospheres

- Do not use your phone at a refueling point.
- · Do not use near fuel or chemicals.
- Do not transport or store flammable gas, liquid or explosives in the same compartment of your vehicle as your mobile phone or accessories.

In aircraft





Installing the SIM Cards


When you subscribe to a cellular network, you are provided with a SIM card loaded with your subscription details, such as your PIN, any optional services available and many others

Important!

- The SIM card can be easily damaged by scratches or bending, so be careful when handling, inserting or removing the card. Keep all SIM cards out of the reach of small children.
- 1 Remove the back cover as shown in figure.




2 Make sure the gold contact area on the card is facing downwards.



3 Insert your battery.



4 Replace the back cover.



Charging the phone



- Insert the charger and plug it into an electrical outlet.
- To maximize the battery lifetime, ensure that the battery is fully charged before you use it for the first time.

♠ WARNING

Use only LG-approved chargers, batteries, and cables. When using unapproved chargers or cables, it may cause slow battery charging, or pop up the message regarding slow charging. Turning Your Phone On/Off

You can power the phone On or Off by pressing and holding the End/Power key.

Calls

Making a call

- 1 Enter the number using the keypad. To delete a digit press Clear.
- 2 Press ____ to initiate the call.
- 3 To end the call, press .

TIP!

To control the volume during a call, press the Up/Down navigation keys.

Making a call from your contacts

- 1 Select **Contacts** from the home screen.
- 2 Using the keypad, enter the first letter of the contact you want to call and scroll through the Contacts.
- **3** Press **to begin the call.**

TIP!

To scroll through your contacts, use the Up/Down navigation keys.

Answering and rejecting a call

When your phone rings, press ____ to answer the call.

While your phone is ringing, select **Silent** to mute the ringing.

Press or select **Silent** then **Reject** to reject the incoming call.

T8 Calls

TIP!

- You can change the settings on your phone to answer your calls in different ways.
- Press Menu > Settings > Call > Advanced settings > Answer mode and choose Any key or Auto answer when headset mode.

Using the speakerphone

During in call, you can activate speakerphone by pressing RSK (H-Free) and you can use the handset in hands-free mode.

If the speakerphone is active, press RSK (H-Held) again to resume normal handset conversation mode.

Viewing your call logs

Press Menu and choose Logs.

- All calls Displays the lists of all three types (Received/Dialled/Missed calls) by time. This option lets you view the details of last 60 calls.
- Missed calls This option lets you view the unanswered calls.
- Received calls This option lets you view the incoming calls.
- Dialled calls This option lets you view the outgoing calls (called or attempted).
- Call duration Allows you to view the duration of your last call, dialled calls, received calls and reset all.
- Text msg. counter Allows you to count the number of messages sent and received from the phone.
- Data information Allows you to view the information of last sent, last received, all sent, all received and reset counter.

Contacts

Searching for a contact

- 1 Select **Contacts** from the home screen.
- 2 Using the keypad enter the first letter of the contact you want to call.
- 3 Press Up/Down navigation keys to scroll through the contacts.

Adding a new contact

- 1 Select **Contacts** from the home screen.
- 2 Choose Add new contact.
- 3 Select To SIM or To Phone and Press OK.
- 4 Then enter the Name, Number & details of your new contact, select **Options** then choose **Save**

Messaging

Sending a message

- 1 Press Menu, select Messaging, select Write message and choose Text Message or Multimedia Message.
- 2 A new message editor will open with the first field for recipients and second field for message content.
- 3 Enter your receipients by either entering manually or from Options choose **Add** recipient to enter from phonebook. If you want to add more recipients, press **\text{\xi} \text{ key in recipient field.}
- 4 Enter your message using either the T9 predictive mode or Abc manual mode or 123 mode. You can switch text input modes by pressing the ## | key.

Entering text

You can enter alphanumeric characters using the phone's keypad. The following text input methods are available in the phone: T9 mode (\$\sqrt{1}\) Abc), Abc mode and 123 mode. To change modes, press the **\(\frac{11}{2}\)** key.

NOTE: Some fields may allow only one text input mode (e.g. telephone number in address book fields).

T9 mode (\$ Abc)

T9 mode (\$1 Abc) uses a built-in dictionary to recognise words you're writing based on the key sequences you press. Simply press the number key associated with the letter you want to enter, and the dictionary will recognise the word once all the letters are entered.

Messaging $\overline{21}$

Using the T9 mode (\$ Abc)

- 1 When you are in the T9 predictive text input mode, start entering a word by pressing keys 2007 to 90000. Press one key per letter.
 - If the word is still incorrect after typing completely, press the left & right navigation keys to scroll through the other word options.
 - If the desired word is missing from the word choices list, add it by using the Abc mode
- 2 Enter the whole word.
 - To delete letters, press Clear.

Abc mode

This mode allows you to enter letters by pressing the key labelled with the required letter once, twice, three or four times until the letter is displayed.

123 mode

Type numbers using one keystroke per number. You can also add numbers while remaining in letter modes by pressing and holding the desired key.

Inserting symbols

If you want to insert symbols, press the \times key, then you can choose a symbol. And in some editors you can press **Options**, go to **Insert symbol**.

Changing the language

There are two ways to change the writing language from the writing screen. You can press **Options**, go to **Writing language** and then set the language you want or long press # 1 key in editor.

Message folders

Press **Menu**, select **Messaging**. And select the folder you want.

Inbox – You will be alerted when you have received messages. They will be stored in Inbox.

Drafts – If you don't have time to finish writing a message, you can save what you have written so far in here.

Outbox – This is a temporary storage folder used while messages are being sent.

Sent messages – After sending out the message, the text message is saved in the Sent folder.

Message settings – Your message settings are pre-defined so that you can send messages immediately. If you would like to change the settings, you can do this using the settings options.

Conversations – Inbox, Outbox and Sent messages are shown together grouped by the recipients.

NOTE: If you want Inbox, Outbox and Sent messages instead of Conversations, then go to **Message Settings**, select **Conversations** and choose **Off**.

E-mail

Setting up your e-mail

You can stay in touch on the move using e-mail on your phone. It's quick and simple to set up a POP3 or IMAP4 e-mail account.

- 1 Press Menu and choose E-mail.
- 2 The first time you open the E-mail, you need to setup an email account. A setup wizard opens to help you add an e-mail account.
- **3** Follow the pop up instruction and enter the information required.

NOTE:

- While doing email operations you may get certificate error.
 From Options choose Install and give any name and save this certificate. The certificate import happens successfully.
- Please set correct Date and Time before you use Email.

Multimedia

FM radio

Your phone has an FM radio feature so you can tune into your favourite stations and listen on the move.

Searching for stations

- 1 Press Menu and select FM radio.
- 2 Select Options and choose Auto search. You can also use the left and right navigation keys to increase/decrease the frequency.

NOTE: Insert the earphone into the headset connector in order to listen to the radio and keep the good radio reception.

Camera

Taking a photo

- 1 Press Menu and choose Camera.
- **2** Holding the phone and point the lens towards the subject of the photo.
- 3 Press **OK** key to take a photo.

The following options will appear at the bottom of the screen by pressing left soft key. White balance – The white balance ensures any the white areas in your video are realistic. To enable your camera to adjust the white balance correctly, you may need to determine the light conditions. Choose from Auto, Daylight, Tungsten, Fluorescent, Cloudy or Incandescent.

Effects – Set the Effects as Normal, Grayscale, Sepia, Sepia green, Sepia blue or Colour invert.

Multimedia $\overline{25}$

Adv. settings – Allows to choose from Storage, Image quality, Contrast, Shutter sound, Anti-flicker and Restore default.

Shooting a video

- 1 Press Menu and choose Camera.
- **2** Press **down navigation key** to convert into the video mode.
- 3 Point the lens towards the subject of the video and press **OK** key to start recording.
- 4 A timer will appear at the bottom of left-side.
- **5** Press **0K** key to stop recording and select the **right soft key** to save.

Adv. settings – Allows to choose from Storage, Video quality, Contrast, Record audio, Anti-flicker and Restore default.

NOTE: You can adjust the zoom scale by using the left and right navigation keys. The zoom scale ranges from Level 1 to Level 4.

Image viewer

This menu allows you to pictures and videos that are captured with camera. You can access the following options by pressing **Options: View, Send, Use as, Rename, Delete, Sort by, Details** and **Storage.** In Use as, you can choose from **Wallpaper**, **Power on display, Power off display** and **Caller picture**.

Voice recorder

You can use Voice recorder to record voice memos or other sounds.

- 1 Press Menu and choose Voice recorder.
- 2 Press up navigation key to begin recording.
- **3** Press **Pause** to pause recording, **Cont.** to continue recording.
- 4 Choose **Stop** to end the recording.

NOTE: After recording, you can access the following options by pressing **Options: New record, Play, Append, Rename, Delete, List, Settings** and **Send.** In Use as, you can choose the Incoming call ringtone.

Media player

This menu allows you to play audio and video files. You can also manage play lists. Choose from **Now playing**, **All songs**, **All videos** and **Music playlists**.

My Stuff

You can store multimedia files in your phone's memory so you have easy access to all your audio, photos and videos. You can also save your files to a memory card. Using a memory card allows you to free up space in your phone's memory. By touching **My Stuff**, you can open a list of the folders that store all your multimedia files.

Bluetooth

Your phone has built-in Bluetooth wireless technology, which makes it possible for you to connect your phone wirelessly to other Bluetooth devices such as a handsfree device, PC, laptop, or other phones. Display

This menu allows you to configure your display settings.

- Wallpaper Allows you to set a picture as your background.
- Power on display Allows you to set a picture as your background when the phone turns on.
- Power off display Allows you to set a picture as your background when the phone turns off.
- Show date and time Allows you to show the date and time on the idle screen.

Phone

Enjoy the freedom of adapting how your phone works for your own style.

- Date & Time You can set functions relating to the date and time.
- Language You can change the language for the display texts in your phone. This
 change will also affect the Language Input mode.
- Security Allows you to protect the features and settings of your phone. Choose from SIM security, Phone security, Certificate manager and Anti-theft mobile tracker.
- Schedule power on/off Allows you to set up time for the phone automatically power on or off. Once the time is set by you, the phone will power on or off automatically at the time specified.

- Hotline SMS Hotline SMS sends SMS with text as defined by the user to recipients. Users can send SMS also by using hotkey and user is allowed to customize it.
- **Encoding** You can choose from ASCII, ISO-8859-1 and Windows-1252.
- Auto update time Allows you to set the phone to automatically update the time and date according to the current local time zone.
- Flight mode You can use this function to switch the flight mode on. You will not be able to make calls, send messages when flight mode is switched on.
- Misc. settings You can set the brightness of the LCD backlight.

You can set the menu relevant to a call.

SIM1/ SIM2 settings

- Caller ID Select Hide ID or Send ID or set be network caller ID info.
- Call waiting Select Active or cancel call waiting.
- Call divert Select methods for diverting calls.
- Call barring Choose a barring password for all outgoing calls, outgoing international, outgoing international except to home country, all incoming calls, or incoming when abroad.

Cost save mode — Every contact is added along with assigned SIM when adding in phone book. During Calling, matching operator SIM is identified and the operation is completed using the matching operator SIM. This makes possible to use benefit from using same operator. To use Cost save mode feature, make sure the feature is On [Settings > Call > Cost save mode]

NOTE: Cost save mode doesn't work during in-call.

Smart call divert – Smart call divert activates call waiting and call forward for both SIMs. when you are in-call with SIM1 or SIM2 call are forwarded to SIM1 and vice versa.

Advanced settings

- Auto redial Choose the switch ON or OFF.
- Call time reminder Choose the Off, Single or Periodic.
- Reject by SMS Choose the switch ON or OFF.
- Answer mode You can change the settings on your phone to answer your calls in different ways.
- Fake call This is a useful function for avoiding awkward situation politely. You
 can call yourself by setting the time in fake call menu.
- Hearing Aid Hearing Aid increases volume levels in call. Volume will be increased only in receiver mode. Not applicable for Speaker, Headset and Bluetooth path

NOTE: Fake call can be activated or deactivated from idle screen using shortcut code #*#.

Restore settings

You can restore and restart the phone by inputting the phone password.

Dual SIM setting

You can see two Network Signal icons on the left-top of the screen when you insert two SIM-Card. To Activate/Deactivate the SIM card, Go to **Menu** > **Dual SIM settings**.

Data Accounts

Pre defined APN, Homepage, IP Address, Port settings have been given for all operators of targeted countries. Data account settings are used to launch Opera, Facebook, Twitter and any other network based apps, which uses data connection.

Network settings

You can select a network that will be registered either automatically or manually.

Data Settings
